Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1950.

PROPORTION (within any factory or place).

Apprentices.

One male apprentice to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving at wages rates or piece-work prices not less than 167s. 6d. per week.

One female apprentice to every three or fraction of three female workers receiving at wages rates or piece-work prices not less than 118s. 6d. per week.

Improvers.

One male improver to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving at wages rates or piece-work prices not less than 167s. 6d. per week.

One female improver to every three or fraction of three female workers receiving not less than 118s. 6d. per week.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
