PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF COHUNA.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and also to fix and, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare the breadth of the carriageway or footways of any public highway: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cohuna has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used as streets, be so declared to be public highways, and that the breadth of the carriageways and footways thereof be fixed and declared: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council in the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands so used as streets hereinafter described and situated within the Shire of Cohuna as aforesaid, to be public highways within

the meaning of the said Act, and do further fix and declare the breadth of the carriageways and footways thereof as hereinafter set out:—

Every person who shall use, or permit, or suffer any water supplied by the Trust to be used, contrary to the provisions of this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day (if more than one) that such offence continues.

5. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may, without prejudice to any other remedy in respect thereof, close or cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water.

5. The places described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby fixed as standings of hackney carriages.

6. No person shall erect, use, or cause to be erected or used any coloured light or sign in a position adjacent to any street and being in the vicinity of traffic control lights or signs or of street intersections, without the consent of the Council in writing first having been obtained, and then only in such place, manner, and of such type, figure, shape, materials, and dimensions as may be specified by the Council in such consent.

7. The principal By-law is hereby altered by substituting for the Schedule thereto the following Schedules:—

4. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC, USE, &C., OF STREETS.

By-law No. 210.

A BY-LAW of the City of Prahran, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 210 for—

- (a) regulating traffic and processions;
- (b) regulating the hours during which and conditions on which locomotive engines or rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over any road;
- (c) prohibiting or regulating the locking of the wheel of any vehicle when descending a hill, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheel during the time of its being locked a skid-pan, slipper, or shoe in such manner as to prevent the road from being injured by the locking of such wheel;
- (d) prohibiting or regulating the use on any road of any vehicle not having the nails on its wheels counter-sunk in such manner as may be specified in this By-law or having on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections forbidden by this By-law;
- (e) prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway, including the prohibition or the regulation of the use on vehicles of brakes which are calculated to cause noise;
- (f) prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in this By-law;
- (g) requiring the owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road to give information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently

- in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law;
- (h) regulating the driving of cattle in or along any specified street in the Municipal District;
- (i) prohibiting or regulating the drawing or trailing of any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage way;
- (j) prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths;
- (k) prohibiting the throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway of orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter;
- (l) prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (m) prohibiting or regulating the soliciting or collection in any road or street or from house to house adjacent thereto of gifts of money or of subscriptions for any purpose;
- (n) controlling the use of footways or roadways by children using skates, trucks, scooters, or other like toy vehicles;
- (o) prohibiting or regulating camping on roads;
- (p) regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control of the management of the Council thereof;
- (q) regulating the use of streets, roads, and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in goods and prohibiting any such persons during particular hours from using any streets, roads, or public places;
- (r) appointing stands in streets, roads, and public places for such street hawkers and itinerant traders and abolishing, enlarging, or diminishing such stands and limiting the space to be occupied by each such person on any such stand and the time during which each such person may remain on any such stand and the number of persons who may occupy any particular stand;
- (s) prescribing the charges to be paid for the right to use such stands and varying the charges according to the stand used and increasing or decreasing such charges, and prescribing the conditions upon which and the times during which such stands may be occupied;
- (t) fixing by priority of application or by lot, tender, or otherwise the positions of any such stand which persons are to occupy;
- (u) prescribing rules to be observed by persons occupying such stands (including rules for securing the cleanliness of carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, and crates used by such persons, and the wholesomeness and cleanliness of the commodities sold or offered or exposed for sale), and with respect to the conduct of such persons;
- (v) prescribing the nature and size of hand trucks, barrows, or other vehicles to be used on such stands, and prohibiting any animal, whether attached to any truck, barrow, or vehicle or not, from standing on any such stand during the time fixed for occupation thereof by street hawkers and itinerant traders;
- (w) providing the form of authority to be issued for occupying such stands, the conditions upon which such authorities are issued and under which they will be permitted to be transferred, and the fee to be paid for a transfer of any such authority and prohibiting any person who is not named in such an authority or is not a transferee of such an authority duly permitted under this By-law from occupying any such stand;
- (x) prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within any area within the Municipal District set forth in this By-law;
- (y) regulating or prohibiting the use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged projections, or regulating the use in or on any fence or erection of any other kind of wire, and requiring that all wire (whether with or without spikes or jagged projections) so used, and any such fence or other erection on which it is so used shall be maintained in a good state of repair;

- (z) prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom;
- (aa) requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after this By-law shall come into operation) from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road;
- (ab) requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads;
- (ac) authorizing the Council at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expense may be recovered by the Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily)—
- (1) to remove or lop trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law;
 - (2) to reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law;
- (ad) regulating the hours during which and conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any street or road;
- (ae) generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.
