Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided; Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MARIBYRNONG RIVER.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

Notice to Boatmen and Others.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, the 3rd of February, 1951, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed. An approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be carried.

All non-competing boats shall be kept off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly complied with.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark, and no boat deemed by the River Officer, or his deputy, to be too large, or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are to be discharged from any boats unless permission of the River Officer or his deputy has been given for so doing.

After sunset, motor boats shall have a red light exhibited, and shall not travel faster than two miles per hour.

Motor Boats shall not tow any boat.

After sunset, rowing boats shall have a white light exhibited.

All boats must give way to racing boats going upstream to the start of the course.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION AND ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES.
—THE 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1950.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act* 1928, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the twenty-fourth day of November, 1947, and subsequently amended, as follows:—

1. Paragraph (b) of Rule 16 is amended by deleting the word "and" at the end of clause (vii) thereof, and adding the following new clause immediately after clause (vii):—

"(viii) a candidate who has passed in a subject or subjects either at the University or elsewhere which the Faculty certifies to be of a standard and scope at least equivalent to the subject of Accounts may be exempted by the Board from passing in that subject; and"

2. Paragraph (b) of Rule 17 is amended by deleting the word "and" at the end of clause (ii) thereof and adding the following new clause immediately after clause (ii):—

"(iii) a candidate who has passed in a subject or subjects either at the University or elsewhere which the Faculty certifies to be of a standard and scope at least equivalent to the subject of Accounts may be exempted by the Board from passing in that subject; and"

3. Paragraph (c) of Rule 17 is deleted and the following new paragraph substituted therefor:—

"(c) after he has passed at the University in the subjects of Introduction to Legal Method, Principles of Contract, Criminal Law and Procedure, and Tort, serve in accordance with the provisions of these rules for a period of at least four years as a clerk under articles."

4. Paragraph (a) of sub-rule (1) of Rule 18 is amended by adding the following new clause immediately after clause (ii) thereof:—

"(iii) a candidate shall not except with the permission of the Faculty present himself for examination in more than four subjects at the one examination;"

5. Rule 34 is repealed and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

"34. Every articulated clerk may as part of his period of service in addition to the public holidays be allowed—

- (a) fourteen days' holiday for each year of service;
- (b) leave of absence for the purposes of study and attendance at examinations not exceeding four days in respect of each subject for which he presents himself for examination; and
- (c) in case of illness, leave of absence not exceeding seven days in all for each year of service.

Such holiday and sick leave may be allowed proportionately for any portion of a year which forms part of the period of service. Any day, other than a Saturday, Sunday, or public holiday, on which the principal's office is not open for business shall be reckoned as part of the clerk's holiday leave."

6. Schedule D is amended by deleting clause 5 thereof and substituting therefor the following new clause:—

"5. During the period of service my office was open for business on every day except Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays and the following occasions (specifying them). In addition to Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays and the occasions hereinbefore specified the said B.A. has been absent with my consent or that of my partner first obtained, only on the following occasions (specifying them) during the period of service above mentioned."

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944-49, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Where a worker applies for a certificate of disablement the medical practitioner, after obtaining the particulars specified in Form 1 of the Third Schedule hereto and such other information as he shall deem necessary, shall forthwith medically examine the worker or, after notice to the worker, in accordance with Form 2 of the said Schedule, appoint a time and place for such examination.

(i) After examination, the medical practitioner shall give a certificate of disablement in the form of Form 3 of the Third Schedule hereto or shall certify in the form of Form 4 of the said Schedule, that he is not satisfied that the worker is entitled to such certificate. In either case he shall deliver the certificate to the worker.

(ii) A copy of any such certificate shall be kept by the medical practitioner and a copy shall, upon request by the employer or worker, be supplied by such medical practitioner."

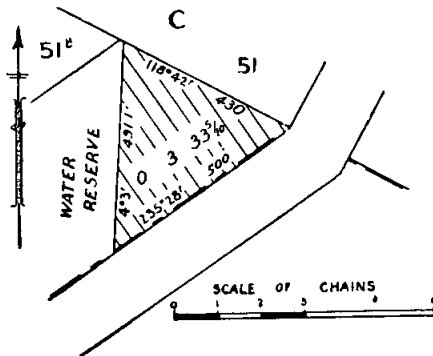

For every stated head of stock by which the submitted number exceeds the actual number yarded or penned, that is to say:—

For every head of store or fat cattle or calves	8d.
For every head of fat or store sheep	1½d."

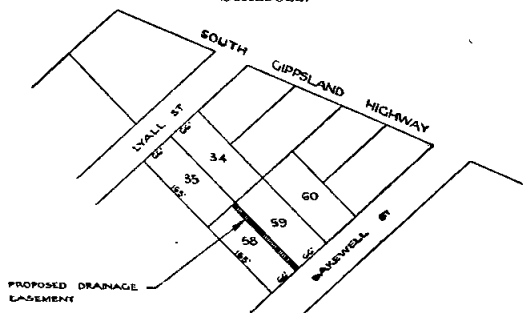
