21. That the lowest piecework prices payable for the following kinds of work shall be as prescribed hereunder.

Within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3877) and the Orders in Council thereunder such portions of the City of Heidelberg, and of the Shires of Broadmeadows, Doneaster and Templestowe, as are not within the said District; the Cities of Chelsea and Mordialicc; and the Shires of Berwick, Bulla, Cranbourne, Dandenong, Eitham, Ferntree Gully, Gisborne, Kellor, Lilydale, Melton, Mulgrave, Romsey, Werribee, and Whittiesea.

Faults proved to be due to the use of defective moulds supplied by an employer shall not be deemed to be maker's faults.
