Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquire for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Eltham has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used as streets within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Eltham aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the District Advisory Committee Election Regulations 1950 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Not less than fourteen days before the holding of elections for the selection of persons to be eligible for appointment as persons representing grazing, agricultural, and other relevant interests on a district advisory committee for a soil conservation district the Authority shall—

- (1) cause to be published in local newspapers circulating in the said district; and
- (2) forward to each municipal clerk of a municipality within the said district—

a notice setting out—

- (a) that elections are to be held for the purpose aforesaid;
- (b) the centres at which public meetings are to be held for the purpose of conducting such elections;
- (c) the time and date on, and the places at, which the public meeting is to be held at each centre; and
- (d) that all owners or occupiers of grazing, agricultural, or other relevant land in the said district are entitled to be present at such public meetings and to vote at the elections held thereat.

3. Each municipal clerk shall, on the receipt of the said notice from the Authority, cause such notice to be posted, and to remain posted until after the holding of the public meetings referred to therein, at the municipal office of the municipality of which he is municipal clerk.

4. (1) At each such public meeting a person authorized for the purpose by the Authority shall preside and shall—

- (a) call for nominations by such owners and occupiers of candidates for election as a person representing grazing, agricultural, and other relevant interests on the said district advisory committee;
- (b) if there is only one nomination, declare the person so nominated elected; and
- (c) if there are more than one nomination, submit the names of the persons nominated to the meeting (in order of nomination) for election by a show of hands or by ballot of such owners and occupiers, and shall declare elected the person who receives the greatest number of votes.

(2) One person only shall be elected at each public meeting.

5. The person who presides at such a public meeting shall forthwith forward to the Authority, at its office in Melbourne, a signed statement of the result of the election at such public meeting.

And the Honorable Henry Edward Bolte, M.L.A., Minister for Conservation for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

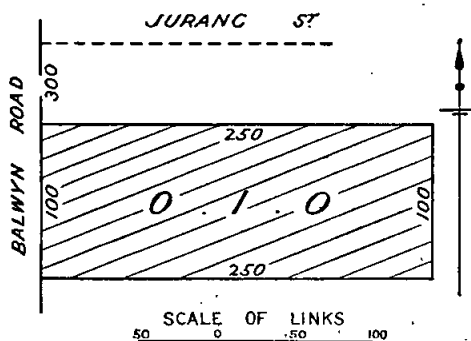

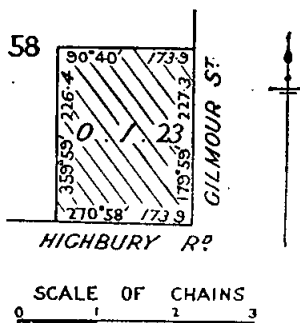

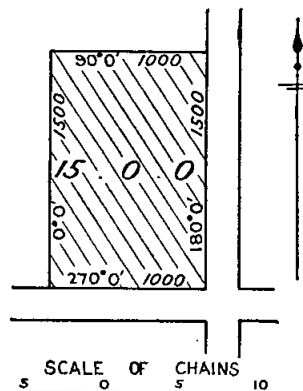
ELGAR'S CROWN SPECIAL SURVEY



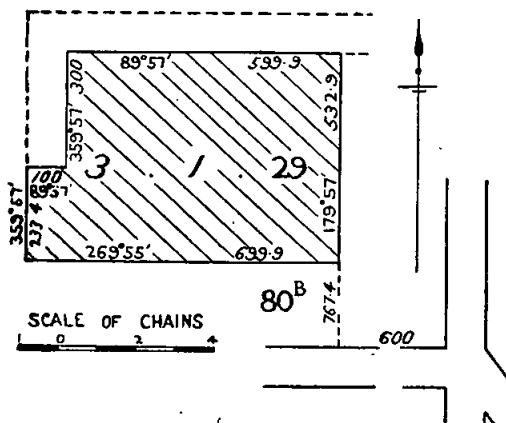

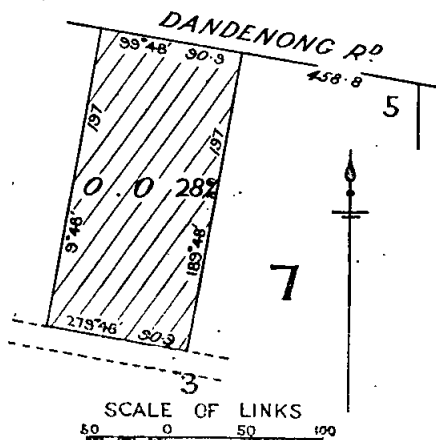
