Prices Regulation Act 1948.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 42.

BRICKS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 42.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 22 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Melbourne and Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the principal post office, Melbourne.
“Prevailing Rate” means, in relation to the cartage of bricks, the rate at which the said service was carried on on 16th day of September, 1948, on substantially the same terms and conditions, or if the said service was not supplied or carried on on that date, the last preceding date on which the said service was supplied or carried on on substantially the same terms and conditions.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which bricks may be sold ex kiln in Victoria to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order.
5. I fix and declare the maximum rate which may be charged for the cartage of bricks from any kiln to the place of delivery to be the prevailing rate.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

6. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I declare the maximum prices at which bricks specified in a notice in writing in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall operate to nullify the provisions of any notice in writing given in pursuance of any Price Regulation Order which is in force at the date of commencement of this Order, which fixes a lower maximum price for the sale of bricks by any person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 43.

COKE—SALES BY RETAIL—MELBOURNE METROPOLITAN AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner for the State of Victoria, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 43.

Definition.

2. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—

- (i) "Coke" means a product of coal that has been treated in a gas retort and is the fixed carbon and ash content remaining after such treatment;
- (ii) "Melbourne Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
- (iii) "cwt." means a weight of 112 lb.;
- (iv) "ton" means a weight of 2,240 lb.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which coke may be sold by retail in the Melbourne Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Notice in Writing.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which coke may be sold by retail in the Melbourne Metropolitan Area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 44.

ICE—GIPPSLAND AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 44.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

- (a) an "eighth block" means a block of ice weighing 11 lb. or more, but less than 22 lb.;
- (b) a "quarter block" means a block of ice weighing 22 lb. or more, but less than 47 lb.;
- (c) a "half block" means a block of ice weighing 47 lb. or more, but less than 100 lb.;
- (d) a "large block" means a block of ice weighing not less than 100 lb.

"Gippsland Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in the following Town, Borough, and Shires:—

Town of Sale;

Borough of Wonthaggi;

Shires of Alberton, Avon, Bairnsdale, Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Korumburra, Maffra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, Omeo, Orbost, Rosedale, South Gippsland, Tambo, Traralgon, Warragul, Woorayl.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by wholesale in the Gippsland Area to be 60s. (Sixty shillings) per ton of 20 (twenty) large blocks.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by retail in the Gippsland Area to be—

(a) *Delivered to the Purchaser's Premises—*

Eighth block—8d.

Quarter block—1s. 3d.

Half block—2s. 6d.

Large block—5s.

(b) *If Purchased at Factory—*

Eighth block—6d.

Quarter block—1s.

Half block—2s.

Large block—4s.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice other than eighth, quarter, half, or large blocks may be sold in the Gippsland Area to be 3d. per block.

Notice in Writing.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any size of a block of ice specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by retail in the Gippsland Area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to such person.
