Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 199.

Men's and Boys' Felt Hats, Plastic Piecegoods, Breakfast Foods, Paints.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 199.

Application.

2. This Order shall apply to the goods specified in the Schedule hereto.

Definitions.

3. "Prevailing price" means, in relation to the sale of specified goods by any person, the price at which that person sold goods on the twenty-fourth day of November, 1950, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no sale of specified goods was made by that person on that date, on substantially the same terms and conditions, then the expression shall mean the price on the last preceding date upon which a sale of specified goods was made by that person upon substantially the same terms and conditions.

"Specified goods" means the goods specified in the Schedule hereto.

Maximum Price.

4. I hereby fix and declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold to be the prevailing price.

Maximum Prices for Goods not Previously Sold.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell any specified goods, which are not substantially identical with any goods which he sold on or prior to the twenty-fourth day of November, 1950, to be the cost of the goods to that person: Provided that on application by any person the maximum price at which those goods may be sold shall be such price as is fixed by notice by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner in writing to that person.

Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this clause is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

THE SCHEDULE.

SPECIFIED GOODS.

Men's and boys' felt hats. Articles made from plastic piecegoods or plastic-coated piecegoods. Foods, primarily for breakfast use, prepared from wheat, maize, oats, or rice, whether in granulated, flaked, biscuit, or any other form, including oatmeals of all types, but not including flour and cornflour.

All raw materials used in the manufacture of paints, varnishes, colours, enamels and lacquers.

Lacquers and enamels.

Olls used in the manufacturing of paint.

Paints and colours, including water paints, kalsomine and distempers, and colours in oil.

Paint and varish removers.

Patent dryggs and colours.

Patent dryers and putty. Resins, including synthetic resins.

Shellac, sandarac, mastic, and other dry gums.

Turpentine and turpentine substitutes. Varnishes and oil stains.

Waterproofing compositions. Whitelead.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 200.

HAIRDRESSING CHARGES.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 200.

Maximum Rates.

2. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the services specified in the Schedule to this Order may be supplied in Victoria to be the rates specified therein.

Exhibition of Price List.

3. Every person who supplies any of the services specified in the Schedule to this Order, the maximum rate for which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, particulars of the maximum rates fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of those services.

Fixation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any service, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, and which is specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph, may be supplied in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
