Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 117.

IMPORTED BATHS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 117.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 67 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Imported Baths” means baths other than of Australian origin.
“Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
“Landed Cost” means the aggregate of—
 - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
 - (ii) inland carriage charges;
 - (iii) outside packing charges;
 - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agent's commission actually incurred;
 - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
 - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates);
 - (vii) exchange calculated at telegraphic transfer rates at date of import (without addition of bank fees, bank commission, or interest charges);
 - (viii) duty and primage paid;
 - (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid;
 - (x) harbor dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy paid;
 - (xi) customs entry and customs agent's charges paid (but not including any charges for costing, or any percentage surcharge on cost, or any charges for cartage from wharf, bond store, or free store); and
 - (xii) sales tax where paid.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which imported baths may be sold by retail to be—

(a) in respect of sales for delivery in the Metropolitan Area—

(i) landed cost as defined in paragraph 3 of this Order, plus

(ii) 22½ per centum of (i).

(b) in respect of sales outside Metropolitan Area—

(i) landed cost as defined in paragraph 3 of this Order, plus

(ii) 22½ per centum of (i), plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of those baths from the Metropolitan Area to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which imported baths specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(2) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person of any imported bath than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

Delivery of Invoices.

6. Every person who sells imported baths shall deliver with those goods an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

(a) date of sale,

(b) name of purchaser,

(c) address of purchaser,

(d) quantity of baths sold,

(e) full description of baths sold,

(f) price at which those goods are sold,

(g) maximum retail prices calculated in accordance with paragraph 4 of this Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 118.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

"'Lanray' Products" means any article specified in the Schedule to this Order and manufactured by Lanray Industries Limited of New South Wales;

"Metropolitan Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any "Lanray" product specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales for delivery within the Metropolitan Area—the appropriate price set out in the Schedule to this Order; and
- (b) in respect of sales outside the Metropolitan Area—the appropriate price set out in the Schedule to this Order, plus the cost of transport (if any) actually incurred by the retailer thereof and properly attributable to the transport of such "Lanray" product to the retailer's place of business.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

4. (1) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any "Lanray" product, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with such goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods and as to be properly associated with such goods.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any "Lanray" product specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(2) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person of any "Lanray" product than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.
