ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 5507. "An Act to approve validate ratify and otherwise give effect to an Agreement between the State of Victoria The Metropolitan Gas Company and The Brighton Gas Company Limited, to establish constitute and incorporate a Public Authority to be called the "Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria," to make provision with respect to the Objects Powers and Duties of such Authority, to provide for the Raising of Money by the State and the Application of such Money, and for other purposes."

The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS REGARDING THE USE OF LONG LINES AND CERTAIN OTHER FISHING LINES IN THE PORT OF PORT PHILLIP (INCLUDING CORIO BAY, HOBSON'S BAY, AND SWAN BAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act* 1928 (No. 3683) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the afore-mentioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act* 1928, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamations made the thirteenth day of July, 1948, and the eleventh day of October, 1949, and published in the *Government Gazettes* of the fourteenth day of July, 1948, and the twelfth day of October, 1949, respecting the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay.

2. Revoke the Proclamations made the sixteenth day of December, 1941, and the twentieth day of February, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazettes* of the seventeenth day of December, 1941, and the twenty-first day of February, 1945, respectively, regarding the use of certain fishing lines in Port Phillip Bay.

3. Prohibit, during the period from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive), any person having in his possession any long line in or upon the waters of Port Phillip (including Hobson's Bay and Corio Bay) or of any river or creek flowing into such waters or within 200 yards of any of such waters, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of a long line and the method of fishing known as "long lining";
- (b) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat with a long line on board, or attached thereto, on to any of the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters, or within 200 yards thereof.

4. Prohibit during the period in any year from the first day of April to the thirtieth day of September (both days inclusive) any person having in his possession more than one long line in or upon the waters of Port Phillip (including Hobson's Bay and Corio Bay) or of any river or creek flowing into such waters, or within 200 yards thereof, or a long line having attached thereto more than 500 hooks, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached thereto;
- (b) permitting more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on such waters;
- (c) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat having thereon, or attached thereto, more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached on to the said waters, or allowing such a boat to be on the said waters;

Provided that during the period in any year from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted in the waters of Corio Bay westward of an imaginary line running north 8 degrees west (magnetic) from the shore end of Drysdale Jetty, through "Arthur the Great" Buoy, and thence to a point on the northern shore of Corio Bay (approximately a quarter of a mile westward of Kirk Point), subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) The line to be used shall be that known as No. 15 cotton line and the snoods shall be No. 9 cotton line;
- (b) Each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 2/0;

- (c) No bait other than raw beef shall be used;
- (d) No person may do any or all of the following things:—

- (i) Use, or assist in the use of, more than one long line or a long line with more than 800 hooks attached thereto in or on the said waters;
- (ii) permit more than one long line or a long line with more than 800 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on the said waters;
- (iii) take or assist in the taking of a boat having thereon or attached thereto more than one long line or a long line with more than 800 hooks attached on to the said waters, or allow such a boat to be on the said waters.

5. Prohibit any person using, assisting in the use of, or having a long line in possession in or on the waters of Swan Bay during the whole of each year.

6. Prohibit the use of any fishing line, whether fixed or unfixed, having attached thereto more than three hooks, in or on the waters of Port Phillip (including Corio Bay and Hobson's Bay), and prescribe that six shall be the maximum number of fishing lines which any person may use or have in his possession or control in or on the said waters, during the period from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive). The provisions of this paragraph shall apply to the waters of Swan Bay during the whole of each year.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS REGARDING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN WESTERN PORT BAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act* 1928 (No. 3683) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the afore-mentioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act* 1928, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made the sixteenth day of July, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of July, 1946, respecting the use of long lines in Western Port Bay.

2. Prohibit in the waters of Western Port Bay within or inside an imaginary line running from Shoreham to the Nobbies and an imaginary line running west north-west and east south-east through the flashing southern light of the inner passage, situated approximately 1,000 yards, 60 degrees from the head of Newhaven Jetty, or of any river or creek flowing into such bay at any time during the period from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following, inclusive, any person having in his possession any long line in or upon the said waters or within 200 yards thereof, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of a long line or the method of fishing known as "long lining";

(b) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat with a long line on board or attached thereto on to any of the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within 200 yards thereof;

(c) using any fishing line, whether fixed or unfixed, having attached thereto more than three hooks or using or having in possession or control more than six such lines in or on the said waters; and further prohibit during the period in any year from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) any person having in his possession more than one long line in or upon the said waters, or within 200 yards thereof, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of more than one long line;
- (b) permitting more than one long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters;
- (c) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat having thereon, or attached thereto, more than one long line on to the said waters; or allowing such a boat to be on the said waters;
- (d) using or assisting in the use of a long line, or moving a boat with a long line on board, attached thereto, or in tow from any mooring anchorage wharf or jetty during the period between noon on any Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday or using any fishing line, whether fixed or unfixed, having attached thereto more than three hooks or using or having in possession or control more than six such lines during such period.

AMENDMENT OF SIXTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency General Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section thirty-eight of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748), as amended by Act 3918, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to such Act after the word "designation" the following substances or preparations:—

- (a) Tetraethyl thiuramdisulphide whether known as antabus (antabuse) tetrabuse or any other name,
- (b) Phenytoin sodium the sodium salt of 5 : 5 diphenylhydantoin whether known as dilantin sodium, epanutin, eptoin, solantoin or any other name,
- (c) Phenylethylhydantoin its salts its acyl derivatives, and their salts, and
- (d) Tridione (trimethadione) 3, 5, 5 trimethyl oxazolidine 2, 4-dione.

And I hereby declare that Division 2 of Part III. of Act 3748 shall apply to each of the said substances or preparations.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of His Present Majesty, King George VI., intitled the *Coal Mines Regulation (Accidents Relief) Act 1950* (No. 5490), it is amongst other things enacted that the Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*.

Now, therefore, I, Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation fix Monday, the eleventh day of December, 1950, as the day upon which the *Coal Mines Regulation (Accidents Relief) Act 1950* shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the said Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the sixth day of December, 1950, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Fourth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Portland and of the Shires of Glenelg, Portland, and Wannan;

the Fifth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Hamilton and Warrnambool, the Boroughs of Koroit and Port Fairy, and the Shires of Belfast, Dundas, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse, and Warrnambool;

those portions of the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Borough of Stawell and of the Shires of Avoca and Stawell;

the Seventeenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Horsham and of the Shires of Arapiles, Dimboola, Dunmunkle, Kaniva, Kowree, Lowan, Warracknabeal, and Wimmera;

the Nineteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of St. Arnaud and of the Borough of Inglewood and of the Shires of Bet Bet, Charlton, Donald, Kara Kara, and Korong;

and those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Rochester, and those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Marong not within the Second Fire Control Region.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1951.

No. 54.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Acts* and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied for the supply of water for domestic purposes upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated by it within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed £16, One pound per annum.
- (b) Of any such tenement the annual municipal valuation whereof exceeds £16, a rate of One shilling and three pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.
- (c) Of lands on which there is no building, a rate of One shilling and three pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year beginning the 1st day of January, 1951, and ending the 31st day of December, 1951, and shall be payable on the 31st day of January, 1951, at the office of the Water Commissioners, Ballarat.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Commissioners is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and one penny per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Commissioners in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and one penny per 1,000 gallons.

5. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commissioners.

6. Such person or persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

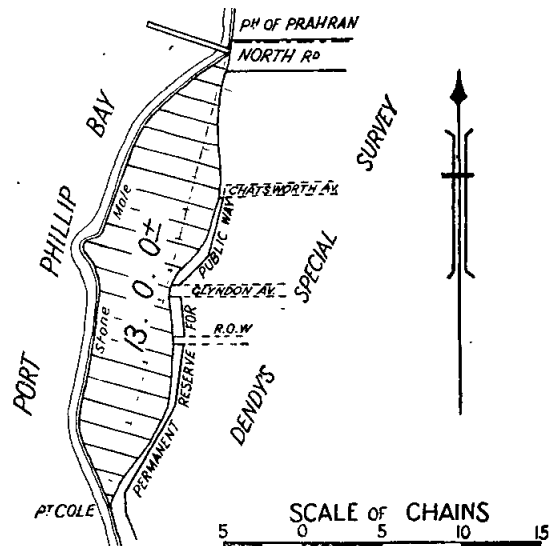

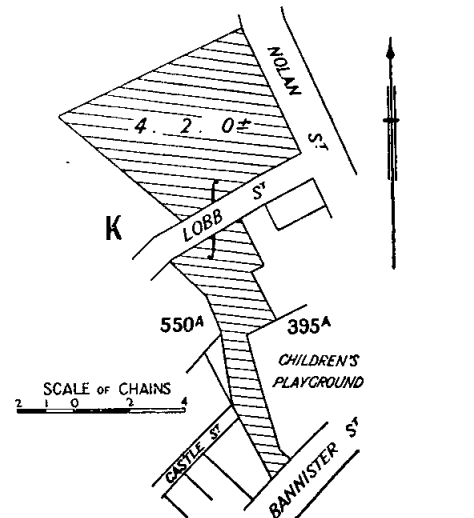

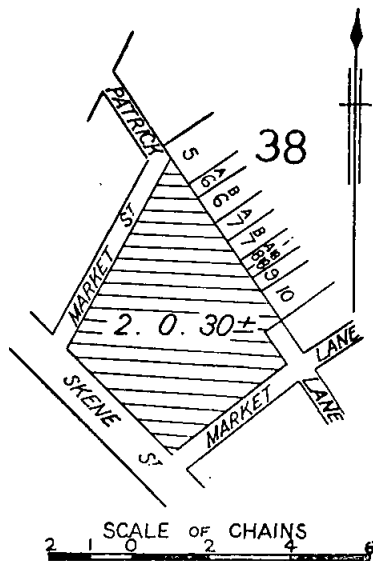

FOREST INDUSTRIES FIRE PROTECTION REGULATIONS 1950.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Forests Acts and of all other powers thereto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Forest Industries Fire Protection Regulations 1950," and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall supersede the Forest Industries Fire Protection Regulations 1940, which are hereby repealed.

2. For the purpose of these Regulations—

- (a) "Sawmill" shall not include those mills used exclusively for the sawing of firewood.
- (b) "Logging operations" means the felling of trees and the obtaining of poles, piles, and logs, and includes any snigging or hauling operation associated therewith.
- (c) "Lumbering operations" means the cutting of pulpwood, firewood, posts, and fencing timbers, the hewing of sleepers and beams, the trimming of poles, the splitting of palings and any like operation, and includes the removal of bark in preparation therefor.

DIVISION A.—FIRE-FIGHTING APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT.

3. Every person conducting sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, or eucalyptus oil distillation operations in any fire-protected area or other industrial operation in any State forest shall, upon receipt of a notice in writing to that effect from the Commission, and within the period stated in such notice, provide or cause to be provided such fire-fighting apparatus and equipment as is specified therein.

4. Such person shall—

- (a) keep or cause to be kept such apparatus and equipment at such place or places as a forest officer may, in writing, direct;
- (b) separately store or cause to be stored such apparatus and equipment in such manner as to be immediately available, whenever required for fire-fighting purposes;
- (c) maintain or cause to be maintained such apparatus and equipment in an efficient condition to the satisfaction of the forest officer for the time being in charge of the area in which such sawmilling, logging, lumbering, or other industrial occupation is conducted.

5. Such person or any other person for the time being in charge of such sawmilling, logging, lumbering, or other industrial occupation shall—

- (a) permit any forest officer to inspect such apparatus and equipment at any reasonable time;
- (b) make such apparatus and equipment available for fire-fighting purposes to any officer or employee of the Commission at any time when not being used or required for a like purpose by any person employed in connexion with such sawmilling, logging, lumbering, or other industrial operation.

DIVISION B.—TELEPHONIC COMMUNICATION.

6. Every person conducting sawmilling operations within any fire-protected area shall, on receipt of notice in writing to that effect from the Commission, construct or cause to be constructed to the specification prescribed by or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Commission a telephone line between his mill and such other terminal as the Commission in such notice directs.

7. Such person shall maintain or cause to be maintained in an efficient working condition such telephone line and all instruments and apparatus associated therewith.

8. Such person or any other person for the time being in charge of such sawmilling operations shall make such telephone line and instruments available to any forest officer or any authorized employee of the Commission for the transmission of official communications.

DIVISION C.—MILL AND LOGGING CAMP CLEARINGS.

9. Every person conducting sawmilling, logging, or lumbering operations in any fire-protected area shall—

- (a) maintain or cause to be maintained in a condition clear of all standing and fallen trees whether green or dry, live or dead ferns and scrub, and any accumulation of inflammable material, including sawdust, the whole area within two chains of any portion of the mill or of any buildings associated with such mill or logging or lumbering operation;
- (b) carry out or cause to be carried out such burning or other protective operations in the vicinity of such mill or logging camp as are directed by a forest officer from time to time;
- (c) erect or cause to be erected all huts, residences and other buildings in as close proximity to the mill as is practicable, and in any case within the boundaries of the licensed mill site;
- (d) adequately and effectively clear or cause to be cleared of all inflammable material the site of any new sawmill or logging camp prior to commencement of construction of any buildings thereon;
- (e) adequately and effectively clear or cause to be cleared of all timber and scrub and maintain in a cleared condition any winch site in accordance with the directions in writing of a forest officer.

DIVISION D.—WATER SUPPLY.

10. Every person conducting sawmilling operations in any fire-protected area shall—

- (a) unless granted an exemption in writing by the Commission, provide a supply of water such that—
 - (i) not less than 3,000 gallons shall be held in reserve in overhead tanks or in a reservoir at such elevation in either case that the point of outlet therefrom is not less than 30 feet vertically above the point of delivery at the mill;
 - (ii) reticulation shall be by metal pipes, the main from reservoir or tanks being not less than 2 inches internal diameter;
 - (iii) a number of hydrants connected to the aforesaid metal pipes shall be provided so that no part of the sawmill, sawdust burner, waste pits, huts, associated buildings and timber stacks shall be beyond effective reach from at least one such hydrant with a hose not exceeding 100 feet in length;
- (b) if granted an exemption as aforesaid store such quantity of water and provide such means for its distribution as the Commission may in writing direct.

DIVISION E.—DISPOSAL OF EDGINGS, WASTE, SAWDUST, ETC.

11. (a) No person conducting any sawmilling operations within any fire-protected area, nor any person employed in connexion therewith, shall light or maintain any fire in the open air for the purpose of burning edgings, offcuts, hearts, bark, or other waste parts of logs or trees (hereinafter called waste material), or permit any fire which is in fact burning any such waste material to remain alight unless—

- (i) such burning be confined to pits located as approved by a forest officer, and so that no part of the mill or buildings in connexion therewith shall be endangered;
- (ii) such pits be of sufficient size and depth to ensure that all such waste material may be confined within and kept at least 1 foot below the level of the banks of such pits.

(b) During the prohibited period any such waste material may be burned by any such person in pits as herein prescribed only between the hours of Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Seven o'clock in the forenoon of the day following on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, provided that—

- (i) all fire be completely extinguished with water not later than half-past Seven o'clock each morning;
- (ii) no such burning shall take place on Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays; and
- (iii) no such burning shall take place on any day when insufficient men are in attendance to extinguish the fire, or on such occasions as the water supply system may be defective or the available supply of water inadequate to extinguish the fire.

(c) During any period of extreme danger of the spread of fire, and during any acute fire danger period within the meaning of section 7 of the *Forests Act* 1939, no such person as aforesaid shall light or permit to remain unextinguished any fire whatsoever for the purpose of burning any such waste material as aforesaid.

(d) Any such person as aforesaid shall completely extinguish any fire in any such pit when requested to do so by a forest officer.

12. (a) Every person, who, not being exempted as herein provided commences to operate any sawmill within any fire-protected area at any date after the gazettal of these Regulations shall install and maintain to the satisfaction of the Commission an efficient sawdust burner of a design approved by the Commission for the disposal of the entire output of sawdust from such sawmill.

(b) The Commission may grant an exemption in writing from the provisions of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) but any such person granted such exemption shall provide such alternative means for the disposal of the sawdust as the Commission in such exemption may prescribe and the Commission may at any time withdraw such exemption.

(c) Any person, who, prior to the gazettal of these Regulations, was conducting or operating a sawmill within any fire-protected area and is directed by the Commission by notice in writing to install and maintain to its satisfaction an efficient sawdust burner of a design approved by the Commission for the disposal of the entire output of sawdust from such sawmill, shall install and maintain such burner within the period specified in such notice.

DIVISION F.—SPARK ARRESTERS, EXHAUST PIPES, ETC.

13. Every person conducting any sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, or eucalyptus oil operations or other industrial operation in any fire-protected area, involving the use of any tractor, boiler or steam engine whether stationary, portable, or locomotive shall—

- (a) during the prohibited period or at any time when there is danger of the outbreak and spread of fire and on receipt of a direction in writing from a forest officer so to do, within the period specified in such direction, fit to the smoke-stack or flue of such boiler or steam engine and maintain in an efficient condition a spark arrester of a design approved by the Commission.
- (b) install in any such engine and maintain in an efficient condition an ash pan so designed that the escape of live coals will be prevented;
- (c) fit the exhaust pipe of any tractor used in any such operation in such a position that the tractor exhausts in a vertically upward direction.

And the Honorable Albert Eli Lind, His Majesty's Minister of Forests for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. That the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission shall adjust the liabilities of the under-mentioned Water-

works Districts, as at 1st July, 1949, by making entries in the books of account of the Commission—

- (a) in the account called the "Capital Expenditure Borne by the State Account" transferring the amounts of capital liability set out in columns 3, 4, and 5 in the Statement hereunder, and
- (b) in the account called the "Revenue Expenditure Chargeable to the State Account" transferring the amounts set out in column 6 of the Statement hereunder—

in respect of lands transferred between the said Districts by Orders in Council:—

- (i) Dated 24th May, 1949, excising portions of the Birchip Waterworks District and adding certain lands thereto (as amended by Order in Council dated 24th January, 1950),
- (ii) dated 24th May, 1949, excising portion of the Sea Lake Waterworks District and adding certain lands thereto,
- (iii) dated 24th May, 1949, excising portions of the Upper Wimmera United Waterworks District and adding certain lands thereto (as amended by Order in Council dated 24th January, 1950),

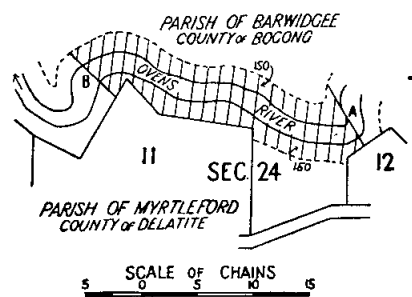

DETERMINATION OF THE NEWSVENDORS' BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies throughout the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Determination of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) employed in the delivery, distribution, or sale of newspapers, periodicals, sports programmes, or other printed matter" has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. This Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 2nd October, 1950.

2. (a) Rates to be paid within any part of Victoria for the delivery or distribution of—

- (i) Newspapers and/or Periodicals At the rate of 2½d. per dozen per day with a minimum of 1s. 3d. per day.
(ii) Other Printed Matter At the rate of £1 5s. per 1,000.

(b) Commissions to be paid for the sale of—

	Within the City Area (as Defined).	Within the Suburban Area (as Defined).	Elsewhere.
(i) Daily newspapers retailed at 2d. each	5d. per dozen	4d. per dozen	4d. per dozen

Provided that any person employed by a wholesale agent shall be paid at the rate of 7½d. per dozen on sales of daily newspapers and at the rate of 24 per cent. of the amount obtained from the sales of periodicals.

DEFINITIONS.

3. "City Area" means the area including, and enclosed by, the following boundaries—the north side of the River Yarra from a point opposite the City Morgue to Spencer-street Bridge, Spencer-street (including all public thoroughfares on the railway station) to Latrobe-street, the south side of Latrobe-street to Victoria-street, Victoria-street from Latrobe-street to Spring-street, and the west side of Spring-street from Victoria-street to the Jolimont railway yards.

"Suburban Area" means the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Orders in Council thereunder, save and except such area as is herein defined as the City Area.

"Wholesale Agent" means any distributor of daily newspapers and/or periodicals who on the 1st July, 1948, issued, distributed, or sold such papers and/or periodicals from a distributing depot only and who did not normally make retail sales direct to members of the general public from such depot.

"Periodicals" means any overseas publications, any interstate publications other than daily newspapers, any Victorian publications, other than the daily newspapers and the Saturday Sporting Globe.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

4. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* (No. 5111) and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

(c) Wharf watchmen commencing duty at 5 p.m. for the evening shift or at midnight for the midnight shift shall be paid eight hours at the ordinary rate provided in each case the full shift is worked, and for the purpose of computing overtime in excess of 40 hours in any week the full eight hours paid for shall be counted as eight hours of work.

For the purpose of this clause evening shift and midnight shift shall be as defined in Order 8 of 1949 of the Stevedoring Industry Commission.

(d) Wharf watchmen shall be required to diligently attend to their duties as watchmen and immediately report to the Superintendent or foreman in charge of the hatch or the Ship's Officer on duty any cases of pillage or suspected or attempted pillage and damage, and if required, make notes and furnish reports regarding same. It is also required that smoking and committing a nuisance in the hold should be stopped and, if persisted in, reported in the manner directed above.

Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 3, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
