PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 65.

SCRAP LEAD.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act* 1948, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 65.

Part Revocation.

2. Insofar as it relates to sales of lead in Victoria, Prices Regulation Order No. 3253 made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 "Battery" means a scrap lead-acid type electric storage battery;
 "Scrap Lead" means scrap lead other than pig lead and includes
 a battery or parts thereof.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price, inclusive of delivery to the purchaser's premises, at which scrap lead may be sold by any person to be the price specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which scrap lead specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

THE SCHEDULE.

Class or Kind of Scrap Lead.

First grade scrap battery lead, that is to say, complete battery groups, viz., lead plates, posts, straps, and wooden or rubber separators, but free of all casing and covers . . .

Second grade scrap battery lead, that is to say, lead plates only without separators and free of all casing and covers

AERATED WATERS, MINERAL WATERS, MILK DRINKS, FRUIT DRINKS .-RETAIL .- SOUTH WESTERN AREA.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Act 1948, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner for the State of Victoria, hereby make the following Order:--

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 66.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 29 is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. This Order shall not apply to sales (not being sales by the bottle) made by a licensed victualler.

Definitions.

- 4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "South Western Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in:-

The City of Warrnambool.

The Towns of Ararat and Hamilton.

The Boroughs of-

Portland.

Warrnambool.

"Town of Manufacture" means-

- (a) where the manufacturer is named in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto—the town specified in the second column of the said Schedule;
- (b) where the manufacturer is not named in the Second Schedule-
 - (i) if the goods are produced in Victoria-the actual town of manufacture;
 - (ii) if the goods are produced outside Victoriathe town in Victoria nearest to the place of manufacture.

- "Fruit Drink" means any drink made from fruit juice, cordial, extract, or syrup with the addition of water, soda water, or other aerated water and with or without the addition of any other ingredient.
- "Pure Fruit Drink" means any drink made from fruit juice with the addition of water, soda water, or other aerated water and with or without the addition of any other ingredient.
- "Ice Cream Soda" means any drink made from fruit juice, cordial, extract, or syrup with the addition of aerated water and a minimum of one serve of ice cream.
- "Milk Drink" means any drink of which milk is the sole or principal ingredient.
- "Oz." means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be.

Bottled Aerated Waters, Aerated Fruit Drinks, and Mineral Waters.—Sales by the Bottle.

5. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which any bottled aerated waters, aerated fruit drinks, or mineral waters, described in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold in all those portions of the South Western Area comprised within a radius of 30 miles from the principal post office of each of the following cities, towns, or townships:—

Warrnambool, Hamilton, Port Fairy, Portland, Casterton,

to be the price set out in the second column of the said Schedule.

- (2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which any bottled aerated waters, aerated fruit drinks, or mineral waters manufactured by the persons set out in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order and described in the third column thereto may be sold in the South Western Area, other than in those areas provided for in clause (1) of this paragraph to be—
 - (a) in all that area comprised within a radius of 30 miles from the principal post office of the town of manufacture, the price set out in the fourth column of such Schedule; and
 - (b) in all areas outside a radius of thirty miles from the principal post office of the town of manufacture, the price set out in the fifth column of such Schedule.

Sales other than by the Bottle.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the items specified in the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold other than by the bottle to be—
 - (a) where delivery is accepted at the counter, bar, or selfservice table on the premises of the vendor, the price set out in the second column of the said Schedule;
 - (b) where the items specified are served at tables or in foyer bars situated within a theatre or public hall, the price set out in the third column of the said Schedule.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any aerated waters, aerated fruit drinks, mineral waters, fruit drinks, or milk drinks specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Price List.

8. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any goods, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in the form of a price list and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those goods, such notice to show separately the deposit charge (if any) for any container included in the selling price so exhibited.

IMPORTED BATHS.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act* 1948, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 67.

Definition.

- 2. In this Order unless the contrary appears-
- "Imported baths" means pressed steel porcelain enamelled baths. other than of Australian origin, complete with plug and washer, and not less than 5 ft. 6 in. in length;
- "Melbourne metropolitan area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Wholesale.

- 3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which imported baths may be sold by wholesale to be $-\!\!\!\!-$
 - (a) in respect of sales for delivery in the Melbourne metropolitan area—£16 11s. 6d. each;
 - (b) in respect of sales outside the Melbourne metropolitan area—£16 11s. 6d. each, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of those baths to the wholesaler's place of business.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Retail.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which imported baths may be sold by retail to be— $\,$
 - (a) in respect of sales for delivery in the Melbourne metropolitan area—£18 9s. each;
 - (b) in respect of sales outside the Melbourne metropolitan area—£18 9s. each, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of those baths from the Melbourne metropolitan area to the retailer's place of business.

Application for Maximum Prices.

5. Any person who imports any baths for which a maximum price is not fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall not sell those baths unless and until that person has made a written request to the Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which those baths may be sold, and the Commissioner has fixed the maximum prices accordingly.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

- 6. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order. I declare the maximum price at which imported baths specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
- (2) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person of any imported bath than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

EMERGENCY POWERS TO HAVE EFFECT.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Gas Regulation Act
1933 it is amongst other things enacted that whenever it appears to the Governor in Council that from any
cause the available supply of gas is or is likely to become
less than is sufficient for the reasonable requirements of
the community, the Governor in Council may from time
to time exercise all or any of the powers conferred on to time exercise all or any of the powers conferred on him by or under the said section and may from time to time by Proclamation declare that on and after the date of the publication of such Proclamation or a later date specified therein the provisions of section 33 of the said Act shall have effect. Act shall have effect:

Act shall have effect:

And whereas there exists in Victoria an acute shortage of coal for the making of gas:

And whereas as a consequence of such cause it appears to the Governor in Council that the available supply of gas is less than is sufficient for the reasonable requirements of the community:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 33 of the said Act do by this my Proclamation declare that on and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the Government Guzette the provisions of section 33 of the Gas Regulation Act 1933 shall have effect.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-first day of June, 1949, 'His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, declared that on and after the date of the publication in the Government Gazette of such Proclamation the provisions of section 33 of the Gas Regulation Act 1933 should have effect: And whereas the said Proclamation was published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-first day of June, 1949: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 33 of the said Act, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Gas

- the following Regulation (that is to say):—

 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Gas Regulation (Emergency Powers) Regulations (No. 65)", and shall apply to and have operation throughout the areas supplied with gas by the Metropolitan Gas Company (including its Heidelberg works), the Colonial Gas Association Limited (as to its Box Hill, Footscray, Frankston, and Oakleigh works), the Brighton Gas Company Limited, the Mordialloc City Council Gas Works, the Ballaarat Gas Company, the Bendigo Gas Company, the Geelong Gas Company, the Warrnambool City Council Gas Works, and the Gas Supply Company Limited (in respect of the Colac and Sale portions of its undertaking). taking).
- (2) These Regulations shall take effect on the twenty-first day of June, 1949.
 - 2. In these Regulations-
 - "Gas" means gas supplied by a Gas Undertaker pursuant to the provisions of the Gas Regulation Act 1933.
 - 'Gas Undertaker" shall have the same meaning as "Undertaker" as defined by the Gas Regulation Act 1933.

3. No person shall use gas for any purpose whatsoever on any day in any week, except between the hours herein-after specified in respect of such day (that is to say):—

Mondays to Fridays---

- (i) 6.30 a.m. and 7.30 a.m.
- (ii) 12 noon and 1 p.m. (iii) 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

Saturdays-

- (i) 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.
- (ii) 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. (iii) 6 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Sundays-

- (i) 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 a.m.
- (ii) 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. (iii) 6 p.m. and 7 p.m.
- 4. The restrictions contained in Regulation 3 hereof shall not apply to persons using gas in connexion with the conduct of hospitals, medical and dental services, rest homes, day nurseries, clinics, baby health centres or public charities, institutions caring for the aged or sick, or to persons using gas for pilot lights, or by-pass flames on automatic appliances on automatic appliances.
- 5. During the operation of these Regulations and not-withstanding anything contained in the Gas Regulation Act 1933, one testing of gas on any day at any testing place shall be deemed to be a complete testing of the calorific value of the gas supplied at the testing place on that day.
- 6. It shall be lawful for any inspector or other person, upon producing an authority issued to him by a Gas Undertaker referred to in Regulation 1 hereof, to enter any premises to which gas is supplied by such Gas Undertaker for the purpose of determining whether the provisions of these Regulations are being observed.
- 7. No person shall obstruct any such inspector or other person in the course of his duties.
- 8. Any person who offends against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds (£50), and in the case of a continuing offence a further penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) for each day on which any offence is continued after conviction or order of any court

And the Honorable William Watt Leggatt, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

(b) Proportion (in any Factory or Place).

Males.

One apprentice or improver to every two or fraction of two journeymen.

Females.

Three female apprentices or improvers to every journeywoman.

All apprentices shall be indentured in accordance with the prescribed form of indenture, provided that a minor may serve an employer as a probationer for a period not exceeding three months. During the said three months he or she shall be paid at least the minimum rates prescribed by this Determination for the first six months of apprenticeship. If the probationer becomes indentured, his or her indentures shall be taken to have commenced from the commencement of the period of probation.

In the event of the employer to whom an apprentice is bound ceasing to carry on business, such apprentice may be bound to another employer for the remainder of the term to be served; provided that if such apprentice be over the age of eighteen years at the time of the original employer ceasibh to carry on business, such person may complete the time to be served as an improver.
