AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality

Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the Regulations was extended to part of the municipality of the Shire of Orbost by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the thirtieth day of June, 1948:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Orbost has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such

extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Buninyong and the Council of the Shire of Korumburra have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the following areas:—

#### SHIRE OF BUNINYONG

(a) The Town of Buninyong, Parish of Buninyong, County of Grant.(b) All that area within the Parish of Ballarat, County

(b) All that area within the Parish of Ballarat, County of Grant. bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 13, section 1; thence southerly to the south-east corner of allotment 14, section 1; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of allotments 14, 10, and 9a, to the south-west corner of allotments 9a, 7a, and 6a, section 1, and easterly along the southern boundary of allotment 6a to a point opposite the north-west corner of allotment 18, section 2; thence across a road to the north-west corner of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotments 18 and 19. secallotment 18, section 2; thence across a road to the northwest corner of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotments 18 and 19, section 2, and continuing southerly to the north-east corner of allotment 12B, section 3; thence southerly bearing 172 deg. 34 min. for a distance of 2,168 links; thence westerly to the watercourse on the Government road; thence southerly by the watercourse to the southern boundary of allotment 6, section 4; thence westerly to the south-west corner of that allotment; thence across the Midland Highway to the southers torner of allotment A1, section 10; thence by the southern boundaries of allotments A1, 7, and 6, to the southernmost corner of allotment 6; thence northwesterly along the western boundaries of allotments 6, 21, 20, and 22, section 10, to the north-west corner of allotment 16H, section 11; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that allotment and across a road to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 16G; thence north-westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment, and north-easterly by the western boundaries of allotments 16G, 16E, 16F, and 16A, section 11, to the northwest corner of the last-named allotment; thence westerly by the Sebastopol-Mt. Clear road to the Yarrowee Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the north-west corner of the Parish of Ballarat; thence easterly by the parish boundary to the point of commencement.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other

than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the first day of September, 1949.

By-Law No. 61.

- A By-lay of the Borough of Maryborough, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 61 for the purpose of—
  - (a) Prohibiting the erection or use on any land within
  - the municipal district of any tents, temporary structures, or buildings for the sale of goods therein and the sale of goods therefrom.

    (b) Prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, &c., as hereinafter described standing or placed on vacant land, or any public place, or land under the care and management of the municipality. of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough do order as follows:—

- 1. The area to which this By-law shall apply is the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Maryborough.
- 2. All previous By-laws and Regulations wherein repugnant to or in conflict with this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 3. No person shall, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the Borough of Maryborough any tent, or other temporary structure, or building, for the sale of goods therein or therefrom, or sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.
- 4. No person shall, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land, or land under the care and management of the municipality of the Borough of Maryborough, or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the Police Offences Act 1928).
- 5. No person, shall, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, and under such terms and conditions as hereinafter provided, sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on any public place or land under the care and management of the municipality of the Borough of Mary-borough. borough.
- 6. The area for stands for street hawkers and itinerant traders is hereby appointed as the east side of the carriage-way of Alma-street adjacent to the kerb, and extending way of Alma-street adjacent to the kerb, and extending from Nolan-street to Inkermann-street. Each such stand shall comprise an area of 18 feet by 9 feet and be numbered consecutively, commencing from Nolan-street. All such stand sites shall be marked on a plan lodged at the Borough Office, Maryborough, and such plan shall be available for inspection thereat during office hours.
- 7. The fee payable for such a licence shall be 30s, per annum, payable in advance, such year to commence from and be inclusive of the date of issue of the licence; but nothing herein contained shall prevent the said Council from revoking or altering at any time, any licence so issued, to use and occupy any such stand for any breach of provisions therein contained, or for any other reason what-soever provided that if any licence is revoked, a pro-rata refund will be made of any fee paid unless such revocation has arisen from a breach of the conditions of the licence or the provisions of this By-law, when such fee shall be forfeited, and further provided that two weeks' notice, in writing, be given of such revocation or alteration.
- 8. All such licences for stands are issued subject to the following conditions and provisions and the licensee shall be so bound:-
  - (a) Times of occupation of such stands shall be such as imes of occupation of such stands shall be such as shopkeepers selling similar goods must observe under the Shops and Factories Act and any Regulation made thereunder, but no person shall use or occupy such stands on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or other day, or portion of any day which may at any time be fixed by Resolution of the Council.
  - (b) At all times keep such stand free from rubbish, paper, fruit stems, skins, or peelings, or any other refuse and likewise that area contiguous to the stand.
  - (c) All licensees must not at any time cause, permit, or suffer any nuisance to exist upon or con-tiguous to his stand.
  - (d) Not to place any box, package, basket, receptacle or other thing except the stall, cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle used by the licensee upon the stand, nor upon the footway or roadway, or any place contiguous to such stand.

- (c) Not to cause, permit, or suffer, any horse or other animal to remain attached to such cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle while occupying the stand, or while not so attached, to remain upon the stand or upon the street or footpath.
  (f) Not at any time to clean fish or suffer fish to be cleaned upon the stand.
  (g) Not to cryo shout the goods or warse or suffer.

- (g) Not to cry or shout the goods or wares, or suffer the goods or wares to be cried or shouted by any other persons at or near or while going to or from the stand.
- (h) Produce the licence for inspection when demanded by any officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force.
- (i) Not to use any flap, shelf, or other device on such stall, cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle where-by the length or width thereof is increased be-yond the measurements set forth in the licence.
- (j) Not to paint or write on such stall, cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle, or display, fix, or carry thereon, or suspend therefrom, any trade or other advertisement or placard, poster, streamer, flag, or sign of any kind whatsoever if the Council objects thereto.
- (k) All conditions of the Health Act or any other Act or Regulation appertaining to the goods or wares sold or displayed to be observed.
- 9. The Council may at any time revoke any such licences if the holder thereof—
  - (a) Is convicted of assault, drunknness or disorder-liness, using obscene or insulting language, brawling or riotous or insulting behaviour, or such like offence.

- (b) Is not cleanly in habit or appearance.
  (c) If in the opinion of the Council the licensee acts in any offensive or discreditable manner in the conduct of his stand.
- (d) Is convicted of any offence under the Health,
  Game, Fruit, or Weights and Measures Act, or
  any other Act or Regulation relating to the sale
  of the particular goods or wares sold from such stand.
- 10. No person shall use or occupy any stand save and except the person to whom a licence to use such stand has been granted, and no transfer of such licence may be made.
- 11. No person shall either personally, or by his nominee, or any other person on his behalf, use or occupy more than one stand.
- 12. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall upon conviction for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five

#### BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH.

#### BY-LAW No. 60.

- A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 60 for regulating traffic and controlling behaviour in streets.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough order as follows:—
  - 1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires-
  - "Council" means the Council of the Borough of Maryborough.

  - borough.

    'Driver' means the person in charge of the vehicle.

    Borough' means the Borough of Maryborough.

    'Motor Car' means any conveyance or machine propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.
  - "Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare or other public place within the prescribed area other than a footway.

- "Vehicle" means any conveyance or machine drawn or propelled by human, animal or mechanical power, and includes a motor car, but does not include a perambulator, go-cart, or invalid's chair. "Commercial passenger vehicle" shall be defined as in section 5, Transport Regulation Act No. 4198.

  2. The parts of all previous By-laws and Regulations where in conflict with this By-law are hereby repealed.

  3. The leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles other than commercial passenger vehicles standing in the following streets or parts thereof is hereby prohibited.

  (a) High-street, west side, from 30 feet to 55 feet from
- - (a) High-street, west side, from 30 feet to 55 feet from intersection, north of Nolan-street.
    (b) High-street, west side, from 30 feet to 55 feet from intersection, north of Inkermann-street.
    (c) Nolan-street, north side, from 30 feet to 80 feet from intersection, west of High-street.
    (d) Tuaggra-street, north side, from 30 feet to 80 feet from intersection, west of High-street.
    (e) Nolan-street, south side, from 30 feet to 100 feet from intersection, east of High-street.

Provided that it shall be lawful for commercial goods vehicles desiring access to cellars at hotels for the delivery of goods thereto to stand in any portion of the areas named in this section for such time as is necessary to deliver such goods if such portion is directly on the opposite side of the footpath to any such cellar.

4. It shall be lawful for commercial passenger vehicles

- stand in those streets or parts thereof as defined in clause 3.
- 5. Any officer of police or authorized officer of the Council may require the owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road to give information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.

  6. No commercial passenger vehicle shall stand in Highstreet between Tuaggra and Inkermann streets, in Nolanstreet between Clarendon and Napier streets, and in Tuaggra-street between Clarendon and Alma streets, other than in the areas defined in clause 3, except that hackney carriages when picking up or putting down fares or when retained by a client on waiting time may park for such period under the same conditions as for unlicensed vehicles.

  An officer of police or officer authorized by the Council may require evidence of a hackney carriage being retained on waiting time by a client.

  Further, no bicycle or motor cycle shall be left parked 5. Any officer of police or authorized officer of the Council

Further, no bicycle or motor cycle shall be left parked within 15 feet of any fixed kerbside petrol pump.

7. Every parked vehicle shall be parallel to the kerb and such that the kerbside wheels are within 2 feet of kerbing if such exists.

8. No cycle shall be left so that any part encroaches onto

8. No cycle shall be left so that any part encroaches onto the roadway more than 18 inches from the roadside edge of the kerb, nor onto the footpath more than 18 inches from the line of verandah posts, nor more than 18 inches from the building line, except that a cycle may encroach onto the roadway such distance as is necessary to park it in any rack which may be provided from time to time. Nothing in this clause shall relieve the "driver" or person in charge of any cycle of any responsibility for accident due to the obstruction of any footway or roadway. 9. The driver of any vehicle upon any street or the rider of any horse upon any street shall, except so far as may be absolutely necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or other justifiable cause—

- or other justifiable cause-

  - (a) Keep as near as practicable to the footway on his near or left-hand side.
    (b) Obey the order of an officer of police or officer authorized by the Council when in charge of or in any way directing the traffic, and if ordered to remove any horse or vehicle from any position shall do so without delay.

shall do so without delay.
