CHEESE-WHOLESALE PRICES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

# Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 290.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Wholesale.

2. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any cheese of a description specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale in Victoria to be the price specified in the second column of that Schedule.

# Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any cheese specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

# PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 291,

PROCESSED MILK PRODUCTS-WHOLESALE PRICES.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldren, Prices Decentrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 291.

#### Definitions and Interpretations.

- 2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
- "Metropolitan Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
  "Ton" means 2,240 pounds weight avoirdupois.

# Maximum Prices-Sales by Wholesale.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which processed milk products of the description specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale in Victoria to be the price set out opposite such goods in the second column of that Schedule.

#### Discounts.

- 4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where any person has customarily allowed, in relation to sales by wholesale of any of the processed milk products specified in the Schedule to this Order, any difference in price-

  - (a) to any person or to any person included in any class of persons;(b) in respect of sales of certain quantities;(c) in respect of sales under certain conditions of sale or upon certain terms of payment;

the maximum prices fixed by or under this Order, in respect of those processed milk products shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities or under such conditions or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by allowance of that difference.

# Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any processed milk product specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

# Prices Regulation Acts. PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 292. HAND KNITTING WOOLS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner for the State of Victoria, hereby make the following Order:—

# Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices. Regulation Order No. 292.

# Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 187 is hereby revoked.

# Amendment.

3. Prices Regulation Order No. 236 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 258, 270 and 281 is further amended by deleting from Columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule to the Order the figures 20 and 22½ respectively appearing against item 14 in column 1 of the said Schedule and inserting in lieu thereof the figures 22½ and 25 respectively.

#### Application.

4. For the purpose of this Order and the Schedule thereto "Hand knitting wool" includes all fingering yarns.

# Maximum Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which hand knitting wools of the type and of the description specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail by the ball, skein, or twist to be the price specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

# Exhibition of Price Tickets.

- 6. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail any hand knitting wool, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach or display with such goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price therefor.
- (2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause-to be attached or displayed with any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those-goods and as to be properly associated with such goods.

# Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any goods, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which are specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
