PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Birchip and the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the following areas:—

SHIRE OF BIRCHIP.

All that area bounded by a line commencing at the south-west angle of Crown allotment 111, Parish of Karyrie, County of Karkaroc; thence easterly to the south-east angle of this allotment; thence southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 114; thence easterly to the south-east angle of this allotment; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 2; thence westerly along the southern boundary of this allotment and across allotment 3a, Parish of Narraport, County of Borung, to the south-east angle of allotment 34, Parish of Wirmbirchip, County of Karkaroc; thence westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 53; thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 31; thence easterly to the commencing point.

SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

All that area in the Parish of Bumbang, County of Karkaroc, bounded by a line commencing at the River Murray at the south-east corner of township reserve; thence south-westerly to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 10, section A; thence westerly along the southern boundary of allotments 10 and 1, section A, to the south-west corner of allotment 1, section A; thence northerly along the western boundary of allotment 1, section A, to the River Murray; thence upstream along the River Murray boundary to the point of commencement.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal districts of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the first day of July, 1949.

The use of "mesh" or "set" nets containing meshes measuring less than four inches is prohibited from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive) provided that in the portion of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio Bay) lying to the westward of an imaginary line running from the Werribee Sand Spit to the West Channel Pile Light and thence to Point King, near Sorrento, the use of such nets shall be prohibited from the first day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive).

2. The maximum length of any single "mesh" or "set" net shall not exceed forty-five (45) fathoms, and no person may use, assist in the use of, or have on board any boat at any one time more than thirty (30) such nets, provided that where two or more persons are working together as a crew in any boat the maximum number of any such "mesh" or "set" nets which such persons may together use or have on board any boat shall not exceed forty-five (45).

3. The use of "seine" nets measuring more than two hundred fathoms in length is prohibited in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio Bay) lying to the westward of an imaginary line running from the Gellibrand Pile Light to the West Channel Pile Light, and thence to the seaward end of the fishermen's pier at Queenscliff throughout the whole of each year.

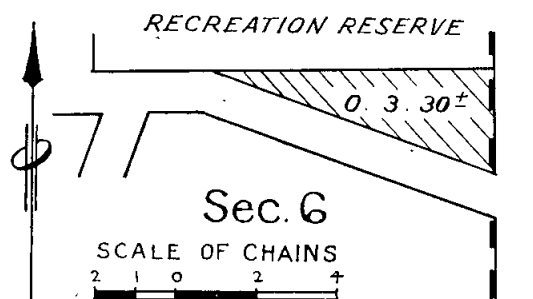

AIRCRAFT TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Aircraft Trades Regulations (No. 1)," and shall apply to the whole of the State of Victoria.

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

- "Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.
- "Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.
- "Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.
- "Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.
- "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

- (a) Aircraft Mechanic (Electrical).
- (b) Aircraft Mechanic (Engine).
- (c) Aircraft Mechanic (Airframe).

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants may be Examined.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at a time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

Exemptions.

- (a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—
 - (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
 - (ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship—General Form.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is

required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course.
- (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable owing to lack of order or through financial difficulties to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.
- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.
- (g) Not require the apprentice whilst under the age of eighteen years to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.
- (h) Not require the apprentice, except in an emergency, to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by the Regulations.
- (i) Provide the apprentice with all tools necessary for carrying out his work, including micrometers and verniers, but excluding all other measuring and precision tools of less than 13 inches.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

- (c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

Mutual Agreements.

3. At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

- (i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or
- (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission, the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship, or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wage rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

10. That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the *Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1947*.

11. That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his own use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 40s. 6d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 61s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 101s. 6d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 128s. 0d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and public holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rates (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to any journeymen who may be employed by him in the same trade; provided that the rate shall be not less than 1s. 6d. per hour.

Standard of Proficiency.

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

12. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

- (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
- (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Five shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
- (c) for the third and/or fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Seven shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every two journeymen or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

14. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship courses for the said trades shall be as set out in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto (as the case may be), but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first, second, and third years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each year to the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

(c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be)—

*Aircraft Mechanic (Electrical).—*The dismantling, overhauling, repairing, reconditioning, adjusting, testing, fabricating, assembling, and installing of all parts of aircraft electrical equipment (excluding radio equipment), including the correct methods of use of tools commonly used in the trade.

*Aircraft Mechanic (Engine).—*The dismantling, overhauling, repairing, reconditioning, adjusting, testing, fabricating, assembling, and installing of aircraft engines, their components and accessories, including the correct methods of use of tools commonly used in the trade.

*Aircraft Mechanic (Airframe).—*The dismantling, overhauling, repairing, reconditioning, adjusting, checking, fabricating, assembling, and installing

of all components of aircraft airframes, including the correct methods of use of tools commonly used in the trade—

and the employer shall, by the best means in his power, teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

15. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage, provided that the employer may require the apprentice to provide a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident, and in that case if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage.

Incorporation of General Regulations.

16. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1), made by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2), made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3), made by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4), made by the Governor in Council on the 25th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

General Regulations (No. 5), made by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of January, 1933.

General Regulations (No. 6), made by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of May, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1943.

General Regulations (No. 7), made by the Governor in Council on the 29th day of July, 1947, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 6th day of August, 1947.

TIMBER ON MAIN ROADS, STATE HIGHWAYS, TOURISTS' ROADS, AND FOREST ROADS.

WHEREAS by sections 66 and 74 of the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) and section 6 of the *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936* (No. 4405) and section 6 of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* (No. 4953) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations governing the cutting and removal of trees, saplings, shrubs, underwood, and timber on or upon roads declared to be main roads or State highways or tourists' roads or forest roads (as the case may be): Now therefore in pursuance of such powers His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations to take effect from the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, that is to say:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Act or in any by-law, lease, licence, right, or authority thereunder, no person shall cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy, damage, or remove the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, underwood, or timber in or upon any main road or State highway or tourist road or forest road without the authority, in writing, of the Country Roads Board (in the form in the Schedule hereto) first had and obtained.

2. Every application for authority to cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy, damage, or remove the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, underwood, or timber, whether the same shall be live or dead, in or upon any road declared to be a main road or declared and confirmed to be a State highway or declared to be a tourist road or forest road within the meaning of the *Country Roads Act 1928* or the *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936* or the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* (as the case may be) shall specify the particular tree, sapling, shrub, underwood, or timber which it is intended to cut, break, bark, root up, or destroy or remove, together with the name of the road and the shire or municipality, parish, and county on and in which the same is situated, and in the case of trees and saplings, shall specify the number thereof, and such further and fuller information as may be necessary to identify the same.

3. Every such application shall be lodged with the Secretary of the Country Roads Board, and shall be accompanied by such deposit as the Board may in each particular case require, and such deposit shall be held by the Board as and by way of security for the proper performance and observance of these Regulations, and of the conditions upon which any such authority is granted.

4. If and when the Board is satisfied that the conditions of such authority have been fully complied with, and that all fees and other moneys payable to the Board in respect of such cutting, barking, rooting up, or removal have been fully paid, such deposit shall be returned to the applicant.

5. Any authority granted in pursuance of these Regulations may be signed on behalf of the Board by the Secretary thereof, or by any officer of the said Board thereto authorized, in writing, either generally or in any particular case, and shall be available only for the period therein set forth.

6. Any authority so granted may be cancelled or withdrawn by the Board or by the Secretary thereof, or by any officer of the Board thereto authorized, in writing, on its behalf at any time during the currency thereof for any breach or non-observance of or non-compliance with these Regulations, or the conditions set forth in such authority.

7. Prior to the issue of any such authority the Board may require payment of a fee, the amount whereof shall be determined by the Board according to the value as assessed by the Board of such tree, sapling, shrub, underwood, or timber in respect of which the said authority is granted.

8. If any tree, sapling, shrub, underwood, or timber, whether live or dead, is cut, broken, barked, rooted up, or otherwise destroyed or damaged, or is cut or removed without authority as aforesaid having been first had and obtained, the Board may assess the value thereof, and the value so assessed shall be deemed to be the true value of the same.

9. Where any such tree, sapling, shrub, or other timber is barked, rooted up, or in any manner damaged, without removal, the value thereof may be assessed by the Board as if the same were cut for removal, and the amount of such assessment shall be considered to be the true value thereof.

10. All timber shall be felled in such a manner as to prevent any obstruction to traffic.

11. Every person to whom any authority under these Regulations is granted shall, to the satisfaction of the Board or of the engineer of a municipality on behalf of the Board, grub out all stumps to a depth of 12 inches below the surface of the roadway, and shall fill in all resulting holes with good loam, which shall be left 6 inches higher than the surrounding surface to allow for subsidence.

12. Every person to whom any authority as aforesaid is granted shall also, to the satisfaction of the Board or of the municipal engineer on behalf of the Board, remove from the water tables and drains and from every other part of the road all limbs, boughs, and other debris remaining after the cutting and removal of any trees, saplings, shrubs, underwood, or timber, and in default thereof shall be liable to forfeit the whole of his deposit.

13. Every person to whom any such authority is granted shall take all precautions to prevent damage or injury to the roadway, water tables, drains, culverts, fences, or any part or parts thereof, but in the event of any such damage or injury being caused shall forthwith repair and make good the same at his own expense, and to the satisfaction of the Board or of the municipal engineer on behalf of the Board. Provided, however, that the Board may, if it think fit, and without notice to such person, rectify, repair, and make good the same immediately, and deduct the whole cost incurred thereby from any moneys held by it by way of deposit on behalf of such person.

14. Every person to whom any such authority is granted shall take all precautions to prevent damage or injury to the person or property of persons lawfully using the road or highway mentioned in such authority, or being lawfully upon or owning or occupying property adjacent thereto, and in the event of any such injury occurring shall be solely responsible therefor, and shall indemnify and save harmless the Board against all action, claims, and demands in respect thereof.

15. No authority granted in pursuance of these Regulations shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Board, be transferred or assigned to any corporation, firm, or person.

16. Any person who is guilty of any contravention of or failure to comply with these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty-five pounds (£25).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the said Act on the 16th November, 1948, prescribing the travelling expenses which members of the Chicory Marketing Board are entitled to receive as follows (that is to say):—

“The total expenses incurred for the purpose of visiting chicory growers shall not exceed Fifty pounds (£50) per annum in the case of the Chairman and Five pounds (£5) per annum in the case of each of the other members.”

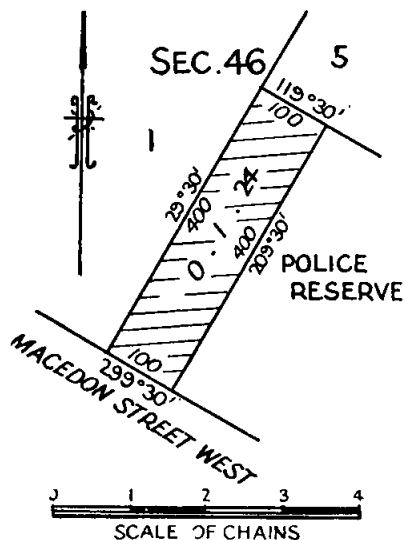
