Female workers employed in laberatories shall be paid 4s. 3d. per week in addition to their ordinary wage. Persons employed clearing or cleaning horizontal drying boxes shall be paid 5s. per week for mid-clearance, or 3s. per week for morning clearance, in addition to their ordinary weekly wage.

Persons operating more than two vacuum pans shall be paid 4s. per pan extra.

Washers of vacuum pans, vacuum holding vats, or evaporators shall be allowed 3d. for each flying clean or 9d. for each full clean in addition to the ordinary weekly wage for the employee concerned.
