 - (iv) Employers shall provide proper washing conveniences for such employees and also hot water or some other efficient cleansing material.

Clauses, other than clause 2 of Part 1 and clause 1 of Part 2, of the said Determination as amended on the 19th February; 1951, shall remain in force.
