APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

1. Orders for interment must be lodged with the sexton at his residence adjoining the cemetery grounds, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the morning and Five o'clock in the afternoon of the day prior to the funeral.

2. The name, age, and late residence of the deceased must be furnished at the time of giving order.

3. All fees or charges payable must be paid before the burial takes place.

3. All fees or charges payable must be paid before the burial takes place.

4. The funeral procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the burial.

5. Usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive. For interments on those days outside the usual hours an extra charge as set out in Schedule A hereunder will be made.

6. For interments on Saturdays or Sundays extra charges as set out in said Schedule A will be made.

7. The fees or charges payable for the burial of any deceased person will be remitted by the trustees on satisfactory evidence being produced to them that the relatives or friends of such deceased person are not in a position to meet such fees or charges.

8. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery must be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the applicant on payment of the fees or charges therefor, as set forth in said Schedule A.

9. The trustees will arrange for the digging of all common graves. Should a brick grave or vault be required it must be constructed under the supervision of the

trustees, or of some person duly appointed by them. In case interment is required in any private grave or vault belonging to another person the consent in writing of such person must be obtained and deposited with the order.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences surrounding the same must be kept in good order and condition at the expense of the owner or owners thereof.

11. Every coffin contained in a brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every tombstone, tomb, pedestal, and a

12. A drawing of every tombstone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees

for their approval. In the erection of tablets, copper clamps must be used.

13. Wooden fences will be permitted, but if not kept in good order and condition same may be removed by the trustees without notice to the owner thereof.

14. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and these may be inspected at the office of the trustees on payment of the fees or charges therefor as set out in said Schedule A.

Schedule A.

15. No servant or other person employed by or engaged on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to accept any gratuity for or in connexion with the carrying out of any duty or duties assigned to him.

16. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in and about the cemetery shall be guilty of an offence, and being convicted thereof, shall be liable to be punished as prescribed by section 38 of the Cemeteries Act 1928.

17. Under no circumstances will dogs be permitted to enter the cemetery grounds.

18. The trustees reserve the right to from time to time alter and amend the foregoing Regulations, and also the fees and charges set forth in the Schedule A hereunder.

AMENDING CINEMATOGRAPH OPERATORS REGULATIONS 1950.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Cinematograph Operators Regulations 1950, and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. Immediately after Regulation 15 of the Cinematograph Operators Regulations 1935, as amended by Regulation 3 of the Amending Cinematograph Operators Regulations 1936, there shall be inserted the Regulation following, namely:—
 - 15a. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulations 10 and 13 hereof the Board may admit to examination any candidate who has attained the full age of twenty-one years and who applies for a licence to operate in small country areas only, where screenings do not exceed three per week, provided the training undergone by such applicant is, in the Board's opinion, satisfactory in the circumstances.
 - (2) The examination of a candidate who applies under the provisions of the immediately preceding sub-regulation shall consist only of Parts 1 and 5 as set out in Regulation 13.
 - (3) Every candidate who passes such examination shall be entitled to be registered and to receive a licence limited to the apparatus and district stated on such licence.
- 3. Regulation 9 of the Cinematograph Operators Regulations 1935 is hereby amended as follows:—
 - (a) By deleting the words "Five shillings" in paragraph (a) and substituting therefor the words "Ten shillings";
 - (b) by deleting the words "One shilling and six pence" in paragraph (b) and substituting therefor the words "Two shillings and six pence";
 - (c) by deleting the words "Two shillings and six pence" in paragraph (c) and substituting therefor the words "Five shillings";
 - (d) by inserting a new paragraph as follows:-
 - " (d) The sum of One guinea for each meeting attended by him at which a quorum is present."

in any case where, on the date of the commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allot-ment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

3. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the municipal district comprised and described in the Proclamation of the Governor in

Council hereinbefore referred to.
