ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 5389. "An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and fifty."

- No. 5396. "An Act to amend the *Mines Act 1928*, and for other purposes connected therewith."
- No. 5397. "An Act to amend the *Coal (Overseas Purchase) Loan and Application Act 1948*."
- No. 5398. "An Act to further amend Section Three of the *Country Roads Board Fund Act 1932* (No. 2)."

No. 5399. "An Act to provide for the Sale and otherwise dealing with Land upon which the Lancefield and Kilmore Railway was constructed."

No. 5402. "An Act to continue the Operation of Part III. of the *Finance Act 1930*."

PROHIBITION OF CERTAIN METHODS OF FISHING
IN THE WATERS OF CORNER INLET AND PORT
ALBERT, AND SHOAL OR SHALLOW INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) Revoke the Proclamations made the twenty-second day of December, 1938, and the thirty-first day of July, 1945, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of December, 1938, and the first day of August, 1945, respectively, regarding flounder spearing in the waters of Corner Inlet and Port Albert.

(b) Prohibit fishing by means of a spear or similar device, or using a light in conjunction with a hand or dip net or contrivance, other than commercial fishing nets or long lines, for fishing during the whole of each year in all the waters northerly and westerly of an imaginary line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shoal or Shallow Inlet, near St. Margaret's or McCrae Island, including the waters of Corner Inlet, Port Albert, Corner Basin, and Shoal or Shallow Inlet; provided that this Proclamation shall not apply to any of the said waters north of a line running north-easterly from the south-east corner of allotment 9B, Parish of Tarra Tarra, to the south-west corner of allotment 52B, Parish of Balloong.

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION REGARDING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the thirteenth day of July, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of July, 1948, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, as follows:—

1. After the words "Port Phillip Bay" in paragraph 2 of such Proclamation, insert the words "(including Corio and Hobson's Bays)."

2. At the end of paragraph 3, insert the following:—

"(f) No person shall permit more than one long line or a long line with more than 800 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on the said waters.

(g) No person shall take or assist in the taking of a boat having thereon, or attached thereto, more than one long line or a long line with more than 800 hooks attached on to the said waters, or allow such a boat to be on the said waters."

Zoological Gardens Act 1936.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Zoological Gardens Act 1936*, certain Regulations were made by the Zoological Board of Victoria, on the seventeenth day of June, 1938, approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fifth day of July, 1938, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of July, 1938:

And whereas such Regulations have been amended from time to time:

Now therefore the Zoological Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth further amend as follows the said Regulations (that is to say):—

For clause 8 there shall be substituted the following:—

"8. The charges for admission to the Gardens shall be as follows (that is to say):—

(i) For admission on any one occasion—

(a) One shilling and six pence for each person over the age of fourteen years;

(b) Six pence for each child over the age of three years but not over the age of fourteen years.

Provided that upon application to the Director of the Gardens, parties of children attending secondary schools or Sunday schools may (except on Sundays and public holidays) be admitted on payment of one-half of the foregoing charge for a child, and parties of children attending State schools or other primary schools, and classes in natural history, or children in the care of charitable institutions may (except on Sundays and public holidays), be admitted to the Gardens free of charge.

(ii) For a family ticket available for admission from the first day of January in any year to the thirty-first day of December next following:—

One pound one shilling.

A family ticket shall entitle the holder and the wife or husband of the holder and the children not over the age of fourteen years of the holder to admission to the Gardens on not more than ten occasions during the currency of the ticket. A family ticket shall be marked by perforation with a metal punch on every occasion upon which it is presented to obtain admission."

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority

may carry out all or any of such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

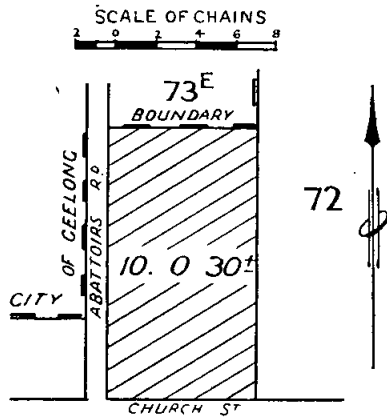

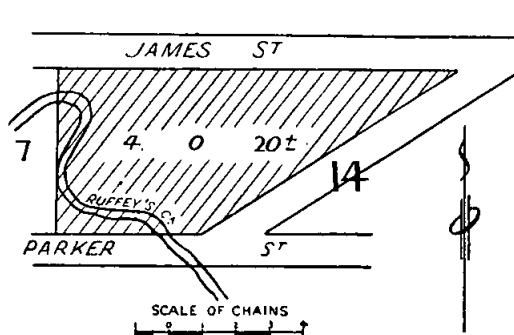

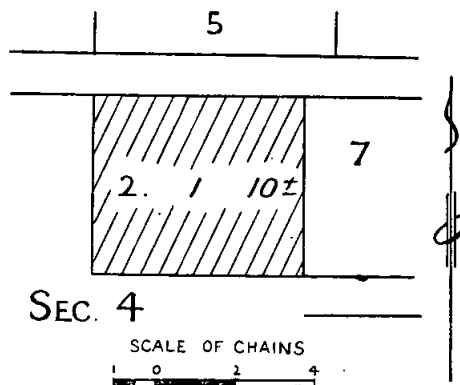

**AMENDMENT OF FIBROUS PLASTERING TRADE
 REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that it to say:—

1. The following Regulations shall be and the same are hereby rescinded as from the thirtieth day of June, 1949:—

Fibrous Plastering Trade Regulations (No. 1) made by the Governor in Council on the 7th day of April, 1937, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 14th day of April, 1937.

Fibrous Plastering Trade Regulations (No. 2) made by the Governor in Council on the 6th day of July, 1937, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 14th day of July, 1937.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulations before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulations substitute the following:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Fibrous Plastering Trade Regulations."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by an appropriate industrial authority or agreement or by these Regulations, as the case may be.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the apprenticeship trade of Fibrous Plastering.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trade shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants may be Examined.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trade may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trade: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

Exemptions.

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trade.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trade as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trade shall be five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trade, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts, with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

(c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

(c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.

(f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.

(g) Provide the apprentice once only during the said term, and as required, with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenant.

(c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

(i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or

(ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

(10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other

matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by the journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority, or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the *Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1948*.

(11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 46s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 60s. 0d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 78s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 102s. 6d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 142s. 0d. per week.
- 6th year—at the rate of 164s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 46s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 60s. 0d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 78s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 102s. 6d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 142s. 0d. per week.

The above rates include allowances as compensation for time lost for prescribed holidays.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. When an apprentice works under conditions for which or at any time when a journeyman employed at the trade of Fibrous Plastering would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

Standard of and Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard of proficiency as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted to such subjects at the annual examinations, he shall for the next succeeding year of his apprenticeship course be paid the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

12. (a) The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trade shall, in cases where the employer employs three or more journeymen, not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trade.

(b) Where an employer employs less than three journeymen he may, upon satisfying the Commission that a proper vacancy for an apprentice exists, and with the approval of the said Commission, employ one apprentice. For the purposes of this paragraph only, an employer who works at the said trade for at least 75 per cent. of the time prescribed for an ordinary week's work in such trade may be deemed to be a journeyman.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

13. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trade shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

14. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first, second, third, and fourth years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year; and

- (ii) in the subjects of the fifth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission,

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

15. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes:—

All phases of the fibrous plastering trade, including the proper method of mixing, reinforcing, and preparing the materials for all kinds of fibrous plastering work; the correct use of the tools employed in the trade; setting out, battening, and furring; the running, making up, casting, reinforcing, and fixing of mouldings and cornices; setting out for and the fixing of fibrous plaster and making pressed cement ornaments and enrichments—

and the employer shall, by the best means in his power, teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

16. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

Incorporation of General Regulations.

17. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1) approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2) approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3) approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dental Mechanic Trade Regulations (No. 2).

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trade, viz.:—

Dental mechanic.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

5. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

(i) in each year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and

(ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall not be less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Standard of Proficiency.

6. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

7. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

(a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

(b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

(c) for the third and/or fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Payment of School Fees.

8. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

- (b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts, with the following additions thereto:—

*Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.**EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.*

- At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

- (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.

- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any faulty work, or for any damage or injury done to material, work or machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.

- (g) Provide the apprentice with the following tools during the first, second, and third years of the term of his apprenticeship, viz.:—Hammer, pliers, cold chisel, screw-driver, one pair of snips, soldering iron, two pairs of footprints, shave hook, dresser, hacksaw, two pairs of Stillson wrenches, and bossing mallet.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

- (c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

- At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

- (i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or

- (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

- (10) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

- (11) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority, or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the *Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1948*.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—

1st year—at the rate of 37s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 49s. 6d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 68s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 96s. 0d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 125s. 0d. per week.
6th year—at the rate of 155s. 0d. per week.

- (b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 37s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 49s. 6d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 68s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 96s. 0d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 125s. 0d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. When an apprentice works under conditions for which or at any time when a journeyman employed at the trades of Plumbing and/or Gasfitting would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

Standard of Proficiency.

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

12. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

- (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

- (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

- (c) for the third and/or fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every two journeymen, or fraction of two journeymen, employed by such employer in such trades.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

14. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

15. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first, second, and third years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission,

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each year of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

16. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be):—

- (i) Plumbing and Gasfitting.—Sanitary plumbing installation; water supply installation; domestic hot-water supply; ventilation and heating installations; roof plumbing; gasfitting, as set out in sub-paragraph (iii) hereof;
- (ii) Plumbing.—Sanitary plumbing installation; water supply installation; domestic hot-water supply; ventilation and heating installations; roof plumbing;
- (iii) Gasfitting.—The installation of systems for or in connexion with coal gas, air gas, oil gas, acetylene, and similar systems for lighting, warming, cooking, industrial purposes, and motive power—

and the employer shall, by the best means in his power, teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

17. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice as proof of such illness or accident.

(c) In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course, the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.

Incorporation of General Regulations.

18. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1) approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2) approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3) approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4) approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

General Regulations (No. 5) approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 14th day of January, 1933.

General Regulations (No. 6) approved by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of May, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1943.

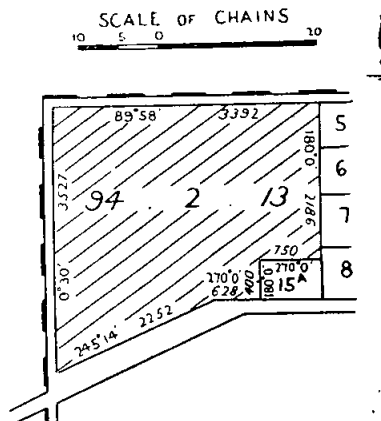

(ii) The Dandenong and District Community Hospital.

(iii) Any church organization, service men's or women's organization, or charitable organization or sporting body, provided such organizations or sporting body are situated in the Shire of Dandenong.

5. In this By-law all auxiliary committees located in the Shire of Dandenong of any recognized hospital or charitable institution shall be regarded as an organization situated in the Shire of Dandenong.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Dandenong.
