PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act* 1946 provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town), extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Braybrook has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bass has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to certain parts of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act* 1946 to the municipal district of the Shire of Braybrook and to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Bass described hereunder:—

- (a) The Township of Kilcunda.
- (b) The Township of San Remo.
- (c) The Town of Corinella.
- (d) Crown allotment 32, Parish of Wonthaggi.
- (e) The area within 5 chains of either side of the Bass Highway and Phillip Island-road within the Shire of Bass.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Shire of Braybrook and parts of the Shire of Bass on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the first day of September, 1950.

PROCLAMATION OF A REDUCTION IN THE SPEED OF CERTAIN TYPES OF MOTOR CARS ON THE OCEAN-ROAD (TOURISTS' ROAD) BETWEEN ANGLESEA AND PRINCETOWN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 13 (3) of the *Motor Car Act* 1928 (No. 3741) it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* reduce any length, weight or speed referred to in any of the provisions of sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of the said section in respect of any motor car on any highway or part of a highway specified in the Proclamation which is a State highway, main road, tourists' road or forest road within the meaning of the Country Roads Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board has recommended that the speed of motor cars carrying goods for hire or goods in the course of trade or constructed primarily to carry goods of any kind and motors cars registered as motor cars used for carrying passengers for hire where such motor cars weigh three (3) tons or more be so reduced on the highway described in the Schedule hereunder: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby proclaim the speed shown in the Schedule hereunder as the maximum speed at which the said types of motor cars which weigh three (3) tons or more may be used on the said highway.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

*Ocean-road (Tourists' Road) Between Anglesea
and Princetown.*

Maximum speed of motor cars carrying goods for hire or goods in the course of trade or constructed primarily to carry goods of any kind and motor cars registered as motor cars used for carrying passengers for hire where such motor cars weigh three (3) tons or more to be twenty-five (25) miles per hour.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Ocean-road (Tourists' Road) Between Anglesea and Princetown.

Maximum length of motor cars registered as motor cars used for carrying passengers for hire to be 28 ft. 6 in.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SOUTH BARWON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of South Barwon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of South Barwon aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

Part Bristol-road.

All that piece of land, being part of Crown allotment 19, section 65, Parish of Puebla, County of Grant, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the said allotment, which is the north-west angle of Crown allotment 21 of the said section; thence bearing south for 66 feet; thence bearing west for 56 feet; thence bearing 40 deg. 19 min. for 86 ft. 7 in. to the commencing point.

Legal Profession Practice Act 1946.

SOLICITORS (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES 1950.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 43 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* and all other powers thereunto enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1950 and shall be read and construed as one with the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 and the Rules amending the same, all of which Rules and these Rules may be cited together as the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules.

(2) These Rules shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. Sub-rule 3 of Rule 2 of the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 is amended—

(a) by inserting after the words "A solicitor shall not" the words "in the course of or in connexion with his practice as a solicitor";

(b) by inserting after paragraph (b) thereof the following paragraph:—

"(c) a solicitor who periodically visits a town situated outside a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne in which neither he nor any other solicitor has a permanent office may advertise in any newspaper circulating principally in that town and the neighbourhood thereof the date or dates on which and the place at which he may be interviewed and his telephone number thereat and the address and telephone number of his principal place of business. For the purpose of this paragraph a solicitor shall be deemed to have a permanent office in a town if he personally or his partner or some person in his employ is normally available in that town for interview by members of the public in connexion with his practice on more than one day in any one week."

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW NO. 50.—WATER SUPPLY.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, hereinafter shortly referred to as the Board's Acts, and in exercise and execution of any powers and authorities in any wise enabling the Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. Clause 3 of this By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 34, duly passed by the Board on the 4th day of February, 1936, and gazetted on the 18th day of March, 1936, and clause 4 of this By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 37, duly passed by the Board on the 11th day of March, 1941, and gazetted on the 26th day of March, 1941.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1950.

3. The said By-law No. 34 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For clause 7 of the said By-law there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"7. The amounts to be charged for the supply of water by measure shall be as follows:—

(a) Water supplied in any one year by the Board by measure in the metropolis in all cases other than those dealt with in (b) and (c) hereof shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons until the quantity so supplied equals the quantity which at such rate would produce an amount equal to the amount of the water rate which under the Board's Acts and By-laws would be payable for the lands and tenements to which the water is supplied if it was supplied otherwise than by measure and thereafter during such year at the rate of One shilling and three pence per thousand gallons.

(b) Water supplied by the Board to shipping at wharves and piers through fixed meters shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and ten pence half-penny per thousand gallons; but wherever it is necessary for the

Board to provide hoses or labour for the supply of water the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings and nine pence per thousand gallons, subject in all cases to the control of the Board as to quantity and time of supply.

(c) Water supplied by the Board by measure for parks and gardens under municipal control shall be charged for at the rate of Nine pence per thousand gallons."

(b) In paragraph (b) of clause 10 of the said By-law after the words "One pound" there shall be inserted the words "and five shillings".

(c) In clause 11 of the said By-law the following substitutions and insertions (as the case may be) shall be made:—

(i) In paragraph (i) for the word "forty" there shall be substituted the word "fifty".

(ii) In paragraph (ii) after the word "brick-work" there shall be inserted the words "and for consolidating ashes"; and after the words "One penny" there shall be inserted the word "farthing".

(iii) In paragraph (iii) for the word "Nine-pence" there shall be substituted the words "One shilling".

(iv) In paragraph (iv) for the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Twelve shillings and six pence".

(v) In paragraph (v) for the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Twelve shillings and six pence" and for the words "Five shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Six shillings and three pence".

(vi) In paragraph (vi) for the word "Twenty" there shall be substituted the word "Twenty-five".

(vii) In paragraph (vii) for the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Twelve shillings and six pence" and for the words "Five shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Six shillings and three pence".

(viii) In paragraph (viii) for the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Twelve shillings and six pence".

(ix) In paragraph (ix) for the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Twelve shillings and six pence".

(x) In paragraph (x) for the words "One pound" there shall be substituted the words "Twenty-five shillings".

(xi) In sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (xi) after the words "the owner" where first appearing there shall be inserted the word "solely", after the words "shall be paid for" there shall be inserted the word "separately", and after the words "One shilling" there shall be inserted the words "and three pence".

(d) In paragraph (a) of clause 49, for the words "a sum of Ten shillings" wherever appearing there shall be substituted the words "a sum of Twelve shillings and six pence" and for the words "a re-sealing fee of Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the words "a re-sealing fee of Twelve shillings and six pence".

4. The said By-law No. 37 is hereby amended in manner following, that is to say, in clause 7 of the said By-law, for the expression "1s.", there shall be substituted the words "One shilling and three pence".

5. By-law No. 34 and By-law No. 37, as hereinbefore amended, are each hereby ratified and confirmed.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

The members of the Milk Pasteurization Committee respectively appointed under paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949*, shall each be entitled to be paid the following remuneration and travelling expenses, when attending meetings of the Committee:—

1. A fee of £2 2s. for each meeting of the Committee attended provided that no member shall be entitled to be paid a fee in respect of more than one meeting on any one day.

2. Personal expenses when outside a radius of 15 miles from his usual residence at the rates in accordance with the conditions prescribed in the Regulations under the *Public Service Act 1946*, for personal expenses for officers, other than Permanent Heads, whose salaries are more than £900 a year, provided that where a member leaves his house and returns the same day he shall be entitled to receive:—

- (a) 3s. for breakfast where he is required to leave before 7 a.m. and is unable to return until after 9.30 a.m.
- (b) 3s. 6d. for lunch where he is required to leave before 12 noon and is unable to return until after 2 p.m.
- (c) 3s. 6d. for tea where he is required to leave before 5 p.m. and is unable to return until after 7 p.m.

3. A mileage allowance in accordance with the scale prescribed in the Regulations under the *Public Service Act 1946*, if it should be necessary for a member to use his own private motor car and reimbursement of any amount reasonably expended on travelling by railway or by other means of transport.

PRIVATE ADVERTISEMENTS.**BOROUGH OF STAWELL.****By-Law No. 35.**

A By-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946* and *Health Act 1928*, for:—

- Regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals or poultry or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.
- Fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal or poultry, or to store any such thing.
- Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district.

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

- "Animals" shall mean horses and dogs.
 "Poultry" shall mean fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and all other classes of poultry.
 "Dwelling" shall include bathrooms, kitchens, sculleries, and all rooms used for sleeping, living, cooking, or like purposes.

2. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept, any animal and/or poultry in any dwelling, or in the yard attached to any dwelling, or in any land whatsoever in such a manner as to be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

3. The occupier of the yard attached to any dwelling, or of any other land in which animals and/or poultry are kept or housed, shall cause the place of keeping of such animals and/or poultry to be maintained in a good state of repair, and thoroughly cleansed and effectually deodorized from time to time as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

4. The owner of any premises on which the business of a commercial poultry keeper was carried on before 1st October, 1949, shall be exempt from the conditions set out in clause 3132 of the Uniform Building Regulations in regard to fowlhouses.

Such owner will not be permitted to extend the area of the poultry farm, nor erect any buildings, nor make any alterations or additions to any building already erected, unless he first submit to the Council a plan of such erection, alteration, or addition; and such erection, alteration, or addition is approved by a majority of the whole Council.

5. No person shall keep any poultry:—

- Within 30 feet from any dwelling.
- Nor in the yard thereof, or attached thereto, the area of which is less than 1,500 square feet.

Definitions.

"Prescribed Area" means the area described in Schedule 1.

"Poultry Keeper" shall mean any person who keeps more than 50 head of poultry.

Regulations to be Observed Within the Prescribed Area.

6. No person shall keep more than 25 head of poultry on any premises within the prescribed area, except those persons and premises which are referred to in clause 4 of this By-law, providing that such persons shall provide a minimum run of six (6) square feet per bird.

7. A fowlhouse may be constructed, provided that such structure:—

- (a) Shall have a height not exceeding 8 feet, and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet.
- (b) 75 feet from boundary of street to which building has a frontage.
- (c) 10 feet from any other street of greater width than 25 feet.
- (d) 5 feet from any other street of lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining land.
- (e) 40 feet from any dwelling whether on same or adjoining ground.
- (f) Covered and roofed with material approved by surveyor.

8. No person shall add to or extend any fowlhouse existing at the date of the operation of this By-law which would cause it to exceed 100 square feet.

9. No person shall erect on any allotment of land more than one fowlhouse nor erect another fowlhouse upon any allotment of land upon which a fowlhouse is already erected.

Regulations to be Observed by Poultry Keepers Outside the Prescribed Area.

10. No poultry farm will be permitted unless approved by the Council, and unless the area of land to be used as a poultry farm exceeds 1,500 square feet, and will allow a minimum run of six (6) square feet per bird.

11. No person shall erect a fowlhouse, shed, shelter, or structure for the housing or keeping of any poultry:—

- (a) Within 40 feet of any dwelling.
- (b) 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining land.
- (c) 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
- (d) 10 feet from the boundary of any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
- (e) 5 feet from the boundary of any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.

12. No shed, shelter, or structure for the housing or keeping of any poultry shall be erected or placed on any land unless a plan and description thereof is first submitted to the Council for approval. Nor unless the buildings are erected in accordance with plans and specifications similar to those suggested by the Agricultural Department.

*SCHEDULE 1.**Prescribed Area.*

From the corner of Upper Main-street and Fisher-street, via Fisher-street, Conway and Duke streets, to Hewitt-street, across the High School reserve to William-street and O'Regan-street to London-road, via London-road to Napier-street to Dawson-street to Sloane-street, via Sloane-street to Brown-street, Doyle-street, Cooper-street to Seaby-street to Longfield-street to Playford-street to Lake-road to Cypress-street to Franklin-street to Newington-road to D'Alton-street to Darlington-road to Oriental-street to Fisher-street.

13. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections or sub-sections of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

14. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

15. This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided by Schedule 1, apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Stawell.
