AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of South Barwon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of South Barwon aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—



### THE ADOPTION OF CHILDREN (COURT OF PETTY SESSIONS) **RULES, 1950.**

3487

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Adoption of Children Act 1928 and the Supreme Court Act 1928 and any other powers thereunto enabling, the following Rules are made:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Adoption of Children (Court Citation. of Petty Sessions) Rules, 1950, and shall come into operation as on and from 1st July, 1950.
- 2. (1) The Adoption of Children (Petty Sessions) Rules 1929 (in Annulment this clause called the "former Rules") and The Adoption of Children Rules. (Court of Petty Sessions) Rules, 1950, published in the Government Gazette of the 31st day of May, 1950, are hereby annulled.
- (2) Such annulment shall not affect any act matter or thing done Saving. under the former Rules before the coming into operation of these Rules, and where any application or other matter has before the coming into operation of these Rules been commenced under the former Rules such application or other matter shall be continued and carried on under the former Rules as if these Rules had not been ·made.
  - 3. (1) In these Rules, unless the contrary intention appears-"The Act" means the Adoption of Children Act 1928 as pretation.

amended by any Act. "The Court" means a Court of Petty Sessions in which the

- application is made, constituted as required by section 10 (1) (c) of the Act.
- "The Clerk of Petty Sessions" means the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Court in which the application is made.
- "The infant" means the child proposed for adoption.
- "The applicant" means the person or persons applying for an adoption order.
- (2) The Acts Interpretation Acts shall apply to the interpretation Application of these Rules in like manner as they apply to the interpretation of &c. an Act of Parliament.
- 4. An application for an adoption order shall be made to the Application Court having jurisdiction for the place where either the applicant or to be by the infant resides at the date of the application by notice of applica-application. tion in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule to these Rules.
- 5. The notice of application shall be filed in the Court by the Filing of Clerk of Petty Sessions immediately upon the lodging thereof by the application. applicant.
- 6. Unless the Court otherwise directs every notice or other Mode of document required by these Rules to be served shall be served personally or by being posted in a prepaid registered envelope addressed to the person or institution to be served, and every such notice or document so posted shall at the expiration of twenty-four hours from the time of posting be deemed to have been served unless the contrary appears. The service of every notice or other document not served by the Court shall be verified by affidavit in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule to these Rules, unless the Court Form 2: otherwise directs.
- 7. Every application for an adoption order shall be supported by Affidavit in evidence on affidavit in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule to support of application. these Rules, which shall disclose-Form 3.
  - (a) the age and sex of the applicant and of the infant and their relationship to each other;

(b) particulars of the birth of the infant;

(c) when the applicants are spouses-particulars of their marriage, including the church or other place and the date of the marriage ceremony and, if known, the name of the minister or other authorized person who performed the marriage ceremony;

(d) the assets and income of the applicant;

- (e) whether the applicant has any children or adopted children and if so the respective sexes and ages of those children;
- (f) whether the consents referred to in sub-sections (3) and (4) of section four of the Act have been obtained;

- (g) whether any and what payment or reward has been made or agreed to be made to the applicant in respect of the adoption of the infant and whether any and what payment or reward has been made or agreed to be made to the parent of the infant in respect of the adoption of the infant;
- (h) whether any and what insurance has been effected on the life of the infant;
- (i) whether the applicant has made any previous application for the adoption of the infant and whether any adoption order has previously been made in respect of the infant and where the birth of the infant has been registered a certified copy of the entry in the register book of births shall be exhibited to the affidavit.

By whom affidavit sworn. 8. The affidavit in support of the application shall be sworn by the applicant, but where he cannot swear positively to all the facts of his own knowledge a further affidavit or affidavits shall be sworn by some other person or persons who can so swear to the facts: Provided that the court may in its discretion admit an affidavit deposing to any facts from information and belief if it considers that the difficulties of obtaining a further affidavit as aforesaid justify that course.

Filing of affidavit.

9. All affidavits and documents in respect of any application' shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of Petty Sessions at the time of the lodging of the notice of application.

Consent to adoption by parent of infant. Form 4. 10. (1) Every consent required under sub-section (3) of section four of the Act shall be in writing in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule to these Rules and shall be verified by affidavit in or to the effect of Form 5 of the said Schedule.

Consent to adoption by spouse of applicant.
Appointment of guardian ad litem and of day for hearing.

(2) Every consent required under sub-section (4) of section four of the Act shall be in writing and shall be verified by affidavit.

Form 6. Affidavit in 11. As soon as practicable after the filing of the notice of application the applicant shall apply to the court to appoint and the court shall by order in or to the effect of Form 6 of the Schedule to these Rules appoint a guardian ad litem to the infant and appoint a time and place for the hearing of the application.

Affidavit in support. 12. The Court may require an affidavit to be filed as to the suitability of the person proposed for appointment as guardian ad litem.

Service of copies of notice of hearing on guardian ad litem and respondents, &c.

13. When a guardian ad litem has been appointed and a day appointed for the hearing of the application, the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall then cause a copy of a notice of hearing in or to the effect of Form 7 of the Schedule to these Rules, together with a copy of the applicant's affidavit, to be served not less than five clear days before the hearing upon the guardian ad litem.

Form 7. Service of copies of notice of hearing on other

14. The Court may in its discretion order a copy of the notice of hearing to be served on any other person or institution, and in that event a copy of the said notice shall be so served not less than five clear days before the hearing.

Production of infant on application.

15. Where the infant is in the actual custody of any person or institution the Court may require that person or institution to produce the infant on the hearing of the application.

Service of copy of Rules re duties of guardian ad litem.

16. The Court may, in its discretion, order that a copy of Rules 17 and 18 of these Rules be served upon the guardian ad litem together with the copy of the notice of hearing.

Duties of guardian ad litem.

- 17. (1) It shall be the duty of the guardian ad litem to investigate as fully as possible all the circumstances of the infant and the applicant, and all other matters relevant to the proposed adoption, with a view to safeguarding the interests of the infant, and, in particular, it shall be his duty to include in his investigation the following questions:—
  - (a) Whether the statements in the applicant's affidavit are true and complete;
  - (b) Whether any payment or other reward in consideration of the adoption has been received or agreed upon; and, if there has been any agreement to make any such payment or reward, whether that agreement is consistent with the welfare of the infant;
  - (c) Whether the means and status of the applicant are such as to enable him to maintain and bring up the infant suitably, and what right to or interest in property the infant has;

- (d) What insurance, if any, has been effected on the life of the infant;
- (e) Whether it is desirable for the welfare of the infant that the Court should be asked to make an interim order or in making an adoption order to impose any particular terms or conditions or to require the adopter to make any particular provision for the infant.
- (2) The guardian ad litem shall orally report to the Court the Report of guardian (2) The guardian as such shall orany report to the court the report may guardian result of his investigation, but by leave of the Court the report may ad literate to Court. be made by affidavit.
- 18. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Acts.
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- 6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.








Parish of Franklin, County of Talbot, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(F.77(7)





# REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1950 (No. 2), shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. Sub-regulation (b) of Regulation 13 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by substituting for the words "diethyl p-nitrophenyl in thiophosphate" the words "diethyl p-nitrophenyl thiophosphate".

And the Honorable Charles Percival Gartside, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### GENERAL SANITARY REGULATIONS 1950.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "General Sanitary Regulations 1950", shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette, and shall be divided into Parts, as follows:-

I.—Introductory.

Part II.—Closets, cesspools, urinals, public sanitary conveniences, and disposal of nightsoil.

Part III.—Storage, collection, removal and disposal of refuse. Part IV .- General and Supplementary.

### PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

### REPEAL.

2. The General Sanitary Regulations 1931 are hereby repealed.

## APPLICATION.

3. Except as otherwise provided herein, these Regulations shall have application throughout the State.

### INTERPRETATION.

- 4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
  - "Approved" means approved in writing by the Commission or the Council, as the case may be.
  - "Cattle" means any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, calf or pig. "Closet" means any structure whatsoever used for the purpose
  - of or in relation to defæcation not connected with the sewers of a sewerage authority or an approved septic tank system, and includes a cesspool-closet.
  - "Contractor" means the person who has contracted with a Council or with any person to collect, remove and dispose of nightsoil and/or refuse.

  - "Council" means Council of a municipality.
    "Depot" means any land, place, or premises used for or in relation to the treatment or disposal of nightsoil.
  - "Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission
  - or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector. "Nightsoil" includes all human excrementitious or fæcal matter and human urine.
  - "Pan" means any removable receptacle in a closet used for the reception of nightsoil, whether chemical substances are placed therein or not.
  - "Prescribed" means prescribed by or under the Health Act
  - 1928 or any amendment thereof.
    "Premises" includes messuages, buildings, land, and hereditaments of every tenure; and also any machinery, plant, appliance, or vehicle used in connexion with any trade carried on at any premises.

- "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.
- "Refuse" includes all wastes (except nightsoil and sewage) produced or accumulated in or about any premises.
- "Sewerage authority" means any sewerage authority within the meaning of the Sewerage Districts Act 1928, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust.
- "Source of water supply" includes river, creek, stream, watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh; spring, reservoir, or well, if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for drinking purposes by man or for domestic purposes, or for any purpose in connexion with the preparation, manufacture or sale of food, or in connexion with a dairy farm or dairy.
- "Suitable sanitary conveniences" means prescribed or specified sanitary conveniences conveniently situated, properly constructed, and sufficient in number, and, if necessary, separate sanitary conveniences for the use of each sex with approaches thereto properly separated for the sexes.
- "The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.
- "Tip" means any land, place or premises (other than an incinerator or destructor) used for or in relation to the disposal of refuse.
- "Trench" means an excavation in the soil suitably prepared for the proper and efficient disposal of nightsoil.
- "Urinal" means any structure whatsover used for the purposes of or in relation to urination.

# PART II.—CLOSETS, CESSPOOLS, URINALS, PUBLIC SANITARY CONVENIENCES, AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHTSOIL.

### CLOSETS.

- 5. The proprietor of every premises not connected with the sewers of a sewerage authority shall provide thereon suitable sanitary conveniences, and where any such proprietor has failed or neglected to provide such conveniences the Council shall by notice in writing require the proprietor within a time therein specified to provide conveniences to the number set out in the notice.
- 6. No person shall erect or construct any pan closet on any premises except in such a position as will admit of the pan being from time to time removed from such closet and from such premises without being carried through any dwelling-house or public building, or through any building or premises in which any person is employed in any manufacture, trade or business.

Provided that if the Council is satisfied that in respect of any particular premises it is impracticable to conform with the provisions of this Regulation, the Council may, consistent with the preservation of health, modify such of the requirements as the Council deems fit.

- 7. Every closet shall be completely air-disconnected from every room used for sleeping, living or dining purposes, or in which any food is stored, prepared, cooked or served, or wherein persons are employed.
- 8. No person shall erect any pan closet or allow such to remain within 50 feet of any source of water supply, or within 50 feet of any building in which food is kept or stored for sale, or of any place where cows are milked.

Provided that in the case of any particular premises where the Council is of the opinion that it is impracticable to conform with the provisions of this Regulation the Council may, subject to such conditions as the Council imposes, permit the erection of a closet at a less distance than 50 feet from such source building or place.

- 9. Every person who proposes to erect a new closet or reconstruct an existing closet on any premises in any city, town, borough, or township shall give written notice to the Council of his intention so to do, and such notice shall include the design position and arrangement and the dimensions of and material to be used in the erection or alteration of such closet.
- 10. Every new or reconstructed pan closet shall comply with the provisions of Schedule 1 hereof.

ΔŦ-

- 11. The proprietor of any premises upon which there is any closet which is not in accordance with the provisions of Schedule 1 or with any other provision of these Regulations shall, when required by the Council, alter, reconstruct, demolish, or remove such closet and provide a closet which is in accordance therewith.
- 12. Every pan closet shall be kept provided with a pan which complies with the requirements of the Council's By-law.
- 13. Every person who has occasion to use any closet shall, before leaving the same, replace the cover over the seat opening, and every person who has need to open the panstead door shall securely close same immediately after the need is over.
- 14. The Council at least once a week shall cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed with its contents from the premises and a clean pan in good order to be left in its place.

### CESSPOOLS.

- 15. The Council of any shire may specify any area or areas of the municipal district within which (subject to the provisions of paragraph (c) of Regulation 16) cesspools may be constructed.
  - 16. No person shall construct a cesspool-
    - (a) in any city, town or borough;
    - (b) in any shire except any such part or parts of the shire as may be specified by the Council;
    - (c) at a less distance than 300 feet from any source of water supply.
- 17. Every person who proposes to construct a cesspool shall notify the Council of his intention so to do and supply particulars as to site design and structure.
- 18. The above-ground structure of every cesspool-closet shall with such modifications as may be necessary comply with the requirements prescribed in relation to pan-closets.
- 19. Where the contents of any cesspool are within 18 inches of the top the proprietor of the premises shall—
  - (a) in the case of an impervious cesspool remove or cause the contents thereof to be removed and disposed of in such manner and in such place as the Council directs;
  - (b) in the case of a pervious cesspool fill in or cause the same to be filled in with dry loam, ashes, or such other suitable material as may be directed by the Council.

### URINALS.

- 20. (1) The proprietor shall in the case of any premises when required by the Council provide such urinal accommodation for the use of the occupants of or persons employed on such premises as the Council may require.
- (2) Such accommodation shall be adequate for the purpose and sanitarily constructed, and efficient provision shall be made to the satisfaction of the Council for the disposal of the urine.

### PUBLIC SANITARY CONVENIENCES.

- 21. Public sanitary conveniences shall be so placed and designed as to secure—  $\,$ 
  - (a) convenient access for the public;
  - (b) adequate privacy for the persons using the same and for each sex where accommodation is provided for both sexes;
  - (c) proper designation for the sexes.
- 22. No person shall foul any portion of any public sanitary convenience or derange or interfere with or damage any portion of the structure or fittings of any such sanitary convenience, or waste or remove therefrom any toilet-paper or deodorant provided therein.
- 23. No person except by authority of the Council shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon or otherwise deface the structure or fittings of any public sanitary convenience.
- 24. The proprietor shall cause every public sanitary convenience (including every such convenience used in connexion with a public building) to which the public have access after dark to be kept adequately lighted inside and outside during the periods of time it is open to the public.

### DISPOSAL OF NIGHTSOIL.

25. Any Council or contractor who collects nightsoil shall cause it to be properly, efficiently, and sanitarily disposed of—

- (a) at a depot provided by the Council or a Sewerage Authority in accordance with the requirements of the Act and Regulations; or
- (b) at a depot provided by the contractor and registered with the Council; or
- (c) by means of desiccation, incineration, destructive distillation, or by treatment with absorbent substances or chemicals, or by discharging into a sewer of a Sewerage Authority or by connecting with an approved septic tank system, or by any other method approved by the Commission.
- 26. No Council or person shall establish a depot-
  - (a) in the catchment area of any public or domestic water supply; or
  - (b) within 880 yards of any dam or reservoir containing or any river, creek, or open channel conveying water of a public or domestic supply; or
  - (c) within 440 yards of any building or place where cows are milked, the products of which are sold, or in which milk or milk products are kept or stored for sale.

Provided that where it is impracticable to secure a site for a depot complying in all respects with the requirements of this Regulation the depot may be situated at such site as the Council selects subject to the approval of the Commission, and such approval may be given with or without such modifications or conditions as the Commission thinks fit;

- (d) on any land liable to flooding.
- 27. No person shall-
  - (a) dispose of any nightsoil in any depot except in accordance with Schedule 2 hereto or by some other method specifically approved by the Council or in the case of a depot owned or conducted by a Council or a Sewerage Authority by a method specifically approved by the Commission;
  - (b) dispose of any nightsoil in any depot within 50 feet of the boundary thereof;
  - (c) dispose of nightsoil in any land in which nightsoil has been deposited less than twelve months previously;
  - (d) dispose of nightsoil in any land in which nightsoil has been deposited previously unless such previously deposited nightsoil be completely humefied;
  - (e) allow any cattle to have access to any land in or on which nightsoil has been deposited unless a period of not less than three months has elapsed since the last deposit; or
  - (f) plant any vegetables or sow seeds of any vegetables in any land in or on which nightsoil has been deposited until at least six months after the last deposit of nightsoil: provided that this clause shall not prevent the sowing on such land within the prescribed period of seeds of grass or fodder crop if the methods of preparation and sowing are such that the nightsoil is not disturbed or exposed.
- 28. Where a removal service is not provided the proprietor of the premises or any person shall not dispose of nightsoil except in a sanitary manner and in accordance with any instructions as to such disposal as the inspector may give from time to time.
- 29. The proprietor of a nightsoil depot shall provide at the depot an adequate supply of water and an efficient plant for cleansing the pans and other receptacles, apparatus and vehicles used in connexion with the processes carried on at the depot.
- 30. The proprietor of a nightsoil depot shall keep the premises at all times in a clean and sanitary state and shall cleanse or cause to be cleansed all pans and other receptacles apparatus and vehicles immediately after use.
- 31. The proprietor of any pan-changing station or relay hauling station used in connexion with the transport of nightsoil shall comply with the provisions of Regulations 29 and 30 hereof as far as such provisions are applicable to such station.

# PART III.—STORAGE, COLLECTION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

### TEMPORARY STORAGE OF REFUSE.

- 32. (1) Unless exempted by the Council, the proprietor of every premises in every city, town, borough and township shall provide and keep thereon a proper and suitable receptacle (or receptacles) for temporarily storing all refuse (including animal manure) produced or accumulated on such premises and which is offensive or likely to become offensive.
- (2) The Council may exempt any township from the operation of this regulation.

### COLLECTION AND REMOVAL OF REFUSE.

- 33. The Council shall cause-
  - (a) all refuse which is offensive or likely to become offensive to be collected and removed from the premises once in each week, or, in case of specified premises, at such shorter periods as are required;
  - (b) all trade or other refuse which is not offensive or not likely to become offensive to be collected and removed from the premises at such periods of time as the inspector directs.

### DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

- 34. The Council shall cause all refuse removed from any premises to be disposed of in an efficient, proper and sanitary manner at an approved tip, incinerator, or destructor, and no person shall dispose of such refuse except at such tip, incinerator, or destructor.
  - 35. No person shall-
    - (a) dispose of any refuse at any tip except in accordance with Schedule 3 hereof or by some other method specifically approved by the Council or in the case of a tip owned or conducted by a Council by a method specifically approved by the Commission;
    - (b) allow any cattle to have access to any land in or on which refuse has been deposited unless a period of not less than three months has elapsed since the last deposit;
    - (c) light a fire on any tip.
- 36. The proprietor of every tip shall cause it to be protected against entry of cattle by means of a substantial fence or wall and gate or gates and (where necessary) against entry of stormwater by means of an efficient catchwater drain or other approved means and shall maintain the tip in accordance with Schedule 4.
- 37. Where any tip is in such a state as to be a nuisance or dangerous to health or offensive, the Council shall prohibit any further deposit of refuse (except clean soil or other innocuous material) at such tip, and no person shall thereafter deposit any refuse (except such as may be permitted by the Council) at such tip until the Council notifies that deposition of refuse may be resumed.
- 38. When a Council becomes aware that drainage or wind-blown refuse from the tip may pollute any source of water supply, such Council shall forthwith take such action as may be necessary to efficiently safeguard such source of water supply.

### PART IV.—GENERAL AND SUPPLEMENTARY.

- 39. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for such purposes.
- 40. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and any person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

### Regulation 10.

### SCHEDULE 1.

Every new or reconstructed pan closet shall have-

- (a) its internal dimensions not less than 3 feet in width, 4ft. 6in. in length, by 7 feet in height from floor-line to wall-plate level;
- (b) weather-proof walls formed of brick, stone, concrete, wood or other approved material, and at least two of its walls shall be exposed to the open air, and the door shall be in one of such walls except in the case where an approved airlock is provided;
- (c) a weather-proof roof formed of slates, tiles, galvanized iron, or other approved material;
- (d), a suitable door capable of being fastened from the inside when shut;
- (e) an impervious floor of brick and cement, concrete, flagstone, or other approved material having its surface impervious, horizontal beneath the seat with a gradient downwards from the riser to the front wall of not less than half an inch per foot, and such floor shall be nowhere less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground level;
- (f) a space of suitable dimensions for the reception of the pan or pans and the internal surfaces of the walls of such space shall be as smooth as practicable;
- (g) a seat (covering the top of the pan space) with an ovoidal opening having its front margin not less than 3i inches and its rear margin not more than 13 inches behind the internal surface of the riser and being not more than 9 inches wide and being fitted with a hinged flyproof cover;
- (h) the seat at such a height above the floor that the vertical distance between the top of the pan and the underside of the seat shall not be more than 1½ inches;
- (i) access to the pan space for the removal and replacement of the pan either by having the seat hinged or by provision of a door in the riser or in an external wall of the pan-space, and any such door shall be strongly made and closely fitting and shall be hinged at the side and provided with an effective fastening;
- (j) the pan space fitted with guides and stops so placed as to ensure that the pan shall always be placed in its proper position relative to the seat opening;
- (k) the pan space flyproof (when the pan door and the cover over the opening in the seat are shut), and a flyproof air-grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall of the pan space having a clear airway of at least 12 square inches and an upcast outlet ventilating shaft not less than 9 square inches in cross-sectional area extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof; and every such outlet ventilating shaft extending vertically to such a height that the mouth of the shaft shall be at least 6 feet higher than any adjacent window, door, or other opening of any habitable or occupied room.

Provided that where the pan space has two external walls furnished with flyproof air-gratings having not less than 12 square inches of clear airway each, it shall not be necessary to provide a ventilating shaft as prescribed.

### Regulation 27

### SCHEDULE 2.

- 1. All nightsoil shall be deposited in trenches which shall not be more than 18 inches wide and shall be excavated according to a regular plan.
- 2. No trench shall be more than 18 inches nor less than 9 inches deep and the depth of any one trench shall be sensibly uniform throughout its length.
- 3. Every trench shall be so located in relation to the slope of the land that its bottom shall be at the same level throughout its length.
- 4. The proprietor may define areas or sections of the depot to be treated as disposal units, and each unit shall be worked as set out in the succeeding clauses.
- 5. The first trench in any depot or unit shall be excavated (subject to compliance with Regulation 28 (2)) near the lowest part of such depot or section and each subsequent trench shall be higher than its predecessor until the depot or unit has been used.
- 6. In all cases where the soil is such that liquid is not readily absorbed the bottom of the trench shall be broken up roughly so that liquid from the nightsoil may drain rapidly into the spaces between the clods.
- 7. Nightsoil shall be emptied into trenches in such a manner as to avoid splashing and so that no nightsoil shall be less than 6 inches below the surface of the undisturbed soil; and it shall then be covered immediately with soil to a depth of at least 6 inches.

- 8. Covering of nightsoil shall be done so as not to cause overflowing or to raise the surface of the nightsoil closer to ground surface level than 3 inches, and any soakage to the surface shall be immediately covered with clean earth.
- 9. Spilled nightsoil shall be forthwith collected and buried as described above, and the soiled ground shall be immediately covered with clean earth.
- 10. Every depot as a whole, and in large depots where the slope of the surface or character of the soil so requires, every section, shall be protected from ingress of water from neighbouring land.
- 11. Provision shall be made by means of check-banks, trenches and/or apparatus to prevent the escape of polluted drainage from every depot.

### Regulation 35.

#### SCHEDULE 3.

- 1. All refuse shall be tipped or deposited over a face in a position indicated either verbally or by notice by the proprietor or his employee.
- 2. Metal articles and metal waste shall be tipped either on the same face as other refuse, in which case all large metal or other articles shall be rolled to the toe of the face, or at a separate tip not less than 440 yards from any tip used for the deposit of decomposable refuse.
- 3. Refuse shall not be deposited in water without the special approval of the Commission

- 1. All refuse shall be tipped or deposited over a face.
- 2. The vertical height of a face shall not exceed 6 feet.
- 3. The length of the face in use on any day shall not exceed three times the distance by which the face advances each day: Provided that a face need not be less than 25 feet long.
  - 4. The top of the tip shall be even.
- 5. The tip shall be properly consolidated by traffic or by mechanical plant.
- 6. Metal articles and metal waste shall be tipped either on the same face as other refuse, in which case all large metal or other articles shall be rolled to the toe of the face, or at a separate tip not less than 440 yards from any tip used for the deposit of decomposable refuse.
- 7. The top, the face, and the exposed flank or flanks of the tip shall be covered at the end of each day's operations by a layer of earth or other non-putrescible material so that no refuse is exposed.
- 8. Not less than once a week the face and flanks shall be covered (unless already done in complying with clause 7) with not less than 12 inches of earth, sand, ashes, or other dense and incombustible material.
- 9. The thickness of any cover shall be measured from the most superficial portion of the refuse to the surface of the cover.
- 10. Refuse shall not be deposited in water without the special approval of the Commission.
  - 11. All contaminated drainage shall be deodorized.
  - 12. Every tip shall be protected from flooding by banks or other means.
- 13. Any fire which may break out on a tip shall be extinguished as soon as possible.
- 14. Where a public water supply is available pipes shall be provided to standpipes so placed that water may be discharged by means of hose in adequate volume to extinguish a fire in any part of the tip.
- 15. Where no public water supply is available other provision satisfactory to the Commission shall be made for the supply of water for extinction of fire in any tip.

### RURAL FINANCE CORPORATION ACT 1949.

### REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Rural Finance Corporation Act 1949, in that behalf His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

### Preliminary.

1. These Regulations shall be known as the "Rural Finance Corporation Regulations" and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the  $Government\ Gazette$ .

### Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations the expression "Act" shall mean the Rural Finance Corporation Act 1949, the expression "Corporation" shall mean the Rural Finance Corporation, and the expression "Section" shall mean section of the Rural Finance Corporation Act 1949.

### Custody and use of seal.

3. When not in use the seal of the Corporation shall be kept under lock and key by the Secretary and in his absence by any person appointed by the Corporation to act as deputy secretary. Except where otherwise declared by the Corporation, pursuant to paragraph 5 of the First Schedule to the Act, or otherwise provided for in paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Second Schedule to the Act, the common seal of the Corporation shall be affixed to any document when duly authorized by the Corporation and in the presence of any two members of the Corporation or in the presence of any member of the Corporation and of the General Manager or in the presence of any member of the Corporation and of the Secretary (or any person appointed by the Corporation to act as deputy secretary).

### Charges in respect of loans.

4. Every applicant for a loan, pursuant to Part III. of the Act, shall, either at the time of lodging an application for such loan or at any other time when directed by the Corporation to do so, make a payment on account of valuation, inspection or other expenses in accordance with the following scale:—

Amount of loan applied for.		Fee payable.
Not exceeding £1,000	 	£2
£1,001–£2,000	 	£3
£2,001-£3,000	 	£4
£3,001 and upwards	 	£5

Any moneys so paid shall become the absolute property of the Corporation whether the loan is approved (in whole or in part) or is not approved; provided that the Corporation may in any case, where it is of opinion that the circumstances may justify it in doing so, waive, remit or reduce any such fee.

5. Every application for a composition or scheme of arrangement shall be made in the form or to the effect of the form of Form No. I in the schedule hereto.

## REGULATIONS No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Authorities Superannuation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 4, and shall be read and construed as one with the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 2 and the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 3.
- 2. Regulation 11 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 2 and the Fifth Schedule thereto are hereby repealed.
- 3. The interest to be credited to the account of each participating employee at the end of each year pursuant to sub-section (6) of section 15 of the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act* 1947 as amended by the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act* 1949 shall be calculated in the following manner (that is to say):—
  - (a) From the total amount of interest received by the Board in respect of investments of the Local Authorities Provident Fund there shall be deducted—
    - (i) all moneys transferred from such interest to a reserve account pursuant to sub-section (3) of section 12 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947 as amended by the Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1949, and
    - (ii) all interest relating to any period of such year which is included in any certificate of the Board given pursuant to section 16 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947.
  - (b) The balance of such interest then remaining shall be multiplied by one hundred and the product divided by the total amount at the credit of all the participating employees at the end of such year. The resultant figure shall be the percentage rate of interest to be credited to the account of each participating employee as aforesaid.
  - (c) "Year" for the purposes of this Regulation shall mean the period of twelve calendar months ending on the 28th day of February in each year.
- 4. The rate of interest to be paid by an Authority on any contribution not paid on the date prescribed by Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 2 shall be five pounds per centum per annum.
- 5. If any permanent employee having pursuant to Regulation 2 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 3 given to the Board notice in writing under his hand that he desires to take over any policy on his life, fails within two weeks after service on him by the Board of a request for payment thereof to pay to the Board any amounts certified by the Board to be due under the Local Authorities Superannuation Acts by such employee to the Board or to any Authority, the Board may cancel such policy and shall thereupon pay the surrender value of such policy on cancellation, after deducting therefrom any such amounts so certified, to such permanent employee.

6. In the case of any permanent employee to whom Part I. of the Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947 applies dying during the currency of any policy or policies on his life, if the Board certifies that the balance due or payable in respect of such policy or policies (as ascertained in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 3) is not more than Two hundred pounds, the Board may in its discretion pay such amount to the person or persons appearing to the Board to be entitled thereto according to law as on the intestacy of the said deceased employee, or to any person claiming to be entitled to a grant of probate of the will or letters of administration of the estate of the said deceased employee, upon such person making a statutory declaration to that effect and producing such other evidence as the Board requires, and any such payment shall be valid and effectual with respect to any demand against the Board of any other persons as next of kin, legatees or personal representatives of the said deceased employee, but such next of kin legatees or personal representatives shall nevertheless have the right to recover the whole or any portion of such amount from the person or persons who have received it from the Board.

7. Any list required by the Board pursuant to Regulation 13 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 2 shall, if the Board so requires, be certified by statutory declaration made by the chief executive officer of the Authority concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAVERS HILL RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 3rd May, 1949, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Barwongemong, and known as the "Lavers Hill Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred the "Lavers Hill Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, herein-after referred to as the "Committee."

## RECULATIONS

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, tree of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fètes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Committee first obtained.

- 2. No person shall-
  - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
  - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
  - (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or em-ployed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.

- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve. or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.
- 6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage, and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.
- 10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles broken glass process corrections. bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.
- 11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.
- 12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
- 13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.
- 16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of those reserved lands in the Parishes of Lyndhurst and Frankston as are indicated by red colour on plan marked "F"/15.4.48 attached to Lands Department correspondence C.77017, and known as the "Reserves." as the "Reserves."

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations the expression "the Committee" shall mean the duly appointed Committee of Management
- 2. No person shall camp on or use as a camp or for the purpose of camping any portion of the Reserves.
  - 3. No person shall-
    - (a) cut, pluck, injure, or destroy any tree, shrub, marram grass, bush, plant, or flower growing on the Reserves;
      (b) dig, cut, or remove any turf, sod, loam, sand,
    - gravel, shellgrit, or other substance in or on the Reserves;
    - (c) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed on the Reserves;
      (d) carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol, or firearm
  - (a) carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol, or firearm in or upon the Reserves, or throw or cause to be thrown any stones, sand, or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserves or the property thereon, or remove any bird's nest or the nest of any animal from the Reserves;
     (e) hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in the Reserves, or sell or let for hire any article place seat or chair without the

- description in the Reserves, or sell or let for hire any article, place, seat, or chair, without the consent of the Committee first obtained;

  (j) bring into the Reserves any dog for training or exercising or coursing, or for any purpose of sport, or suffer or cause any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in any part of the Reserves, unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or animal, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee;

- 4. No person offending against decency in dress, language, or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserves
- 5. No person shall bathe from the Reserves, unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
- 6. No person shall in any part of the Reserves, obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserves, or obstruct or neglect to obey the lawful direction of any authorized officer of the Committee. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obseene language or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the Reserves, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom.
- 7. No person shall light a fire on the Reserves without the written consent of the Committee, except in fire-places specially provided therein by the Committee, and any person who lights a fire in the Reserves shall take any person who lights a life in the Reserves shall take precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control, nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly, or negligently light any fire, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire, to anything growing or being thereon.

# DETERMINATION OF THE NAILMAKERS BOARD.

# NOTE,

A notice of appeal to the Industrial Appeals Court has been lodged against certain parts of the Determination.

Section 22 (2), Act 4874. provides that, when an appeal is made in accordance with that Act, the Determination or part thereof appealed against shall not come into operation until the Appeal has been dealt with by the Court.

#### Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.

(c) If through lack of orders or through financial difficulties an employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may, with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian, be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at the indenture may with the approval of the Secretary for Labour be determined by the employer. The onus of proving circumstances justifying such determination shall be on the employer.

(d) (i) The proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall be one to every three or fraction of three tradesmen

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and, in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is for a term not exceeding two years taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to tradesmen.

(ii) An employer specially qualified to teach apprentices may, with the consent of the Secretary for Labour, on the recommendation of the Wages Board, employ a greater proportion of apprentices to tradesmen than hereinbefore specified.

Until further order, apprentices so taken shall not be counted in future calculations of the proportion of apprentices to tradesmen authorized by this Determination.

#### Period of Apprenticeship.

If an apprentice is under the age of 16 years 6 months at the time of commencing—5 years; if 16 years and 6 months or over-4 years.

#### Probationary Period.

(e) Minors may be taken on probation for three months and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. Wages.

(f) The minimum weekly rates of wages for apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in addition thereto the constant and war loadings specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such

The total wage of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

Provided that subject to the sub-clause relating to lost time herein an apprentice on attaining the age of 21 years shall thereafter, until he has completed his apprenticeship, be paid the appropriate tradesman's rate as set out in clause 2.

On the expiration of his apprenticeship an employee who produces satisfactory evidence that he has satisfactorily completed the full term set out in his indentures shall, irrespective of the work on which he may be employed, receive the rate provided for a nail or tack tool maker.

### Hours.

(h) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the tradesmen.

# Overtime and Shift Work.

(i) No apprentice under the age of eighteen years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.

## Payment by Results.

(j) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

## Lost Time.

(k) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.

Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

## Prohibition of Premiums.

(l) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

# Attendance at Technical Schools.

(m) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

#### Annual and Sick Leave.

(n) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 14 and 15 hereof respectively.

#### FEMALES, MALE JUVENILE WORKERS, AND IMPROVERS.

4. Female labour may be employed at sorting or packing. The minimum rates of wage for adult and junior females and for juvenile workers and improvers shall be as follows:—

Provided that the rate payable to any employee shall not, excluding the constant loading, be less than 20s.

The total wage shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

The proportion of improvers who may be taken by an employer shall be one to every four or fraction of four tradesmen.

The minimum rate payable to a junior female of any age or a junior male of eighteen years or more each with less than six months' experience under this Determination shall, until he or she has had such six months' experience, be 10 per cent. less than the amount represented by the percentage of the needs basic wage hereby prescribed for a junior employee of his or her age and in addition thereto the constant loading prescribed for such an employee.

A female or a junior employee, who on the date of this Determination coming into force, in his or her case was entitled under the previous Determination to a rate higher than that hereby prescribed for an employee of his or her age and experience, shall be paid at not less than the rate prescribed by such previous Determination for an employee of his or her age or experience, as the case may be, until he or she completes the year or experience or of age in respect of which the last-mentioned rate is prescribed. Upon completion of such year the minimum rate of wage in his or her case shall be the rate hereby prescribed.

#### SPECIAL RATES.

5. In addition to the wages prescribed in clauses 2, 3, and 4 hereof, the following special rates and allowances shall be paid to employees including apprentices and unapprenticed juniors:—

# Dirty Work.

(a) Work which a foreman and workman shall agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature, 14d. per hour extra.

In case of disagreement between the foreman and workman, the workman or a shop steward on his behalf shall be entitled within 24 hours, to ask for a decision on the workman's claim by the employer's industrial officer (if there be one), or otherwise by the employer or the executive officer responsible for the management or superintendence of the plant concerned. In such case a decision shall be given on the workman's claim wihin 48 hours of its being asked for (unless that time expires on a non-working day, in which case it shall be given during the next working day), or else the said allowance shall be paid.

## Wet Places.

(b) An employee working in any place where his clothing or boots become saturated, whether by water, oil, or otherwise, shall be paid 2d. per hour extra: Provided that this extra rate shall not be payable to an employee who is provided by the employer with suitable and effective protective clothing and/or footwear: And provided further that any employee who becomes entitled to this extra rate shall be paid such extra rate for such part of the day or shift as he is required to work in wet clothing or boots.

# $Special\ Rates\ not\ Cumulative.$

(c) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

### Rates not Subject to Penalty Additions.

(d) The special rates herein prescribed shall be paid irrespective of the times at which the work is performed, and shall not be subject to any premium or penalty additions.

### Hours of Work.

## Day Workers.

6.(a) The ordinary hours of work shall be 40 per week to be worked in five days of not more than 8 hours (Monday to Friday inclusive) and one day (Saturday) of not more than 4 hours; or five days (Monday to Friday inclusive) of 8 hours each continuously except for meal breaks at the discretion of the employer, between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7 a.m. and noon on Saturday.

In localities where the recognized half-holiday is on a day other than Saturday the day so recognized may be substituted for Saturday for all the purposes of this Determination.

Provided that the spread of hours or the daily hours prescribed may be altered as to all or a section of the employees by mutual agreement between an employer and the representative of the union in that shop.

#### Five-Daus' Week.

- (b) In any case in which the ordinary week's work of 40 hours can be performed in five days as aforesaid without—
  - (i) detriment to the public interest;
  - (ii) loss in the value of goods handled or to be handled;
  - (iii) reducing the efficiency of production; or
  - (iv) reducing the efficacy of the necessary service,

the employer shall allow those employees who so desire to do so to work their ordinary hours in five days as aforesaid.

This sub-clause shall not apply to employees engaged on the maintenance and servicing of plant.

It is a condition of the allowing of a five-days' week hereunder that if required employees shall comply with the reasonable and lawful orders of the employer as to working overtime, including the working of overtime on Saturday.

### SHIFT WORK. Definitions.

7. (a) For the purposes of this clause:

"Afternoon shift" means any shift finishing after 6 p.m. and at or before midnight.

"Continuous work" means work carried on with consecutive shifts of men throughout the 24 hours of each of at least six consecutive days without interruption except during breakdowns or meal breaks or due to unavoidable causes beyond the control of the employer.

"Night shift" means any shift finishing subsequent to midnight and at or before 8 a.m.

"The shift" means any shift finishing subsequent to midnight and at or before 8 a.m.

"Night shift" means any shift finishing subsequent to midnight and at or before 8 a.m.
"Rostered shift" means a shift of which the employee concerned has had at least 48 hours' notice.

## Hours-Continuous Work Shifts.

(b) This sub-clause shall apply to shift workers on continuous work as hereinbefore defined. The ordinary hours of such shift workers shall not exceed-

(i) 8 in any one day; or

(ii) 48 in any one week; or (iii) 88 in 14 consecutive days; or

(iv) 160 in 28 consecutive days.

Subject to the following conditions such shift workers shall work at such times as the employer may require:-

(i) a shift shall consist of not more than eight hours, inclusive of crib time;
(ii) except at the regular change-over of shifts, an employee shall not be required to work more than one shift in each 24 hours;

(iii) twenty minutes shall be allowed to shift workers each shift for crib, which shall be counted as time worked.

#### Hours-Other than Continuous Work.

(c) This sub-clause shall apply to shift workers not upon continuous work as hereinbefore defined. The ordinary hours of such shift workers shall not exceed—

(i) 40 in any week to be worked in five shifts of 8 hours on Monday to Friday inclusive, or five shifts of not more than 8 hours and one shift (Saturday) of not more than 4 hours, or

(ii) 80 in fourteen consecutive days in which case an employee shall not, without payment for overtime, be required to work more than eight consecutive hours on any shift or more than six shifts in any week, or

(iii) 120 in 21 consecutive days, in which case an employee shall not, without payment for overtime, be required to work more than eight consecutive hours on any shift or more than six shifts in any week.

Such ordinary hours shall be worked continuously except for meal breaks at the discretion of the employer. An employee shall not be required to work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

Except at regular change over of shifts an employee shall not be required to work more than one shift in each 24 hours.

#### Rosters.

(d) Shift rosters shall specify the commencing and finishing times of ordinary working hours of the respective shifts.

## ·Variation by Agreement.

(c) The method of working shifts may in any case be varied by agreement between the employer and the accredited representative of the union to suit the circumstances of the establishment.

The time of commencing and finishing shifts once having been determined may be varied by agreement between the employer and the accredited representative of the union to suit the circumstances of the establishment, or in the absence of agreement by seven days' notice of alteration given by the employer to the employees.

# Afternoon or Night Shift Allowances.

(f) Shift workers on continuous work whilst on afternoon or night shifts shall be paid 71 per cent. more than the ordinary rates for such shifts.

Shift workers on other than continuous work whilst on afternoon or night shifts shall be paid 10 per cent. more than the ordinary rates for such shifts.

Shift workers who work on any afternoon or night shift which does not continue for at least five successive afternoons or nights in a five-day workshop or for at least six successive afternoons or nights in a six-day workshop shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

An employee who-

(i) during a period of engagement on shift works night shift only; or
(ii) remains on night shift for a longer period than four consecutive weeks; or
(iii) works on a night shift which does not rotate or alternate with another shift or with day work so as to give him
at least one-third of his working time off night shift in each shift cycle,

shall during such engagement, period or cycle, be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for all time worked during ordinary working hours on such night shifts.

(fi) The minimum rate to be paid to any shift worker for work performed between midnight on Friday and midnight on Saturday shall be time and a quarter. Such extra rate to be in substitution for and not cumulative upon the shift premiums prescribed in the first and second paragraphs of sub-clause (f) hereof.

#### Overtime.

(g) Shift workers for all time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours prescribed by this Determination or on a shift other than a rostered shift shall—

(i) if employed on continuous work be paid at the rate of double time; or(ii) if employed on other shift work at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, except in each case when the time is worked-

(iii) by arrangement between the employees themselves;
(iv) for the purpose of effecting the customary rotation of shifts; or
(v) is due to the fact that the relief man does not come on duty at the proper time; or
(vi) on a shift to which an employee is transferred on short notice as an alternative to standing the employee off in
circumstances which would entitle the employer to deduct payment for a day in accordance with clause 13 (b)

Provided that when not less than eight hours' notice has been given to the employer by the relief man that he will be absent from work and the employee whom he should relieve is not relieved, the unrelieved employee shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours on duty after he has finished his ordinary shift and at the rate of double time thereafter except where the employee is required to continue to work on his rostered day off when he shall be paid double time.

## Compulsory Overtime.

(gi) An employer may require any employee to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such employee shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

į.

#### Sundays and Holidays.

(h) Shift workers on continuous work shifts for work done on a rostered shift the major portion of which is performed on a Sunday or holiday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

Shift workers on other than continuous work for all time worked on a Sunday or holiday shall be paid at the rates prescribed by clause 10 of this Determination. Where shifts commence between 11 p.m. and midnight on a Sunday or holiday the time so worked before midnight shall not entitle the employee to the Sunday or holiday rate; provided that the time worked by an employee on a shift commencing before midnight on the day preceding a Sunday or holiday and extending into a Sunday or holiday shall be regarded as time worked on such Sunday or holiday.

#### Junior and Female Employees.

(i) Female shift workers, apprentices or juniors whilst on afternoon or night shifts shall be paid not less than the rates hereinbefore prescribed or ls. per shift whichever is the higher.

#### MIXED FUNCTIONS.

8. An employee engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If for less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

#### OVERTIME.

9. (a) For all work done outside ordinary hours the rates of pay shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, such double time to continue until the completion of the overtime work. Provided that in the case of an apprentice or a junior the rate for overtime shall be not less than the rate herein prescribed or 1s. 6d. per hour, whichever is the higher.

Except as provided in this sub-clause or sub-clause (b) hereof in computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

#### Rest Period After Overtime.

(b) When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that employees have at least eight consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

An employee (other than a casual employee) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this sub-clause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

If on the instructions of his employer such an employee resumes or continues work without having had such eight consecutive hours off duty he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring

#### Call Back.

(c) An employee recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving the premises) shall be paid for a minimum of three hours' work at the appropriate rate for each time he is so recalled; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, the employee shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job he was recalled to perform is completed within a shorter period. This sub-clause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for an employee to return to his employer's premises to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours, or where the overtime is continuous (subject to a reasonable meal break) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

Overtime worked in the circumstances specified in this sub-clause shall not be regarded as overtime for the purposes of sub-clause (b) of this clause where the actual time worked is less than three hours on such recall or on each of such recalls.

## Saturday Work-Five-Days' Week.

(d) A day worker on a five-days' week required to work overtime on a Saturday shall be afforded at least three hours' work or paid for three hours at the appropriate rate except where such overtime is continuous with overtime commenced on the day

#### Standing By.

(e) Subject to any custom now prevailing under which an employee is required regularly to hold himself in readiness for a call back, an employee required to hold himself in readiness to work after ordinary hours shall until released be paid standing by time at ordinary rates from the time from which he is so to hold himself in readiness.

(f) For work done during meal hours and thereafter until a meal-hour break is allowed time and a half rates shall be paid. An employee shall not be compelled to work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

#### Meal Hours-Maintenance Employees.

(g) Subject to the provisions of the second part of sub-clause (f) of this clause an employee employed as a regular maintenance man shall work during meal breaks at the ordinary rates herein prescribed whenever instructed to do so for the purpose of making good breakdowns of plant or upon routine maintenance of plant which can only be done while such plant is idle.

## Crib Time.

(h) An employee working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of twenty minutes without deduction of pay after each four hours of overtime worked if the employee continues work after such crib time.

Provided that where a day worker on a five-days' week is required to work overtime on a Saturday the first prescribed crib time shall, if occurring between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., be paid at ordinary rates.

Unless the period of overtime is less than one and a half hours an employee before starting overtime after working ordinary hours shall be allowed a meal break of twenty minutes which shall be paid for at ordinary rates. An employer and employee may agree to any variation of this provision to meet the circumstances of the work in hand provided that the employer shall not be required to make any payment in respect of any time allowed in excess of twenty minutes.

Tea Money.

(i) An employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid 2s., and 1s. 3d. for each subsequent meal, but such payment need not be made to employees living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for meals.

Unless the employer advises an employee on the previous day or earlier that the amount of overtime to be worked will necessitate the partaking of a second or subsequent meal (as the case may be) the employer shall provide such second and/or subsequent meals or make payment in lieu thereof as above prescribed.

If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less than the amount advised he shall be paid as above prescribed for meals which he has provided, but which are surplus.

#### Transport of Employees.

(j) When an employee, after having worked overtime, or a shift for which he has not been regularly rostered, finishes work at a time when reasonable means of transport are not available, the employer shall provide him with a conveyance to his home, or pay him his current wage for the time reasonably occupied in reaching his home.

## Compulsory Overtime.

(k) An employer may require any employee to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such employee shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

#### HOLIDAYS AND SUNDAY WORK.

10. (a) Employees shall be entitled to the following public holidays without loss of pay as regards employees on weekly hiring:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or such other day as is generally observed in the locality as a substitute for any of the said days respectively.

By agreement between any employer and his employees, other days may be substituted for the said days or any of them as to such employer's undertaking.

(b) An employee not engaged on continuous work shall be paid at the rate of double time for work done on Sunday and public holidays, such double time to continue until he is relieved from duty:

Provided that where employees are necessarily engaged in repairs to or renewals of their employer's plant and machinery necessary for resumption of work the next following working day, work done on holidays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first eight hours and double time thereafter.

- (c) An employee, other than a casual employee, not engaged in continuous work who works on a Sunday or a public holiday and (except for meal breaks) immediately thereafter continues such work shall, on being relieved from duty be entitled to be absent until he has eight consecutive hours off duty, without deduction of pay for ordinary time of duty occurring during auch absence.
- (d) Employees, other than on shift, required to work on Sundays or public holidays shall be paid for a minimum of three

#### EXTRA RATES NOT CUMULATIVE.

11. Extra rates in this Determination, except rates prescribed in clause 5, are not cumulative so as to exceed the maximum of double the ordinary rates.

### PAYMENT OF WAGES.

12. (a) Wages shall be paid weekly or fortnightly.

- (b) On the first pay day occurring during his employment, an employee shall be paid whatever wages are due to him up to the completion of his work on the previous day: Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to employers who make a practice of allowing advances to employees approximating wages due.
- (c) Upon determination of the employment wages due to an employee shall be paid to him on the day of such determination, or forwarded to him by post on the next working day.
- (d) An employee kept waiting for his wages on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid at overtime rates after that quarter hour, with a minimum of a quarter of an hour.
- (e) On or prior to pay day, the employer shall state to each employee, in writing, the amount of wages to which he is entitled, the amount of deductions made therefrom, and the net amount being paid to him.

#### CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT.

#### Weekly Employment.

- 13. (a) Except as hereinafter provided, employment shall be by the week. Any employee not specifically engaged as a casual employee shall be deemed to be employed by the week.
- (b) Employment shall be terminated by a week's notice on either side given at any time during the week or by the payment or forfeiture of a week's wages as the case may be. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employees without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, and in such cases the wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only or to deduct payment for any day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown in machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.
- (c) An employee not attending for duty shall except as provided by clause 14 hereof lose his pay for the actual time for such non-attendance.

## Casual Employment.

(d) A casual employee is one engaged and paid as such. A casual employee for working ordinary time shall be paid per hour one-fortieth of the weekly rate prescribed by this Determination for the work which he or she performs, plus 10 per

## Late Comers.

(c) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in the Determination an employer may select and utilize for time-keeping purposes any fractional or decimal proportion of an hour (not exceeding a quarter of an hour) and may apply such proportion in the calculation of the working time of employees who without reasonable cause promptly communicated to the employer, report for duty after their appointed starting times or coase duty before their appointed finishing times.

An employer who adopts a proportion for the aforesaid purpose shall apply the same proportion for the calculation of

#### SICK LEAVE.

- 14. (a) An employee on weekly hiring who is absent from his work on account of personal illness, or on account of injury by accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, shall be entitled to leave of absence, without deduction of pay, subject to the following conditions and limitations:-
  - (i) He shall not be entitled to paid leave of absence for any period in respect of which he is entitled to workers'
  - compensation. (ii) He shall, within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence, inform the employer of his inability to attend for duty and, as far as practicable, state the nature of the injury or illness and the estimated duration of the

  - absence.

    (iii) He shall prove to the satisfaction of his employer that he was unable on account of such illness or injury to attend for duty on the day or days for which sick leave is claimed.

    (iv) He shall not be entitled in any year (whether in the employ of one employer or of several) to leave in excess of 40 hours of working time.

For the purpose of administering paragraph (iv) of this sub-clause an employer may, within one month of this Determination coming into operation or within two weeks of the employee entering his employment, require an employee to make a sworn declaration or other written statement as to what paid leave of absence he has had from any employer during the then current year; and upon such statement the employer shall be entitled to rely and act.

#### Single Day Absences.

(b) In the case of an employee who claims to be allowed paid sick leave in accordance with this clause for an absence of one day only such employee if in the year he has already been allowed paid sick leave on more than one occasion for one day only, shall not be entitled to payment for the day claimed unless he produces to the employer a certificate of a duly qualified medical practitioner that in his, the medical practitioner's, opinion the employee was unable to attend for duty on account of personal illness or on account of injury by accident. Nothing in this sub-clause shall limit the employer's rights under sub-clause (a) (iii)

## Cumulative Sick Leave.

(c) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in sub-clause (a) (iv) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to an employee by an employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the employee and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed shall be allowed by that employer in a subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this sub-clause shall be available to the employee for a period of two years, but for no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(cc) Rights accrued under sub-clause (c) hereof prior to the 1st day of January, 1948, shall be preserved except that the total number of hours so accrued and not taken prior to the 1st day of January, 1948, shall be reduced by 1/11th of such total the result to be calculated to the nearest hour.

## Attendance at Hospital, &c.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (a) hereof an employee suffering injury through an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment (not being an injury in respect of which he is entitled to workers' compensation) necessitating his attendance during working hours on a doctor, chemist, or trained nurse, or at a hospital, shall not suffer any deduction from his pay for the time (not exceeding four hours) so occupied on the day of the accident, and shall be reimbursed by the employer all expenses reasonably incurred in connexion with such attendance.

#### · ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

15. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946 No. 5111, and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

Accommodation and Conveniences.

#### Boiling Water.

16. (a) (i) Employers shall provide boiling water for employees at meal times.

#### Drinking Water.

(ii) Employers shall provide for the use of employees in workshops a sufficient supply of wholesome cool drinking water from bubble taps or other suitable drinking fountains.

#### First-Aid Outfit.

(iii) In each workshop, and at other places where employees are regularly employed, the employer shall provide and continuously maintain at a place or places reasonably accessible to all employees an efficient first-aid outfit.

Clause 8 of Chapter 9 of the Regulations under the Factories and Shops Act 1928 requires that a first-aid ambulance chest shall be kept in some accessible place upon the premises, and that such chest shall be equipped and supplied with the following articles :-

#### Lockers.

(iv) An employer shall at some reasonably convenient place on his premises provide a suitable locker for each employee in his workshop, or hanging facilities which afford reasonable protection for employees' clothes. In any case in which compliance with this paragraph necessitates the provision of lockers or new or improved hanging facilities, they shall be provided by the 1st July, 1946.

#### Washing and Sanitary Conveniences.

(v) Employers shall provide proper and sufficient washing and sanitary conveniences.

# Clothing, Equipment, and Tools.

Damage to Clothing and Tools.

(b) (i) Compensation to the extent of the damage sustained shall be made where in the covrse of the work clothing or tools are damaged or destroyed by fire or molten metal or through the use of corrosive substances. Provided that the employer's liability in respect of tools shall be limited to such tools of trade as are ordinarily required for the performance of the employee's

# Goggles.

(ii) Suitable mice or other goggles shall be provided by the employer for each employee using emery wheels or where used by more than one employee such goggles shall be sterilized before being used by another employee. An employee when working on emery wheels shall wear the goggles provided for his protection.

Goggles containing celluloid shall not be considered suitable for the purposes of this provision.

# Protective Clothing-Galvanizing, &c.

(iii) Employers shall provide suitable protective aprons, rubber gloves, and rubber boots or clogs, to employees engaged in the manual handling of materials over hot galvanizing or tinning pots or pickling or plating baths.

(iv) Until further order the employer shall provide for each employee such tools as were customarily provided at the time of the making of this Determination. The employee shall replace or pay for any tools so provided if lost through his negligence.

## Females-Rest Period and Seats.

(c) Female employees shall be allowed a rest period of not less than ten minutes during each day or shift, to be taken during the first or second half of the day or shift as may be decided by a majority of the female employees in a shop.

When requested by employees and where practicable suitable seats shall be provided by the employer for female employees.

#### Ventilation.

- (d) While any work is being carried on in any confined or enclosed space in which-
  - (i) fumes, gases, dust or vapours which may be dangerous or injurious are liable to be present or to be generated in the course of the work; or
  - (ii) the atmosphere may otherwise become vitiated,

the employer shall install a suction exhaust apparatus, through which by means of a power-driven fan air is drawn from the vicinity of the work in relation to which it is installed.

Where it is impracticable to install such suction exhaust apparatus the employer shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure safe working conditions in any such confined or enclosed space.

This sub-clause shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the Harmful Gases, Vapours, Mists, Smokes and Dust Regulations 1945 (published in the Victoria Government Gazette No. 21, dated 7th February, 1945) and shall not apply to any processes or occupations to which those Regulations apply.

#### SHOP STEWARDS.

17. An employee appointed shop steward in the shop or department in which he is employed shall, upon notification thereof to his employer, be recognized as the accredited representative of the union to which be belongs, and he shall be allowed the necessary time during working hours to interview the employer or his representative on matters affecting employees whom he represents.

### RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIALS.

- 18. (a) For the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business, a duly accredited union representative shall have the right to enter employers' premises during the midday meal break on the following conditions:—
  - (i) That he produces his authority to the gatekeeper or such other person as may be appointed by the employer.
  - (ii) That he interviews employees only at places where they are taking their meal.
  - (iii) That not more than one representative of each of not more than three unions be on the premises at any one
  - (iv) That no one representative visit the premises more than once in each week.
  - (v) That if any employer alleges that a representative is unduly interfering with his work or is creating dissatisfaction amongst his employees, or is offensive in his methods, or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions such employer may refuse the right of entry

Provided that where certain employees are working under a system of shift work which precludes a representative from interviewing them during the midday meal break the representative shall have the right to enter the employer's premises for the purpose of interviewing such employees at such time and under such conditions as to notice as may be mutually arranged by the representative and the employer.

- (b) For the purpose of investigating complaints concerning the application of this Determination, or the employment of females upon work which is alleged to be unsuitable for females, a duly accredited union representative shall be afforded reasonable facilities for entering an employer's workshop or plant during working hours, subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i) That he discloses to the employer or his representative the complaint which he desires to investigate.
  - (ii) That he makes his investigations in the presence of the employer or his representative (if the employer so desires).
  - (iii) That he does not interfere with work proceeding in the workshop or plant.
  - (iv) That he conducts himself properly.
- (c) A union representative shall be a duly accredited representative of an organization concerned if he be the holder for the time being of a certificate, signed by the general secretary of that organization and bearing the seal of that organization, in the following form, or in a form not materially differing therefrom:—

# TIME AND WAGES BOOK.

- 19. (a) Each employer shall keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each employee and his occupation, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week.
- (b) The time occupied by an employee in filling in any time record or cards or in the making of records shall be treated as time of duty, but this does not apply to checking in or out when entering or leaving the employer's premises.
- (c) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited union official during the usual office hours at the employer's office or other convenient place: Provided that an inspection shall not be demanded unless the secretary of the union or the district secretary or organizer of any division suspects that a breach of the Determination has been committed: Provided also that only one demand for such inspection shall be made in one fortnight at the same establishment.
- (d) The official making such inspection shall be entitled to take a copy of entries in a time and wages record relating to the suspected breach of the Determination.

#### NOTICE BOARD.

20. The employer shall permit a notice board of reasonable dimensions to be erected in a prominent position in his establishment, upon which accredited union representatives shall be permitted to post formal union notices, signed or countersigned by the representative posting same.

#### GENERAL DEFINITIONS.

- 21. For the purposes of this Determination the following definitions shall apply:-

  - "Sunday" means all time between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday.
    "Year" means the period between the 1st day of June in each year and the next 31st day of May.
    "Nail or tack tool maker" means an employee who makes and fits all tools used in nail, staple, or tack making
  - machines.
  - "Nail or tack machinist" means an adult employee who is in charge of and sets up machines to produce the various types of nails and/or tacks. He is also responsible for the quality of the product.

    "Assistant to nail or tack machinist" is one who brings up wire to machines, and assists machinist in feeding machines

  - and removing finished products.

    "Barbed wire tool maker or machinist" means an employee who makes, grinds, and fits tools used in, and is in charge of barbed wire making machines. He is also responsible for the quality of the product.

    "Assistant to barbed wire machinist" is one who feeds material and spools into barbed wire machines, stands by,

  - "Assistant to barbed wire machinist" is one who feeds material and spools into barbed wire machines, stands by, adjusts tension, cuts off and removes finished products.

    "Tradesman" is a person employed as a toolmaker and/or a setter-up and/or a machinist, receiving not less than the appropriate rate set out in clause 2.

    "Improver" is any junior employee other than an apprentice or a juvenile worker as defined.

    "Juvenile worker" means a male person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in assisting rumbler, sawdusting, filling ladles, washing, scrubbing, drying, brushing off, sorting, packing, watching nail machines or barbed wire machines, wiring nail machines or barbed wire machines, wiring nail machines or barbed wire machines, attending horseshoe nail-heading machines, attending horseshoe nail-pointing machines, attending roofing nail-heading machines.

#### PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

22. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates, and, pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted by the same amount and at the same time as such basic wage as prescribed by clause 23.

# Adjustment of Basic Wage.

- 23. (a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.
- (b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1950, the amounts of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 22.
- (c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in an August, a November, a February, or a May, the amount of the needs basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor '037 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach '5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.

#### Marginal Rates.

In addition to the basic wage provided in clause 22 the margins and wartime loadings set out in this clause shall be the minimum rate payable to employees therein named:—
