PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria. in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Frankston and Hastings aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

All that piece of land bounded by a line commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 3, section IV., Parish of Frankston, distant 1,136.2 links southeasterly from the north-eastern corner of the said Crown allotment; thence north 71 deg. 14 min. west for 3,227.3 links; thence south 71 deg. 43 min. west for 75.7 links; thence north 13 deg. 28 min. west for 89.5 links to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BRIDGEWATER PUBLIC PARK."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated 12th November, 1888, and 2nd August, 1889, as a site for Public Recreation and for a Public Park in the Town of Bridgewater, known as the "Bridgewater Public Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Reserve.

2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.

3. No person chall denote.

3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in receptacles provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve, other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter

4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve, other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions, and the payment of such fees, as the Committee of Management shall determine.

6. No person shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles, without the permission in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee of Management.

7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

injure any person.

10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearm in or upon the Reserve.

11. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing, of the Committee of Management first

obtained.

obtained.

13. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force. does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Town of Wodonga temporarily reserved as a site for Tourist Camping purposes by Order in Council dated the 24th October, 1950, together with that portion of the permanent reserve for public purposes along the Wodonga Creek which abuts such land, hereafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee of Management or its
 - Reserve the Committee of Management or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein.

 (b) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick therein or thereupon any bills, or in any way injure, damage, deface, write or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvement, structure or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 - kind therein.

 (c) Remove or displace any board plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
- Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.
- 4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee 4. No person shan, without the consent of the confinite of Management, light any fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the caretaker for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth.
- 5. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.
- 6. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve at any time without the consent of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit.
- 7. All fees prescribed herein shall be paid to the secretary or specially authorized officer on demand
- 8. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except in those parts specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as are hereinafter provided.
- 9. The charges for camping in the area set apart are as follows: --
 - A sum of not more than Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) for one night for a car party not exceeding six persons, for each additional person a sum of Six pence (6d.) per night, and for a party not exceeding six persons Ten shillings (10s.) per week.
- six persons Ten shillings (10s.) per week.

 10. No person shall park any motor car, cycle or other vehicle, or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and any person using any such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee and pay on demand a fee not exceeding One shilling per day
- and pay on demand a ree not exceeding one siming per day for entrance or use of such parking area.

 11. Camping will be permitted for a period not exceeding six weeks unless special permission, in writing, is first obtained from the Committee of Management.

- 12. Camping is only permitted on that area indicated by the Authorized Officer of the Committee of Management.
- 13. Camp sites whilst being occupied by a camp party must be kept in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before a camp party leaves the Reserve such party shall collect and place in the receptacles provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage produced at the camp site allotted to such party.
- 14. No person shall bathe or prepare to bathe in the Reserve unless clad in a bathing costume which meets with the approval of the Committee of Management.
- 15. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter or play on swings or other appliances erected on any children's playground, but parents and other attendants shall be at liberty to enter playground to watch the children who are in their charge.
- 16. The Committee of Management may at its discretion on such terms and conditions, and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent or hire to persons, clubs or associations, any tennis courts or other part or parts of the Reserve.
- 17. The swings and other appliances erected in the children's playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children shall be waiting for them.
- 18. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
- 19. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the children's playground, or bring any animal into same.
- 20. Every person in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any duly authorized officer of the said Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct
- 21. No fête, concert, carnival, or aquatic display shall be held in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, nor shall fees for admission to the Reserve on days on which fêtes, concerts, carnivals, or aquatic dis-plays be charged without the consent of such Committee.
- 22. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 23. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.
- 24. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.
- 25. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage in any way, destroy, or have in his possession in the Reserve, or take away therefrom, any animal, bird, bird's egg, or any live or dead or dressed timber, or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plants or flowers.
- 26. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve, any rifle or firearm of like nature, or sporting gun or air-gun, except with the consent. in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 27. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over or upon the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained, and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed.
- 28. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to the occupier of the Reserve with all power incidental to that status within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
- 29. For the purpose of this Regulation "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928, or amendments thereto.
- 30. No person shall bring or allow any dog or animal belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserve, unless such dog or animal is held on a leash by such person, and all dogs or animals found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 31. No person except workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area enclosed for a special purpose.
- 32. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse, except

on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.

- 33. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
- 34. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein, recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the road, parking area, or Reserve, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on any such road, parking area, or in the Reserve.
- parking area, or in the Reserve.

 35. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth on any site on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall use or cause, to be used, or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection, or booth for residential purposes.
- 36. The Committee of Management shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired, or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.
- 37. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve, within fourteen (14) days after the Committee of Management has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee of Management.
- 38. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as abovementioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee of Management may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth, and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same, but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.
- 39. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

The Council of the Shire of Wodonga has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND RESERVE, DENNINGTON.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under

the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Dennington temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 26th April, 1950, as a site for a Children's Playground, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve, nor stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats, or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any dog, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 - 6. No person shall camp in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall erect therein any structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- 11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 12. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use the Reserve or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the Reserve to watch over children who are in their charge.
- 13. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Reserve, except for the purposes for which they are respectively provided.
- 14. All papers, fruit peel, and other litter shall be placed in the basket or bins provided by the Committee of Management for that purpose.
- 15. Every person in the Reserve shall obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.
- 16. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Reserve.
- swings or other appliances in the Reserve.

 17. Any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee of Management shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty provided under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and

taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
