Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 214.

CALCIUM CARBIDE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 214.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears,
 "Calcium Carbide" means Calcium Carbide manufactured in Tasmania.
 "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 "Point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of Calcium Carbide, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such Calcium Carbide to his place of business passed to the buyer from the person from whom he purchased the said Calcium Carbide.
 "Ton" means 2,240 pounds avoirdupois.

Maximum Price.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which Calcium Carbide may be sold in Victoria to be:—

(a) *In respect to sales for delivery into store or Free on Rails, Metropolitan Area.*

(b) *In respect to sales for delivery free ex wharf Melbourne.*

(c) *In respect of sales for delivery free ex ship's slings Melbourne.*

- (i) When packed in drums or barrels each containing more than one hundredweight 42 16 0
- (ii) When packed in drums or barrels containing one hundredweight or less 44 16 0

(d) *In respect of sales other than for delivery within the Metropolitan Area* the price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for Calcium Carbide for delivery into store or Free on rails Metropolitan Area, plus an amount equal to the current freight which would be payable for transport of that Calcium Carbide by rail from Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne, to the railway station nearest to the point of delivery of that Calcium Carbide.

Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice in Writing.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which Calcium Carbide specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in Victoria, by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by Notice in Writing to that person.

SCRAP LEAD.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

- 1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 215.

Amendment.

- 2. Prices Regulation Order No. 65 is hereby amended:—
 - (a) by omitting paragraph 3 thereto and inserting in its stead the following:—

Definitions.

- “Battery” means a second-hand, used or scrap lead acid-type electric storage battery.
- “Scrap lead” means scrap lead other than pig lead and includes a second-hand, used or scrap battery or parts thereof.

- (b) by omitting the Schedule thereto and inserting in its stead the Schedule to this Order.

Any class or kind of scrap lead not specified above	55	0	0
