Prices Regulations Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 318.

LIQUORS—METROPOLITAN AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 318.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 145 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Liquor or Liquors” means and includes ale, beer, lager, stout, porter, and any mixtures thereof; or any mixtures thereof with aerated waters;

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;

“Oz. or Ozs.” means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;

“4-oz. Glass” means any glass or similar container holding 4 ounces or more, but less than 7 ounces;

“7-oz. Glass” or “Long Glass” means any glass or similar container holding 7 ounces or more, but less than 11 ounces;

“11-oz. Pot” means any glass or similar container holding not less than 11 ounces;

“Reputed Pint” means 13 ounces;

“Reputed Quart” means 26 ounces;

“Nip” means 6½ ounces;

“Demi Nip” means 4½ ounces;

“ Sales by the glass in a lounge or a dining room ” means sales of liquor by the glass either—

- (a) in a lounge where seats and tables are provided in a separate room apart from the bar and where service is made by a waiter or waitress to the tables in the lounge; or
- (b) in a dining room set apart for persons who partake of meals at the hotel and where service is made by a waiter or waitress to the tables in the dining room;

“ Sales by the glass elsewhere than in a lounge or dining room ” means sales of liquor by the glass which are not sales by the glass in a lounge or a dining room.

Liquors Specified in the Schedules.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be the prices specified therein.

Liquors in Schedules—Quantities not Specified.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold in the Metropolitan Area in quantities other than those specified in the said Schedules, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such liquors specified in the said Schedules, or if there is no smaller quantity specified, then such price—calculated to the nearest downward half-penny—as is in the same proportion to the maximum price fixed for the next higher quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

Non Listed Liquors.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind of liquor (together with any container supplied therewith) for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be sold by any person in the Metropolitan Area to be an amount computed at the rate of one half-penny for each fluid ounce of such liquor.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any liquor specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Price List.

8. Every person who sells or holds for sale by retail any liquors, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining rooms, and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such liquors.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 319.

IMPORTED ASBESTOS CEMENT SHEETS—FLAT AND CORRUGATED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 319.

Definitions.

2. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “Asbestos Cement Sheets” means any flat or corrugated sheets manufactured from Asbestos and Cement, or any other similar substituted materials.
 - “Imported” means manufactured outside the Commonwealth of Australia.
 - “Landed Cost” means the aggregate of—
 - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
 - (ii) inland carriage charges;
 - (iii) outside package charges;
 - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agents commission not in excess of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
 - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
 - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current sea freight rates);
 - (vii) exchange and bank fees not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates, and in the case of bank fees three-eighths of one per cent.;
 - (viii) duty and primage paid;
 - (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid; and
 - (x) harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy paid.
 - “By Wholesale” means in relation to the sale of any Asbestos Cement Sheets (flat or corrugated) a sale by a person who purchases or imports those goods and sells them in quantities of not less than one crate as per the description of the packages which appeared on the bill of lading;
 - “By Retail” means in relation to the sale by a person who purchases or imports those goods and sells them in quantities of less than ten (10) sheets;
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles of the General Post Office, at Melbourne.

Maximum Rate for Supply of Service as Indent Agent.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of acting as an indent agent, in connexion with the bringing into the State of Victoria of any Asbestos Cement Sheets to be $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the landed cost of such material or ten shillings (10s.) per ton whichever is the lesser.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any Asbestos Cement Sheets may be sold by wholesale to be as follows:—
 - (i) where the Asbestos Cement Sheets are delivered to the purchaser ex wharf in Victoria—the price set out in the Second Column of the First Schedule to this Order;
 - (ii) where the Asbestos Cement Sheets are delivered to the purchaser at the store of a person who sells by wholesale and such store is situated within the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Third Column of the First Schedule to this Order;
 - (iii) where the Asbestos Cement Sheets are delivered to Spencer-street Railway Station—the price set out in the Third Column of the First Schedule to this Order.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which Asbestos Cement Sheets may be sold by retail to be as follows :—

- (i) within the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Second Column of the Second Schedule to this Order ;
- (ii) outside the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Second Column of the Second Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred and properly attributable to the transport of the Asbestos Cement Sheets to the premises of the seller from the place in Victoria at which he became liable to bear the cost of transporting the material.

Issue of Dockets or Invoice.

6. Every person who sells Asbestos Cement Sheets, a maximum price for which is fixed by or under this Order, shall deliver with the goods a docket or invoice, containing the following particulars :—

- (a) name of purchaser ;
- (b) address of purchaser ;
- (c) number of sheets, sizes of such sheets and trade name of the Asbestos Cement Sheets concerned in the sale ;
- (d) rate charged per sheet ; and
- (e) the total price charged.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. (i) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any Asbestos Cement Sheets, flat or corrugated, specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(ii) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order, issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person of any Asbestos Cement Sheets lower than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

Application for Maximum Prices.

8. Any person who purchases for resale any Asbestos Cement Sheets, flat or corrugated, for which a maximum price is not fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall not sell, or offer for sale, such Asbestos Cement Sheets unless and until that person has made written request to the Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which such Asbestos Cement Sheets may be sold and the Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 320.

IMPORTED HARDBOARD.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 320.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Hardboard” means flat sheets of any building board manufactured from wood fibre or similar material usually used for lining or similar purposes, but does not include Asbestos Cement Sheets.

“Imported” means manufactured outside the Commonwealth of Australia.

“Landed Cost” means the aggregate of—

- (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
- (ii) inland carriage charges;
- (iii) outside package charges;
- (iv) overseas office or forwarding agents commission not in excess of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
- (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
- (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current sea freight rates);
- (vii) exchange and bank fees not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates, and in the case of bank fees three-eighths of one per cent.;
- (viii) duty and primage paid;
- (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid; and
- (x) harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy paid.

“By Wholesale” means in relation to the sale of any hardboard a sale by a person who purchases or imports those goods and sells them in quantities of not less than the quantity content of one crate as per the description of the packages which appeared on the bill of lading.

“By Retail” means in relation to the sale by a person who purchases or imports those goods and sells them in quantities of less than ten (10) sheets.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles of the General Post Office at Melbourne.

Maximum Rate for Supply of Service by Indent Agent.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of acting as an indent agent, in connexion with the bringing into the State of Victoria of any hardboard to be $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the landed cost of such hardboard or ten shillings (10s.) per ton whichever is the lesser.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any hardboard may be sold by wholesale to be as follows:—

- (i) where the hardboard is delivered to the purchaser ex wharf in Victoria—the price set out in the Second Column of the First Schedule to this Order;
- (ii) where the hardboard is delivered to the purchaser at the store of a person who sells by wholesale and such store is situated within the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Third Column of the First Schedule to this Order;
- (iii) where the hardboard is delivered to Spencer-street Railway Station—the price set out in the Third Column of the First Schedule to this Order.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any hardboard may be sold by retail to be as follows:—

- (i) within the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Second Column of the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (ii) outside the Metropolitan Area—the price set out in the Second Column of the Second Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred and properly attributable to the transport of the hardboard to the premises of the seller from the place in Victoria at which he became liable to bear the cost of transporting the hardboard.

Issue of Dockets or Invoice.

6. Every person who sells hardboard, a maximum price for which is fixed by or under this Order, shall deliver with the goods a docket or invoice, containing the following particulars:—

- (a) name of the purchaser;
- (b) address of the purchaser;
- (c) number of sheets, sizes of such sheets and trade name of hardboard concerned in the sale;
- (d) rate charged per sheet; and
- (e) the total price of the hardboard.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. (i) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any hardboard specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such Notice is given as is specified by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(ii) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to this Order, which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person of any hardboard lower than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order and which are in force at the commencement of this Order, shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

Application for Maximum Price.

8. Any person who purchases for resale any hardboard, for which a maximum price is not fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall not sell, or offer for sale, that hardboard unless and until that person has made written request to the Commissioner to fix a maximum price at which that hardboard may be sold, and the Commissioner has fixed a maximum price accordingly.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 321.

PETROLEUM AND SHALE PRODUCTS—MOTOR SPIRIT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 321.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 285 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Motor spirit” means a liquid petroleum or shale product normally marketed for use as fuel in internal combustion engines with spark ignition, excluding power kerosene, but including such motor spirit blended with distillate from coal products or with alcohol.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Maximum Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which motor spirit may be sold by retail to be—

(a) in the Metropolitan Area—Three shillings and four pence halfpenny per gallon;

(b) outside the Metropolitan Area—the sum of the purchase price paid or payable to the wholesale seller plus Three pence three farthings per gallon. Provided that where the maximum price so calculated results in a price not exactly divisible by One halfpenny the maximum price may be determined at the nearest upward halfpenny.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which motor spirit specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decentral Commission by notice in writing to that person.
