AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

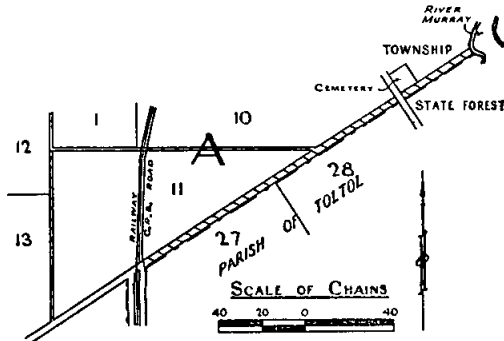
Parish of Beerik, County of Dundas, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(B.393⁽²⁾) (D.3656).



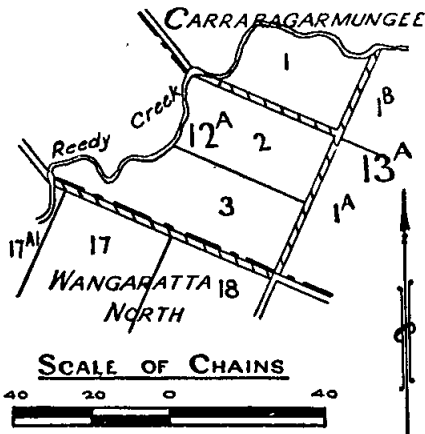
Parish of Bruk Bruk, County of Dundas, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(B.470^(B2)) (D.3656).



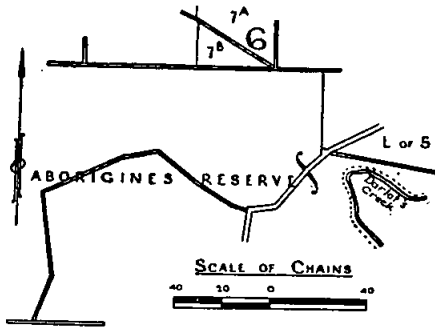

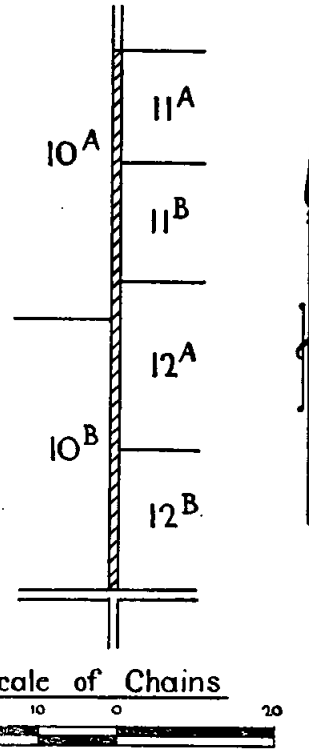

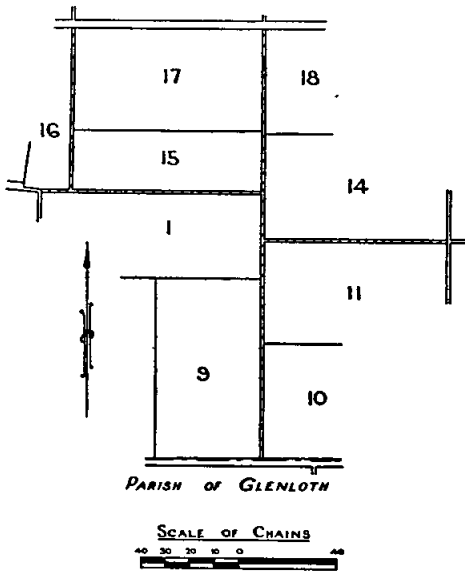
Parish of Condah, County of Normanby, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(C.362(3) (D.9259).



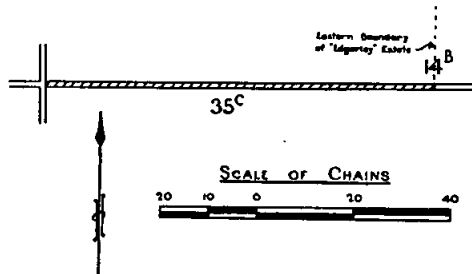
Parish of Willaura, County of Ripon, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(W.246(2) (D.1829).



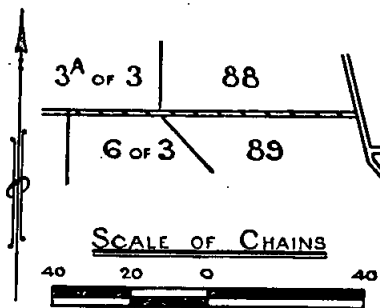
Parish of Jeruk, County of Gladstone, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(J.35(2) (D.7765).



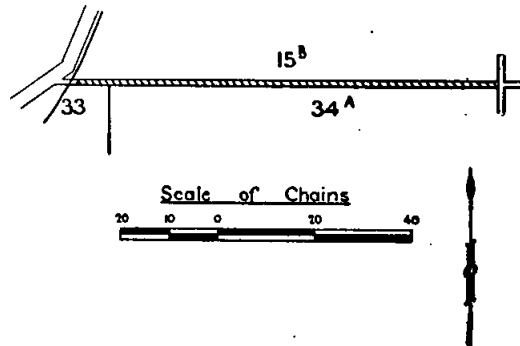
Parish of Willaura, County of Ripon, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(W.246(2) (D.1829).



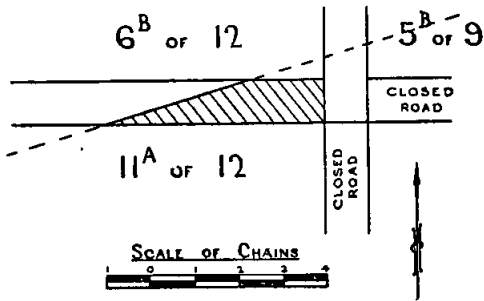
Parish of Wagra, County of Benambra, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(W.292(5) (D.7696).



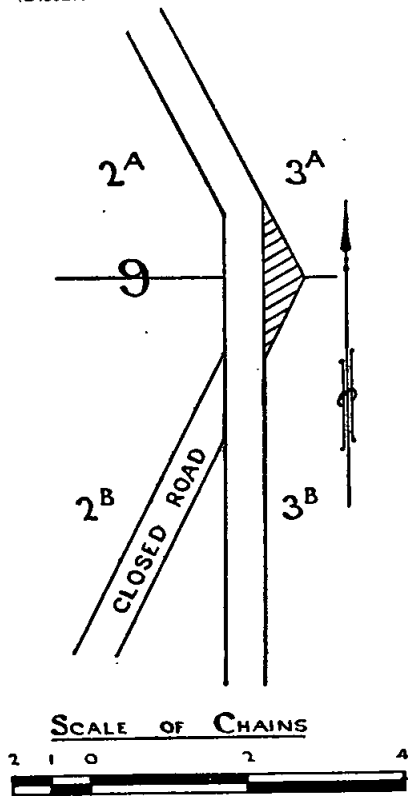
Parish of Willaura, County of Ripon, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(W.246(2) (D.1829).

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

MOUNT MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1950.

THE Mount Macedon Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of the municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Mount Macedon Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1950, and shall be payable on the 31st day of May, 1950, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons up to 300,000 gallons, and One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons in excess of this amount.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

AMENDMENT OF AIRCRAFT TRADES REGULATIONS
(No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation 9 of the Aircraft Trades Regulations (No. 1) as from the beginning of the first full pay period to commence in May, 1950, and doth hereby substitute therefor the following, that is to say:—

1. The rescission of any Regulations by these Regulations shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or the liability of any person under such rescinded Regulations, where such right accrued or such liability was incurred prior to the coming into operation of these Regulations.

2. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, as from the beginning of the first full pay period to commence in May, 1950, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and of the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

1st year—at the rate of 38s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 54s. 6d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 72s. 6d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 114s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 143s. 0d. per week.

AMENDMENT OF BOILERMAKING AND/OR STEEL
CONSTRUCTION TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 2).

3. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to penalties, impositions, and requirements prescribed by Regulations 301 to 307 inclusive of Chapter 3 of the Uniform Building Regulations 1945, Victoria.

On the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight.

3. The times and hours during or at which respectively any such registered hall or other building used for public meetings or any registered building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be closed shall be from Twelve o'clock midnight on each week-day night to the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding week-day.

Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall extend or be applied to any registered hall or building to prevent the holding of public worship therein on Sundays, or lectures (without the use of a biograph or such like apparatus) of an educational nature between the hours of half-past Two and half-past Five o'clock on Sunday afternoons, or free instrumental performances conducted by bands or orchestras subsidized by the Council of the City of Footscray whereat collections only are to be made to defray expenses, between the hours of half-past Eight and half-past Ten o'clock on Sunday evenings.

Further provided that nothing in this Regulation contained shall extend or be applied to any registered hall or building to prevent the extension of the time for the holding of a ball therein on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday until Two o'clock a.m. on the next succeeding day.

TOWN OF CASTLEMAINE.

BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law of the Town of Castlemaine, made under section 80 of the Health Acts, and numbered 100, for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place of any animals (including birds) or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Healths Acts and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the Town of Castlemaine, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following By-law, and order as follows:—

1. All existing By-laws of the Council (if any) so far as they relate to matters and things provided for herein shall be and are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Castlemaine, and shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. Throughout this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Council" means the Council of the Town of Castlemaine.

"Inspector" means the Inspector of Health of the Town of Castlemaine, or person authorized by the Council to act under this By-law.

"Animal" shall mean and include every animal other than an animal described as a domestic animal.

"Domestic animal" shall mean and include the ass, mule, cow, calf, goat, dog, cat, and horse.

"Bird" shall mean and include every bird other than a bird described as a domestic bird.

"Domestic bird" shall mean and include turkey, goose, duck, fowl, pigeon, and song bird.

"Property" shall include any tenement or land in separate occupation.

"Dwelling" includes living room, sleepout, or tent.

"Poultry yard" includes buildings, pens, roosts, yards, runs, or other enclosures or places wherein domestic birds are kept or congregate.

4. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any animal or bird other than domestic animals or domestic birds on any property without the written permission of the Council.

Before granting such permission the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing of same is adequate and not likely to become offensive or injurious to health.

5. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property any domestic animal other than a dog or cat except in a suitable enclosure, every part of which shall be a clear 30 feet from any dwelling.

6. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any domestic birds other than song birds except in yards, pens, or runs having an area of not less than 100 square feet, provided that if more than 25 head of birds are kept at any one time, then for every 25 head in excess of such number there shall be an additional space of 100 square feet.

Provided further that such yards, pens, or runs shall at all times be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state to the satisfaction of the Council or its inspector.

All such yards, or pens or runs shall be a clear 30 feet from any dwelling, and if, in the opinion of the Council, the removal of a poultry yard any part of which is within 30 feet of any house is necessary, the Council may order the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such poultry yard is situated to remove such portions as may be within 30 feet of any house.

7. No person shall within 30 feet of any house establish or construct or cause, permit, or suffer any poultry yard to be newly constructed or established, nor within such distance cause, permit, or suffer any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a poultry yard.

8. The occupier or owner of any property whereon any animals or birds or domestic animals or domestic birds are kept or housed shall cause the place of keeping to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition with particular attention to the drainage.

9. (a) Any person who fails to do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by or under this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(b) Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day upon which the offence shall continue after the expiry date of the time limit, as specified in the notice served on such person by the Council.

BY-LAW No. 28.

A By-law of the Shire of Healesville, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 28, for appointing in streets and roads, standing places for motor cars and for regulating the use of any such standing places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville order as follows:—

1. In this By-law and the Schedule hereto unless the context otherwise requires—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Healesville.

"Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car.

"Limit of Parking" where parking lines are painted on a street or road means within the lines indicating the space in which a motor car may be parked or left standing.

"Motor Car" means a motor car within the meaning of section 3 of the *Motor Car Act 1928*, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places may be fixed or appointed by the council of any municipality under the powers conferred by any enactment other than sub-section 7 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, but shall not include a motor truck or motor bus as herein defined.

"Motor Bus" means any motor vehicle designed primarily for the carriage of passengers which vehicle has seating accommodation for more than seven passengers.

"Motor Truck" means any motor vehicle designed primarily for the carriage of goods, which vehicle, including any trailer or semi-trailer (if any) attached thereto exceeds twenty feet in length.

"Parking Area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the council under any By-law.

"Parking Lines" means the lines painted on the street or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor car and to define the limit of parking or standing space within which a motor car shall park or stand.

2. By-law No. 26 is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district within the Township of Healesville set out in the Schedule hereto.

4. The streets and roads and/or parts of streets and roads set out in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "car parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars and horse-drawn vehicles within the Township of Healesville on the days during the hours and for the periods of time as set out in the said First Schedule in columns 2, 3, and 4 thereof.

5. The streets and roads and/or parts of streets and roads set out in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "bus parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor buses within the Township of Healesville on the days during the hours and for the periods of time as set out in the said Second Schedule in columns 2, 3, and 4 thereof.

6. The streets or roads and/or parts of streets or roads set out in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "truck parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor trucks within the Township of Healesville on the days during the hours and for the periods of time as set out in the said Third Schedule in columns 2, 3, and 4 thereof.

7. The method of parking in the several parking areas shall be as set out in column 5 of the said respective Schedules opposite the parking area described in column 1 of the said Schedule.

8. (a) A driver of a motor car or horse-drawn vehicle shall not park a vehicle driven by him in a bus parking area or a truck parking area.

(b) A driver of a motor bus shall not park a vehicle driven by him in a car parking area or a truck parking area.

(c) A driver of a motor truck shall not park a vehicle driven by him in a car parking area or a bus parking area.

9. Every driver shall conform to the method of parking set out in the Schedule applicable to the parking area in which he shall park his vehicle and—

(a) as directed by the parking attendant in charge of the parking area if an attendant be present, or

(b) if no such attendant be present shall park his vehicle in the order of his arrival at the parking area and in such manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to a vehicle already parked and in such manner as not to cause obstruction to a vehicle parking or moving from the place occupied by it.

10. A driver of a motor car shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor car to be parked or left standing in such a manner as to extend beyond the painted lines (if any) marking the limit of parking in any parking area.

11. A driver of a vehicle used or adopted for use in the carrying of live stock shall not cause, allow, or permit such motor car to be parked in any parking area set out in the First, Second, or Third Schedule to this By-law.

12. A driver of a motor car, motor bus, motor truck, or horse-drawn vehicle shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor car to be parked in any street or road or portion of a street or road in a position—

(1) (a) marked on the street or road "no park" or by a "no parking" traffic standard, or
(b) marked on the roadway "bus stop", or
(c) marked on the roadway "safety zone".

(2) In any position prohibited as set out in clause 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944.

(Copy of clause 26 is set out at the foot of this By-law for information of persons consulting the By-law.)

13. The Council may from time to time fix or appoint openings through and in any parking area for cross traffic, and may vary such openings.

14. The Council may appoint, alter, or vary the hours during which parking areas or any of them shall be available for use.

15. A driver of a vehicle shall not cause, permit, suffer, or allow any vehicle driven by him to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established or set apart for any purpose prescribed by this By-law or for any cross traffic, and such obstruction or occupation by any vehicle of any such opening is prohibited.

16. The Council may by resolution from time to time—

(a) discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any standing place for motor cars, motor buses, motor trucks, or horse-drawn vehicles appointed under any By-law, and

(b) may appoint or employ officers and attendants for any standing places so appointed and remove any such officer or attendant.

17. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council, or otherwise authorized by the Council, shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or building, or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building.

18. No person not being an officer or employee of or otherwise authorized by the Council shall affix any notice,

sign, or other thing on to or in any street or footway, or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, erection, or other thing upon or into any street or footway.

19. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

No building shall be built or erected on land fronting to or abutting upon any of the streets or roads, or portions of streets or roads set out in the First Schedule to this By-law, and for a distance of 140 feet on each side thereof, unless such building is enclosed by walls of brick or stone laid in mortar or concrete, or other approved hard or incombustible material.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

2. (a) The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3, of Table 803 of the *Uniform Building Regulations Victoria* (hereinafter called the *Regulations*) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout those portions of the Municipal District, set out and described in paragraph 1 hereof, relating to brick areas.

(b) The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the *Uniform Building Regulations Victoria*, are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout all portions of the Municipal District, other than those set out and described in the said paragraph 1.

Distance from Street Alignment.

3. The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or II. occupancy from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 25 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

4. Subject to the Regulations made pursuant to section 17 of the *Slum Reclamation and Housing Act*, the Council may, upon written application being made to it, permit any person to:—

- (a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the *Regulations*, or in clause 806 of the *Regulations*; or
- (b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class VI. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 808 of the *Regulations*.

provided in all such cases that on the date of commencement of the *Regulations* such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or was shown on a plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the *Regulations*, the Council may, upon written application being made to it, dispense with the requirements of clause 811 of the *Regulations*.

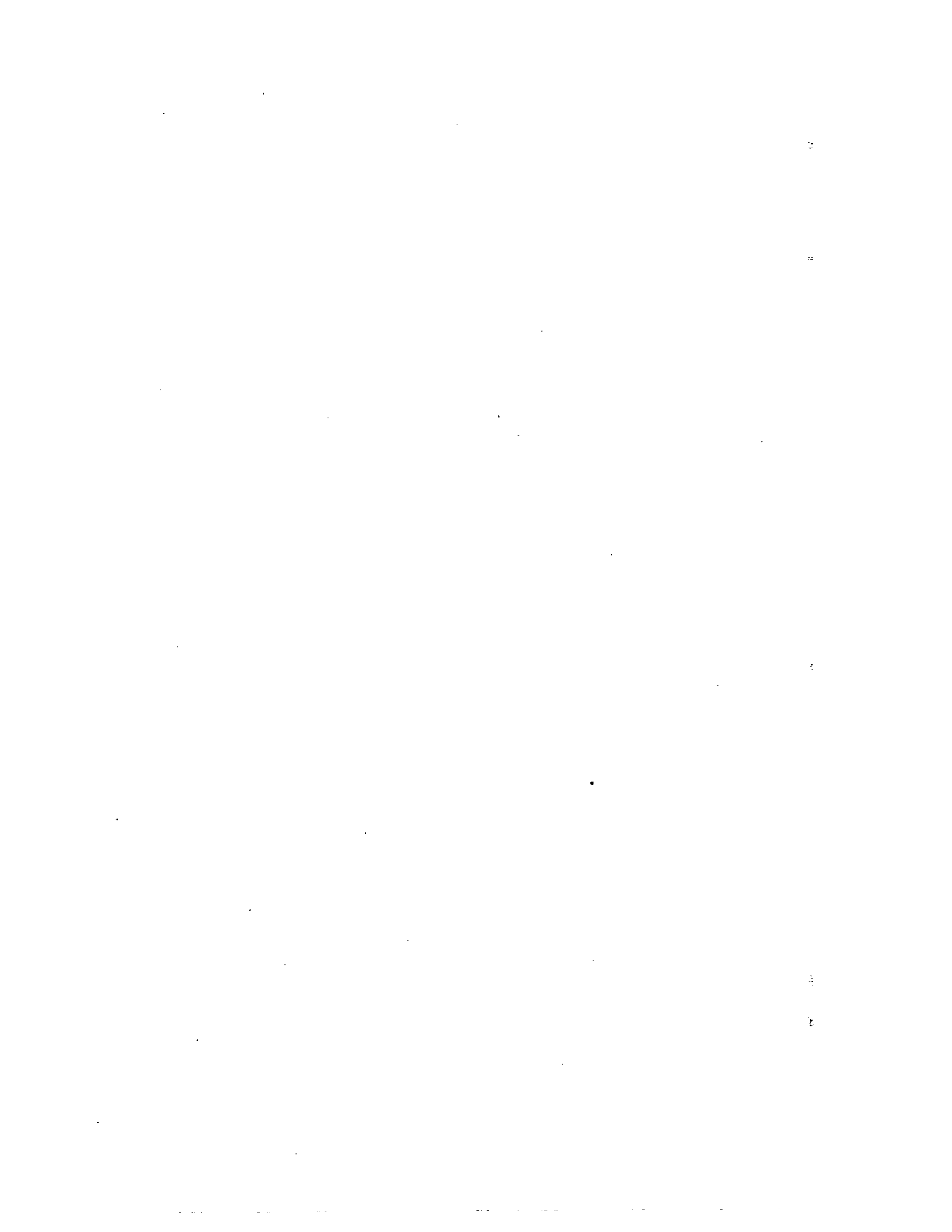

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CANTEEN WORKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which has the power to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) engaged in or in connexion with the supply of goods, food, drink, or meals to workers in manufacturing, trading, or commercial undertakings”, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1950, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

HOURS FOR A WEEK'S WORK.

3. The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 40.

TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

4. Times of beginning and ending work shall be within the hours prescribed by any Award, Determination or Agreement covering the majority of employees in the industry.

OVERTIME.

5. All times worked in excess of those prescribed by Clause 3 of this Determination shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.

6. (a) Employees (other than casuals) shall be engaged by the week and paid by the week.
 (b) Weekly employees to be entitled to a full week's wage shall be available, ready, and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employee affected.
 (c) The provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) hereof shall not apply if there is a stoppage of work for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible through any strike, breakdown of machinery or other cause, proof of which shall be on the employer.
 (d) (i) Except in the case of misconduct by either employer or employee, weekly employees to terminate employment shall be entitled to or shall give one week's notice, or in lieu thereof, one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be.
 (ii) This shall not effect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency or neglect of duty, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.
 (iii) If employment is terminated through any cause all monies due to the employee shall be paid on the day of termination.

CASUAL EMPLOYEES.

7. Casual employees, i.e., employees engaged by the hour shall, in the case of females, be paid at the rate of time and a third with a minimum of four hours each day up to a maximum of twenty hours per week, and for each hour thereafter in excess of twenty hours, at the ordinary wages rate, but not so as to exceed an ordinary week's wage.

MEAL BREAK.

8. A break of not less than half an hour and not more than one hour shall be allowed each day or shift for a meal which shall be provided free of cost to the employee.

ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.

9. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

SICK LEAVE.

10. Employees (including casuals) shall be entitled to sick leave to the extent as provided by any Award, Determination or Agreement for the general body of employees in the industry in connexion with which they are employed, at the rate of wage they would have received had they been working.
 Provided that the sick leave shall not exceed 40 hours of working time in any year.

UNIFORMS.

11. Uniforms shall be supplied free of cost to the employee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

12. Employees shall be entitled to the same terms and conditions as regards—

- Public Holidays,
- Special Rates for Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays,
- Right of Entry of Union Officials,
- Time and Wages Book, and
- Shift Work.

as those provided by any Award, Determination or Agreement for the general body of employees in the industry in connexion with which they are employed: Provided that if such Award, Determination or Agreement does not make provision for casual employees, then such casual employees shall not be entitled to payment for Public Holidays.

DEFINITIONS.

13. "Cook (Grade 1)" means a cook who is in charge of one or more cooks, and substantially directs operations in the kitchen.
 "Cook (Grade 2)" means a cook working under the supervision of a cook (Grade 1).
 "Cook working alone" means a cook working without other cooks, and substantially in charge of kitchen operations.
 "Supervisor" means a female employee who supervises the work of other employees.
 "Attendant" means an employee (whether male or female) who, except otherwise defined, is engaged in or in connexion with the supply of goods, food, drinks or meals in canteens to workers employed in manufacturing, trading or commercial undertakings.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

14. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted as prescribed by Clause 15. Provided that the wages of adult females and improvers shall be adjusted from time to time by increasing or decreasing the said rates in the same proportion as the amount of increase or decrease of the basic wage bears to the basic wage current immediately prior to the adjustment. Such adjustments shall be calculated to the nearest threepence, half or less than half of threepence to be disregarded.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

- 15 (a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.
 (b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1950, the amounts of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 14.
 (c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in an August, a November, a February, or a May, the amount of the needs basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .087 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.

DETERMINATION OF THE SOFTGOODS—WHOLESALE—BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed selling softgoods in wholesale warehouses" has made the following Determination, namely:—

MEAL MONEY.

6. Any employee required to work after 6.30 p.m. shall be paid not less than 4s. meal money in addition to the overtime rates as prescribed for in this Determination.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

7. Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof. This provision shall only apply in the case of an employee who has been employed continuously for three months or more.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RATION.

8. Where an employer owing to slackness of trade desires to ration his employees, he shall give at least one clear working day's notice to each employee of his intention to ration such employee.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

9. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* No. 5111 and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

SICK PAY.

10.—(a) Any employee not attending for duty who has had not less than twelve months' continuous service with the same employer shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill health or accident for more than six days in any one calendar year.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof, if the full period of sick leave as prescribed is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding eighteen days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year without deduction of pay.

For the purposes of this sub-clause service prior to 22nd April, 1946, shall be disregarded.

SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.

11. The special rates for all work done on Sundays or the undermentioned public holidays shall be—

Sunday	Double time.
New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day,
King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day	Double time.

But if by Act of Parliament or Proclamation any other day be substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

UNIFORMS.

12. Where any employee is required to wear any special uniform, dress, frock, overall, or dustcoat, such garment or garments shall be supplied by the employer and laundered free of cost to the employee. The garment or garments shall remain the property of the employer.

REST PERIOD.

13. A rest period of 10 minutes, at a time to be mutually arranged, shall be allowed employees during each morning.

REFERENCE.

14. An employee, on severing his or her connexion with an employer, shall be entitled to and shall receive from such employer a reference in writing, stating his or her period of service and qualifications. This provision shall apply only in the case of an employee who has been employed continuously for nine months or more.

TIME AND WAGES RECORDS.

15. An employer shall keep time and wages records showing the name of each employee, the hours worked each week by, and the wages and overtime paid to each employee.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

16. The wages rates set out in clause 2 for adult males and adult females "employed in any other departments" are based upon the following basic wage rates, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted as prescribed by Clause 7. Provided that the wages of other adult females shall be increased or decreased by 9d. for every 1s. increase or decrease in the basic wage and apprentices or improvers shall be adjusted from time to time by increasing or decreasing the said rates in the same proportion as the amount of increase or decrease of the basic wage bears to the basic wage current immediately prior to the adjustment. Such adjustments shall be calculated to the nearest threepence, half or less than half of threepence to be disregarded.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

17. (a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1950, the amounts of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 16.

(c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in an August, a November, a February, or a May, the amount of the Needs Basic Wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .037 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD TRADE BOARD.

NOTES (i).—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria as follows:—

- (a) Clauses 1 to 16 inclusive apply to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Orders in Council thereunder, and such portion of the Shires of Doncaster and Tomplestowe (other than the township of Warrandyte) as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Chelsea, Geelong, Geelong West, Mildura, Mordialloc, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sobastopol; the township of Merbein; the township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and of Strathfieldsaye; the township of Spring Gully, in the Shire of Strathfieldsaye; such portion of the Shire of Broadmeadows as is south of Somerton-road; the Shire of Dandenong; the Doulta Galla Riding of the Shire of Keilor, and such portion of the Maribyrnong Riding of the said Shire as is within 3 miles of the St. Albans Post Office; the Shire of Mulgrave; such portions of the Shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio as are within a radius of 5 miles of the Geelong Post Office; and portions of the Shire of Werribee as are within a radius of 3 miles of the Altona Post Office and such portions of the Shire of Mildura as are within a radius of 1 mile of the Red Cliffs Post Office and the Irymple Post Office respectively.
- (b) Clause 1 and clauses 17 to 29 inclusive apply to the whole of the State *outside and excepting* those parts enumerated in the preceding paragraph.
- (ii) On 31st May, 1938, the Bread Board, the Country Bread Board, and the Provincial Bread Board were deprived of the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for bread making or baking," and such power was conferred exclusively on the Bread Trade Board.
- (iii) The Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship indenture.
- (iv) Breadmaking and baking were proclaimed on 12th December, 1938, as Apprenticeship Trades under the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* for the Metropolitan District.
- Full particulars of the apprenticeship regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, 103 Russell-street, Melbourne. (Price 3d.)

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of bread making or baking" has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That on the 13th May, 1950, the Determination made on the 26th day of January, 1950, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination, which shall be read as part of the Determination of this Board published in *Government Gazette* No. 145 of the 22nd day of February, 1950.

(a) If in charge of five tradesmen as aforesaid—1s. per day;

(b) If in charge of more than five tradesmen as aforesaid, 1s. per day for being in charge of the first five tradesmen, plus an additional 1s. per day for each additional five, or fraction of five tradesmen in excess of such first five tradesmen.

(e) An employer shall not employ any minor at work covered by this Part, other than as a juvenile worker as defined, unless under a contract of apprenticeship, provided that any person who on or before the 1st June, 1949, was employed as an improver may continue to be so employed and paid at the rate prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof for an improver of like experience.

Clauses, other than clause 2 of Part I. and clause 2 of Part II. of the said Determination shall remain in force.

LEADING HANDS.

Leading hands in charge of not less than three and not more than ten employees, 9s. per week extra; more than ten and not more than twenty employees, 18s. per week extra; more than twenty employees, 27s. per week extra.

Provided that an employee in an electrical supply undertaking detailed to act as leading hand in charge of two other adult employees working away from power station or workshop (one of whom is of the same classification as himself) shall be paid 6s. per week extra.

TRADESMEN IN LARGE POWER HOUSES.

Tradesmen and/or welders, and their assistants employed in large operating power houses (i.e., power houses developing more than 8,000 kilowatts), other than those not on the regular staff, engaged on new construction work, shall be paid 6s. per week extra, and other apprentices and unapprenticed juniors 3s. per week extra; such amount shall be deemed to include all special rates prescribed in clause 6.

This allowance shall continue to be payable to tradesmen attached to the staffs of such power houses while carrying out repairs or maintenance in rotary converter sub-stations which are in regular operation.

APPRENTICESHIP.

3. (Other than those covered by the Apprenticeship Commission.)

Apprenticeship Trades.

(a) An employer shall not employ minors in the following trades or occupations otherwise than under a contract of apprenticeship as hereinafter provided:—

- (i) Brassfinisher (except the making of parts by specialized processes and the assembling thereof)
- (ii) Electrical fitter and/or armature winder (except the winding of armatures by specialized processes).
- (iii) Electrical mechanic.
- (iv) Fitter and/or turner.
- (v) Locksmith—making and/or repairing locks, including those of safes and strong-room doors, but not including the making of parts by specialized processes and the assembling thereof.
- (vi) Machinist—1st and 2nd class.
- (vii) Motor mechanic.
- (viii) Moulder and/or coremaker—jobbing.
- (ix) Patternmaker.
- (x) Refrigeration mechanic or serviceman.
- (xi) Safe and strong-room maker.
- (xii) Scale maker (except the making of parts by specialized processes and the assembling thereof).
- (xiii) Scientific instrument maker.
- (xiv) Smithing—Blacksmith, copper and/or brass smith.
- (xv) Welder—1st class.
- (xvi) Window frame fitter.
- (xvii) Brass polishing.
- (xviii) Adding machine, calculating machine, book-keeping machine, cash register, or first-class mechanic.

Contract of Apprenticeship.

(b) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (iii) a statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship;
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.

(c) Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Labour, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Secretary for Labour, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provision of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

Instruction in Welding.

(d) The training of apprentices to blacksmithing, structural steel works, fitting or fitting and turning shall include instruction in electric welding and/or oxy-acetylene welding as far as is practicable with the facilities available in the shop in which they are trained.

Proportion.

(e) (i) An employer shall not employ apprentices in excess of the proportion hereinafter prescribed. Subject to this sub-clause the proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice to every three or fraction of three tradesmen in the trade concerned.

In the trades of—

- Welder—1st class;
- Motor mechanic; and
- Moulder and/or coremaker—jobbing;

the proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice for every two or fraction of two tradesmen in the trade concerned.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years, taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

(ii) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided in the trades of—

- Fitter and/or turner,
- Machinist—1st and 2nd class,
- Motor mechanic, and
- Refrigeration mechanic or serviceman,

an employer may with the consent of an apprenticeship authority and upon satisfying that authority that he has the plant, equipment and staff necessary for the proper tuition of each apprentice concerned take apprentices in excess of the proportion herein prescribed. Until further order apprentices so taken shall not be counted in future calculations of the proportion of apprentices to journeymen authorized by the Determination.

Period of Apprenticeship.

(f) The periods of apprenticeship, except as to those marked (i), (xi), (xii), and (xvi), shall be as follows:—

If the apprentice, when indentured, is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

For the trades marked (i), (xi), (xii), and (xvi)—four or five years at the option of the contracting parties.

Adult Apprentices.

(g) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(h) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the appropriate apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

Wages.

(i) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in addition thereto the constant and war loadings specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made, the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

The total wages of apprentices and improvers shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

The sum of 4s. per week shall be added to the above rates in the case of apprentice patternmakers.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

Hours.

(k) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

Overtime and Shift Work.

(l) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires. No apprentice shall except in an emergency work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by any statute, Determination or regulation applicable to him.

Payment by Results.

(m) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

Lost Time.

(n) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent, shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served. Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

Prohibition of Premiums.

(o) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

Attendance at Technical Schools.

(p) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

Annual and Sick Leave.

(q) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 17 and 18 hereof respectively.

IMPROVERS.

4. Improvers employed at brass polishing or in the making or repairing of typewriters, book-keeping machines, adding machines, calculating machines, cash registers, duplicating machines, and similar machines shall be paid as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Determination contained, where an improver is under the age of 21 years after completion of five years at the trade of making or repairing typewriters, book-keeping machines, adding machines, calculating machines, cash registers, duplicating machines, and similar machines, he shall be paid four-fifths of the second-class mechanic's time wage until reaching the age of 21 years.

Proportion of Improvers.—In the making or repairing of typewriters, book-keeping machines, adding machines, calculating machines, cash registers, duplicating machines, and similar machines—one improver to every two or fraction of two workers employed in this section.

Brass polishing.—One improver to every two or fraction of two brass polishers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

FEMALES AND UNAPPRENTICED MALE JUNIORS.

5. (a) No junior other than an apprentice or an improver shall be employed at brass polishing or in assembling, making, or repairing typewriters, book-keeping machines, adding machines, calculating machines, cash registers, duplicating machines, and similar machines.

(b) Subject to the exception hereinafter provided, the minimum rates of wage for adult and junior females and for unapprenticed male juniors employed in occupations for which apprenticeship is not provided by this Determination shall be as follows:—

Provided that this sub-clause shall not operate to reduce the rates paid to any female employee as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1942.

Prohibited Occupations.

(d) Junior employees shall not be employed:—

- (i) if under the age of 16 years—
on oil or gas burners or fires used for heating of small articles; or
using electric arc or oxy acetylene blow pipe, or
- (ii) if under 18 years of age—
die setting on power presses; or
as furnacemen or assistants to furnacemen.

A written copy of any such agreement, signed by the Secretary of the Union and the Employer concerned, shall be lodged with the Wages Board Branch.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
