WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 17 of the Local Government Act 1946, acting on a petition signed by not less than twenty-five (25) ratepayers resident in portion of the Shire of Upper Murray, and with the consent of the Council of the said shire, do hereby proclaim as a Township under the name and title of the Township of Cudgewa, the portion of the said shire as described in the said petition, comprised within the boundaries herein set forth and described, viz.:—

Commencing at the south corner of Crown allotment 3A, section 13, Parish of Wabba; thence north-westerly along the south-west boundary of the said allotment, across a road, and along the south-west boundary of Crown allotment 2B to the south-west corner thereof; thence generally north-westerly and north-easterly along the north-west boundary of the said allotment 2B to the western corner of Crown allotment 2A; thence north-easterly along the north-west boundaries of Crown allotment 2A, section 13, Crown allotments 10B, 10A, 5c, 5B, 5A, 39, 2B, section XI, and recreation reserve to the most northern corner thereof; thence south-easterly along the north-east boundary of the said recreation reserve and continuing in the same straight line across a road to the north-west boundary of Crown allotment 4B, section XI.; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of Crown allotment 4B to the western corner thereof; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 4B to its eastern corner; thence by a straight line in a south-easterly direction across a road and Crown allotment 11, and across another road to the most northerly corner of Crown allotment 7c, section XI., Parish of Cudgewa; thence westerly and south-westerly by the north and north-west boundaries of this allotment to the south-western corner thereof; thence along the north-westerly boundary of Crown allotments 7b and 8 to the western corner of Crown allotment 8, section XI., Parish of Cudgewa, and continuing across a road to the north-east boundary of Crown allotment 9; thence south-easterly along the north-easterly boundary of the said allotment 8 to the intersection of this boundary with the northern prolongation of the south-easterly boundary of Crown allotment 9A, section XI., Parish of Cudgewa; thence south-westerly along the said boundary of allotment 9A and its northern prolongation to the southern corner thereof; thence south-easterly, south-

SIGNALLING RULES.

1. The code of signals, clearly and conspicuously printed or painted on a metal plate, shall be posted in full view of the engine driver, and shall also be displayed at each working plat.

2. Every signal shall be distinctly given.

3. Every pump shaft shall be provided with a separate knocker of a different tone, independent of those used for winding.

4. When a cage has been left suspended at or in front of a level, no person shall attempt to make use of such cage, or to put on or take off tools or material, without first giving three knocks for "Hold Fast" which shall be answered by the engine driver moving the cage slightly.

5. On receiving the signal "4 pause 3"—"Holes charged ready for firing," the engine driver shall answer by moving the cage or bucket slightly, and at the same time one of the party to be moved shall stand by the knocker line until the men are on the cage or bucket when he shall knock "1."

6. The signal "4" means "Men on," and care shall be taken that no other signal conflicts with it.

7. The signal for "Serious accident"—"15"—implies that a doctor and an ambulance are required.

8. An approved system of communication between the bracceman and the engine driver shall be installed, in addition to the knocker line, and may consist of—

- (a) a plate having painted thereon in legible figures the number of the level to which men wish to ascend or descend; or
- (b) indicator boards or dials, one of which is erected at the brace and connected with another having a bell attachment in the engine room; or
- (c) a speaking tube fitted up between the brace and a point in the engine room convenient to the engine driver; or
- (d) a telephone or other electrical system of communication.

Resolution for Declaration of a Deviation under the Country Roads Act.

Whereas the land the site of the highway the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Act* 1928 for the purpose of constructing such highway deviation which highway deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same: And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads

Board incorporated under the said Act) thinks that the highway aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 58 of the said Act doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said highway deviation the course of which is described in the First Schedule hereto with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified to be part of a State highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act* 1928: And the said Board doth also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of the existing highway or part thereof described in the Second Schedule hereto.

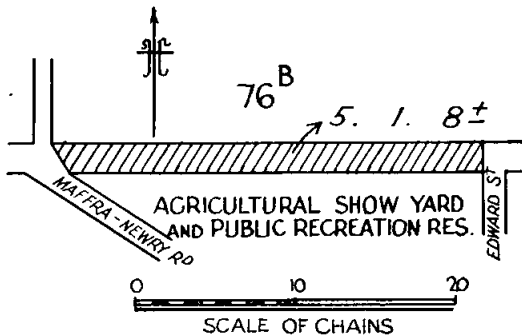

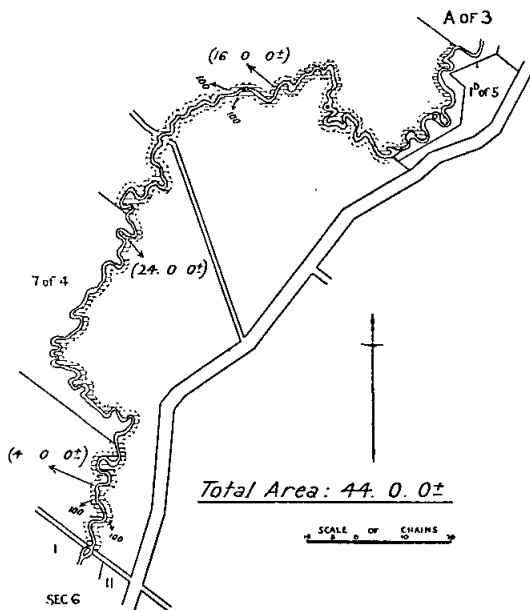

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS regulations known as the "Police Regulations" were made by the Governor in Council on the fifth day of August, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of August, 1947:—

And Whereas such regulations have been amended from time to time:—

Now Therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend as follows the said "Police Regulations," such amendment to take effect from the twelfth day of April, 1949 (that is to say):—

1. In the definition of "Officer" in sub-clause (1) of clause three of chapter one, for the expression "any Superintendent, Chief Inspector, Inspector, or Sub-Inspector" there shall be substituted the words "or any Superintendent, Chief Inspector, or Inspector".

2. In the definition of "Sub-officer" in sub-clause (1) of clause three of chapter one, for the words "first or second class sergeant" there shall be substituted the word "sergeant".

3. For clause one of chapter two there shall be substituted the following clause:—

“1. (1) The Police Force is divided into the following ranks and grades:—

Officers.

- (i) Chief Commissioner.
- (ii) Inspecting Superintendent.
- (iii) Superintendents.
- (iv) Chief Inspectors.
- (v) Inspectors.

Sub-Officers and Constables.

- (i) Sergeants.
- (ii) Senior Constables.
- (iii) First Constables.
- (iv) Constables.

“(2) Members of the Force holding the rank of sub-inspector immediately before the twelfth day of April, 1949, shall, as from and inclusive of that date, be deemed to hold the rank of inspector; and members of the Force holding the rank of sergeant, first class, or sergeant, second class, immediately before the said twelfth day of April, 1949, shall, as from and inclusive of that date, be deemed to hold the rank of sergeant; provided that the order of seniority of members of the Force existing immediately before the said twelfth day of April, 1949, shall not be affected by the operation of this sub-clause.”

4. For the heading above clause thirty-one of chapter four there shall be substituted the heading “Chief Inspectors and Inspectors”.

5. In clause thirty-one of chapter four, for the expression “Chief Inspectors, Inspectors, and Sub-Inspectors” there shall be substituted the words “Chief Inspectors and Inspectors”.

6. In clause thirty-three of chapter four, for the expression “Chief Inspectors, Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors” there shall be substituted the words “Chief Inspectors and Inspectors”.

7. In clause thirty-three of chapter six, for the expression “Superintendent, Inspector or Sub-Inspector” there shall be substituted the words “Superintendent or Inspector”.

8. In sub-clause (1) of clause seven of chapter eight, for the expression “sub-inspector” there shall be substituted the word “inspector”.

9. In clause two of chapter nine, for the expression “Chief Inspectors, Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors” there shall be substituted the expression “Chief Inspectors, Inspectors”.

10. For chapter seventeen there shall be substituted the following chapter:—

“CHAPTER 17.

“Illness.

“1. (1) On receipt of a notification that any member of the Force is ill and unfit for duty, the officer in charge of the station to which such member is attached shall cause such member to be visited by a sub-officer or, in the case of the first mentioned member being a policewoman, by the senior policewoman or a policewoman authorized by her. As soon as practicable after such visit, a report giving particulars as to the condition of the member of the Force so visited shall be submitted by the sub-officer, senior policewoman or policewoman by whom such visit is made.

“(2) A member of the Force who has reported sick shall remain at his residence so that he may be so visited.

“2. If a member of the Police Force fails to furnish a report as required by clause nine of Determination No. 12 of the Police Classification Board in respect of any injury or illness, any subsequent claim for such injury or illness to be regarded as ‘on duty’ shall not be recognized unless reasons satisfactory to the Chief Commissioner and the Chief Secretary can be advanced for the delay. No claim for an injury or illness to be regarded as ‘on duty’ shall be entertained in any case where the member concerned has sustained such injury or contracted such illness through his own unauthorized, illegal or improper acts.

“3. In the case of a sudden illness of a member of the Force whilst on duty, he shall report either to the officer in charge of the relief, the member in charge of the

section or station, or the member in charge of the adjoining beat, or some other appropriate member and, if unfit to continue working, shall, if able, proceed to the station and report his condition.

"4. If a member fails to comply with the provisions of the previous clause, an excuse that he was absent from his beat or other duty through illness shall not be accepted without proof, the onus of which shall be upon such member.

"5. All cases of serious illness or dangerous injuries to members of the Force shall be reported for the information of the Chief Commissioner by officers in charge of Districts immediately the facts are ascertained by them.

"6. (1) Any member of the Force under the rank of inspector attending the Police Hospital (in accordance with the provisions of clause nineteen of Determination No. 12 of the Police Classification Board) shall be subject to a deduction from his pay of fourteen shillings per day as an in-patient and three shillings per day as an out-patient.

"(2) Any member of the Force of or above the rank of inspector attending the Police Hospital (in accordance with the provisions of clause nineteen of Determination No. 12 of the Police Classification Board) shall be subject to a deduction from his pay of one pound per day as an in-patient and five shillings per day as an out-patient.

"7. All stoppages of pay on account of illness shall be deducted in the office of the Chief Commissioner from the pay of the member of the Force concerned."

11. Clauses twenty-four to forty-three of chapter nineteen are hereby revoked.

12. In the definition of "Officer" in clause one of chapter twenty-one, for the expression "and Superintendent, Chief Inspector, Inspector, and Sub-Inspector" there shall be substituted the expression "or any Superintendent, Chief Inspector, or Inspector".

13. In clause eleven of chapter twenty-one, for the expression "second-class sergeant or first-class sergeant" there shall be substituted the word "sergeant".

14. In clause thirty-seven of chapter twenty-one, for the expression "sergeant second class, sergeant first class or sub-inspector" there shall be substituted the words "sergeant or inspector".

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as provided in the Schedule. *Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender.

Security will be required, as provided in the tender form, either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, bank deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

Rates tendered must include T.T. exchange ruling at time of tendering.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words, "Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender Box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and Schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the Schedule or Schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the Schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one-half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1949, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1950. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with Schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the Schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In the case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 10.

10. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange, which may affect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

14. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.

15. Every account shall be in prescribed form, setting out the contract and item numbers, and shall furnish full details of how it is made up.

Minimum Area, Depth, Width of Frontage, and Distance from Boundaries.

4. The minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and distance of outer walls from street alignment and boundaries in column 3 of Table 803 of the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria* (hereinafter called the *Regulations*), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and distance of outer walls from street alignment and boundaries of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout that portion of the municipal district set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—

- (a) construct a building of Class I. Occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or
- (b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations,

in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

6. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
