Weights and Measures Act 1928.
ADDITION TO A WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-third day of November, 1920, the Borough of Mildura and the Shires of Mildura and Walpeup were proclaimed to be a Union for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1915*:

And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of April, 1933, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*, the Shire of Swan Hill was added to such Union:

And whereas the Councils of the municipalities at present constituting such Union and the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna and Kerang have requested that the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna and Kerang be added to such Union:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the first day of April, 1950, the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna and Kerang shall be added to and form part of such Union and, at the request of the Councils of the City of Mildura, the Borough of Swan Hill, and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, Mildura, Swan Hill, and Walpeup, do fix as follows the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the *Weights and Measures Act 1928* shall be borne by the several municipalities as from the first day of April, 1950, viz.:

City of Mildura	one-seventh;
Borough of Swan Hill	one-seventh;
Shire of Cohuna	one-seventh;
Shire of Kerang	one-seventh;
Shire of Mildura	one-seventh;
Shire of Swan Hill	one-seventh;
Shire of Walpeup	one-seventh.

And, further, at the request of the Councils of the City of Mildura, the Borough of Swan Hill, and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, Mildura, Swan Hill, and Walpeup, I do hereby fix one as the number of managers for such Union that each such Council shall elect.

And, lastly, I do hereby declare that the title of the Union of the City of Mildura, the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, Mildura, Swan Hill, and Walpeup shall be the "Northern Mallee Weights and Measures Union".

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter

described, and situated within the City of Nunawading aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

Holberry-street.

All that piece of land being part of Crown allotments 116a and 116c, Parish of Nunawading, County of Bourke, known as Holberry-street, being the land described in certificates of title, volume 3050, folio 609839, and volume 5773, folio 1154404, bounded by lines commencing at a point on the east building line of Springvale-road distant 1.137 ft. 2 in. south of the north boundary of Crown allotment 116a; thence on a bearing of 89 deg. 32 min. for a distance of 567 ft. 5 in.; thence southerly along the east boundary of Crown allotment 116a for a distance of 2 ft. 9½ in.; thence on a bearing of 89 deg. 53 min. for a distance of 233 ft. 9 in.; thence on a bearing of 175 deg. 21 min. for a distance of 51 ft. 7½ in.; thence on a bearing of 269 deg. 53 min. for a distance of 237 ft. 8½ in.; thence northerly along the east boundary of Crown allotment 116a for a distance of 2 ft. 9½ in.; thence on a bearing of 269 deg. 32 min. for a distance of 567 ft. 7 in.; thence on a bearing of 8 deg. 38 min. along the east building line of Springvale-road for a distance of 51 ft. 6 in. to the point of commencement.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 49.—STANDING ORDERS.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1928* (No. 3731) and in exercise of all other powers possessed by or vested in such Board, doth hereby make the By-law and Regulation following:—

1. This By-law and Regulation shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with By-law No. 17 of the Board (therein called Standing Orders of the Board) as amended from time to time (such By-law as so amended being hereinafter referred to as "the said By-law").

2. Clause 64 of the said By-law is hereby repealed and the following clause 64 substituted therefor:—

"64. In addition to the Officers and Servants' Committee required to be appointed pursuant to section 46 of the Act, there shall be six permanent committees, to be respectively called 'Finance,' 'Water Supply,' 'Sewerage,' 'Legislative,' 'Farm,' and 'Stores' committees. The Water Supply and Sewerage Committees shall consist of ten members each, the Officers and Servants', Finance, and Farm Committees of nine members each, and the Legislative Committee of seven members, and the Stores Committee shall consist of the vice-chairmen from time to time of the Officers and Servants', Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, Legislative, and Farm Committees, and the quorum for committees shall be as follows, namely, for the Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, and Farm Committees, five, and for the Officers and Servants', Legislative, and Stores Committees, three."

3. Clause 65 is hereby amended by the insertion, after the words "several committees," of the words "with the exception of the Stores Committee."

The foregoing By-law and Regulation was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works on the twenty-eighth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and the common seal of the said Board was affixed hereto in the presence of—

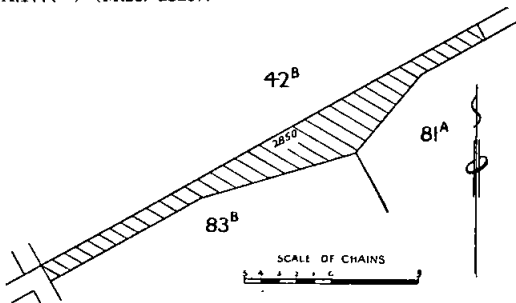

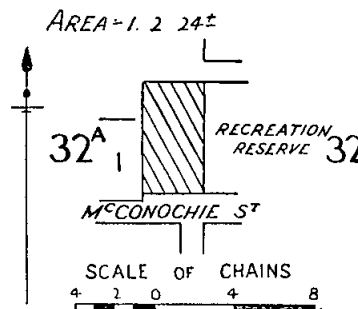

BY-LAW No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Weights and Measures Act 1928* and all other powers thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Managers of the Bacchus Marsh Weights and Measures Union of the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Bulla, Gisborne, Keilor, Melton, and Romsey order as follows:—

The fees to be paid to an Inspector or the Union for examining, comparing, and stamping, when necessary, any weights, measures, beams, scales, balances, steelyards, or other weighing instruments shall be those set forth hereunder, that is to say, for each article:—

 - Over 5 oz. troy, but not over 100 oz. troy—6d.
 - Over 100 oz. troy—1s.
- (4) Measures of capacity—
 - Not over 1 gallon—4d.
 - 2 gallons—6d.
 - 3 and 4 gallons—9d.
 - 5 gallons—1s.
 - 6 to 10 gallons—2s.
 - 11 gallons and over—3s.
 - 1 bushel—1s. 6d.
 - ½ bushel, 1 peck—1s.

The fee for each subdivision of a subdivisional measure shall be the fee prescribed for a measure of similar capacity.

(b) Weighing Instruments—

- (1) Portable weighing instruments and scales, including beam scales, counter scales, spring balances, self-indicating counter machines (non-computing), steelyards, deadweight machines, and platform weighing machines—
 - Capacity not over 14 lb.—1s.
 - Over 14 lb., and not over 2 cwt.—2s.
 - For capacities over 2 cwt. the fees shall be 2s. plus 1s. for each cwt., or part thereof, over 2 cwt.
- (2) Price—computing weighing instruments—
 - Capacity not over 10 lb.—2s. 6d.
 - Capacity over 10 lb., and not over 150 lb.—5s.
- (3) Fixed weighing instruments—
 - Capacity not over 10 cwt.—10s.
 - For capacities over 10 cwt. the fee shall be at the rate of 1s. per cwt., or part thereof, with a maximum of 40s.
- (4) Weighbridges—
 - Capacity not over 10 tons—£2.
 - Capacity over 10 tons, and not over 25 tons—£2 10s.
 - Capacity over 25 tons—£3.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made pursuant to the Motor Omnibus Acts, and numbered 73, for repealing portion of By-law No. 36 and prescribing the routes within the municipal district, or any part thereof, along which and the terminal points between which urban motor omnibuses for which licences are granted by the licensing authority may operate and the stands for such motor omnibuses.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Omnibus Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. That the portion of the Second Schedule of By-law No. 36, prescribing the routes and terminal points between which motor omnibuses may be licensed to operate on the White Hills, North Bendigo, Epsom, and Huntly routes and the stands for such motor omnibuses, be repealed, and the following substituted in place thereof:—

White Hills.

Terminal Points.—The terminal points shall be at the stand in Bull-street and at the stand at White Hills.

Route.—The route shall be from the stand in Bull-street; thence along Bridge-street, White Hills-road, Napier-street, to the stand at the Botanical Gardens, returning along Napier-street, White Hills-road, Bridge-street, Howard-place, Mundy-street, Hargreaves-street, and Bull-street, to the stand in Bull-street.

Stands.—The stands shall be in Bull-street between the Law Courts and the Conservatory, and in White Hills, main road, opposite Wellington Hotel.

Huntly.

Terminal Points.—The terminal points shall be at the stand in Bull-street and at the stand in Huntly.

Route.—The route shall be from the stand in Bull-street; thence along Bridge-street, White Hills-road, Napier-street, Midland Highway, to the stand at Huntly, returning along the Midland Highway, Napier-street, White Hills-road, Bridge-street, Howard-place, Mundy-street, Hargreaves-street, and Bull-street, to the stand in Bull-street.

Stands.—The stands shall be in Bull-street between the Law Courts and the Conservatory, and in Huntly on the north side of the Midland Highway (opposite Pederson's store).

North Bendigo.

Terminal Points.—The terminal points shall be at the stand in Pall Mall and at the stand in Sandhurst-road.

Route.—The route shall be from the stand in Pall Mall; thence along Park-road, Barnard-street, Arnold-street, Holmes-road, and Sandhurst-road, to the stand in Sandhurst-road, returning along Sandhurst-road, Holmes-road, Arnold-street, Barnard-street, Park-road, Howard-place, Mundy-street, Hargreaves-street, and Bull-street, to the stand in Pall Mall.

Stands.—The stands shall be in Pall Mall on the north side opposite the Conservatory, and at Sandhurst-road, near the intersection of Nelson-street.

2. Subject to the provisions of clause 15 of By-law No. 36, the drivers of motor omnibuses on the White Hills, Huntly, and North Bendigo routes shall stop to pick up or set down passengers at the point in Bull-street near the southern intersection of Pall Mall indicated by the words "Bus Stop" painted on the roadway.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 118.

A By-law of the City of Essendon, and numbered 118, for prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages, and prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land, and the provision, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the Health Acts and of any and every other Act or power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land, unless the same be deposited in such a receptacle and in such manner as is hereinafter provided.

3. The occupier of every premises shall provide and keep at such premises a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish, or so many of such receptacles as may be necessary to contain all refuse and rubbish from such premises, and shall cause all such refuse and rubbish to be placed in such receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay.

4. All refuse or rubbish likely to become offensive shall be rolled in paper before being placed in any such receptacle.

5. No such receptacle shall exceed 3 cubic feet in volume, and every such receptacle shall be constructed of iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and shall be fitted with handles for convenience of moving and emptying, and shall be provided with a close-fitting metal cover so constructed as to exclude the entry of rats, flies, and other vermin and insects.

6. The occupier of every premises shall on the day of which the Council notifies him that refuse and rubbish shall be collected from such premises place the receptacle or receptacles provided by him as aforesaid immediately inside a gate of such premises leading to a street upon which such premises front, abut, or adjoin.

7. The occupier of every premises shall cause every such receptacle on his premises to be kept at all times clean and disinfected, and to be kept at all times properly covered with such close-fitting metal cover provided as aforesaid.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

9. Clauses 1 to 8a, both inclusive, and clauses 11 and 14 of By-law No. 68 are hereby repealed.
