PART III.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE ONLY TO PERSONS EMPLOYED IN BOND OR FREE STORES OR ESTABLISHMENTS ENGAGED IN THE GENERAL BULK STORAGE BUSINESS.

CASUAL WORK.

24. Casual employees, i.e., persons employed in Bond or Free Stores or Establishments engaged in the general bulk storage business for less than four weeks, shall be paid at the rate of 4s. 5 del per hour, and such employees shall be guaranteed not less than two hours' work at every start.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 3, 4 (a), 4 (b), 4 (c), and 4 (d) of Part I., and clause 24 of Part III., of the said Determination shall remain in force.
