Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 6 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

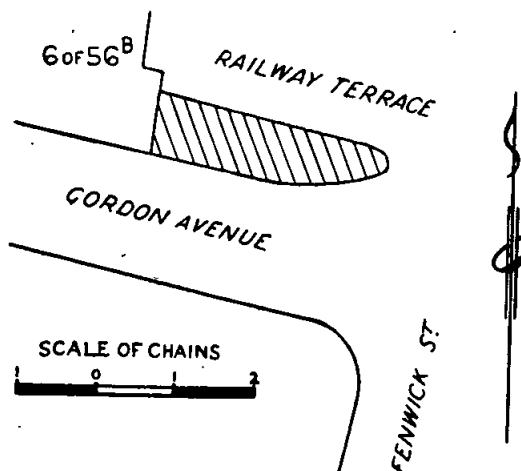

SOLDIER SETTLEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT 1949.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intitled the *Soldier Settlement (Amendment) Act 1949*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday the eighth day of February One thousand nine hundred and fifty as the day upon which the *Soldier Settlement (Amendment) Act 1949* shall come into operation.

CLOSE SEASON FOR VARIOUS SPECIES OF WILD DUCK AND TEAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation remove the period of the close season set opposite the names of the under-mentioned birds in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928* by Proclamation dated the fifteenth day of January, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the sixteenth day of January, 1946, and prescribe instead of such period the period from the first day of June in each year to Six o'clock in the forenoon on the first day of March next following, which period shall be set opposite the names of the said birds in the said Schedule.

DISSOLUTION OF A UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time if he thinks fit dissolve any Union by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation issued on the 3rd day of March, 1897, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 19th day of March, 1897, the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of Kara Kara were proclaimed to be a Union for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1890*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that such Union should now be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*, do by this my Proclamation dissolve the Union of the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of Kara Kara which was proclaimed as aforesaid.

THE Council of the Borough of Clunes, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Clunes Water Supply District:—

On such lands and tenements a rate of Two shillings in the pound of the amount of the annual municipal valuation, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and One shilling and eight pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds.

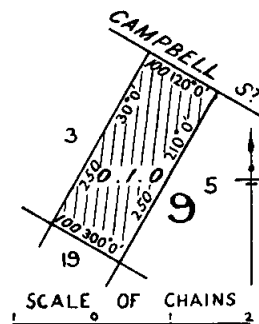
