DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 186s. 6d. per week of 40 hours, or the prescribed piecework prices.														
APPRENTICES.														
Feather Duster or Mop Sections.														
One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 186s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.														
IMPROVERS.														
Feather Duster Making Section.														
Two male improvers to every worker receiving not less than 186s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.														
Two female improvers to every female worker receiving not less than 135s. per week of 40 hours.														
IMPROVERS.														
Mop Making Section.														
Two male improvers to every worker receiving not less than 186s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.														
Two female improvers to every female worker receiving not less than 135s. per week of 40 hours.														
IMPROVERS.														
Broom Section.														
One improver to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 186s. 6d. per week of 40 hours, or the prescribed piece-work prices.														

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that in clause 14 the amount of 80s. 6d. wherever appearing shall be increased to 88s. 6d.
