Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby increase the area of Crown land comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

No. 5365. "An Act to authorize and approve the Execution by the State of Victoria of an Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia and the State of Victoria relating to Mental Institution Benefits, and for other purposes."

The Fisheries Acts.

PRESCRIPTION OF GUMMY AND SCHOOL OR SNAPPER SHARKS AS "FISH" AND FIXING OF MINIMUM LENGTHS THEREFOR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do, by this my Proclamation:—

1. Prescribe that the following sharks shall be "fish" for the purposes of the Fisheries Acts:—

- (a) Gummy Shark (*Emissola antarctica*),
- (b) School or Snapper Shark (*Notogaleus australis*).

2. Add the aforementioned sharks to the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act* 1928 and set opposite thereto the following lengths:—

- (a) Gummy Shark (*Emissola antarctica*) 24 inches,
- (b) School or Snapper Shark (*Notogaleus australis*) 36 inches.

The length of such fish shall be ascertained by measuring overall, that is, from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail.

MILDURA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1928*, the Trustees of the Mildura Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

All Rules and Regulations in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these Rules and Regulations shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

General.

1. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Trustees when application is made or orders given, and the full name and address of such purchaser of ground for private burials must be supplied by the person making such application.

Provided, however, that any person who so desires may be granted a period of up to twelve months for payment in full of the amount due for purchase of ground for private burials.

If, after a period of twelve months, such amount due for ground for private burials has not been paid in full, the Trustees may, after the expiration of 30 days after notification in writing has been given, as far as practicable, to the purchaser or person who made such application on behalf of such purchaser of ground for private burials, resume possession of and utilize such ground for common burials.

2. That any person desiring ground within the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, mausoleum, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or other erection, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved, the Trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying, a certificate of right of burial.

3. No person being the owner of an exclusive right of burial shall transfer such right without the consent of the Trustees. Upon the Trustees having consented, and the transferor having delivered up the existing certificate of right of burial, and paid the charge prescribed by the Trustees, a new certificate shall be issued.

4. Upon satisfactory evidence being produced to the Trustees that a certificate of right of burial has been lost or destroyed, and upon the charge prescribed by the Trustees being paid, a fresh certificate shall be issued by the Trustees.

5. That unless otherwise ordered, the vehicular entrance of the cemetery shall be open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on days from Mondays to Fridays (inclusive).

6. All persons driving motor or other vehicles in the cemetery shall obey the directions of the secretary or other officer duly approved by the Trustees in every respect in regard thereto.

7. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees, enter or remain in the cemetery at a time when same is not opened to the public.

8. No child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

9. No person shall—

- (a) Affix any bill or stencil mark to any tree, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, pillar, railing, kerbing, or memorial erection in the cemetery or its approaches.
- (b) Cut, break, remove, or deface any of the statuary, trees, shrubs, plants, seats, gates, posts, fences, or erections in the cemetery.
- (c) Write upon any of the statuary, trees, shrubs, plants, seats, gates, posts, fences, or erections in the cemetery.
- (d) Cut, pluck, gather, take, or injure any of the plants, flowers, or fruit in the cemetery.
- (e) Interfere with or injure any of the grass plots, trees, shrubs, flowers, vases, labels, or other property in the cemetery.
- (f) Do any injury or damage to any road or pathway in the cemetery.
- (g) Remove or interfere in any way with, or injure any article whatsoever attached to the land, or built or placed on or in any grave or burying place or land in the cemetery.
- (h) Climb any of the trees or shrubs in the cemetery, or climb or jump over any of the seats or fences therein, or stand or lie in any of the seats therein.
- (i) Behave in an improper or offensive manner, or use bad language, or commit any act of indecency within the cemetery.
- (j) Carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, or promote or advertise the same by any means whatsoever.
- (k) In the employ of the Trustees within the cemetery, interfere in or suggest the engagement of any monumental mason or sculptor, stone-cutters, or others, to erect or repair monuments, or to do any other work in the cemetery.

(l) Other than relatives of the deceased therein interred, or the owner for the time being of the certificate of right of burial or his relatives, dress or decorate any grave within the cemetery without first obtaining the written authority of the Trustees so to do. Such authority shall be subject to such conditions as the Trustees shall direct, and be in the form set out in the certificate of right of burial, or such other form as may from time to time be approved by the Trustees.

- (m) Sell or buy any article or thing in the cemetery.
- (n) Distribute any handbill, card, circular, or advertisement in the cemetery.
- (o) Disturb any funeral service at any grave.
- (p) Cause or permit or suffer any animal to trespass or stay or be at large within the cemetery.
- (q) Do any work near a grave where a burial service is being performed.
- (r) Do constructional work on any grave, vault, tomb, memorial, headstone, or kerb on any Sunday, Good Friday, or Anzac Day.
- (s) Employed under the Trustees, be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he received payment by the Trustees, and any person employed under the Trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.
- (t) Carry firearms, pea rifles, or other offensive weapons.

10. Any workman, or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any person, shall at all times while in the cemetery be subject to the supervision, directions, and control of the secretary or other officer duly appointed by the trustees, and shall obey all such directions, and may be removed from the cemetery upon any breach of the Regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

11. When, in the opinion of the Trustees, any tomb, monument, tablet, gravestone, or other erection is, or is likely to become dangerous, the Trustees shall, where practicable, give notice in writing to the owner or person responsible, to repair, if his place of abode can be ascertained. If within reasonable time such repair is not effected, the Trustees may take down and remove such monument, tablet, gravestone, or other erection, and sell or otherwise dispose of the materials of which same was composed. The Trustees shall not be required to account for the proceeds of such sale or for such disposition of the materials. A notice sent by prepaid post to the address of such owner or person last known to the secretary shall be sufficient notice under this regulation.

12. All memorial stones, iron railings, or other monumental appendages, and all decorations which have been allowed to fall into decay, and present a dilapidated and unsightly appearance, also all trees and shrubs, &c., which the Trustees may consider unsuitable, or may have become unsightly or overgrown, or appearing to cause injury to any erection, &c., may be removed altogether by the Trustees from the place of burial on which they have been erected or placed at any time after the expiration of 30 days after notification in writing has been given, as far as practicable, to the owner or person responsible for such grave. A notice sent by prepaid post to the address of such owner or person last known to the secretary shall be sufficient notice under this regulation.

13. All rubbish is to be placed in the receptacles provided in the cemetery for that purpose.

14. All fees and other charges which the Trustees are by these Rules and Regulations authorized to impose may be sued for and recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

15. The Trustees may charge and receive the fees and charges provided in the scale of fees which may be adopted from time to time.

16. Any person desiring to have a monument or place of burial kept in order in perpetuity may do so by depositing in the hands of the Trustees a sum of money which shall be determined by the Trustees in each case, and by executing an agreement with the Trustees containing such provisions and conditions as the Trustees think fit. The Trustees shall not be called upon to re-erect any vault, monument, or other structure which may fall or become damaged through defective work, or other causes, and all work must be in thorough order and repair prior to the Trustees accepting responsibility for such maintenance.

17. The secretary, or other proper officer duly appointed by the Trustees as referred to in these Rules and Regulations, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the secretary or other officer in charge of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

Interments.

18. Every application for interment in the cemetery shall be made at the office of the Trustees and shall be accompanied with a certificate of right of burial, and such particulars as are set out in these Rules and Regulations, and no order for interment shall be issued until such particulars and all fees, costs, and charges as fixed by these Rules and Regulations are paid to the Trustees.

No corpse shall be interred or deposited in the cemetery contrary to this regulation unless special permission in writing is given by the secretary.

19. An order from the secretary shall be proper authority to the officers of the cemetery for the interment of every corpse mentioned in such order.

20. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead, copper, or other approved plate, with the name of the deceased distinctly stamped or engraved thereon.

21. Every undertaker or person bringing a body for interment shall make such interment under the direction of the secretary or sexton.

22. No body or portion of a body shall be buried in a grave except it be fully encased in a coffin of wood.

A stillborn child shall be suitably encased.

23. Any person desiring to re-open a grave or a vault for the purpose of an interment shall not less than eight hours prior to the time fixed for each interment, remove the head and foot stones, kerbing slabs, and/or monuments necessary to permit of such interment, and shall immediately after the interment duly and properly replace same in the conditions in all respects (such to the approval of the Trustees) in which the same were prior to removal.

24. Notwithstanding the last preceding regulation, and without being obliged so to do, the Trustees may, if they think fit, and upon due notice and payment of the costs and charges, undertake the removal and replacement of head and foot stones, kerbings, slabs, and monuments, &c., when graves or vaults are required to be opened, but shall not be responsible for any damage which may occur in the performance of such work. If due notice be not given, and the costs and charges are not paid as aforesaid, the Trustees will not undertake the re-opening of such grave or vault.

25. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave, vault, mausoleum, or other similar erection, shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the secretary or other proper officer on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron.

26. The hours for the arrival of funerals at the cemetery are as follows:—

Mondays to Fridays, inclusive—10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Saturdays—special arrangement only.

Sundays—special arrangement only.

Holidays—special arrangement only.

27. The time appointed for any funeral to arrive at the cemetery shall be notified to the secretary at least eight working hours before the time appointed for such arrival, and such time shall be punctually observed. An extra fee of 10s. 6d. for each half hour or portion thereof shall be charged in the event of arrival of any funeral after the time appointed therefor.

28. No coffin shall be allowed to be deposited in any vault in the cemetery unless such coffin shall have an inner leaden coffin, or casement of lead, and a certificate to that effect, duly signed by the undertaker supplying such a coffin, shall have been furnished to the secretary.

29. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave, vault, mausoleum, or other erection without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other evidence to the satisfaction of the Trustees that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

30. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave, vault, mausoleum, or other erection to which during life the deceased had no claim, the written consent of the owner or the legal holder for the time being of the certificate of burial shall be given with the application.

Masonry.

31. The Trustees may issue a licence to any qualified person desiring to be licensed as a monumental mason for the purpose of undertaking work in the cemetery. Every licence issued shall be the property of the Trustees and shall be held by the licensee subject to the provisions of these Rules and Regulations, and shall be delivered up to the Trustees upon demand.

Where the Trustees have suspended or cancelled any licence, they may re-issue the same or a substituted licence, subject to such conditions as the Trustees think fit.

A person holding a licence under these Regulations shall at all times comply with the provisions of these Rules and Regulations and with the terms of all authorities, orders, notices, and directions issued, given, or exhibited under the authority of these Rules and Regulations.

A person holding a licence under these Regulations shall forthwith, from time to time when thereunto required by the Trustees, furnish to the secretary, in writing, true and accurate information of and concerning all works carried out by the licensee in the cemetery during the period or periods specified in the requisition of the Trustees.

No person who is not licensed as a monumental mason under these Regulations shall undertake any work within the cemetery.

This regulation shall not apply to employees of the Trustees whilst engaged in their employment under instruction of the Trustees.

32. Any person desiring to erect any memorial or other erection within the cemetery or to kerb land in respect of which he is the holder of an exclusive right of burial shall make or cause to be made application for a permit, in writing, authorizing such work to be carried out.

33. In the case of erections and/or kerbing, renovations, alteration, the engraving of inscriptions, or any other work permitted under these Rules and Regulations, all such applications shall be made by the holder of a licence issued by the Trustees as mentioned in Regulation 31 hereof, and the owner's consent, in writing, to the carrying out of such work shall be submitted with the application.

34. All applications shall be lodged with the secretary at his office.

35. A copy of every proposed inscription and drawing of every proposed memorial, erection, and kerbing, drawn to scale or with figured overall measurements thereon, and a statement of the approximate weight of such memorial, shall be submitted to the Trustees and approved of by them prior to the cutting or erection of the same, if so required.

36. Every permit issued by the secretary for the erection or carrying out of work must be delivered to the sexton before such work is commenced. If for any reason work which is commenced would be left incomplete, the site and surroundings must be left thoroughly clean and tidy to the satisfaction of the sexton.

37. All persons (other than employees of the Trustees) who have obtained a permit authorizing the carrying out of any work in the cemetery shall commence work not earlier than 8 a.m. on a working day (being Mondays to Saturdays, both inclusive, only, and not including Cemetery Employees' Award holidays), during which the cemetery is open, and shall work not later than 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, and 12 noon on Saturdays. No work shall be done on any Sunday, Good Friday, or Anzac Day.

38. All materials required in construction of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery.

39. No material with a fault of any description shall be used in any erection or construction within the cemetery.

40. No material of any description shall be delivered to the cemetery or placed on any portion therein by any person without the consent of the secretary, and all materials so delivered shall be deposited only where directed by such secretary or sexton, and such secretary or sexton shall have the right to order the removal of any materials deposited on any site without such consent, or contrary to such direction.

41. No memorial work shall be taken from the cemetery for the purpose of making alterations or additions thereto without the consent of the secretary.

42. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out such work, and he shall immediately repair and make good to the satisfaction of the secretary or sexton, all damage caused by him in the execution of such work.

43. The Trustees may allow the construction of concrete and granolite kerbs and headpieces, and the following rules as hereunder set out shall be strictly observed:—

- (a) Concrete to be composed of a mixture of four (4) parts bluestone or granite screenings of a grade not larger than 1 inch, two (2) parts clean sharp sand, and one (1) part first quality cement.

- (b) Concrete or granolite to be finished with smooth plain face.
- (c) Foundations to consist of four (4) piers; such piers shall be carried to the solid clay, or to the bottom of the grave if so directed by the secretary or sexton.
- (d) Each and every kerbing shall be reinforced with No. 3 (three) mild steel rods, $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in diameter, the ends of which shall be properly lapped at the corners.
- (e) Headpieces shall be not more than 24 inches in height above the kerbing unless supported by pillars, and not less than 6 inches in thickness, with splayed central portion, the central portion to be filled with an inscription panel of natural stone, and such panel shall be of a thickness of not less than 1 inch.
- (f) Plain name panels of natural stone will be permitted to be set in the kerbing.

44. All work shall be erected on proper and substantial foundations constructed of concrete or first quality bricks set in cement mortar. Concrete shall be composed of a mixture as specified in clause 43 (a).

45. Kerbings and posts erected on base course shall be permanently affixed with mild steel dowels (two dowels to each kerbing), such dowels to be not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter and 3 inches long.

46. Kerbings and memorials, including all projections, shall not project beyond the boundary of the allotment, and shall be set in line, plumb level.

47. Rock-faced work shall not project more than 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch beyond the arris or pitch line.

48. When a kerbing or memorial is erected, the whole space between the new kerbing and the adjoining kerbings shall be filled with concrete to the satisfaction of the Trustees. Concrete laid in the form of paving shall not be less than 3 inches thick, and shall be of the same specification as the concrete for foundations as specified in clause 43 (a).

49. The minimum thickness of any kerbing for allotments 8 feet by 4 feet, or multiples thereof, shall be 6 inches.

50. All stones of kerbings, monuments, and memorials shall be securely dowelled together with not less than one dowel or cramp of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter mild steel to each joint. Dowels or cramps shall be properly grouted with liquid cement. The use of sulphur is strictly prohibited in the fixing of any work.

51. No wooden structure will be permitted.

52. Every new kerbing or memorial shall have the grave number clean cut and painted in block type figures 1 inch high on the foot kerb, and this shall also apply when permission is given for the renovation of any memorial or kerbing.

53. When graves are to be covered with concrete and chippings or pebbles, such concrete covering shall be not less than 2 inches thick, and shall be composed of four parts bluestone or granite screenings, two parts clean sharp sand to one part first quality cement. A brick or concrete support shall be placed in each corner.

54. Concrete coverings shall be set within the kerbing, and shall not be made in the form of ledgers projecting above the kerbing.

55. All work shall be solidly and substantially built, and properly finished to the satisfaction of the Trustees. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations, the Trustees may order the removal of any work which in their opinion is shoddy, flimsy, or in which inferior materials have been used, or where faulty workmanship has been performed.

56. The designer's or mason's name and address may, with the owner's consent, be placed upon memorial work, providing that the lettering is not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch size. In cases where firms have trade name plates of approved design, the area of such plate shall not exceed 10 square inches.

57. When any vault, monument, tablet, gravestone, monumental inscription, kerbing, railing, or other erection has been erected, built, or placed in the cemetery contrary to these Regulations, or without the order of the Trustees, contrary to the terms and conditions of authority to erect, build, or place the same, the Trustees may take down and remove such vault, monument, tablet, gravestone, monumental inscription, kerbing, railing, or other erection.

58. Touting for business within the cemetery area is strictly forbidden, and cemetery employees are not permitted to act as agents for monumental masons, directly or indirectly, or to receive gratuities or commissions of any kind. Any employee of the Trust not complying with this regulation will be subject to summary dismissal.

59. No monumental mason or his employees shall enter the cemetery for business purposes on any Saturday after 12 noon, or on any Sunday or holiday, unless he shall have notified the secretary of the cemetery beforehand of a definite appointment with a client, or unless he shall have brought such client to the cemetery. The licence of any monumental mason failing to comply with this rule may be immediately cancelled.

60. No soil shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave except by permission of the secretary or sexton.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1928* the Veterinary Board of Victoria is empowered, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, or rescind Regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect. Therefore the said Board doth hereby rescind all previous Regulations made under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, and the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915* and make the subjoined Regulations in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act (that is to say):—

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.

1. *Appointment of Returning Officer.*—The Board shall, from time to time, appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person who is registered as a qualified veterinary surgeon, and not being a member of the Board, to be Returning Officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. *Date of Triennial Election.*—In the month of May, in the year 1951, and in the month of May in every next succeeding third year thenceforward, the Returning Officer shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered veterinary surgeons of Victoria, to serve as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.

3. *Returning Officer to give Notice of day of Election and day of Nomination, and of the Time and Place when and where Nominations will be Received.*—At every election of members to serve on the Board, the Returning Officer shall give 42 days' notice by advertisement in such daily paper or papers as may be approved of by the Board of his intention to proceed on a certain day at a specified time to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of eligible persons to serve as members on such Board, and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than 28 days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

4. *How Elections shall be made.*—Should the nominations exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, an election by ballot shall be held, otherwise the Returning Officer shall declare those nominated duly elected.

5. *Nominations.*—Nominations of persons for election to the Board must be submitted in writing to the Registrar on or before the day named by the Returning Officer as the day for nomination and each nomination must bear the signature of the proposer and be countersigned by the nominee.

6. (a) *Returning Officer to Ascertain Number of Votes of Each Candidate in Presence of Registrar and Scrutineers Casting Vote of Returning Officer—Candidates Declared Duly Elected.*—The Returning Officer shall at least 21 days prior to the date of election post or otherwise cause to be delivered to every registered veterinary surgeon to his address appearing in the Veterinary Register of Victoria a voting-paper in the form given in Schedule III. of these Regulations.

(b) The Returning Officer shall proceed in the presence of the Registrar and of the scrutineers appointed by any candidate to open the envelopes and take out the voting-papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes the Returning Officer shall in each case have the casting vote. Provided always that if and person entitled to vote be unable to write the Returning Officer if requested by such person before the expiration

of the time fixed for receiving votes, and being satisfied with the voter's identity, shall fill up for him his voting-paper as directed by the voter and obtain and attest his mark thereto and receive and deal with the same as the vote of such voter; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the Returning Officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate and shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.

7. *Voting-paper may become Invalid—Voting-paper to be Delivered to Address of Returning Officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain on any voting-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given in and by such paper shall be rejected by the Returning Officer. The voter shall enclose such voting-paper in an envelope and shall cause the same to be received by the Returning Officer before the hour fixed for holding such election.

8. *How Candidates may Retire.*—If any candidate for election to the Board desires to retire from such candidature before the day of holding such election such candidate, not later than three days after the day of nomination, shall sign and deliver to the Returning Officer a notice stating that he so retires, and the Returning Officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting-paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.

9. *Appointment of Scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint one scrutineer to be present when the Returning Officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day of holding the election, notice of such appointment to be in writing addressed to the Returning Officer.

10. *Seat of Member, how Vacated.*—If any member die, or, by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar, resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of every such member shall become vacant and the Board may appoint an eligible person to fill the vacancy and the person so appointed shall hold office until the next ensuing triennial election and no longer.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

11. *Election of President.*—The President shall be elected at the first meeting after the election of the Board by a majority of the members present, and if for want of a quorum, or from any other cause, a President shall not be elected at such first meeting he shall be elected at the next meeting, a week's notice having been given by the Registrar to each member of the Board.

12. *Meetings of Board—Special Meetings.*—The Board shall meet at least quarterly at the office of the Registrar or some other place approved by the Board, or oftener as the President or any two members of the Board shall desire by requisition, in writing, addressed to the Registrar, who shall thereupon summon the members of the Board to meet on the day and at the time fixed by such requisition, and the Registrar shall give at least three clear days' notice, in writing, by post to their addresses in the register, to each member of the Board of all meetings to be held.

13. *Meeting to Lapse when Quorum not Present.*—If at the expiration of 30 minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting of the Board there shall not be a quorum of members present, no business shall be transacted, and the meeting shall lapse.

14. *Order of Business.*—At every ordinary meeting of the Board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to the accuracy as a record of the proceedings, such minutes when confirmed shall be signed by the President or chairman presiding at

24. *Duties of Treasurer.*—It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to pay by cheque signed by two members of the Board and countersigned by the Registrar such accounts as the Board may from time to time order by resolution, which shall specify the sums of money to be paid, and to whom.

25. *Quarterly Statement of Treasurer and Annual Balance-sheet.*—The Treasurer shall present to the Board a quarterly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past quarter and he shall also, in the month of March in each year, prepare and present to the Board an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Board at the 31st December next preceding.

26. *Appointment of Auditor.*—The Board shall appoint, in the month of December in each year, an Auditor, who shall hold office until the month of December in the following year, and the Board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1928* a fee of Two pounds two shillings to such Auditor. The Auditor shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the Treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct.

FEES.

27. *Fees.*—The scale of fees specified in Schedule II. to these Regulations shall be those payable to the Registrar of the Board before registration, as provided by section 14 of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1928*, in lieu of, and in substitution for, the fees specified in the Second Schedule to the said Act.

28. *Appropriation of Fees.*—The Board shall be at liberty, out of any moneys coming to its hands under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1928* or of these Regulations, to pay and discharge all costs, charges and expenses, debts, liabilities, and obligations incurred by it howsoever in connexion with framing these Regulations or carrying out the provisions of the said Act and Regulations, and all matters and things done thereunder.

APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION.

29. Every application for registration shall be in the form of a declaration by the applicant, showing that he is entitled thereto under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1928* supported by such corroborative evidence as the Board may in each case, in its absolute discretion, require. The application of a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain or of any college or school recognized by the Board shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule IV. and every applicant shall, before registration, sign his name in the Registrar's signature-book hereinbefore referred to.

30. The veterinary colleges and schools whose certificates or diplomas of competency as a veterinary surgeon will be recognized by the Board are the following:—

The University of Melbourne,
The University of Sydney,
The University of Brisbane,
The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain,

and such other colleges and schools as may from time to time be recognized by the Board.

31. The Board shall, on approval of the application of a person entitled to registration under the said Act, and payment of the proper fees, grant and cause to be issued to him a certificate of registration in the form specified in Schedule I. to these Regulations under the seal of the Board.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE MEAT SUPERVISION
REGULATIONS 1947.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Meat Supervision Regulations 1949," and shall come into operation three months after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 38 of the Meat Supervision Regulations 1947 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

38. (1) No person shall bleed or attempt to bleed any large cattle unless they have first been effectually stunned: Provided that, where the preliminary casting of the beast has been carried out by an apparatus approved by the Commission, this sub-regulation shall not apply to the slaughtering of animals for the purpose of providing Kosher meat.

(2) No person shall stun or attempt to stun any large cattle by any means other than a humane killer of a captive bolt type approved by the Commission or an electrical stunning instrument of a type approved by the Commission or by a hammer the head of which in the case of calves is not less than two and a half pounds in weight and in the case of any other type of large cattle is not less than five pounds in weight: Provided that the Council of any shire may permit the stunning of large cattle by means of a rifle in any abattoir where not more than one slaughterman is employed.

(3) No person shall bleed or attempt to bleed any swine unless such swine have been effectually stunned by an electrical stunning instrument of a type approved by the Commission: Provided that the Council may permit the stunning of swine by a hammer, the head of which is not less than two and a half pounds in weight, in any abattoir, where—

- (a) no suitable electric current is available; or
- (b) the maximum kill of swine in any week of the previous calendar year did not exceed twenty-five.

(4) Any permission given by a Council for the stunning of large cattle by means of a rifle or of swine by means of a hammer shall be given in writing and the Council shall forward a copy thereof to the Commission.

(5) No person shall kill any sheep or lambs except by the rapid severance of all structures anterior to the vertebral column in the neck.

(6) No person shall slaughter or attempt to slaughter any animal except in a compartment set apart for the purpose and complying with the relevant provisions of the Offensive Trades Regulations 1939 or any regulations amending the same.

3. Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of Division 2 of the First Schedule of the Meat Supervision Regulations 1947 is hereby amended by deleting the word "military" and substituting therefor the word "miliary."

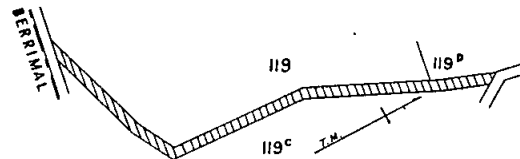

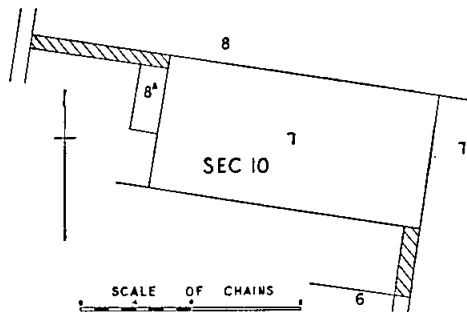

7. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards, dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

12. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, erect in the Reserve any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, stand, building, or structure.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any part therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any stand, structure, or erection in the Reserve.

15. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserve, or snare or destroy any wild fowl therein.

16. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained, do or perform any of the following acts in or on the Reserve:—

- (a) Dig up, displace, or interfere with any soil, loam, gravel, or material.
- (b) Gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserve, or take away therefrom any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or any other vegetation.
- (c) Ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.

17. No person shall remove any soil, loam, gravel, or material from the Reserve.

18. No person shall bathe from the Reserve without permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

19. Any person committing any of the following offences within the Reserve shall (in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable therefor) be liable to be ejected from the Reserve, namely:—

- (a) Being drunk.
- (b) Using profane, abusive, insulting, threatening, indecent, or obscene language.
- (c) Assaulting any person or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner.
- (d) Obtaining admission to or being found in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission thereto under these Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

CITY OF COLLINGWOOD.

BY-LAW No. 80.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under Part VII., Division (1), section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 80, prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of vehicles standing in any street or road or part thereof specified herein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and of every other act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

"Motor car" means a motor car within the meaning of section 3 of the *Motor Car Act 1928*, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places may be fixed or appointed by the Council under the powers conferred by any enactment other than section 197 (1) (xxd) of the *Local Government Act 1946*.

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power and includes a motor car but does not include a push bicycle.

2. No driver of a vehicle shall leave such vehicle (whether unattended or not) standing in such part of the street or road as specified in the Schedule hereto except for such period as may be necessary to pick up or set down passengers or goods, but such period shall not in any event exceed five minutes.

3. The owner or person apparently in control of any vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any portion of any street or road specified in the Schedule hereto shall, when questioned by any officer of the Council or member of the Police Force, give to such officer or member of the Police Force his full name and address and all information sought with respect to any person other than the said owner or person apparently in con-

trol who is or was the driver of such vehicle, which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.

4. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable therefor to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BY-LAW No. 63.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, numbered 63, made under the powers conferred by section 198 of the *Local Government Act* and all other powers thereunto enabling, for the purpose of prohibiting the erection of verandahs other than cantilever type verandahs, and requiring the removal of verandahs other than cantilever type verandahs.

BY-LAW No. 39.

A By-law of the Shire of Lowan, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 39, for the purpose of regulating street traffic, and for all other purposes in this By-law mentioned.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lowan order as follows:—

1. Definitions.—In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Lowan.

"Crossing" means a crossing (established by the Council) for pedestrians on streets, and includes the part or parts of any intersection used by pedestrians when crossing such intersection.

"Commercial vehicle" means any wagon, truck, motor truck (other than a utility truck of a capacity not in excess of 1½ ton), transport wagon, timber haulage wagon, hire car, taxi or passenger bus of any description, or any motor passenger vehicle with a trailer of any description attached thereto (which motor passenger vehicle, together with the trailer, has a total length greater than 21 feet).

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or an animal.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare or other public place within the Township of Nhill habitually used by pedestrians, and not vehicular traffic.

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle, whether or not such streets cross.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare or other public place within the Township of Nhill other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, mechanical, electrical or other power, and includes a motor car.

2. A vehicle shall not be left standing (whether attended or not)—

(a) Within the areas between the curbed lawn situated in front of the Nhill Post Office, and the footways contiguous to the western extremity of the park area in Nelson-street, Nhill, as defined to the east thereof, and the eastern extremity of the park area in Nelson-street, Nhill, as defined to the west thereof respectively.

(b) Against the boundary of the band rotunda park area situated in Victoria-street, Nhill, at or near any corner thereof, between the points indicated thereat.

(c) At either end of any park area situated in Victoria-street aforesaid, between Nelson-street aforesaid, and Pine-street, Nhill, between the points indicated thereat.

(d) In any street in the Township of Nhill within 30 feet of the building line of any intersection.

(e) On the south side of Nelson-street aforesaid, from the intersection of McDonald-street to the eastern boundary of the site of the Nhill Hospital and Nurse's Home.

3. A vehicle shall not be left standing (whether attended or not) for a period in excess of 30 minutes, and then only in such a position that the left or near side wheels are parallel with and as near as practicable to the curb on the left or near side of the street, and that such vehicle is not less than 4 feet from any other vehicle—

(a) On the north side of Nelson-street, Nhill, between Young and Railway streets.

(b) On the south side of Nelson-street aforesaid, from the intersection with Campbell-street to a point on the southern boundary of Nelson-street, 260 feet west of the south-west intersection of Victoria and Nelson streets, and being the western boundary of the motor garage property at present occupied by Bullen Bros.

(c) On the east side of Victoria-street, Nhill, from intersection with Nelson-street to a point on the eastern boundary of Victoria-street, a distance of 122 feet south-west of the south-east intersection of Victoria and Macpherson streets, and being to private right-of-way adjoining on south the motor garage building known as "Chrysler House."

(c) In Victoria-street aforesaid, against curbed gardens or band rotunda park, and between the southern points of the areas defined by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of clause 3 of this By-law and the intersections with Leahy and Pine streets respectively (save and except in any area specifically defined in Regulation 5 hereof).

(d) In Brougham-street, Nhill, between the intersections with Victoria-street and Farmers-street.

5. A commercial vehicle shall not be left standing (whether attended or not) in any street in the Township of Nhill between the hours of 7 o'clock in the afternoon and 7 o'clock in the forenoon, save and except in the areas hereinafter defined, viz.:—

(a) Park area as defined situated in the centre of Nelson-street aforesaid, opposite the Tattersalls Hotel and the motor garage property at present occupied by Bullen Bros. hereinbefore mentioned, from the entrance to the park area opposite Young-street westwards.

(b) Park area as defined situated in the centre of Victoria-street aforesaid, bounded on the north end and commencing from a point being 23 feet north 29 deg. 54 min. east of the intersection of the centre lines of Victoria and Macpherson streets, and thence south-west for a distance of 303 feet, and being opposite the motor garage property at present occupied by Bongiorno Bros. Pty. Ltd. hereinbefore mentioned.

(c) In the centre of tree plantation situated in Victoria-street south, and commencing at a point at the intersection of the centre line of Victoria-street with a line running 119 deg. 54 min. south-east from the north-east angle of allotment 6, section L, opposite the foundry property at present occupied by E. 7. A vehicle shall not be left standing (whether attended or not) in any street in the Township of Nhill so as to obstruct the free flow of traffic in such street or the free flow of traffic over any intersection or lane, or at or over any footway, vehicular crossing or entrance to any property or park area, or at or over any fire plug.

8. This By-law shall not apply to any vehicle drawing up at a bowser for the service of petrol, oil or air, or to any vehicle actually loading or unloading goods or merchandise, or setting down or picking up passengers, providing that a vehicle whilst actually loading or unloading goods or merchandise, or setting down or picking up passengers, shall not remain in any area in which the same would not otherwise be permitted to be left standing continuously for more than 30 minutes between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

9. Every person leaving a vehicle standing attended or unattended in any street shall (save and except as provided in clause 3 of this By-law) conform to the following regulations:—

Such vehicle shall be draw up, with the left or near side thereof as close as practicable to the curb on the left or near side of the street.

10. Every driver of a motor car or any other vehicle, and the rider of any horse or other animal, and the rider of any motor cycle or bicycle, whilst driving such motor car or riding or driving such horse or other animal, or riding such motor cycle or bicycle along the part of Victoria-street, Nhill aforesaid, between the intersections of Leahy-street and Pine-street aforesaid, and the northern extremity of Victoria-street, and across Nelson-street to the Nhill Post Office, shall observe the following route, that is to say:—He shall keep such motor car or other vehicle, or such horse or other animal, or such motor cycle or bicycle—

(a) Whilst travelling in a north-easterly direction to that portion of the carriage-way which lies in that direction on the near or left-hand side of the bridge situated approximately between Leahy and Pine streets aforesaid, the park band rotunda, park and lawn plantation areas, and the curb alignment; and

(b) Whilst travelling in a south-westerly direction to that portion of the carriage-way which lies in that direction on the near or left-hand side of the park band rotunda, park and lawn plantation areas aforesaid, and the western edge of the bridge aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

By the Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Deputy for the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5366. "An Act relating to a Royal Commission to enquire into and report upon the Origins, Aims, Objects, and Funds, of the Communist Party in Victoria and the Operations and Activities in Victoria of that Party and Members thereof and Organizations and Persons associated therewith."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

REGISTER OF MIDWIVES

for the Year ended 31st December, 1948.

Midwives Act 1928.

NURSES BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Midwives Act, the following copy of the Supplement to the Midwives Register, as at 31st December, 1948, is hereby published.

Sections 14 (a) and 15 (1) (a) indicate that the midwife holds a certificate in midwifery from the Women's Hospital, Melbourne, or such other certificate as is approved by the Board.

Section 14 (b) indicates that the midwife had been in bona fide practice, in Australia or New Zealand, for at least two years prior to December, 1915.

Section 14 (b) (2) indicates that the midwife has been in bona fide midwifery practice, in some part of His Majesty's Dominions, for at least one year prior to December, 1915, and has passed such examinations as the Board requires.

Sections 14 (c) and 15 (1) (c) indicate that the midwife had completed the prescribed course of training and passed the prescribed examination.

Sections 15 and 16 (1) indicate that the midwife has been trained and registered in some part of His Majesty's Dominions in which there is in force an Act for the registration of midwives, or that she is enrolled or certificated by an Institution or Association in existence where the training and examination is, in the opinion of the Board, substantially equivalent to that prescribed under the Midwives Act, Victoria.

Section 16 (2) indicates that the midwife had passed an examination required by the Board or undergone supplementary training.

Section 3, Nurses Registration Act, and section 4, Nurses Acts, indicate that in a locality where a hospital approved by the Nurses Board under the Midwives Act for the training of midwives was not available, a woman, being a registered nurse, had, under the direction of a medical practitioner, attended in childbirth not less than 50 women, and had, in the presence of a medical practitioner, personally conducted not less than (20) twenty cases of childbirth, and had passed the prescribed examination.

APPRENTICESHIP.

5. (a) Youths shall not be engaged in the following occupations except under indentures of apprenticeship for the periods and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed:—

Patternmaking, electrical fitting, engineering fitting and turning, first and second class engineering machining, first-class welding, engineering blacksmithing, jobbing moulding and/or coremaking, sheet metal (first-class bench work) motor mechanic.

(b) In the trades immediately hereinafter mentioned the proportion of apprentices which may be taken by any employer shall be as follows:—

- Mechanical engineering—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Electrical fitting—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Electrical mechanic—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.
- Patternmaking—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Smithing—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Moulding—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.

(c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion, an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

(i) The period of apprenticeship shall be as follows:—

If the apprentice when articulated is under the age of 17 years, five years; if over the age of 17 years, four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

(ii) An employer especially qualified to teach apprentices may, with the consent of the Secretary for Labour, or of the State Apprenticeship Commission, employ a greater proportion of apprentices to tradesmen than hereinbefore specified.

(iii) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and, if apprenticed, such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship.

(iv) Until further order, any contract of apprenticeship hereafter made may contain the following provision:—

If through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by the employer. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer.

This clause shall not apply to apprenticeship controlled by the State Apprenticeship Commission, but such Commission shall be free to adopt such schemes for suspension or cancellation of indentures as it may deem reasonable.

Wages per Week of 40 Hours.

(v) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in addition thereto the constant and war loading specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages at not less than such rates.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

- (vi) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall be the same in each workshop as those of journeymen in the trade the apprentice is learning.
- (vii) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be liable to work overtime unless he so desires.
- (viii) No apprentice shall work under any system of payment by results.
- (ix) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.
- (x) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in the Determination for the trade, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.
- (xi) No employer shall, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device, receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.
- (xii) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.
- (xiii) Apprentices shall be entitled to annual leave and sick leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 10A and 14A of this Determination respectively.

6. WHEREAS by the *Royal Commission (Communist Party) Act 1949* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may issue a commission to, and appoint as sole commissioner, a Judge of The Supreme Court of the State of Victoria to inquire into and report upon the matters specified in the said Act:

And whereas the Governor in Council deems it expedient that a commission shall forthwith issue for the purpose aforesaid:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Royal Commission (Communist Party) Act 1949* and all other powers him thereunto enabling doth by this Order direct that a Royal Commission shall forthwith issue constituting and appointing the Honorable Sir Charles John Lowe, Knight Bachelor, Master of Arts, Bachelor of Laws, to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report upon the following matters, namely:—

The origins aims and objects of the Communist party in Victoria and the activities and operations in Victoria of that party and of members thereof and of organizations and persons associated therewith and, in particular—

(a) whether that party by its constitution or propaganda, or any of its members or any of such organizations or persons by propaganda

or otherwise, advocates or encourages the overthrow by force or violence of established government;

(b) whether the activities or operations of that party or any of its members or any of such organizations or persons are or have been designed to effect or accomplish, or are or have been directed at effecting or accomplishing—

- (i) the overthrow or disruption of representative or democratic institutions;
- (ii) the subversion of law and order;
- (iii) the attainment of social economic industrial or political ends by force violence intimidation or fraudulent practices;
- (iv) the dislocation or disruption of services safeguarding, or essential to the maintenance of, the life health and welfare of the community;
- (v) the dislocation disruption or retardation of industrial production;
- (vi) the indoctrination of children and young people with beliefs or ideas calculated or likely to result in activities and operations of the nature hereinbefore referred to.

And the Honorable W. Watt Leggatt, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, has given the necessary directions herein accordingly.

- (v) knocking out boxes and castings;
- (vi) knocking off runners;
- (vii) returning sand to moulders; and
- (viii) cleaning up.

Leading Hands.

Leading hands in charge of not less than three and not more than ten employees, 9s. per week extra; more than ten and not more than twenty employees, 18s. per week extra; more than twenty employees, 27s. per week, extra.

3.

APPRENTICESHIP

(other than those covered by the Apprenticeship Commission).

Apprenticeship Trades.

(a) An employer shall not employ minors in the following trade or occupation otherwise than under a contract of apprenticeship as hereunder provided:—Moulder and/or coremaker—Jobbing.

Period of Apprenticeship.

(b) If the apprentice when indentured is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen years—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

Contract of Apprenticeship.

(c) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (iii) statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship.
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.

(d) Subject to the approval of the Wages Board, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if, through lack of orders or financial difficulties, an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Wages Board, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provisions of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

Proportion.

(e) The proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall, except as hereinafter prescribed, be one apprentice to every three, or fraction of three, tradesmen in the trade concerned.

The exceptions are: Jobbing moulder and/or coremaker—one apprentice for every two, or fraction of two, tradesmen in the trade concerned.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and, in ascertaining such proportion, an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is for a term not exceeding two years taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

Adult Apprentices.

(f) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his twenty-second birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(g) Minors may be taken on probation for three months and, if apprenticed, such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall, within fourteen days of employing a probationer, notify the appropriate apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

Wages.

(h) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in addition thereto the constant and war loadings specified and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship, and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed, shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

Hours.

(i) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

Overtime and Shift Work.

(j) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires. No apprentice shall except in an emergency work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by any statute, determination or regulation applicable to him.

Payment by Results.

(k) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

Lost Time.

(l) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or on which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent, shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served: Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

Prohibition of Premiums.

(m) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device, receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

Attendance at Technical Schools.

(n) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

Annual and Sick Leave.

(o) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 15 and 16 hereof respectively.

FEMALES AND UNAPPRENTICED MALE JUNIORS.

4. (a) Subject to the exceptions hereinafter provided, the minimum rates of wages for adult and junior females and for unapprenticed male juniors employed in occupations for which apprenticeship is not provided by this Determination shall be the under-mentioned :—

Provided that the rate payable to any employee shall not, excluding the constant loading, be less than 20s.

The total wage shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

A junior employee of eighteen years or more shall be paid 3s. per week in addition to the rates prescribed herein while he is employed as a furnaceman or assistant to a furnaceman.

(b) Except in the case of employees in foundries, the minimum rate payable to a junior female of any age or a junior male of eighteen years or more each with less than six months' experience under this Determination shall, until he or she has had six months' experience, be 10 per cent. less than the amount represented by the percentage of the needs basic wage hereby prescribed for a junior employee of his or her age and in addition thereto the constant loading specified for such an employee :

Provided that this sub-clause shall not operate to reduce the rates paid to any female employee as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1942.

(c) Junior employees employed on the following machines or operations shall be paid at not less than the appropriate adult minimum rates :—

- (i) Assisting steel furnace ladleman, other than in daubing or repairing ladles.
- (ii) Breaking up pig iron.

(d) Junior employees shall not be employed—

if under 18 years as furnacemen or assistants to furnacemen.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 3, and 4, of the said Determination shall remain in force.

(b) An employee who lives in and is under casual engagement to perform any work at any place outside the metropolitan area shall have first class rail or other transport provided by the employer and if required to travel at night shall be provided with a sleeping compartment in the case of rail travel. Should the employer not provide such sleeping compartment the employer shall pay to the employee the sum usually charged to the employer by the railway authorities therefor.

The employer shall provide reasonable accommodation at an hotel or boarding house for any such casual employee who is obliged to remain and lodge overnight at any place other than his usual place of abode and in default thereof shall pay such employee the sum of 12s. 6d.

Should the total time of the outward and return journey of a casual employee travelling to and from employment outside the metropolitan area exceed 24 hours such employee shall be paid one half of the abovementioned rates for each period of 24 hours or part thereof in such excess in addition to the provision of lodging.

(c) Employees engaged by the week while on tour shall be paid their weekly wages from the time the employees leave the place of engagement until they return to that place at the end of the tour, broken weeks at the beginning or end of the tour to be paid for *pro rata*, and the days of departure and return other than Sundays to be each counted as one day worked;

Provided that such employees whilst travelling on ship, if the employer provide passage, including bed and board, shall in respect only of each complete calendar day of such travelling be entitled only to one-twelfth of their weekly wage.

APPRENTICESHIP.

Contract of Apprenticeship.

3. (a) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (iii) a statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship;
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.

(b) Subject to the approval of the Wages Board, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Wages Board, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provision of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

Proportion.

(c) The proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice to every three or fraction of three tradesmen.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

An employer may with the consent of the Wages Board and upon satisfying that authority that he has the plant, equipment and staff necessary for the proper tuition of each apprentice concerned take apprentices in excess of the proportion herein prescribed. Until further order apprentices so taken shall not be counted in future calculations of the proportion of apprentices to journeymen authorized by the Determination.

Period of Apprenticeship.

(d) If the apprentice, when indentured, is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

Adult Apprentices.

(e) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(f) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the appropriate apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

Wages.

(g) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the needs basic wage, and in addition thereto the constant and war loadings specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

The total wages of apprentices and improvers shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

Hours.

(i) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

Overtime and Shift Work.

(j) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.

Payment by Results.

(k) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

Lost Time.

(l) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent, shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served. Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

Prohibition of Premiums.

(m) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

Annual and Sick Leave.

(n) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 13 and 14 hereof respectively.

APPRENTICESHIP.

3. (a) An employer may employ any minor as an apprentice in any work covered by the Determination provided that no minor shall be employed in the trade or occupation of a spinner—1st class otherwise than under a contract of apprenticeship as hereinafter provided.

Period of Apprenticeship.

(b) If the apprentice when indentured is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen years—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

Contract of Apprenticeship.

(c) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice
- (iii) a statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship;
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

Cancellation or Suspension of Indentures.

(d) Subject to the approval of the Wages Board but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if in the opinion of the Wages Board circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provisions of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

Proportion.

(e) An employer shall not employ apprentices in excess of the proportion hereinafter prescribed:—

- (i) In the trade of a spinner—1st class.—One apprentice for every three or fraction of three tradesmen;
- (ii) In all other cases.—Three apprentices and two improvers or two apprentices and three improvers to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 12s. per week.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and, in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years, taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

Adult Apprentices.

(f) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his twenty-second birthday may by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(g) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

Wages.

(h) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage, and in addition thereto the constant and war loadings specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

Hours.

(j) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

Overtime and Shift Work.

(k) No apprentice under the age of eighteen years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires. No apprentice shall except in an emergency work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by any statute, determination, or regulation applicable to him.

Payment by Results.

(l) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

Lost Time.

(m) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or on which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served. Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

Prohibition of Premiums.

(n) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

Attendance at Technical Schools.

(o) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

Annual and Sick Leave.

(p) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 15 and 16 hereof respectively.
