Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—


North West Mallee Settlement Areas Act 1948.

NORTH WEST MALLEE SETTLEMENT AREA.—ANNUELLO-KOOLONONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI., intituled the *North West Mallee Settlement Areas Act 1948*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any area of land in the North West Mallee to be a North West Mallee Settlement Area for the purposes of the aforesaid Act: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that the areas in the Counties of Karkaroc and Tatchera, as indicated by hachure on plan hereunder, be a North West Mallee Settlement Area, to be known as the Annuello-Kooloonong Settlement Area,

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Braybrook has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Braybrook aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

All that piece of land, commencing at the south-west corner of Summerhill and Ballarat roads; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Ballarat-road 288 deg. 47 min. for a distance of 28 ft. 8 in.; thence south-easterly by the arc of a circle of 40 ft. 2½ in. radius, and whose centre lies southerly, a distance of 49 ft. 9½ in.; thence northerly along the western boundary of Summerhill-road 28 ft. 8 in. to the commencing point, and being in Crown portion 16, Parish of Cut-paw-paw, County of Bourke.

PART IV.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

Sick Leave.

Sub-regulations (4) and (5) of Regulation 40 shall be revoked and the following Sub-regulations inserted in lieu thereof:—

(4) If any officer (or any employee in a State sanatorium) is certified by the Government Medical Officer to be suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis and to be probably curable, leave of absence may be granted on the following terms, viz., six months on full pay and three months on half pay; provided that such pay may be made conditional on the officer undergoing treatment in an approved sanatorium when so recommended by the Government Medical Officer. Any leave so granted in excess of the amount standing to his credit shall not be regarded as a debit against such officer or employee. On his resumption of duty, such officer or employee shall be entitled to a total initial credit of not less than sixteen days on full pay and sixteen days on half pay.

Leave of absence under this sub-regulation shall not be granted to any officer or employee who is certified by the Government Medical Officer as having suffered from pulmonary tuberculosis prior to being accepted for employment in the Public Service.

(5) If any officer or employee in a State sanatorium is certified by the Government Medical Officer to be a case of clinically suspected tubercular infection, such officer or employee may be granted leave of absence on full pay for a period not exceeding thirteen weeks, provided that such pay may be made conditional on the officer or employee undergoing treatment in an approved sanatorium when so recommended by the Government Medical Officer. Any leave so granted in excess of the amount standing to his credit shall not be regarded as a debit against such officer or employee.

For the purposes of this sub-regulation "Government Medical Officer" shall include—

- (a) Director of Tuberculosis or his deputy.
- (b) Clinical Tuberculosis Officer.
- (c) Medical Superintendents of Sanatoria.

Leave of absence under this sub-regulation shall not be granted to any officer or employee who is certified by the Government Medical Officer as having suffered from pulmonary tuberculosis prior to being accepted for employment in the Public Service.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend Town and Country Planning Regulations No. 1, approved by the Governor in Council on the 25th day of June, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 121, dated 3rd July, 1946, and No. 132, dated 17th July, 1946, in the manner following (that is to say):—

1. Clause 8 is hereby rescinded, and the following clause inserted in lieu thereof:—

8. After the commencement of the preparation of any planning scheme, the responsible authority may, for the purpose of regulating the development of any land within the area of the proposed planning scheme, issue an Interim Development Order pursuant to section 12 of the Act. A specimen form of an Interim Development Order which may be used is set out in Appendix "A." The Order, in triplicate, shall be sealed and forwarded to the Board. The responsible authority shall, after approval thereof by the Governor in Council, publish a copy of every Interim Development Order in the *Government Gazette* and in two newspapers, one of which shall be a daily newspaper circulating generally throughout Victoria, and one of which shall be a newspaper circulating in the neighbourhood to which the Order relates, and the Interim Development Order shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Sub-clause (ii) of clause 10 is hereby rescinded, and the following sub-clause inserted in lieu thereof:—

(ii) The responsible authority shall forthwith cause to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and twice in some newspaper generally circulating in the area included in the planning scheme, a notice as set out in Form 3. This notice shall describe shortly the purport of the scheme; shall state where the relevant documents can be seen free of charge; shall call upon all persons affected, who may have any objections to the scheme, to set forth their objections in writing to the responsible authority, addressed to the Municipal Clerk, the Secretary of the Committee, or the Secretary of the Board, as the case may be, within three (3) months or, in the case of a planning scheme which makes provision only for the matters referred to in item 3 of the Schedule to the principal Act, one (1) month of the publication of the notice in the *Government Gazette*, and shall state that the responsible authority will consider any objections to the scheme at its next ordinary meeting after the expiration of the said period.

3. Clause 11 is hereby rescinded, and the following clause inserted in lieu thereof:—

11. The responsible authority, at its first ordinary meeting held after the expiration of the three (3) months or, in the case of a planning scheme which makes provision only for the matters referred to in item 3 of the Schedule to the principal Act, one (1) month from the date of the publication of the said notice in the *Government Gazette*, shall proceed to consider and deal with all objections made by or on behalf of any persons affected by the planning scheme.



CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 144.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under Part VII, Divisions 1 and 7, of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 144, for requiring that all verandahs erected in front of any house or building abutting on any public footway in any streets in the City shall be of cantilever form, and requiring the pulling down and removal, before a date specified in this By-law, of all verandahs which are supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 94 made by the Council of the City of Richmond on the 30th day of June, 1924, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of September, 1924, and Regulation No. 18 of the City of Richmond made on the 24th day of March, 1890, are hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "verandah" shall be construed as having the meaning contained in the definition of "verandah" in the Uniform Building Regulations.

"Sun Blinds" shall be construed as having the meaning contained in the definitions of "Sun Blind" in the Uniform Building Regulations.

"City" means the City of Richmond.

"Council" means the Council of the City.

"Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor of the City.

3. From and after the 31st day of December, 1949, no verandah shall be erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street within the City, or part thereof, or over or across such footway unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise.

4. No verandah shall be constructed over the footway of any street unless a permit for such construction has been obtained from the Council.

5. Applications for permission to construct a verandah shall be made by or on behalf of the owner of the building to which the verandah is to be attached, and be in writing in the form of the Third Schedule to the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria in force at the time of the making of such application, with such modifications or alterations to such form as are suitable to meet the case, and there shall be deposited with the application a plan and specification of the verandah proposed to be erected.

6. If the application is approved of by the Council, permission to erect a verandah may be obtained on payment of fee prescribed by the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria in force at the time of making such application.

7. Every verandah, a permit for the construction of which is given by the Council, shall be constructed in absolute conformity with the provisions of the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria relating to the construction of street verandahs.

8. If at any time the width of any footpath is altered or if the Surveyor certifies, in writing, to the Council that any verandah renders dangerous or less commodious the passage along any footway or street, the Council may by order direct that within such time as it thinks reasonable any verandah (whether erected before or after the passing of this By-law without violation of any By-law for the time being lawfully in force) on or over the footway be removed, or be altered, or re-built in such a way as the Council thinks necessary, and if within the time specified in the said order, the owner or occupier of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed does not remove, or does not alter, or re-build the verandah in the way prescribed by the order, the Council may, after giving not less than seven days' notice to the owner or occupier of the building against or in front of which such verandah may be, of its intention so to do, cause the verandah to be removed, altered, or re-built, and in such case shall make reasonable compensation to the owner of such building in the manner provided by clause 6 of the Fifteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act* 1946, or any amendment thereof in force for the time being. Provided always that this clause shall not be construed so as to affect the operation of the provisions of clause 5 of the said Fifteenth Schedule in respect of any verandah erected at any time (whether before or after the coming into force of this By-law) contrary to any By-law lawfully in force at the time of such erection.

9. If the Surveyor certifies, in writing, to the Council that any verandah whether erected before or after the passing of this By-law is in such a state of disrepair as

to be objectionable or dangerous to the public, the Council, notwithstanding that such verandah was erected in accordance with the By-laws for the time being in force, may by order direct that the verandah be removed, or be altered or re-built in such way as it thinks necessary and within such time as it thinks reasonable, and if within the time specified in the said order the owner or occupier for the time being of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed does not remove, or does not alter, or re-build the said verandah in the way prescribed by the order, the Council may, at the cost and expense of such owner or occupier, cause the verandah to be removed, altered, or re-built, and in addition to such cost the owner or occupier shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which such default continues, but not exceeding in all the sum of Twenty pounds.

10. Service of the order to be made under clause 8 hereof and of the order to be made under clause 9 hereof may be made on the owner or occupier personally, or by leaving a copy with some person apparently engaged in the altering or re-building of the verandah, or by affixing a copy on some conspicuous part of the front of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed.

11. No person shall climb any verandah post or shall sit or be upon any verandah except for the purpose of cleaning, renovating, or repairing the same. Any person who offends against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings.

12. No sun blind shall be constructed to project over any street within the City except with the approval of the Council, and every sun blind, for the erection of which approval is given by the Council shall be constructed in conformity with the Uniform Building Regulations applicable to sun blinds.

13. The owner of any verandah erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway of any street in the City, which verandah is upon, over, or across such footway and is supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, shall pull down and remove such verandah before the 31st day of December, 1959.

14. If any verandah (other than a verandah supported by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports) in existence, which was erected before the coming into operation of this By-law—

- (a) is destroyed or demolished, or is pulled down or damaged to the extent (in the opinion of the Surveyor) of more than one-half of its value, such verandah shall not be restored, reconstructed or repaired, and shall not be replaced by a verandah other than a verandah supported by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports,
- (b) is pulled down or damaged to the extent (in the opinion of the Surveyor) of not more than one-half of its value, such verandah may be restored, reconstructed or repaired with the same type of materials as were used in the original construction thereof, provided that the written consent of the Surveyor has been previously obtained, and that such restoration, reconstruction or repair is carried out in accordance with the plan and specification adopted by the Council before the coming into operation of this By-law, but nothing in this sub-clause shall be construed so as to relieve the owner of any such verandah from complying with the requirements of clause 13 of this By-law.

15. Any person committing any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for a first offence, and to such further penalties as are prescribed by the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria for an offence against such Regulations.

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

BY-LAW No. 66.

A By-law of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, made under the *Local Government Act 1946* and the Health Acts, and numbered 66, for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of animals in the opinion of the Council offensive or injurious to health, for suppressing nuisances, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the Health Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully.

2. In this By-law the word "dog" shall mean a dog of either sex over the age of three months.

3. No person shall keep or cause to permit to be kept on any premises more than two (2) dogs, provided that the Council may from time to time, for such period of time as it may think fit, consent, in writing, to the keeping of more than two (2) dogs in any premises where, in the opinion of the Council, facilities for the keeping of more than two (2) dogs exist, and when such keeping shall not be likely to be a nuisance or offensive or injurious to health.

4. The occupier of any premises on which any dog is kept or housed shall cause the place where it is so kept or housed to be thoroughly cleansed as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place clean and wholesome, and in a sanitary state and condition.

5. No person shall cause or permit a dog to be confined within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling house.
