Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do, by this my Proclamation, appoint Wednesday, the eleventh day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, as the day upon which the said Town and Country Planning (Metropolitan Area) Act 1949 shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

And, further, I do fix one as the number of managers which each council in the said Union shall elect.

 - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount:
 - (ii) inland carriage charges;
 - (iii) outside packing charges;
 - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agent's commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 32 per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount):
 - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
 - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates);
 - (vii) exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in the case of exchange in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates and in the case of bank fees three-eighths of 1 per cent.);

 - (viii) duty and primage paid;(ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid;
 - (x) harbour dues and Stevedoring Commission levy paid;
 - (xi) customs entry and customs agent's charges paid (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost); and
 - (xii) cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of current standard Master Carriers' rates)."

 - "Household refuse or garbage" shall mean all waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation of food "Wet refuse" shall mean any fluid waste matter, and water shall have the same meaning. "Garden clippings" shall mean rose prunings, hedge clippings, and all like matter, and shall include flowers.

- "Ashes" shall mean the residue of any combustible material after burning.
- 2. By-law No. 31 is hereby repealed.

Every occupier of premises within the City of Geelong West shall provide or cause to be provided and kept therein one or more ratproof, flyproof, and waterproof receptacles, made of durable non-absorbent material; such receptacle shall be cylindrical in shape and present smooth surfaces free from projections and sharp edges, and shall not be less than five nor more than 10 gallons in capacity.
 - 4. Every occupier shall-

Every occupier shall—

(a) cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use on his premises, and the covers thereof, to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition;
(b) cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary.
(c) cause such receptacles to be maintained in good order and condition;
(d) cause all household refuse arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles;

- in such receptacles;
 (e) cause all household refuse arising from his premises to be effectively wrapped in newspaper premises the material before depositing in refuse or other like material before depositing in refuse
- receptacle:

 (f) cause such receptacles to be continually covered save when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom;
- discharged therefrom;
 (g) cause a separate receptacle to be provided for the deposit of ashes;
 (h) cause such receptacles to be placed in the yard or garden of such premises close to the entrance from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which

such premises abut once a week on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse.

5. No person shall-

- (a) deposit or cause to be deposited any wet refuse in a refuse receptacle or receptacle provided for the deposit of ashes;
- (b) deposit or cause to be deposited any ashes in a refuse receptacle;
 (c) deposit or cause to be deposited any garden clip-

- pings in a refuse receptacle or receptacle provided for the deposit of ashes.
- No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.
- No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any refuse, garbage, or garden refuse in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.
- 8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Geelong West.
- 9. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Ten shillings for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Ten shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued or continued.

Subject to any limitations imposed by or pursuant to this By-law, all streets and roads and parts of streets and roads within the municipal district of the shire, with the exception of those parts in or which parking is prohibited by clause 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944, shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars and are hereinafter called "parking areas."

5. Every person parking a vehicle or leaving a vehicle in any street or road shall conform with the following Regulations:—

(a) On the south side of Nepean Highway between Jetty-road and Seventh-avenue, Rosebud, be-tween the hours of 8.45 o'clock in the fore-noon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon of any day

noon and 6 o'clock in the atternoon of any day except Sunday, no person shall park or leave standing any vehicle except in obedience to the signal of a member of the Police Force.

(b) In any street or road within the municipal district of the shire no person shall park or leave stationary any vehicle within 30 feet of an intersection or within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.

(c) No person shall park or leave any vehicle opposite any crossing or entrance.

By-law, made under section 80 of the Health Act 1928, and numbered 17, for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or any animals, including birds, or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 80 of the Health Act 1928, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

. Throughout this By-law, unless inconsistent with the subject matter-

- "Shire" shall mean the Shire of Marong.
 "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of
- Marong.
 "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector of Health of the Shire of Marong, or any person authorized by the Council to act under this By-law.
 "Animal" shall mean and include every animal other
- than an animal described as a domestic animal. "Domestic animal" shall mean and include the horse,
- cow, dog, and cat.
 "Domestic bird" shall include poultry as hereinafter
- defined, pigeon, cockatoo, parrot, and song bird.
 "Poultry" shall include turkey, goose, duck, and fowl.
 "Property" shall mean any tenement or land in
- separate occupation.
 "Dwelling-house or dwelling" shall include a livingroom, sleepout, or tent. Words importing the masculine gender shall include
- the feminine.
- Words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular, and words relating to persons shall include corpora-
- 2. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property any animal other than a domestic animal or any bird other than a domestic bird without the written

permission of the Council first had and obtained. Before granting such permission the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing or yarding of the animal or bird, as the case may be, is adequate and not offensive or injurious to health.

- 3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on property appurtenant to a dwelling or on any other property of which any boundary fence is less than 30 feet from the nearest dwelling, whether in the same or other occupation-

 - (a) more than one horse or one cow,(b) more than twenty head of adult poultry.
- 4. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property other than that described in the last clause—

 - (a) more than three horses or cows,(b) more than twenty head of adult poultry,

without the written consent of the Council first had and obtained, and before granting such permission the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing of the animals or poultry, as the case may be, is adequate and not offensive or injurious to health.

5. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any poultry, except in yards or runs having an area of not less than 200 square feet, provided that if more than 40 head of poultry are kept at any one time then for every five head in excess of such number there shall be an addi-tional space of 25 square feet, but nothing in this clause shall be interpreted so as to allow any greater number of birds to be kept than are allowed under clauses 3 or 4 of this By-law.

All such yards or runs shall be securely fenced with a fowl-proof fence, and shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state. Every such yard or run shall be—

- (a) a clear 40 feet from any dwelling-house;
 (b) at least 75 feet distant from the street on which the land upon which such yard or run is situate
- abuts as a frontage;
 (c) at least 10 feet distant from any side street on which such land abuts;
 (d) at least 5 feet distant from any other boundary of
- such land

And the Council may, upon reasonable notice to the occupier of the land on which such yard or run is situate, require him to remove or alter such yard or run so as to fulfil the aforesaid requirements.

6. In clause 5 of this By-law, where land is situated at the corner of two streets, the word "frontage" therein used shall mean the shorter of the frontages to such streets, and where the land abuts at the front and rear thereof on streets at least 40 feet wide then any such

house, shelter, yard, or run as mentioned therein shall be at least 70 feet distant from the front street and 40 feet distant from the rear street.

- 7. The occupier of any property on which any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird is kept or housed shall cause the place or keeping to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.
- 8. Any animal, bird, or domestic animal or domestic bird which shall develop diphtheria, tubercle, or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings shall forthwith be destroyed or caused to be destroyed by the person keeping the same or causing or permitting the same to be kept.
- 9. The occupier of any property upon which any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird is kept shall, at all reasonable times, afford free access to every part thereof respectively to the Health Officer or Inspector of the Shire, or either of them, or to any person or persons appointed by the Council to act under this By-law.
- 10. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law, and any person guilty of an offence against this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
