



AMENDMENT OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748) AS AMENDED BY ACT No. 3918.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency General Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

RY virtue of the powers conferred by section 38 of the Poisons Act 1928, as amended by section 5 of Act No. 3918, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add the names of the following substances and preparations to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928, as amended by Act No. 3918, namely:-

"All natural androgenic and oestrogenic hormones and synthetic substances having or purporting to have androgenic or oestrogenic activities for internal administration to human beings."

And declare that the Division 2 of Part III. of the Poisons Act 1928, as amended by Act No. 3918 shall apply to the substances and preparations named in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2).



REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES. AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

 - "56a. IMITATION FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRODUCTS.
 - (1) Imitation fruit and vegetable products are preparations made wholly or in part from one fruit or vegetable in imitation of another fruit or vegetable product with or without the addition of prescribed colouring and/or flavouring substances.
 - (2) Every person who sells any package containing imitation fruit or vegetable products shall attach thereto a label in which shall be written the word 'IMITATION' in letters of not less than eight points followed by the name of the fruit or vegetable product in letters of not less than six points.
 - (3) No person shall sell any imitation fruit or vegetable products contrary to any provision of this Regulation."
- 4. Regulation No. 62 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by inserting the following statement at the end of clause 1:—"They may contain saccharin in proportion not exceeding 15 grains to the gallon."





 - (ii) any adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership and might lawfully have been used for the same purposes.

(c) the use of any building which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was lawfully used for the purposes of any trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amuse-ment for the purposes of such trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than the following:—

Animal by-products extraction or manufacture.

Arsenic recovery works.
Asphalt, asphalt product, tar or tar product manufacture.

Bitumen or bitumen products manufacture. Blast furnace or smelting works, structural

steel works. Blood albumen factories or blood boiling or blood drying works. Boiling-down works.

Bone boiling or burning or grinding or milling works.

Bone manure works.

Bottle or glass factory. Brick, tile, terra-cotta or pottery manufacture. Burnt clay products. Cattle sale-yards as defined in the Health

Acts.

Celluloid manufacture.

Cement works and cement-bag cleaning works. Chemical fertilizer or manure works.

Coal gas manufacture, coke ovens, distillation of coal. Creosote manufacture or its wholesale application to materials.

Explosive manufacture, excavation of land except so far as is necessary for building

 (b) For clause 3 of the said By-law 116, as amended by the said By-law 138, there shall be substituted clause 5 of this By-law.
 (c) For the areas referred to in clause 2 of the said

- (c) For the areas referred to in clause 2 of the said By-law 116, as altered by clause 3 of By-law 136, and by clause 3 of By-law 137, and for the areas set out in clause 2 of By-law 138, there shall be substituted the areas set out in Schedules A and B of this By-law.
- 2. The areas within the municipal district set out in Schedules A and B of this By-law shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas.
- 3. The areas within the municipal district set in Schedule C of this By-law shall be and are hereby prescribed as business areas.
- 4. In respect of the areas set out in the said Schedule A the provisions contained in clause 5 of this By-law shall be of application.
- 5. The use of any land or the erection (including adapta-tion for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements is hereby prohibited, but such prohibition shall not preclude-
 - (i) the use of any dwelling house, or part of any dwelling house, for the purpose of his profession or occupation-
 - (a) by any barrister and/or solicitor, account-ant, medical practitioner, dentist, archi-tect, surveyor, auditor, masseur, physio-therapist, dietitian, chiropodist, optician, optometrist, civil engineer. or regis-tered teacher, or

(b) by a single worker carrying on his profession or occupation without any employee or assistant, and without the use of any mechanical device actuated or driven by any source of energy exceeding in power that generated by a half horse-power single-phase electric

(ii) the use-

use—

(a) of any dwelling house erected at the date
of the coming into operation of this
By-law, or any part thereof, or

(b) with the consent of the Council (which
consent may be withheld in the discretion of the Council, if the Council is
satisfied that such use will be likely to
interfere with the amenities of the
neighbourhood) of any dwelling house
erected after the date of the coming into
operation of this By-law, or any part
thereof, thereof.

as a private hospital, convalescent home, rest home, guest house, boarding house, or apart-ment house carrying on the usual business of such concerns and providing services only for the inmates thereof, but the provisions of sub-clause (ii) (b) hereof shall not be construed so as to permit without the consent of the Council the continued use of any such dwelling house, or part thereof, used for any of such purposes if any such dwelling house, or part thereof, so used shall be rebuilt, altered, or extended.

- 6. In respect of the areas set out in the said Schedule B the provisions contained in clause 5 of this By-law shall be of application, except that the prohibition therein contained shall not preclude (in addition to other matters expressly therein referred to as not being precluded) the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building on an allotment of land having a frontage of not less than 60 feet—
 - (i) for the conduct of wedding and other receptions or meetings (not being public meetings) of a social nature, or of entertainments not con-ducted as regular features but associated with
 - any of the foregoing, or

 (ii) for the conduct of a guest house or a boarding house or an apartment house or for the conduct of a block of flats in which (provided that in such block there are not less than twenty units for separate occupation complying with all requirements of the Council as to size and situation within the building in which they are contained, and as to services available for the occupiers thereof), a dining-room for the purpose of providing meals for persons other than the inmates thereof may be included in such situation as the Council shall approve.
- 7. In respect of the areas set out in the said Schedule C the provisions contained in clause 5 of this By-law shall be of application, except that the prohibition therein contained shall not preclude (in addition to other matters expressly therein referred to as not being precluded), the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building. building-
 - (i) for the conduct of any business of the class referred to in clause 6 (i) and clause 6 (ii) of this By-law,
 - (ii) as a shop, or
 - (iii) as a factory having a floor area (excluding all usual out-buildings) not exceeding 600 square feet, and in which not more than ten persons, inclusive of working proprietors, are employed.

For the purpose of this By-law the word "shop" shall For the purpose of this By-law the word "shop" shall be deemed to mean a building complying with all requirements of the Council with regard to the erection and construction of buildings and the materials and size thereof where articles or commodities are sold to the public by retail, but shall not include (unless the Council shall at its discretion consent thereto in view of special circumstances), a building where articles or commodities are manufactured, repaired, re-serviced, or re-conditioned.

8. For clause 4 of the said By-law 116 the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

'Nothing hereinbefore contained shall preclude-

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purposes for which the land or building was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law, or
- (b) the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building, and the continuance of the use of the building as so enlarged, rebuilt, or ex-

tended for the purposes for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law so long as the building as so enlarged, rebuilt, or extended does not extend beyond—

- (i) the premises on which the building was
- situated immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law and (ii) any adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership and might lawfully have been used for the same purposes."
- '9. In order to facilitate the operation of this By-law and the perusal and interpretation thereof, the provisions of clause 5 of the said By-law 116 are hereby declared to be of continued operation, and are included in this By-law as clause 10 as follows:—
- 10. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any 10. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building or buildings contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, or any officer thereof, may serve on the owner or occupier of such building or buildings, or leave upon the site thereof, notice, in writing, requiring him or her to pull down or remove the same within a time to be specified in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice, the Council, by its officers or workmen, may cause such building or buildings to be pulled down and removed, and it shall be at liberty to sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building the expenses of pulling down and removing such building or buildings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building or
- 11. The following shall be substituted for clause 6 of the said By-law 116, namely:-
 - "In addition to any penalties provided for by the Local Government Acts and this By-law, any person who shall be guilty of a breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a further penalty of not more than £10 (Ten pounds) for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after such notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court."
