PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Gisborne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street

hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Gisborne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

All that piece of land being part of W. J. T. Clarke's special survey in the Parish of Kerrie, commencing at the south-east angle of lot 26 on plan of subdivision lodged at the Office of Titles, and numbered 5477; thence south-westerly 3,949 links by the boundaries of lots 26 and 25; thence south-easterly 100 links by a line at right angles to the south-eastern boundary of lot 25 to the boundary of lot 21; thence north-easterly 3,949 links by the boundaries of lots 21 and 20 to the north-east angle of lot 20; thence north-westerly 100 links to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "KINGLAKE TOWNSHIP RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 16th August, 1910, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Kinglake, and known as the "Kinglake Township Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions, a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.), may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall:—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding 2s. for each vehicle.

8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage, and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Corres. Rs.4814.)

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 9 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1946, in the manner following, that is to say:—

Revoke the whole of Regulation 9 and substitute therefor the following:—

Regulation 9.

STUDENT TEACHERS.

1. Candidates for appointment as student teachers—

- (a) Shall make application on a form approved by the Director which shall be forwarded through the head teacher of the school last attended;
- (b) shall be not less than sixteen years of age,
- (c) shall, except as hereinafter provided, have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in at least five subjects of the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, including English, or shall hold an equivalent or higher qualification;
- (d) shall furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character;
- (e) shall pass the prescribed medical examination by a school medical officer; and
- (f) shall satisfy a district inspector or a board of inspectors of their aptitude and general suitability for the work of teaching.

2. Appointments of student teachers shall, subject to the provisions of clause 3 below, be made in order of merit as determined by—

- (a) an assessment, given by the district inspector or a board of inspectors, for aptitude and general suitability for the work of teaching after consideration of the report of the head teacher of the school last attended and as a result of a personal interview and of any further tests deemed necessary; and
- (b) an assessment given according to the number and value of the subjects passed at examinations.

3. (a) The Tribunal, after consultation with the Director, may from time to time determine the proportionate number of males and females to be appointed as student teachers.

(b) Holders of teaching scholarships or teaching bursaries who possess the qualifications as prescribed in clause 1 shall have a preferential right of appointment over other qualified candidates.

(c) Where a vacancy for a student teacher occurs in a school outside a radius of 20 miles of the Melbourne General Post Office, special consideration shall be given to candidates whose parents reside in the district.

4. Where there is a vacancy for a student teacher and there is no candidate possessing the qualifications prescribed in clause 1, the vacancy may be filled by the appointment of the candidate who has the highest qualifications and who, in the opinion of the Director, is suitable for appointment.

5. (a) A student teacher appointed under the provisions of clause 4 shall be required to secure the qualifications prescribed in clause 1 (c) within twelve months from the date of appointment, unless the student teacher enters on an approved course of training before the twelve months has elapsed.

(b) A student teacher may be required by the Director to enter a teachers' college or other institution approved for the training of teachers at any time following his appointment as a student teacher, provided that no student teacher will be required to enter on a course of training of less than two years' duration before he has completed at least six months' approved training as a student teacher.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (b), a student teacher who has attained the age of 21 years shall be required to enter a teachers' college or other institution approved for the training of teachers at any time determined by the Director.

6. (a) Head teachers shall furnish reports on student teachers as often as may be required.

(b) The reports mentioned in sub-clause (a) of this clause shall be furnished on a prescribed form and shall be forwarded through the district inspector.

7. Every person appointed as a student teacher shall be on probation during his full term of service as a student teacher.

8. Except in special circumstances approved by the Director, a student teacher shall not be transferred unless he has completed at least twelve months' service in the school to which he has been appointed.

9. During the course of training a student teacher may be required to attend such classes of instruction as the Director may from time to time determine.

10. A student teacher shall be required to present in any year for examination in such subjects as the Director may from time to time determine.

11. Student teachers shall be divided into three grades as follows:—

(a) Candidates who are qualified as in clause 12 shall be classified as student teachers of the First Grade.

(b) Candidates who have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or who have passed the examination for the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or an approved equivalent or higher examination in at least five subjects, including English, shall be classified as student teachers of the Second Grade.

(c) Candidates who are qualified as in clause 4 shall, upon appointment, be classified as student teachers of the Third Grade.

12. A student teacher shall be qualified for the First Grade provided that he—

(a) has passed the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University or holds an approved equivalent or higher qualification; or

(b) having completed a year as a student teacher of the second grade, and having received satisfactory annual reports from a district inspector and satisfactory half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which he is employed, has unsuccessfully applied for admission to a teachers' college or some other approved training institution.

13. The head teacher of a school to which students are attached shall—

(a) make provision for instruction in such subjects as the Director shall from time to time determine;

(b) give a satisfactory proportion of this instruction; and

(c) train student teachers in the theory and practice of teaching.

14. The exercise books kept by student teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the head teacher or the assistants, shall be dated from day to day and shall be produced for inspection by the district inspector.

15. At each visit the district inspector shall report on the character of the instruction of the student teachers and on the arrangements made for their practical training in the art of teaching.

16. Head teachers shall bring under the notice of the district inspector any marked irregularity, unpunctuality of attendance, or unsatisfactory work on the part of student teachers.

17. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clauses of this Regulation, student teachers may be employed as temporary head teachers or as temporary assistants, provided that they comply with the following requirements:—

(i) they shall be at least eighteen years of age;

(ii) they shall have served at least ten months as student teachers, and received satisfactory reports;

- (iii) they shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have completed five subjects, including English, of the Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, or possess equivalent qualifications; and
- (iv) they shall have completed a satisfactory course of at least two weeks training in rural school management and instruction at an approved school.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 12 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1946, in the manner following, that is to say:—

Regulation 12.

STUDENTSHIPS AND COURSES AT TEACHERS' COLLEGES.

1. (a) Training shall be conducted at Teachers' Colleges, at the University of Melbourne, and at such other institutions as may from time to time be approved by the Tribunal.
(b) Training schools for the training of students in teaching shall be associated with the Teachers' Colleges, the University of Melbourne, and other institutions approved for the training of teachers, and training therein shall be conducted under the supervision of the Principal and other officers of the appropriate training institutions.
2. The Teachers' Colleges shall provide training for students taking the courses mentioned in clause 4 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h).
3. The members of the staff of each of the Teachers' Colleges shall be a principal and such other officers as may from time to time be determined by the Tribunal after consultation with the Director.
4. The courses and the period of training for each course at the Teachers' colleges shall be—
 - (a) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate—four years or five years;
 - (b) Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—one year;
 - (c) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—two years;
 - (d) Trained Special Teacher's Certificate—two years;
 - (e) Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate and Diploma of Domestic Arts—three years or four years;
 - (f) Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate—three years;
 - (g) Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate—two years; and
 - (h) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director, and approved by the Tribunal.
5. The Director shall from time to time prescribe the details of the subjects of the courses for the certificates mentioned in clause 4.
6. Awards of studentships shall be made annually by the Director in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.
7. (a) The number of studentships to be awarded in each of the courses mentioned in clause 4 shall be determined annually by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director.
(b) Studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be distributed among applicants specially qualified in the following groups: (i) English and History, (ii) Modern Languages, (iii) Classics, (iv) Mathematics, (v) Science, (vi) Geography and Geology, (vii) Commercial Subjects, and (viii) such other groups as may from time to time be determined by the Director.

(c) When the number of qualified applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate exceeds the number of studentships available, studentships shall be awarded in order of merit as determined by the following considerations:—

- (i) The number and standard of the subjects passed at examinations by the applicants;
- (ii) the records of the applicants as teachers;
- (iii) length of service and age of applicants;
- (iv) the personal qualities of the applicants.

8. Holders of studentships admitted to the courses for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate, and the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate shall have their names placed provisionally on the Classified Roll for the Secondary Schools Division, whilst those admitted to the courses for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, and the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate shall have their names placed provisionally on the Classified Roll for the Primary Schools Division; provided that the retention of their names on the respective Classified Rolls shall be subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned.

9. (a) In special cases any holder may have his studentship suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

(b) The Minister may at any time cancel any studentship if he is satisfied—

- (i) that the prescribed conditions of tenure have not been complied with; or
- (ii) that the aptitude, attendance, conduct, or progress of any student has been unsatisfactory; or
- (iii) that any student is not of sound constitution, or is suffering from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher;

and thereupon all advantages connected with such studentships shall cease and determine.

10. (a) No applicant shall be awarded a studentship in any of the courses of training prescribed in clause 4 until he has submitted a certificate from a school medical officer, or from a qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, that he is of sound constitution and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher.

(b) When the medical examination discloses minor defects of a remedial character, such as unsound teeth, post-nasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, the applicant may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months and, at the end of this period, the studentship may be withdrawn if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.

11. No holder of a studentship shall receive an appointment to a classified position unless, during the last year of his course, he has submitted a certificate from a school medical officer, or from a medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, that he is free from any defect or disease likely to impair his efficiency as a teacher and that he is suitable for permanent appointment to the Teaching Service.

TRAINED SECONDARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

12. The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be—

- (a) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of March in the year in which the studentships are awarded.
- (b) They shall have qualified for matriculation at the University of Melbourne.
- (c) They shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

13. (a) The course of training for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, or of Commerce, or of Science, or of Music, or of Agricultural Science, or of Engineering, at the University of Melbourne, together with the first year of the course for the Bachelor of Education.

(b) In each or any year of the course of training as set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause, there may be included, if the Director so determines, a course in drawing, in music, in applied art, in physical education, in speech training, and in teaching.

(c) During the whole of the period of his studentship, the holder shall be under the general direction of the Principal of the Teacher's College, or the officer in charge of the appropriate training institution.

(d) An applicant holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or the third or the fourth or the fifth year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate may, if awarded a studentship, be admitted by the Director to the year for which he is qualified.

TRAINED PRIMARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

14. (a) The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate shall be—

(i) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.

(ii) They shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate or have passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification.

(iii) They shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, studentships may be awarded to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause, the Director may decline to award a studentship to any student teacher who has failed to carry out satisfactorily all such duties as may be required under the provisions of clause 17 of Regulation 9, Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.

TRAINED INFANT TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

15. The applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate shall have successfully completed the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and shall have been specially recommended by the Principal.

TRAINED SPECIAL TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

16. The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate shall be as follows:—

Applicants shall have successfully completed the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and shall have been specially recommended by the Principal, who shall take into consideration the temperament and personality of the applicants and their experience and ability in teaching normal children.

TRAINED DOMESTIC ARTS TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE AND DIPLOMA OF DOMESTIC ARTS.

17. (a) The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate shall be—

(i) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.

(ii) They shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate or have passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification.

(iii) They shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, studentships may be awarded to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(c) An applicant who holds the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause and who has completed a three years' technical school diploma course in domestic arts, or an approved equivalent or higher course, may be awarded a studentship in the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate, and, on satisfactory completion of such course shall be appointed to a classified position, on probation, for a period of twelve months.

(d) Students who have successfully completed the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate and who have been specially recommended by the Principal may be granted an extension for an additional year to undertake the course for the Diploma of Domestic Arts.

TRAINED MANUAL ARTS TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

18. (a) The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate shall be—

- (i) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.
- (ii) They shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate or have passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification.
- (iii) They shall produce satisfactory evidence of ability in Art.
- (iv) They shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, studentships may be awarded to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(c) Applicants who hold the qualifications set out in paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of sub-clause (a) of this clause and who have completed a three years' technical school course in Art and Applied Art, or an approved equivalent or higher course, may be awarded a studentship in the course for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate and, on satisfactory completion of such course, shall be appointed to classified positions, on probation, for a period of twelve months.

(d) The first two years of the course shall be taken at an approved technical school, or other school approved for the purpose, and the third year at a teacher's college.

(e) Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or third year of the course may, on being awarded studentships, be admitted by the Director to the year for which they are qualified.

TRAINED COMMERCIAL TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

19. (a) The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate shall be as follows:—

- (i) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.
- (ii) They shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate or have passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification, and shall have completed an approved commercial course.
- (iii) They shall be recommended for studentships by an inspector of schools.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, studentships may be awarded to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

ALLOWANCES AND INITIAL SALARIES.

20. Holders of studentships shall be paid allowances (which shall include expenses for travelling, games, &c.) during their course of training at the rates prescribed in clause 43 of Part X. of the Teaching Service (Classifications, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations.

21. (a) (i) Upon successfully completing a course of training at the Teachers' College, the holder of a studentship shall, except in the cases mentioned in sub-clauses (b) and (c) of this clause, be placed

in a subdivision and paid an initial salary in accordance with the rates prescribed for teachers in the under-mentioned subdivisions of the Fifth Class in the Primary Schools Division or the Secondary Schools Division or the Technical Schools Division, as the case requires:—

(ii) The holder of a studentship who fails to complete the final year of his course of training successfully shall be placed one subdivision lower than the subdivision in which he would have been placed if he had successfully completed the course, and shall be paid the corresponding initial salary:

Provided that a student who has served in the armed forces in the war which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine and who does not fail in more than one major subject or in more than two minor subjects may be regarded as having successfully completed the course.

(iii) The holder of a studentship who has satisfactorily completed a five years' course of training shall be classified in the fifth subdivision of Class V., and shall, in addition, be paid an allowance sufficient to bring his salary to that of the first subdivision of Class IV. On satisfactory completion of a year's service in the fifth subdivision of Class V. he shall be reclassified in the second subdivision of Class IV.

(b) The holder of a studentship who, prior to the award of his studentship, had completed one year, or had completed two or more years of any University course approved by the Director, shall upon successfully completing the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, be placed in the subdivision and paid the initial salary allotted the holders who have completed a two years' course or a three years' course of training respectively.

(c) The holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate who, prior to the award of his studentship, did not satisfy the requirements of having obtained the School Leaving Certificate or of having passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or of having successfully completed an approved technical school diploma course, or of holding an approved equivalent or higher qualification, shall be placed one subdivision lower than the subdivision in which he would have been placed if he had satisfied this requirement, and shall be paid the corresponding initial salary.

AGREEMENTS.

22. Each applicant awarded a studentship shall as a condition of such studentship enter into an agreement as prescribed by Order in Council.

EXAMINATIONS.

23. Examinations in the subjects of the courses for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate, the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate, and in such subjects of the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate as are not provided for in the first year of the course for the Bachelor of Education, shall be conducted by the Board of Examiners for the Colleges appointed for the purpose by the Director and composed of representatives of the staff of the appropriate College and of external examiners.

24. Holders of studentships who complete successfully any of the courses under clause 4 shall be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate for that course on the completion of two years' satisfactory service after the termination of their studentships.

25. (a) Any holder of a studentship in the course of the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate who fails to pass a satisfactory examination in the first year of his course may be allowed by the Director to enter upon the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the

Trained Special Teacher's Certificate (in any one of which cases he shall be transferred to the Classified Roll for the Primary Schools Division), and, upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of the course to which he has been transferred, shall be regarded as having completed such course; or such holder may have his studentship suspended by the Minister for one or more years in order that he may complete such year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate at his own expense.

(b) Any holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate who fails to pass a satisfactory examination in the second or third, or in the case of a music or engineering or agricultural science student the fourth year of his course, shall have his studentship suspended by the Minister for one or more years in order that he may complete such year at his own expense.

(c) Holders of studentships who at the end of their course of training have failed to pass in any subject or subjects prescribed for a Trained Teacher's Certificate may be allowed to present themselves in such subject or subjects at any subsequent examination for such Trained Teacher's Certificate.

(d) On the recommendation of the Principal, special consideration may be given by the Director in the case of students where failure to pass the prescribed examinations was due to illness or other exceptional circumstances.

(e) Special consideration shall be given by the Director in the case of a male student whose failure to pass the prescribed examinations was, in the opinion of the Director, due to his having been on service with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the war commencing in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

EXTENSIONS OF STUDENTSHIPS.

26. Each year holders of studentships recommended by the Principal may have their studentships extended by the Director in the various courses under the conditions as set out hereunder:—

(a) In all cases the course of study to be undertaken during the period of extension shall be as determined by the Director, upon the recommendation of the Principal.

(b) Extensions shall be granted only to holders of studentships who have successfully completed the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and who are otherwise qualified to enter upon a course set out in sub-clause (c) of this clause, and who are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and possessing the personality and aptitude to profit by further training.

(c) The courses which may be undertaken during the period of extension are:—

- (i) Any University course approved by the Director.
- (ii) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.
- (iii) Trained Special Teacher's Certificate.
- (iv) Diploma of Agriculture at Dookie Agriculture College.
- (v) Art and Craft for Primary Schools.
- (vi) Speech.
- (vii) School Librarianship,

and

(viii) Any other course approved by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director.

(d) The number of extensions of studentships to be awarded in each of the courses mentioned in sub-clause (c) shall be determined annually by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, present holders of scholarships shall continue to enjoy them during the tenure of their studentships.

GENERAL.

27. The Principal shall furnish an annual report to the Director for submission to the Minister, and he shall also once each year furnish to the Director a report on the conduct, efficiency, and aptitude of each student, and shall assign to each an assessment mark.

28. (a) With the approval of the Director students other than holders of studentships may be admitted to the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate at a Teachers' College provided that they—

- (i) are at least seventeen years of age;
- (ii) have obtained the School Leaving Certificate or have passed in at least five subjects, including English, of the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (iii) are of good moral character and of good physique;
- and
- (iv) pay to the Accountant of the Education Department the prescribed fee of £10 10s. per annum.

(b) With the approval of the Director students other than holders of studentships may be admitted to a Teachers' College for portions of any of the courses mentioned in clause 4, provided that they pay to the Accountant of the Education Department, for subjects not taken at the University, fees as prescribed hereunder:—

- (i) For Education (Theory and Practice), £6 6s. per annum.
- (ii) For Education (Theory only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (iii) For Education (Practice only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (iv) For any portion of Theory of Education or other subjects, £1 1s. per annum.

(c) Receipts for the above-mentioned fees shall on or before the first day of each term be submitted to the Principal of the Teachers' College.

29. Special students, such as graduates of the University or holders of the Infant Teacher's Certificate, First Class, or the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, or persons holding Trained Teacher's Certificates entitling them to registration as primary or secondary teachers, may, on payment of the fee prescribed in clause 29, be allowed to enter upon the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.

30. Students who have paid the prescribed fees and have attended a course of training specified, and have complied with the prescribed conditions, shall be admitted to the final examination for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, as the case may be, without further payment.

31. (a) Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and have qualified for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, and have complied with the conditions prescribed in clause 25, shall be awarded certificates in the courses for which they have qualified.

(b) Such certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment as teachers in State schools.

(c) Such students may apply to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions as classified teachers in State schools.

(c) an additional travelling fee of 1s. per mile each way in respect of each visit is paid.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE QUARRY BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board which, since 13th October, 1934, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

- (i) the process, trade, or business of quarrying not including agriculture;
- (ii) (a) carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with or incidental to the trade or business of quarrying (not including agriculture);
- (b) the trade of crushing stone—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 18th August, 1949, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

When an employee is working in water to a depth of 2 inches or more, he shall, in addition to the ordinary rate of pay, receive 1s. 6d. extra per day or portion of a day whilst he is so employed.

The wages rates herein prescribed for a "Feeder of a stone crushing machine" and a "Dust hole man" were determined after due consideration had been given to the dirty and dusty conditions of the work.

(c) Employees on afternoon and/or night shift shall be paid at the appropriate rate prescribed in sub-clause (b) hereof plus 20 per cent.

HOURS.

3. The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 40 for all employees to be worked between the following times :—

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (b) hereof, the spread of hours may be varied on any job by mutual agreement between an employer and the majority of his employees on the job provided that the maximum number of hours that may be worked on any day without payment for overtime shall be 4 hours on a Saturday and 8 hours on any other day.

OVERTIME.

4. (a) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee outside the times of beginning and ending work, or outside the hours mutually agreed upon between an employer, and the majority of his employees on the job as prescribed in clause 3 shall be time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time. Provided that an employee who has completed his ordinary week's work and is required to work on a Saturday morning shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a half for the first three hours and double time thereafter. Provided further that time spent in harnessing or unharnessing horses shall be deemed not to be time worked. In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

(b) An employer may require any employee to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such employee shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

TIME WAGES.

5. Any person working on time wages in connexion with stone-crushing plants for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work, shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work, be paid the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

SPECIAL RATES.

6. (a) For all work done on Sunday (except as prescribed in sub-clause (b) hereof) and the undermentioned holidays the rates shall be :—

Australia Day, Labour Day (and outside the Metropolitan District, King's Birthday)
New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day (and within the Metropolitan District, Melbourne Cup Day), provided that time and a half only shall be payable in respect of time worked rendered necessary by (a) a breakdown in plant, (b) repair work on such plant	} Double time.

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(b) Where work is rendered necessary by a breakdown in the plant or by repairs to such plant, time worked on any Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

HOLIDAYS.

7. All employees shall be entitled to be absent without deduction of pay on any of the holidays prescribed in clause 6 hereof.

TOOLS AND APPLIANCES.

8. That any employee on wages rates who is called upon to supply any or all of the following tools or appliances, viz. :—

Picks, shovels, wheelbarrows, face bars, banker bars, drills, jumpers, dressing hammers, spawling hammers, striking hammers, scabbling picks, or any other tools that may be necessary for the process of quarrying, shall be paid by the employer 3d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rates fixed by this Determination.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

9. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* (No. 5111), and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

POWDER MONKEY.

10. Powder monkey shall mean a person using or having charge of explosives during any portion of a week.

ASSISTANT POWDER MONKEY.

11. Assistant powder monkey shall mean a person who assists a powder monkey. Provided that if, in the absence of the powder monkey and/or for any other reason, he carries out the duties of a powder monkey, he shall be paid at the rate fixed for such person.

SANITATION.

12. Proper sanitary conveniences for the use of employees shall be provided and kept clean by the employer.

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

13. Payment of wages shall be made not later than Thursday in each week and any employee kept waiting for his wages on pay day for more than ten minutes after—

(a) the usual time of ceasing work in the case of a person not working overtime, or

(b) his time of ceasing work in the case of a person working overtime,

shall be paid at overtime rates after that quarter of an hour with a minimum of a quarter of an hour.

SHELTER.

14. (a) Where quarrying operations are continuously carried out each employer shall provide suitable dressing accommodation with a concrete or timber floor, and including seating and clothes hanging facilities on all jobs. Where three or more men are employed, and the work is estimated to last one week or more, a shelter shed based on six square feet per person with a minimum of 50 square feet, shall be provided. Such shed shall be for the exclusive use of workmen and not used for the storage of tools or other materials.

(b) Where running water is available an adequate number of showers with concrete floors shall also be provided adjacent to this building.

CARRYING OF WORKING TOOLS.

15. All time occupied by an employee in carrying his working tools—

(a) into or out of the quarry, or

(b) for a greater distance than 100 yards to or from the place of work,

shall be paid for at the rate fixed in this Determination for the class of work usually performed by him.

MEAL INTERVAL.

16. In places where only one shift is worked, each employee shall have not less than three-quarters of an hour, nor more than one hour meal interval each day.

WALKING TIME.

17. Where an employee during a meal hour is required for the purposes of safety, or for safety in the use of explosives to walk from his place of work to an appointed crib house, his meal hour shall be extended (without deduction of pay) for a period sufficient to cover the time occupied in returning from the crib house to his place of work.

EMPLOYEE PRESENTING HIMSELF FOR WORK.

18. Any employee who is not informed before he leaves the job at the end of his shift that he is not required to work at his next shift, and having presented himself at the time fixed for commencing work, is not employed, shall be paid for two hours on the basis of his classification. Provided that where an employee becomes entitled to payment as aforesaid, and is employed for part of the shift, he shall not receive payment for more than an ordinary day's work for such shift.

The provisions of this clause shall not apply where unemployment is caused by a breakdown in machinery, or an act of God not otherwise provided for.

To be entitled to the benefit of this provision, an employee (other than a driver of a motor vehicle engaged in delivery) shall have worked the whole or part of his immediately preceding shift.

PAYMENT FOR WET WEATHER.

19. An employee shall be paid on the basis of his ordinary classification for all time lost, when in the opinion of the employer or his responsible representative, the weather is too wet for the employee to continue his ordinary duties.

Provided that an employee shall not be entitled to payment as aforesaid, unless he attends at, and remains at, his place of employment, and is available and willing to perform under cover when requested to do so such other duties as may be allotted to him.

PIECE-WORK.

20. The Board determines under the provisions of Section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

SICK LEAVE.

21. (a) An employee who is absent from his work on account of personal illness, or on account of injury by accident, shall be entitled to leave of absence, without deduction of pay, subject to the following conditions and limitations—

- (i) He shall not be entitled to receive payment for leave of absence for any period in respect of which he is entitled to worker's compensation;
 - (ii) He shall within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence, inform the employer of his inability to attend for duty and, as far as practicable, state the nature of the injury or illness and the estimated duration of the absence;
 - (iii) He shall prove to the satisfaction of his employer (or in the event of dispute the Wages Board) that he was unable to attend for duty on the day or days for which sick leave is claimed on account of such illness or injury;
 - (iv) He shall be entitled to sick leave not exceeding one hour's leave for each 48 hours he has actually worked up to a maximum leave of 40 hours of working time in any one year.
 - (v) For the purposes of this clause a year shall be deemed to commence on the 1st January, and service prior to the 1st January, 1948, shall be disregarded.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (a) hereof, if the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 120 hours of working time which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year of service without deduction of pay.

CAMP ALLOWANCE.

22. In connexion with a quarry established for a construction project where the majority of the employees in connexion with such project are entitled, under any Award, Agreement, or Determination, to a camping allowance the following provisions shall apply—

- (a) Employees who in order to be available for their work have to live in a camp established by employers or employees shall be paid a camping allowance of 4s. for each day on which they are required to hold themselves, and do hold themselves available throughout the said day to serve the employer's purposes on that or any other day, whether or not work is done on the said day. Provided however, that the total amount payable under this clause shall not exceed 20s. per week.
- (b) An employer who at his own cost provides the employees with a proper mess room and cooks the employees' food free of charge shall make a camping allowance of 2s. per working day provided, however, that the total amount payable under this provision shall not exceed 10s. per week.

MIXED FUNCTIONS.

23. An employee engaged for four hours or more on any one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If for less than four hours on any one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

TRANSPORT OF INJURED OR SICK EMPLOYEE.

24. An employer shall take immediate action to provide for an employee, if required, the necessary transport in the case of sickness or injury arising out of the normal duties of such employee.

TEA BREAK.

25. A tea break, not exceeding ten minutes duration to be taken approximately mid-way between the commencement of work for the day, and the meal interval, and to be counted as time worked, shall be allowed without deduction of pay. The employer shall fix the time for the commencement of the tea break, and provide adequate boiling water. The interval shall be arranged by the employer so as to avoid the necessity for a stoppage of operations in the establishment, and may be staggered in regards to any sections thereof.

FIRST-AID OUTFIT.

26. In each workshop, and at other places where employees are regularly employed, the employer shall provide and continuously maintain at a place or places reasonably accessible to all employees an efficient first-aid outfit.

Clause 8 of chapter 9 of the Regulations under the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* requires that a first-aid ambulance chest shall be kept in some accessible place upon the premises, and that such chest shall be equipped and supplied with the following articles :—

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

27. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage and, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted by the same amount and at the same time as such Basic Wage as prescribed by clause 28.

Provided that proportionate adjustments to the rates for apprentices and improvers shall be made at the same time as follows :—

The rates for apprentices and improvers to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

28. (a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1949, the amounts of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 27.

(c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amount of the needs basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .087 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since the 19th October, 1942, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed outside the employer's place of business in the process, trade, business, or occupation of—

- (a) Soliciting orders for articles, goods, wares, merchandise, or materials—
 - (i) in quantity for re-sale,
 - (ii) to be used by the purchaser in the manufacture, production, preparation, or distribution of commodities for sale;
- (b) Soliciting orders for articles, goods, wares, merchandise, or materials to be used by the purchaser or by the person from whom the order was solicited in his business, trade, or occupation, or (in the case of a public or semi-public body) for the purpose of its undertaking,

but not including persons subject to the Determination of the Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware) "has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 20th August, 1949, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

2. WEEKLY WAGES.

		An additional amount of £1 shall be paid to a Traveller required by his employer to be away from his home or headquarters for any week-end.

(See Clause 11 for Definitions.)

3. TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.

(a) Subject to the limitations mentioned hereinafter and to the provisions of clause 6, the minimum weekly wage prescribed in clause 2 shall be paid, whether by salary and/or commission or otherwise, to a person covered by this Determination in respect of a week or part of a week in which he has been employed and has carried out his duties.

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(b) If an employee fails to attend to his duty for any portion of a week in which he has been employed, a sum proportionate to the time of such non-attendance may be deducted from his pay, i.e., one-sixth of the weekly wage for each day of absence. Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply in any case where failure to attend to duty has been due to a cause for which the employee cannot reasonably be held responsible.

(c) An employee who has been in the service of an employer for not less than twelve months shall be entitled to payment when absent from duty through illness for not more than eight days in any one calendar year. Where an employee has been in the service of an employer for a period of less than twelve months he shall be entitled to payment when absent from duty through illness for a total number of days calculated *pro rata* on the basis of eight days for one year's service.

(d) An employee engaged for any portion of the week on work not subject to this Determination shall be paid, in respect of each day during which any work subject to this Determination is performed, a sum equal to one-sixth of the weekly amount fixed in this Determination as remuneration, plus 25 per cent. Provided that this sub-clause shall apply only when the employee is engaged by the same employer on all ordinary working days of the week.

4. EXPENSES AND ACCOMMODATION.

In addition to the remuneration payable under clause 2 all expenses actually and properly incurred by the traveller in the discharge of his duties shall be paid by the employer. First class hotel accommodation (as approved by the United Commercial Travellers Association of Australia) shall be allowed for or provided by the employer. Where rail travelling is necessarily involved first class rail ticket shall be allowed for or provided by the employer. Such expenses as can be reasonably anticipated shall be payable in advance.

5. LOCOMOTION.

All means of locomotion required shall be provided and maintained by the employer, but where a traveller by arrangement with his employer provides his own car, he shall be paid the following minimum allowances:—

(a) Town traveller employed solely in the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts:—

(1) For motor cars of 14 h.p. or under:—

£3 15s. per week. But where he is required to use his own car for a part of a week only, he shall be paid not less than 18s. 9d. for any one day or portion thereof with a maximum of £3 15s. for any one week.

(2) For motor cars exceeding 14 h.p.:—

£4 15s. per week. But where he is required to use his own car for a part of a week only, he shall be paid not less than £1 3s. 9d. for any one day or portion thereof with a maximum of £4 15s. for any one week.

(b) Town traveller outside the Metropolitan District as so defined:—

(1) For motor cars of 14 h.p. or under:—

£3 15s. per week, or at the rate of 3½d. per mile, whichever is the greater.

(2) For motor cars exceeding 14 h.p.:—

£4 15s. per week, or at the rate of 4½d. per mile, whichever is the greater.

(c) Country traveller, £6 per week, or at the rate of 4½d. per mile, whichever is the greater.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained above the employer and the employee may make any other arrangement as to car or car allowance not less favorable to the employee.

6. ENGAGEMENT BY MORE THAN ONE EMPLOYER.

Any employer who employs a commercial traveller, which traveller is at the same time also in the employ of one or more than one other employer, shall be deemed to comply with clauses 2, 4 and 5 of this Determination if and so long as the following provisions are observed:—

(1) that the said employer pays to the traveller a sum of not less than one-third part of the weekly amount fixed in this Determination as remuneration and expenses in respect of the work performed by such traveller.

(2) that the said employer has been notified in writing by the traveller that the total amount of remuneration and expenses to be received by him in respect of his employment by all his employers is not less than the weekly amount fixed in this Determination as remuneration and expenses in respect of the work performed by such traveller. Provided that where notice in writing as required in this paragraph has been furnished to an employer, such notice shall be considered to apply to the employment of the said traveller until countermanded in writing by him.

A written contract setting out the conditions of employment must in all cases be completed by the parties concerned and a signed copy of same retained by each for inspection.

For the purposes of this clause, the term "expenses" shall include all payments and allowances to which the employee is entitled under clauses 4 and 5 of this Determination.

The provisions contained in clause 3 as to deductions for absence from duty and payment for periods of illness shall apply to travellers whose employment is subject to this clause.

7. CREDITING TRAVELLERS' RETURNS.

(i) All business canvassed for by a traveller and received by the employer as a result of such canvass from a territory worked by the traveller shall be credited to such traveller.

(ii) Where a special traveller is sent out to sell on the territory of a regular traveller, any sales by the special traveller shall be credited to the regular traveller.

8. HOLIDAYS.

All work done by any person covered by this Determination in soliciting orders at the request of the employer on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall be payable only on the day so substituted. For the purpose of this provision "double time" shall mean one day's wages, being 1/6th of the minimum weekly wage in addition to the prescribed weekly rate.

9. ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* (No. 5111), and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

10. TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

One week's notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof.

Provided that notwithstanding anything in this clause an employer may at any time forthwith dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, or carelessness in the performance of his duties.

If an employee be justifiably dismissed for any reason set out herein he shall be entitled to payment proportionate to the days worked but to that only.

11. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this Determination the following definitions shall apply:—

"Town traveller" shall mean a commercial traveller who ordinarily returns each day to his home or headquarters.

"Country traveller" shall mean a commercial traveller other than a "town traveller".

"Probationary" as applied to a traveller shall refer to a commercial traveller of less than twelve months experience.

"Special traveller" shall mean a salesman sent out as a commercial traveller and not in the company of a regular commercial traveller.

12. PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates and, pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted by the same amount and at the same time as such basic wage as prescribed by clause 13.

13. ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

(a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers," or any like expression, means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1949, the amounts of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 12.

(c) During each future successive period, beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amount of the needs basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .087 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.
