Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 235s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Improvers (Males).

Four improvers to each male worker receiving not less than 235s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Females.

Two improvers to each female worker receiving not less than $160s.\ 9d.$ per week of $40\ hours.$

Definition of Juvenile Workers.

Persons other than apprentices or improvers under 18 years of age doing general work, i.e., all work

- (a) picking out or selecting.
 (b) making in the raw
- state.
 (c) twisting in the dry state.

Proportion (in any Place) Males.

Six juvenile workers to each worker receiving not less than 235s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Females.

Three juvenils workers to each worker receiving not less than 160s. 9d. per week of 40 hours.
