DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1950.

PROPOSTION.

Males.

One male improver to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving not less than 162s. per week of 40 hours.

PROPORTION.

Female Improvers.

Two female improvers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 106s. 3d. per week of 40 hours.

JUVENILE WORKERS.

Two juvenile workers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 106s. 3d. per week of 40 hours.

Note.—A juvenile worker is a female person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in bagmaking at machining, cutting, turning, folding, breaking-off, or flying.
