DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOFS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1949.

Experience for the purpose of this Clause means actual experience whether as an apprentice or otherwise.

Proportion.

(In any factory or place.)

An employer shall not employ make apprentices in excess of the proportion of one make apprentice to every three make workers or fraction thereof receiving wage rates or earning at piece work prices not less than the minimum hourly wage for adult makes. Such proportion shall be based on the average number of workers employed during the previous six months-receiving wage rates or earning at piece work prices not less than the minimum hourly wage for adult makes.

An amended indenture of apprenticeship has been prescribed by the Board.

See Clause 7 for wages and proportion of unapprenticed Junior Workers.

FEMALES-Improvers.

3. Females employed clicking, designing, or cutting patterns, stuff cutting, stuff fitting, or preparing for makers, or making or finishing, including the following operations in the making of slippers:—Turning, bottom levelling, wood heeling, blocking, steaming, and ironing on the last, irrespective of age or experience shall be paid the same rates as are paid to adult males on the same class of work.

Females employed attaching uppers to soles of shoes, known as or similar to the Sahara Sandal, or interlacing material of the uppers on the last or attaching such uppers to the soles of shoes known as Basket Shoes or any shoe similar thereto shall be paid the same rates as are paid to adult males on the same class of work.

Proportion.

(In any factory or place.)

One female apprentice to every three or fraction of three female workers employed and receiving at wages rates or earning at pieces work prices not less than the minimum wage for adult females.

[•] Wages of apprentices and improvers in the Metropolitan District are regulated by Apprenticeship Commission.

[†] Junior females may be employed on the operations set out in paragraphs (c), (d), and (s) of Clause 5 at the above rates.

Proportion.

(In any factory or place.)

Three female improvers to each female worker employed and receiving at wages rates or earning at piece work prices not less than the minimum wage for adult females.

Provided that the total number of female apprentices and improvers in any factory or place shall not exceed three to each adult female receiving not less than the minimum wage for adult females.

⁽f) Females over the age of 21 years with less than the experience hereinbefore mentioned shall for the first twelve months be paid 93s. 0d. per week and thereafter the rate prescribed for their occupation.
