- (iii) Any person called upon to handle paris green or aluminium bronze in loose form, or soda ash other than in metal containers shall be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour in addition to the weekly rate.
- (iv) Storemen or packers called upon to work in cool stores shall be paid 5s. 71/20d. per hour whilst so employed. This rate includes 11/10d. as a war loading. Such war loading shall not be taken into account when computing overtime or holiday pay.

24. Casual employees, i.e., persons employed in Bond or Free Stores or Establishments engaged in the general bulk storage business for less than four weeks, shall be paid at the rate of 4s. 10\frac{1}{4}d. per hour, and such employees shall be guaranteed not less than two hours' work at every start.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 3, 4 (a), 4 (b), 4 (c). 4 (d), and 4 (e) of Part I., and clause 24 of Part III., of the said Determination shall remain in force.

For the purpose of ascertaining the proportion of improvers to male or female adults, there shall be a weekly count, and any union official making an inspection of the books to ascertain such proportion shall take the weekly average number of such male or female adults as the case may be, and the average number of male or female improvers employed during the week in which the inspection is made.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, junior workers receiving the adult wage prescribed for the class of work being performed by them, shall be counted as adult workers in calculating the proportion of juniors, but, in calculating such wage, bonuses shall not be considered as part of the wage.
