

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fourth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI., initituled the Survey Co-ordination Act 1940, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim certain areas of land as survey areas for the purpose of the aforesaid Act: Now therefore I, the Governor

of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do, by this my Proclamation declare that the land hereinafter described be proclaimed a Survey Area for the purposes of section 12 (2) of the aforesaid Act (that is to say):—





4. Regulations Nos. 230 to 233 inclusive are repealed, and the following Regulations substituted therefor:-

WHARF CRANES AND MECHANICAL APPLIANCES.

WHARF CRANES AND MECHANICAL APPLIANCES.

230. Every person desiring to use any crane or any mobile cargo-handling plant of the Commissioners shall make application on the prescribed form there for to the Commissioners, who may grant permission to use the same on payment of the fee which they may from time to time appoint.

231. The hirer of a crane or any mobile cargo-handling plant shall see that all the working parts thereof have been carefully oiled before using it, and must not lift a greater weight with it than that indicated on the crane or the plant as the maximum lift thereof, and must not use any such crane or plant for dragging out cargo, or for any other purpose than lifting and landing.

232. The hirer of any crane or any mobile cargo-

232. The hirer of any crane or any mobile cargo-handling plant shall be responsible therefor, and shall make good any damage sustained by such crane or plant when in his use.

plant when in his use.

233. The Commissioners shall be under no responsibility for any crane or any mobile cargo-handling plant when in use by any hirer thereof, and the persons using such crane or plant when hired on behalf of the hirer, are to be deemed servants of the latter, and not of the Commissioners. The hirer shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Commissioners from and against all actions, claims, and demands whatsoever arising out of the operation or use of such crane or plant during the period of hiring (except claims made by an employee of the Commissioners for workers' compensation under the Workers' Compensation Acts of the State of Victoria, or any amendment thereof for the time being in force, where the injury was not due to the negligence force, where the injury was not due to the negligence of the hirer).

5. After Regulation No. 304 of the Principal Regulations, the following Regulation is inserted:—

304A. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel requiring the use of any berth at Station Pier or Princes Pier, Port Melbourne, shall pay to the Commissioners for the use of such berth for the storage of cargo, in addition to the charges provided in Regulation No. 316, the following charges:—

- (a) For the storage of outward cargo prior to the berthing of the vessel by which it is intended to be shipped, from the time when such wharf is set apart until the berthing of the vessel-
 - At Station Pier, the sum of £5 7s. 9d. for each quarter of a day.
 - At Princes Pier, the sum of £3 6s. 6d. for each quarter of a day.
- (b) For the storage of any cargo remaining on the wharf after departure of the vessel, whether such cargo was intended for shipment or was landed from the vessel, from time of departure of the vessel until the whole of such cargo has been removed, the sum of £1 5s. per quarter of a day.

Provided always that the charge for any part of a day of or less than six hours shall be that specified for a quarter of a day.

The granting of the use of any portions of the piers for the storage of outward cargo shall be at the discretion of the Commissioners and any such grant may be revoked.

The provisions of Regulation No. 304 shall not apply to Station Pier or Princes Pier, Port Melbourne.





REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations the expression "The Committee" shall mean the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve.
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
 - 3. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards, dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
 (d) Offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve.

 (f) Climb, jump on, or get over any of the gates, fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings,

 (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.

 (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything
 - that might injure any person.

 (i) Light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
 - (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein.
 (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

 (1) Spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

 (m) Erect any building, tent, or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

 (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, but this clause shall not apply to greyhounds.

 (o) Bring into the Reserve any greyhound for exercise or training or for any purpose.

 (p) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

 Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such persons may be

- 4. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
- 6. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for athletic

training, or other physical recreation, subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations;

deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations; and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

7. No club, association, or person shall hold or take part in any game of tennis, or any games of any description, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained.

No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time.

9. No person except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying

the fees chargeable for admission.

10. No person shall park a motor car within the Reserve except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the purpose.

11. No person shall take or put, or allow to be taken or put, in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control, or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the

Reserve.

12. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

13. No person shall train or exercise any horse in the

No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee; and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a

person in charge thereof.

15. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Com-mittee or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff. 16. No person, except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shubs or

17. The Committee may from time to time grant annual or temporary permission to any person or persons to place boats on the water of the lake in the said Reserve, and to use such boats in accordance with the conditions to be made by the said Committee and endorsed in such permit, and to erect suitable and convenient boat houses thorein

18. The Committee may, on a breach of the said conditions endorsed on such permit, in its discretion determine any such permit and remove the boat and any other property of the person or persons having obtained such a permit from the said Committee.

19. No person shall convey into the Reserve or place upon the lake therein any boat in respect of which a licence has not been obtained from the Committee.

20. No boat house shall be used for entertainment

purposes or for any other purpose than that relating to the storage and use of boats without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

21. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding 5 miles per hour in one direction as indicated by a sign post near the entrance to the Reserve, and shall not on any pretence turn back from such direction.

22. No person shall ride a motor cycle in any part

of the Reserve.

23. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect such fees or other charges for entering, and use of any such area as the Committee shall from time to time determine.

24. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged

24. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding ten in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for the purpose of sports, carnivals, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—For admission of every adult person, such sum as the Committee may determine not exceeding Two shillings and six pence: Provided that the net amount received by the Committee, after providing for any expenses and disbursements in connexion

therewith, shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an

maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works.

25. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce, and if required surrender, such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized

ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

26. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of fêtes, sports, carnivals, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit with the Committee any sum, not exceeding Twenty pounds, which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

27. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or otherwise offending against decency in the Reserve, or otherwise offending against these Regulations, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being, to keep order, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence regulation. against these Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

"Builder" means the master builder or other person employed to construct any building and shall include the owner or occupier of the land upon which any such building is or is intended to be constructed or other the person for whom or by whose order or under whose direction and control such construction is done or is intended to be done as the case may be.

"Construct" and "construction" have the meanings ascribed thereto respectively by clause 102 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Mel-

"Story" and "ground story" have the respective meanings ascribed thereto by clause 102 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

"Surveyor" means a building surveyor appointed by the Council and includes any deputy building surveyor appointed by the Council.

- 2. From and after the date of the coming into operation of this By-law those parts of the City of Melbourne comprised within the areas more particularly described in the Second Schedule to By-law No. 251 save and except in the Second Schedule to By-law No. 251 save and except thereout those parts of the City of Melbourne more particularly described in the Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy within the meaning of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, shall not be constructed to contain more than three stories including the ground story. Such areas are hereinafter referred to as prescribed areas.
- 3. No builder shall construct in any prescribed area any building of Class II. Occupancy within the meaning of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, having more than three stories including the ground story.
- 4. Any builder who constructs a building contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence
- 5. If any building is constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law the surveyor may service notice in writing upon the owner or occupier of the land upon which such building is constructed requiring the person served with such notice forthwith to pull down any building constructed upon such land contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
- 6. If the pulling down of a building required by notice served under clause 5 is not commenced within seven days after the service of such notice or is not proceeded with and completed as speedily as the nature of the case will admit the Council may call upon the owner and the occupier of the land upon which the building has been constructed as aforesaid to show cause why an order should not be made for the pulling down or removal of such building and if such owner or occupier does not show cause as aforesaid the Council may order such owner or occupier to pull down and remove such building within the time to be fixed by the Council. 6. If the pulling down of a building required by notice

In the event of non-compliance with an order made by the Council under clause 6 the Council may pull down and remove such building or may authorize any person whom it thinks fit to do so and may sell the materials pulled down or removed in such manner as it may think the materials pulled the materials are the materials and the materials pulled the materials are not provided the materials and the materials are not provided to the materials are pulled down or removed in such manner as it may think it and may apply the proceeds of such sale in or towards reimbursing itself for the expenses of such pulling down or removal and may also recover any balance of such expenses not satisfied as aforesaid from the owner or occupier in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
- 8. Any person who fails to comply with any order of the Council under clause 6 of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence.
- 9. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

10. Any notice or order under this By-law may be in the same manner as is prescribed by section 847 of the Local Government Act 1946 with respect to notices which by that act are required to be given to the owner or occupier of any building or land.

11. Clause 3 of By-law No. 248 is hereby repealed.
