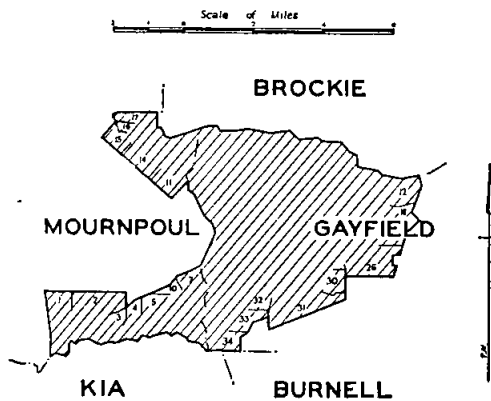

NORTH WEST MALLEE SETTLEMENT AREA.
ANNUELLO-KOOLONONG (EXTENDED).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI., intituled the *North West Mallee Settlement Areas Act 1948*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any area of land in the North West Mallee to be a North West Mallee Settlement Area for the purposes of the aforesaid Act: And whereas, by Proclamation dated the twentieth day of September, 1949, certain areas in the Counties of Karkaroc and Tatchera were declared to be a North West Mallee Settlement Area to be known as the Annuello-Kooloonong Settlement Area: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that the Annuello-Kooloonong Settlement Area is hereby extended by the addition thereto of the areas indicated by hachure on plan hereunder, together with allotment 18, Parish of Geera, County of Karkaroc; allotment 45, Parish of Pines; and allotment 18, Parish of Piambie, County of Tatchera.

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).
DECLARING THAT ONIONS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE ONION MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same.

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to onions and assigned to such Board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, all onions shall, subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Onion Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such onions shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to the Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same.

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 24th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 7th April, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to chicory and assigned to such Board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, all chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

Marine Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1928*, and under all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine, as follows:—

That on and after the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or *vice versa*, for steamships and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to and including 6,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be Two pence half-penny (2½d.) per ton, and for every additional ton over 6,000 tons, Three farthings (¾d.), calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, subject in any case to a minimum charge of Five pounds (£5) and a maximum charge of One hundred pounds (£100).

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the 9th day of March, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1950.

THE Alexandra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Alexandra Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building be less than Thirteen shillings and four pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1950, and shall be payable on the 10th day of April, 1950, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without any further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

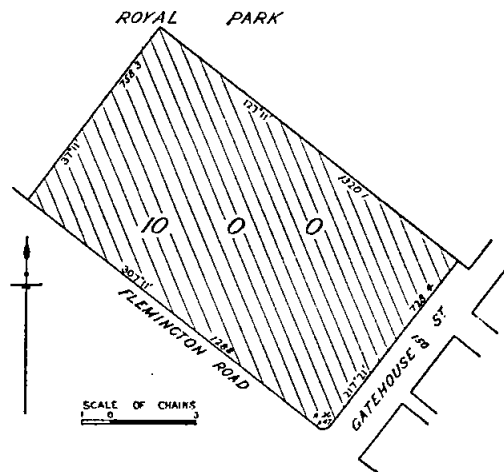

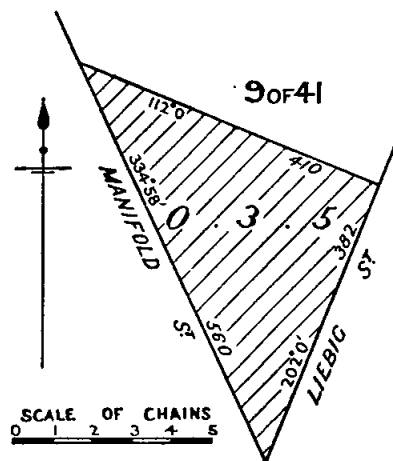

The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. 6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the Schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. 14. The contractor shall not insure the material against war risk. Provided the material is consigned on a separate bill of lading to the Government of Victoria, any loss or damage in transit occasioned by any war risks to which

the material may be subject whilst on board ship shall be to Victorian Government account, subject to the production by the contractor of documentary evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board.

15. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.

16. Every account shall be in prescribed form, setting out the contract and item numbers, and shall furnish full details of how it is made up.

17. Payment for supplies will be made in Melbourne when same have been accepted.

Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purpose of this contract, the

Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case, he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.)

Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

18. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

19. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical, High, or Higher Elementary Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

Teaching Service Act 1946.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 4A of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1946, in the manner following, that is to say:—

Rescind the whole of Regulation 4A and substitute therefor the following:—

REGULATION 4A.

APPEALS.

A. *Professional Officers.*

1. The Director shall furnish the Tribunal with a requisition for the making of an appointment to any vacancy which occurs for a professional officer in the Education Department and shall attach thereto a summary of the duties and of the appropriate qualifications for such position.

2. The Tribunal, after discussion with the Director, may alter, vary, or amend such duties and qualifications and shall cause the position to be advertised in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

3. Applications will close with the Tribunal on the date stated in such advertisement, which date shall be not less than fourteen days after the date upon which the advertisement is published in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

4. Applications will be listed by the Tribunal in lexicographical order and forwarded to the Director.

5. The Director shall, within twenty-one days after the date on which the applications are received by him, notify the Tribunal of the name of the applicant recommended by the special committee and submit to the Tribunal such information as the special committee deems desirable. The Director shall at the same time notify in writing all applicants of the name of the recommended applicant.

6. Any applicant who feels aggrieved by the failure of the special committee to recommend him for appointment may appeal, in writing, to the Tribunal within fourteen days of the notification to him by the Director of the name of the recommended applicant. The appellant shall state—

- (a) the grounds of his appeal; and
- (b) whether he desires to appear in person before the Tribunal.

7. Subject to clause 13 of this Regulation any appellant shall be entitled to appear in person before the Tribunal to support his appeal.

B. *Position on the Classified Roll in the Primary, Secondary, and Technical Schools' Divisions.*

8. (a) Every appeal by a teacher who feels aggrieved at the decision of any committee of classifiers—

- (i) with respect to the sub-class in which he is placed on any revision of the classified roll; or
- (ii) with respect to any revision of his classification by which his classification is reduced—

shall be made in writing, shall set forth fully the grounds of the appeal, and whether or not the appellant desires to appear in person on the hearing of the appeal, and shall be delivered to the Tribunal on or before the expiration of fourteen days after the day on which he was notified by the classifiers of the decision against which the appeal is made.

(b) A teacher shall be deemed to have been notified of a decision of a committee of classifiers affecting his classification on the day on which there is published a copy of the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*, or any supplement thereto, or any circular issued by the Education Department, in which there appears notification of such decision: Provided that when there is a delay in the issue of the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* the Tribunal will accept appeals within a period of fourteen days from the date of its general issue to schools.

C. Promotions in the Secondary and Technical Schools' Divisions.

9. The provisions of clause 8 of this Regulation with such adaptations as are necessary shall apply to every appeal to the Tribunal by an applicant against an appointment where a vacancy in the Secondary Schools Division or the Technical Schools Division is filled by way of promotion.

D. Promotion List for the Primary Schools Division.

10. The provisions of clause 8 of this Regulation with such adaptations as are necessary shall apply to every appeal to the Tribunal by a teacher in the first sub-class of his class who is not placed in an annual promotion list.

E. General.

11. When an appeal is allowed the Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of train fares and reasonable personal expenses to a successful appellant who is required to travel to Melbourne to support his appeal.

12. When a recommended applicant is appointed to a vacant office the Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of train fares and reasonable personal expenses to him if he is required to travel to Melbourne to support his application, and the Tribunal may authorize such reimbursement to a recommended applicant who is not appointed to a vacant office.

13. An appellant who is not a member of the teaching service shall not have the right to appeal in person before the Tribunal, but may be granted permission by the Tribunal to do so.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under the provisions of the Health Acts and any other Act enabling, and numbered 138, for fixing fees for examining and branding carcasses or meat of animals.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power it thereunder enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, with the approval of the Public Health Commission, hereby order as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, By-law No. 131 and clause 4 of Regulation No. 22 is hereby repealed.

2. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, the following clause shall be included in Regulation No. 22:—

No. 4. The fees payable for examining and branding any carcass, part of carcass, or meat, by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector, shall be as follows:—

(a) Bull, cow, calf, heifer, ox, or steer	.. 4d.
(b) Goat, kid, lamb, or sheep	.. 1d.
(c) Swine	.. 4d.

And such fees shall be paid to the City Treasurer, Town Hall, Footscray, once at least in each fortnight, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

Health Act 1928.

SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

No. 4 BY-LAW, RELATING TO THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Beechworth, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the area described in the Township of Beechworth, viz.:— Commencing at the most south-easterly point formed by the intersection of a line running parallel to and distant 2 chains from the eastern boundary of Buckland-road and a line running parallel 1½ chain on the southern boundary of Mellish-street; thence by a line running north-westerly for a distance of 34½ chains by a line parallel to and distant 1½ chain from the southern boundary of Mellish-street to a point on allotment 12, section 2A, 50 links from the Bridge-street boundary of the said allotment; thence by a line running north-westerly for a distance of 24½ chains to a point on allotment 14, section 28, distant 1½ chain from the Loch-street boundary of the said allotment and 2½ chains from its northern boundary; thence by a line running north-easterly for a distance of 12½ chains running parallel to and distant 1½ chain from the western boundary of Loch-street; thence by a line running at right angles to the last for a distance of 3½ chains in a north-westerly direction, parallel to and 1½ chain distant from the southern boundary of Church-street to the eastern boundary of Finch-street; thence north-easterly along the said boundary of Finch-street to its intersection with the southern boundary of Church-street; thence north-westerly along the southern boundary of Church-street for a distance of 12 chains; thence by a line running at right angles to the last in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 55 chains, running parallel to and distant 1½ chain from the western boundary of Last-street to the most northerly point of allotment 7, section 36, on the south-western boundary of Sydney-road; thence south-easterly along the said western boundary of Sydney-road for a distance of 11½ chains; thence by a line running north-easterly across Sydney-road at a right angle to the last and continuing in the same direction by a line constituting the boundaries between allotments 3 and 4 and allotments 2 and 3, section A, to its intersection with the south-western boundary of Balaclava-road; thence south-easterly along the said boundary of Balaclava-road and its elongation to the centre line of the Beechworth-Yackandandah Railway Line; thence by the said centre line of railway in a south-easterly direction to a point intersected by a line running parallel to and 1 chain on the north-east of the north-eastern boundary of Albert-road; thence south-easterly by the said parallel line to its point of intersection with the boundary between allotments 10 and 13, both of section F2; thence south-westerly to a point on the south-western boundary of allotment 19, section D2, distant 3½ chains from the western corner of allotment 16, section D2, being the intersection of the north-eastern boundary of Fletcher-road with the eastern boundary of Buckland-road; thence from the said point of the said boundary of allotment 19, section D2, in a southerly direction, a distance of 14 chains, by a line running parallel to and distant 2 chains from the eastern boundary of Buckland-road to the point of commencement; and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context of subject matter, "proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof. "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage or manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises, shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any leakage or other means of escape of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and fitted with properly attached side lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a close fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance of such house, building, and premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which the house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council in that behalf.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The Contractor or person authorized by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into vehicle provided for its reception. Such person or Contractor shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, when as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by such method as may be approved by the Commission and in such a manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the Contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material so as not to create a nuisance.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable

to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
