### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5370. "An Act to amend the Soldier Settlement Acts."

No. 5371. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six million and fifty-four thousand nine hundred and twenty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine and One thousand nine hundred and fifty."

No. 5372. "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Agricultural Education."

### CONSTITUTION OF A MEAT AREA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation constitute as a meat area those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Kilmore described hereunder, namely:—

(1) All that piece of land containing the premises of Francis Holman Still, James Alexander Still, and James Oliver Alexander Still, bounded by Foote-street, John-street, Union-street, and Church-street, being part section XXXI. and part section XXXIII. of the Township of Kilmore, in the Parish of Willow Mavin, County of Dalhousie.

(2) All that piece of land being allotments 1 and 2, section 34, Town of Kilmore, Parish of Bylands, County of Dalhousie, being the property of Albert Joseph Boyd and May Lincoln.

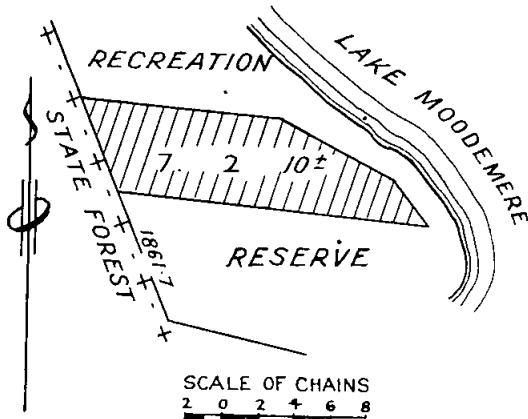

## RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following rules are made, and shall take effect from the first day of June, 1949:—

In Chapter 1 Order XXXI is repealed and the following Order is made:—

## ORDER XXXI.

## DISCOVERY AND INSPECTION.

1. In any action commenced by Writ of Summons any party may once, without leave, and in any other cause or matter may, by leave of a Judge, deliver interrogatories in writing for the examination of any one or more of the opposite parties and such interrogatories when delivered shall have a note at the foot thereof, stating which of such interrogatories each of such persons is required to answer. Further interrogatories may be delivered, by leave of a Judge, on such terms as to costs or otherwise as he may order.

Discovery by interrogations.

1A. A Judge may order that all or any of such interrogatories may be answered by some person on behalf of any party and in such case the answers of such person shall be as effective and binding in all respects as if made by the party interrogated.

1B. Interrogatories which do not relate to any matters in question in the action, cause or matter shall be deemed irrelevant notwithstanding that they might be admissible on the oral examination of a witness.

2. In deciding upon any application for leave to deliver interrogatories the Court or Judge shall take into account any offer which may be made by the party sought to be interrogated, to deliver particulars, or to make admissions, or to produce documents relating to the matter in question and any leave shall be given as to such only of the interrogatories as shall be considered necessary either for disposing fairly of the cause or matter or for saving costs. Instead of giving leave to administer any specified interrogatories the Judge may grant leave generally or limited to a particular subject of inquiry.

Offer to discover to be considered.

3. The costs of interrogatories and answers thereto or of discovery shall, unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order, ultimately be borne by the party requiring the same.

Costs of interrogatories or discovery.

4. Interrogatories shall be in the Form No. 6 in Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require.

Form of interrogatories

5. The affidavit of discovery and the affidavit in answer to interrogatories in the case of a body corporate or a joint stock company, whether incorporated or not, or any other body of persons empowered by law to sue or be sued, whether in its own name or in the name of any officer or other person, shall be made by the secretary or other proper officer of such corporation, company or body. Provided however that any opposite party may apply for an order allowing him to deliver interrogatories to any member or officer of such corporation, company or body, and an order may be made accordingly.

Interrogatories to Corporation or Company.

Objections may  
be taken in  
answer.

6. Any objection to answering any one or more of several interrogatories, on the ground that it or they is or are scandalous or irrelevant or not bona fide for the purpose of the cause or matter or are unreasonable, oppressive or unnecessary, or that the matters inquired into are not sufficiently material at that stage, or on any other ground, may be taken in the affidavit in answer notwithstanding that such interrogatories may have been delivered pursuant to leave.

Answer.

8. Interrogatories shall be answered by affidavit to be filed within ten days of their delivery or within such other time as a Judge may allow.

Form.

9. An affidavit in answer to interrogatories shall be in the Form No. 7 in Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require.

Order for  
further  
Answer.

11. If any person interrogated omits to answer, or answers insufficiently, the party interrogating may apply to the Court or a Judge for an order requiring him to answer, or to answer further (as the case may be). And an order may be made requiring him to answer, or answer further, either by affidavit or by *viva voce* examination, as the Court or a Judge may direct.

Discovery of  
documents.

12. In any action commenced by Writ of Summons any party may serve upon any opposite party a notice for discovery in accordance with the Form 7A in Appendix B. In any other cause or matter any party may, without filing an affidavit, apply to the Court or a Judge for an order directing any other party to make discovery on oath of the documents which are or have been in his possession or power relating to any matter in question therein. On the hearing of such application the Court or Judge may either refuse or adjourn the same if satisfied that such discovery is not necessary, or not necessary at that stage of the cause or matter, or make such order, either generally or limited to certain classes of documents, as may, in its or his discretion, be thought fit.

Affidavit in  
opposition.

13. The party served with a notice or an order for discovery shall, in the affidavit in compliance therewith, specify which, if any, of the documents therein mentioned he objects to produce, and such affidavit shall be in the Form No. 8 Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require.

Neglect to  
make discovery.

13A. If any party neglect or refuse to make discovery within the time limited or shall make insufficient discovery, a Judge may order compliance with such discovery upon such terms as he shall think fit.

Production of  
documents.

14. It shall be lawful for the Court or a Judge at any time during the pendency of any cause or matter to order the production by any party thereto, upon oath, of such of the documents in his possession or power relating to any matter in question in such cause or matter as the Court or Judge shall think right; and the Court or Judge may deal with such documents, when produced in such manner as shall appear just.

Inspection of  
documents.

15. Every party to a cause or matter shall be entitled at any time, by notice in writing, to give notice to any other party, in whose writ, pleading, particulars, or affidavit reference is made to any document, to produce such document for the inspection of the party giving such notice or of his solicitor and to permit him to take copies thereof; and any party not complying with such notice shall not afterwards be at liberty to put any such



document in evidence on his behalf in such cause or matter unless he shall satisfy the Court or a Judge that such document relates only to his own title, he being a defendant to the cause or matter, or that he had some other cause or excuse which the Court or Judge shall deem sufficient for not complying with such notice, in which case the Court or Judge may allow the same to be put in evidence on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court or Judge shall think fit.

16. Notice to any party to produce any documents referred to in his writ, pleading, particulars, or affidavit shall be in the Form No. 9 Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require. Notice to produce.

17. The party to whom such notice is given shall, within two days from the receipt of such notice, if all documents therein referred to have been set forth by him in such affidavit as is mentioned in Rule 13, or if any of the documents referred to in such notice have not been set forth by him in any such affidavit, then within four days from the receipt of such notice delivered to the party giving the same a notice stating a time within three days from the delivery thereof at which the documents, or such of them as he does not object to produce, may be inspected at the office of his solicitor, or, if he appear in person, at some office not more than three miles from the office of the Prothonotary, or, in the case of bankers' books or other books of account, or books in constant use for the purposes of any trade or business at their usual place of custody, and stating which (if any) of the documents he objects to produce, and on what ground. Such notice may be in the Form No. 10 in Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require. Appointment for inspection.

18. If the party served with the notice under Rule 15 omits to give such notice of a time for inspection, or objects to give inspection, or offers inspection elsewhere than at the office of his solicitor, the Judge may, on the application of the party desiring it, make an order for inspection in such place and in such manner as he may think fit. And any Application to inspect documents except such as are referred to in the writ, pleadings, particulars, or affidavit of the party against whom the application is made, or disclosed in his affidavit of documents, shall be founded upon an affidavit showing of what documents inspection is sought, that the party applying is entitled to inspect them, and that they are in the possession or power of the other party. Order for inspection. Application for it.

19. (1) Where inspection of any business books is applied for, the Court or a Judge may, if it or he should think fit, instead of ordering inspection of the original books, order a copy of any entries therein to be furnished and verified by the affidavit of some person who has examined the copy with the original entries, and such affidavit shall state whether or not there are in the original books any and what erasures, interlineations, or alterations. Provided that notwithstanding that such copy has been supplied, the Court or a Judge may order inspection of the books from which the copy was made. Verified copies.

(2) Where on an application for an order for inspection privilege is claimed for any document, it shall be lawful for the Court or a Judge to inspect the document for the purpose of deciding as to the validity of the claim of privilege.

(3) The Court or a Judge may, on the application of any party to a cause or matter at any time, and whether an affidavit of documents shall or shall not have already been ordered or made, make an order requiring any other party to state by affidavit whether any one or more specific documents, to be specified in the application, is or are, or has or have at any time been, in his possession or power, and, if not then in his possession, when he parted with the same, and what has become thereof. Such application shall be made on an affidavit stating that in the belief of the deponent the party against whom the application is made has, or has at some time had, in his possession or power the document or documents specified in the application, and that they relate to the matters in question in the cause or matter, or to some of them.

Question of discovering or inspection may be reserved.

20. If the party from whom discovery of any kind or inspection is sought objects to the same, or any part thereof, the Court or a Judge may, if satisfied that the right to the discovery or inspection sought depends on the determination of any issue or question in dispute in the cause or matter, or that for any other reason it is desirable that any issue or question in dispute in the cause or matter should be determined before deciding upon the right to the discovery or inspection, order that such issue or question be determined first, and reserve the question as to the discovery or inspection.

Attachment on failure to comply with order.

21. If any party fails to comply with an order for interrogatories, or for discovery or inspection of documents, he shall be liable to attachment. He shall also, if he fails to comply with such an order or to answer interrogatories duly delivered for his examination or to comply with a notice for discovery, be liable, if a plaintiff, to have his action dismissed for want of prosecution and, if a defendant, to have his defence (if any) struck out, and to be placed in the same position as if he had not defended; and the party interrogating may apply to the Court or a Judge for an order to that effect, and an order may be made accordingly.

Service on solicitor.

22. Service of an order for interrogatories or discovery or inspection on the Solicitor for the party against whom such order is made shall be sufficient service to found an application for an attachment for disobedience to the order. But the party against whom the application for an attachment is made may show in answer to the application that he has had no notice or knowledge of the order.

Notice to client.

23. A solicitor for any party to whom interrogatories are delivered or upon whom an order for interrogatories, or a notice or order for discovery, or an order for inspection is served, who neglects, without reasonable excuse, to give notice thereof to his client shall be liable to attachment.

One answered part may be used without the rest.

24. Any party may, at the trial of a cause, matter, or issue, use in evidence any one or more of the answers or any part of an answer of the opposite party to interrogatories without putting in the others or the whole of such answer: Provided always that in such case the Judge may look at the whole of the answers, and if he shall be of opinion that any others of them are so connected with those put in that the last-mentioned answers ought not to be used without them he may direct them to be put in.

25. In any action against or by the Sheriff in respect of any matters connected with the execution of his office the Court or a Judge may, on the application of either party, order that the affidavit to be made in answer either to interrogatories or to a notice or an order for discovery shall be made by the officer actually concerned. Action against or by Sheriff.

26. This order shall apply to infant plaintiffs and defendants, and to their next friends and guardians *ad litem*. Order to apply to Infants.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1949, and shall be payable on the 15th day of June, 1949, at the office of the said local governing body, Shire Hall, Werribee.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Council is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Sixteen pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Twenty-one pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Twenty-one pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the "Regulations Relating to Pilots and Pilotage" as follows, that is to say:—

- (1) Commencement and repeal.—These Regulations shall form portion of the "Regulations Relating to Pilots and Pilotage 1931," published in the *Government Gazette* of 11th November, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations), and shall be read and construed therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- (2) For Regulation 122 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—  
122. With the application for an examination for a certificate, the applicant shall lodge with the Secretary to the Board the fee set out in Schedule "E" to these Regulations, and such fee shall be paid into General Revenue.
- (3) For Regulation 123 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—  
123. The master of any vessel having an exemption certificate issued by the Board, and desirous of presenting himself for examination for some port or ports other than those specified upon his certificate shall make application therefor, as hereinbefore prescribed, and lodge with the Secretary to the Board the fee set out in Schedule "E" to these Regulations. If the candidate pass the examination, the necessary endorsements shall be recorded upon his certificate, which must be lodged with the secretary by the candidate with his application.
- (4) 115. In the proviso to Regulation 115 of the principal Regulations, the expression, commencing with the words "and in such circumstances" and ending with the words "the general revenue" shall be repealed.
- (5) To the schedules to the principal Regulations there shall be added:—

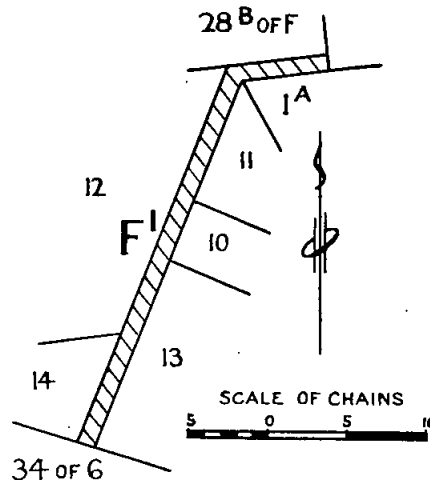

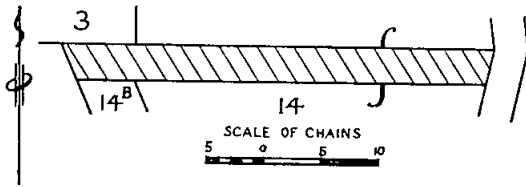

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS Regulations known as the "Police Regulations" were made by the Governor in Council on the fifth day of August, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of August, 1947:

And whereas such Regulations have been amended from time to time:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend as follows the said "Police Regulations" (that is to say):—

1. For clause eight of chapter six there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"8. The stipendiary magistrate nominated by the Governor in Council to act as a member of the Police Discipline Board shall be appointed for a period of three years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment."

2. For clause nine of chapter six there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"9. Should such stipendiary magistrate for any cause whatsoever cease to act as a member of the Police Discipline Board or be unable by reason of absence from duty or incapacity by illness or other temporary cause to carry out his duties as a member of the said Board, the Governor in Council may nominate and appoint another stipendiary magistrate to act as a member of the said Board for the remainder of the term for which the former stipendiary magistrate was appointed to be a member of such Board or during his absence or incapacity (as the case may require)."

3. For clause eleven of chapter six there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"11. Should such superintendent for any cause whatsoever cease to act as a member of the Police Discipline Board or be unable by reason of absence from duty or incapacity by illness or other temporary cause to carry out his duties as a member of the said Board, the Chief Commissioner may nominate and the Governor in Council may appoint another superintendent to act as a member of the said Board for the remainder of the term for which the former superintendent was appointed to be a member of such Board or during his absence or incapacity (as the case may require). Where a member of the Force who is stationed in a district under the control of the superintendent who is a member of the Police Discipline Board is charged with a breach of duty or act of misconduct which is dealt with by the said Board, the Chief Commissioner shall nominate and the Governor in Council may appoint some other superintendent to act on the said Board in place of the first-mentioned superintendent for the purpose of hearing such charge."

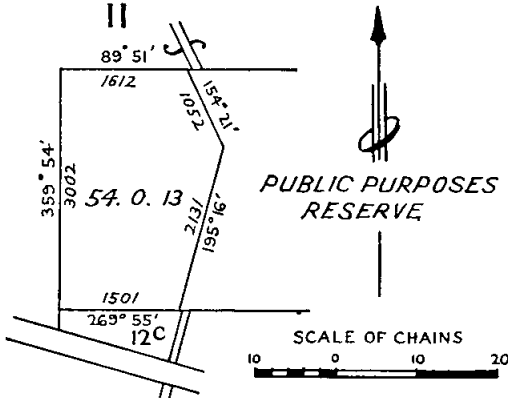

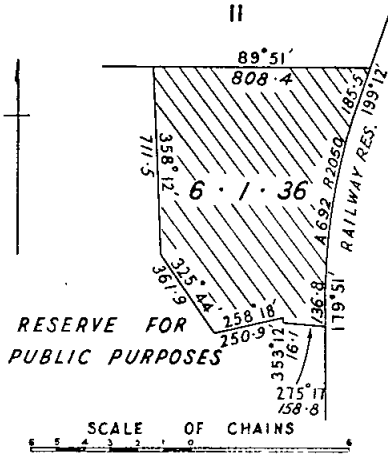

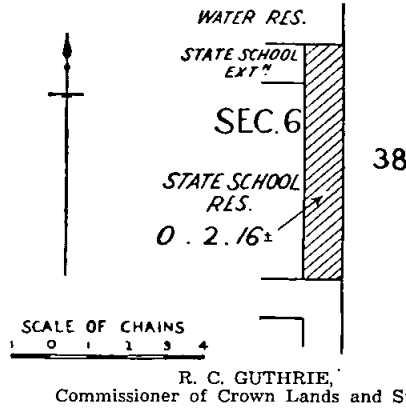

#### BY-LAW No. 366.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 366, for fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the chilling chambers at the South Melbourne Abattoirs.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

1. The chilling chambers at the abattoirs shall be opened and closed daily, except Saturdays, Sundays, and proclaimed public holidays, at such times as the Superintendent shall direct and at no other times, and all persons doing business at the abattoirs in connexion with the chilling chambers shall conform to the directions of the Superintendent or duly authorized officer of the Council on duty at the chilling chambers at the time.

2. Every person who shall pay the fees or dues hereinafter referred to shall be entitled to use such portion of the chilling chambers at the abattoirs as are assigned to him by the Superintendent, and such portion of the chilling chambers shall only be used over the period and for the purpose for which it was assigned.

3. The following fees or dues shall be payable to the Council for the use of the chilling chambers or portion thereof at the abattoirs:—

(a) For every—	s. d.
(i) Carcass of any bull, sow, heifer, ox, or steer .. .. .	4 0
(ii) Sheep or lamb .. .. .	0 4
(iii) Calf of a weight over 100 lb. and not exceeding 300 lb. .. .. .	2 6
(iv) Calf of a weight not exceeding 100 lb. .. .. .	0 6
(v) Swine .. .. .	0 9

4. No person shall leave or keep any carcasses of animals slaughtered at the abattoirs in the chilling chambers thereat for a longer period than 72 hours.

5. In the event of a person leaving or keeping the carcasses of any animals slaughtered at the abattoirs in the chilling chambers for any period longer than 72 hours, the fees or dues referred to in clause 3 of this By-law shall be payable for the second or any subsequent period of 72 hours or part thereof.

6. In the event of a person leaving or keeping the carcasses of any animals slaughtered at the abattoirs in the chilling chambers for any period longer than 72 hours, or for any second or subsequent period of 72 hours, or part thereof, failing to remove such carcasses from the chilling chambers within 24 hours of notice by the Superintendent so to do, the Superintendent or employees under his direction may remove such carcasses from the chilling chambers and place the same in one of the other buildings at the abattoirs.

7. The Council shall have a lien on all carcasses of animals for the time being in the chilling chambers or having been removed therefrom to one of the other buildings at the abattoirs of any person indebted to the Council, and if any person after demand shall make default for seven days in payment of any of the fees or dues herein prescribed the Council may, by its Superintendent or other authorized officers, and without further notice, sell by public auction or private contract all or any of such carcasses, and after deducting the fees or dues payable to the Council pay the surplus thereof to the owner of such carcasses.

8. The Council will take no responsibility for bontaint or for any other condition which may occur in carcass meat in the chilling chambers not arising from the neglect or default of any of its employees.

9. The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses while in the chilling chambers, but will not be responsible for any loss thereof or damage thereto.

10. No unauthorized persons shall interfere with the machinery or plant provided for the operation of the chilling chambers at the abattoirs.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes "motor car."

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

4. The driver of any vehicle or motor car shall, except as far as may be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or other justifiable cause—

- (a) when proceeding in a northerly direction in Cumming-avenue drive his vehicle on the west side of the central plantations,
- (b) when proceeding in a southerly direction in Cumming-avenue drive his vehicle on the east side of the central plantations,
- (c) when overtaking any vehicle pass to the right hand of that vehicle.

5. Any driver of a motor car who shall cause the same to become stationary in Cumming-avenue shall stop such motor car at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb line with the near front wheel within 10 inches of the edge of the gutter or channel.

Provided that the driver of any motor car with a trailer attached thereto shall cause such motor car to become stationary with all near side wheels within 10 inches of the gutter or channel.

Provided further that the driver of any motor car may stop such motor car at an angle of 90 degrees to the kerb line on any unfenced section of the central plantations that is not a continuation of any side street.

6. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing sections of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

## BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 27, authorizing the placing on roads, in situations approved by the municipal engineer (subject, in the case of State Highways, main roads, and tourist roads, to the further approval of the Country Roads Board), of stands or platforms for milk and cream cans, and prescribing the nature and size, and regulating the use of such stands and platforms.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra order as follows:—

## 1. In the interpretation of this By-law—

"Council" means Council of the Shire of Korumburra.  
"Person" includes corporation, and

"Road" means any street or road within the municipal district of the Shire of Korumburra.

Words importing the singular shall be deemed to include the plural.

2. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the Council may, by its engineer or other authorized officer, authorize any person to place upon any road a stand or platform for milk and cream cans.

3. Every such stand or platform shall conform in nature and size to the following requirements:—

*Nature of Construction.*

(a) Any stand or platform placed on a road, in pursuance of this By-law, shall be soundly and neatly constructed and finished in a proper and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer. The external surfaces of the end walls and outer faces of all posts of every such stand or platform shall be painted white, and such external surfaces shall be kept painted white.

Drains shall be constructed around or under the stands in such positions as shall be directed by the Shire Engineer. Such drains shall be maintained in a clean and serviceable condition to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer or any deputy appointed by him to give directions on this matter.

*Size of Stands and Platforms.*

(a) The maximum width of any stand or platform, measured in a direction at right angles to the direction of adjacent road formation, shall not exceed 5 feet.

(b) The maximum length of any stand or platform, measured in a direction parallel to the direction of the adjacent road formation, shall not exceed 18 feet.

(c) The height of the floor of any unroofed platform shall not be less than 2 feet nor more than 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the adjacent ground.

(d) No part of any roofed stand shall be at a height greater than 7 feet above the level of the adjacent ground.

4. Any person desiring to place such stand or platform upon a road shall first make application to the Council, in the form contained in the Schedule hereto, for written permission (hereinafter called a "permit") so to do, and shall obtain such permit.

5. No person shall place or erect or commence to place or erect or cause to be placed or erected or cause to be commenced the placing or erection of any such stand or platform on any road without having first made application to the Council in the form contained in the Schedule hereto for a permit so to do.

6. No person shall place or erect or commence to place or erect or cause to be placed or erected or cause to be commenced the placing or erection of any such stand or platform on any road without having first obtained a permit so to do.

7. On receipt of such application the Council shall refer the same to its engineer, and if satisfied that the proposed stand or platform conforms to the specifications hereinbefore contained, the Council, by its authorized officer, shall issue a permit authorizing the placing of the same upon the road, in a situation approved by the engineer, provided, however, that if such road shall be a State highway, main road, tourist road, such authority shall be subject to the further approval of the Country Roads Board.

8. No person to whom a permit has been issued as aforesaid to place a stand or platform upon a road shall erect the same otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permit and the provisions of this By-law.

9. No person shall use or cause to be used any stand or platform placed upon a road, in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law for any purpose other than that of holding, loading, or unloading of milk and/or cream cans.

10. Any person who erects or causes to be erected a stand or platform, in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stands or platform is currently used or maintained shall at all times maintain such stand or platform in a proper state of repair, both as to construction and painting, and the Council may at any time give written notice to such person requiring him to effect such repairs as may be deemed necessary by the Councils engineer or other authorized officer.

11. The Council may at any time revoke a permit by giving written notice of revocation to the person to whom the permit for the erection of such stand or platform was issued or to the person by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained.

12. Any person who, having erected a stand or platform in pursuance of a permit issued under the provisions of this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained, fails to comply with the terms of any notice served on him under the foregoing provisions, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person who shall wilfully offend against or commit any breach of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

When an employee is working in water to a depth of 2 inches or more, he shall, in addition to the ordinary rate of pay, receive 1s. 6d. extra per day or portion of a day whilst he is so employed.

The wages rates herein prescribed for a "Feeder of a stone crushing machine" and a "Dust hole man" were determined after due consideration had been given to the dirty and dusty conditions of the work.

Such piecework prices shall be adjusted from time to time to conform as far as practicable, and to the nearest farthing, with the wage rate adjustments as set out in clauses 16 and 17, and the following method shall be used for the purpose of such adjustments:—

The piecework prices for the respective classifications shall each be multiplied by the number of shillings (and fraction of a shilling, if any) in the appropriate weekly wage rate as adjusted, and the resultant amount divided by the number of shillings (and fraction of a shilling, if any) in the appropriate weekly wage rate shown in the Determination of the Board which came into operation as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the 1st December, 1947.

The Board has also determined that where any person employed on tonnage rates set out in such Schedule fails to earn during any day on which he is so employed an amount equal to one-fifth of the prescribed weekly rate he shall be paid for such day not less than one-fifth of the prescribed weekly rate. Provided that if such employees elects to work for a shorter period than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary day's work he shall be paid a sum proportionate to the time worked.

The proportion of juniors employed shall not exceed two to each employee receiving not less than the minimum adult rate. In determining the proportion of juniors to employees receiving the adult rate each shift shall be taken into account separately.

Provided that, in the full-fashioned department of the knitting section, the proportion of females shall be one junior female to each female receiving the adult wage, and the proportion of males shall be two junior males to each three males receiving the adult wage.

Provided also that, in computing the proportion of juniors in the full-fashioned department of the knitting section, employees in the silk throwing department shall not be counted, and the count for the remainder of the full-fashioned department shall be taken over all the shifts.

The Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship indenture.

(b) Changes in rates to be effective from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the attainment of the prescribed age.

(c) A junior female, after four years' experience in the industry shall be paid the rates prescribed for an adult female in the classification in which she is employed.

Maintenance work includes operations in areas used for sewage disposal on carriers used for the conveyance of sewage, and on drains used for the conveyance of effluent.

(b) An employee engaged on continuous shift work shall, in addition to the appropriate rate fixed above, be paid a loading at the rate of 10s. per week. Provided that for shift work done on a Saturday he shall be paid at the rate of time and one half of the appropriate rate fixed above.

(c) (i) Where an employee in any of the above classifications is required to do work of an unusually offensive nature in grass filtration or pasture areas, entering or cleaning out sewage distribution or effluent channels or digestion tanks or septic tanks, he shall be paid a disability rate of 10s. per week or 2s. per day in lieu of the disability rate for his classification as prescribed in clause 16 with a minimum of two hours on any one day. The decision as to what constitutes work of an unusually offensive nature shall be made by the Resident Engineer, if necessary after consultation with an employee member of the Wages Board on the job.

(ii) Where an employee in any of the above classifications is required to enter and manually remove sludge from sedimentation tanks, or syphons, he shall be paid a disability rate of 25s. per week or 5s. per day in lieu of the disability rate for his classification as prescribed in clause 16.

NOTE.—The Wages Board has determined in accordance with section 25 (1) of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, that the trade is so unskilled that no person should be taken as an apprentice in the trade.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
