PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF KEILOR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Kellor has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Kellor aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF KEILOR.

That part of Broadmeadows-road between Bulla-road on the north and the Government road also known as Sharpes-road on the south, being part of Crown section 3, Parish of Tullamarine, County of Bourke, and being the land bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-western corner of Bulla-road and Broadmeadows-road; thence by a line bearing south 8 min. east for a distance of 3,167 ft. $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; thence by a line bearing south 65 deg. 48 min. east for a distance of 74 ft. 6 in.; thence by a line bearing north 4 min. west for a distance of 2,902 ft. $2\frac{1}{2}$ in.; thence by a line bearing north 13 deg. 41 min. west for a distance of 304 feet to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION

*Local Government Act 1946.*PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town), extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Stawell has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Seymour has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to certain parts of the municipal district of such municipality: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Borough of Stawell and to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Seymour, described hereunder:—

(a) The Township of Avenel.

(b) The Town of Dabyminga.

(c) The land bounded by a line commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 49, Parish of Tallarook; thence in a direct line northerly across a road to the south-east angle of allotment 7, Township of Seymour; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the Township of Seymour to the north-east angle of allotment 22, Township of Seymour; thence in a direct line across a road to the eastern angle of allotment 8, section W, Parish of Seymour; thence westerly in a direct line across the aforesaid allotment 8 and allotments 7 and 7A, a road, the railway property, allotment 9, section W, Parish of Seymour, and another road to the north-east angle of allotment 10, section W, Township of Seymour; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of allotments 10 and 11 to the south-east angle of allotment 9, section A; thence in a northerly direction along the east boundary of allotment 9, section A, to its north-east angle; thence in a direct line across a road to the south-east angle of allotment 8, section A; thence along the eastern boundary of allotment 8, section A, to its north-east angle; thence in a south-westerly direction along the northern boundaries of allotments 8, 7, and 6, section A, to the north-west angle of allotment 6, section A; thence north-westerly in a direct line across a road to the eastern angle of allotment 12, section A; thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the aforesaid allotment 12 to its northern angle; thence across a road in a direct line to the eastern angle of allotment 13, section A; thence along the boundary of allotment 13, section A, to its north-eastern angle; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the aforesaid allotment 13, section A, to its north-west angle; thence southerly along the boundary of allotment 14, section A, across a creek reserve and along the western boundaries of allotment 15, section A, to its southern angle; thence across a road in a direct line to the north-western angle of allotment 17, section A; thence southerly along the western boundary of allotment 17, section A, to its western angle; thence across a road in a direct line to the north angle of allotment A; thence along the western boundaries of allotment A to its southern angle; thence across a road in a direct line to the western angle of allotment 1, section J; thence across Bolton-street in a direct line to the north corner of allotment 10, section I; thence south-westerly along the frontages of allotments 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, and 1, section I, to the western corner of allotment 1, section I; thence across Robert-street in a direct line to the northern angle of allotment 10, section 2; thence along the frontages to Ballendella-place of allotments 10, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 1 of section 2, to the western angle of allotment 1, section 2; thence westerly across roads in a direct line to the eastern angle of allotment 4, section K; thence along the frontages facing the Goulburn River of allotments 4 and 3A, section K, to the northern angle of allotment 3A, section K; thence north-westerly in a direct line across Tierney-street to the eastern angle of allotment 9, section L; thence along the boundaries facing the Goulburn River of allotments 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, section L, to the west angle of allotment 1, section L; thence south-westerly across a road in a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 4, section Q; thence along the frontage to the Goulburn River of allotments 4, 3, 2,

and 1, section Q, to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section Q; thence south-westerly in a direct line across roads to the north angle of allotment 14, section E; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along the boundaries of allotment 14, section E, to its southern angle; thence south-easterly in a direct line across a road to the western angle of allotment 13, section E; thence south-easterly along the frontages of allotments 13, 11, and 10, section E, to the southern angle of allotment 10, section E; thence south-easterly across a road in a direct line to the western angle of allotment 6, section E; thence south-easterly along the southern boundaries of allotments 6, 4, 3, and 2, section E, to the southern angle of allotment 2, section E; thence south-easterly in a direct line across a road to the western angle of allotment 1A, section E; thence in a south-easterly direction along the southern boundary of allotment 1A, section E, crossing the railway property to the southern angle of allotment 1A, section E; thence along the boundaries facing the Goulburn River of allotment 1A, section E, and allotments 4, 2, and 3, section V, to the south-east angle of allotment 3, section V; thence in a direct line south-easterly across a road to the western angle of allotment 48, Parish of Tallarook; thence along the boundaries of allotment 48, Parish of Tallarook, facing the Goulburn River and a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 48, Parish of Tallarook; thence in a direct line across a road and allotments 48A and 49, Parish of Tallarook, to the commencing point.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Borough of Stawell and parts of the Shire of Seymour on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the fifteenth day of May, 1950.

Town and Country Planning Acts. INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Town and Country Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land, who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until the Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

HORSHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them under the Cemeteries Acts, the Trustees of the Horsham Public Cemetery hereby rescind the Rules and Regulations previously published in the *Government Gazette*, and substitute the following:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars supplied in form Schedule A, an order obtained, and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, has been delivered to the secretary or sexton.
2. Before any interment shall be permitted all charges must be paid when the order for the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.
3. The order for interment must be given to the sexton before 12 o'clock noon on the day previous to the interment where a morning interment is required, and before 2 p.m. on the day previous to the interment where an afternoon interment is required.
4. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time of arrival at the cemetery and such time shall be punctually observed.
5. The usual hours of interment shall be between 10 a.m. and to 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday, and 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours on payment of the prescribed fees with the consent of the chairman or secretary.
6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, or any alteration made thereto, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the burial right must accompany the application.
7. Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and made airtight.
8. No adult shall be buried within 4 feet, nor child under the age of twelve years within 3 feet of the ordinary surface level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. A certificate of ground for a burial place within the cemetery may be granted by the secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule B, on payment of fees prescribed.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. Before any person commences the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, fence, railing, or enclosure, the permission of the trustees must be obtained, also payment made of fees set out in the scale of charges. Persons desiring to make such erections are required to submit designs, drawings, or descriptions, proposed location, also a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph, and such information as the trustees may require. The trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as inappropriate, unbecoming, or not sufficiently durable.
12. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection, shall be maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners. Where any monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection is allowed to fall into a state of disrepair and the owners fail to carry out repairs to the satisfaction of the trustees within seven days after the serving of written notice so to do by the trustees to the

last registered address of the owners, the trustees may remove such monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection.

13. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and the trustees may refuse to allow any vehicle conveying such material to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavourable weather. Stones, refuse, and rubbish or other materials remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the persons employed on the work, and in the event of any such refuse or other material not being removed within seven days after completion of the work the trustees may have same removed at the expense of the persons or firm carrying out such work.

14. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept and may be inspected at the office of the sexton at the cemetery.

15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, on being convicted thereof, is liable to the penalties provided by the Cemeteries Act.

16. No dogs will be allowed in the cemetery.

17. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

18. These Rules and Regulations may be altered or amended and additions made thereto from time to time by the trustees with the consent of the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts.

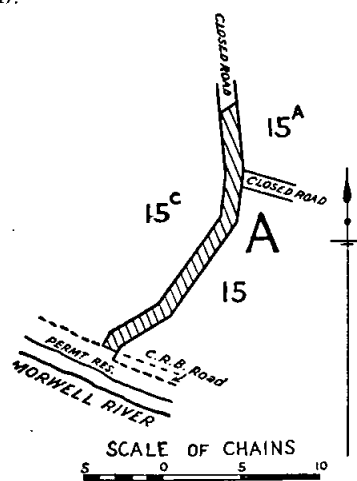

2. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use any of the appliances or equipment erected in the reserve.
3. Appliances or equipment erected shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.

4. No child shall use any of the appliances or equipment except for the special purposes for which they are respectively provided.

5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the reserve.

6. All papers, fruit, peel, or other litter, shall be placed in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

7. Every person in the reserve shall in respect to his or her conduct therein obey instructions and directions of any employee of the Council or of any member of the Police Force.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the appliances or equipment in the reserve.

9. The reserve and/or appliances or equipment therein shall not be used after sunset.

10. Any employee of the Council or member of the Police Force shall have the right to remove or exclude from the reserve any person who commits a breach of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any appliance or equipment or property in the reserve, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty prescribed for a breach of this By-law.

Every person offending against this By-law shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.
