AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

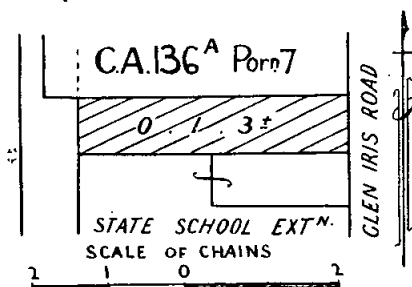

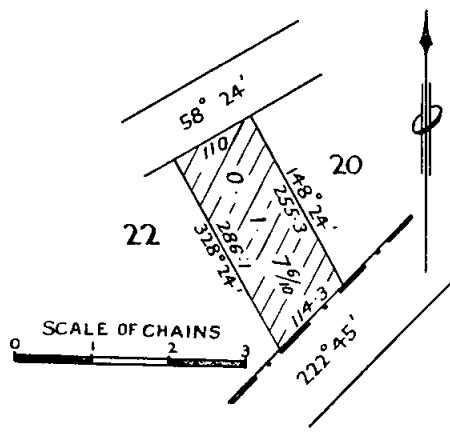

TENDERS will be received until Eleven a.m. on the 29th June, 1951, from persons willing to supply, at Melbourne, Paper and Envelopes, &c., for the Victorian Government, as per Schedule No. 1, in the quantities and at the time stated therein.

The rates tendered must not include Sales Tax.

Forms of tender, conditions of tendering, schedule, conditions of contract, and samples, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as provided in the Schedule. *Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender.

Security will be required, as provided in the tender form, either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, bank deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

Rates tendered must include T.T. exchange ruling at time of tendering.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words, "Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender Box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and Schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the Schedule or Schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the Schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one-half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1951, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1952. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with Schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the Schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In the case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 10.

10. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange, which may affect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

14. The contractor shall not insure the material against war risk. Provided the material is consigned on a separate bill of lading to the Government of Victoria, any loss or damage in transit occasioned by any war risks to which the material may be subject whilst on board ship shall be to Victorian Government account, subject to the production by the contractor of documentary evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board.

15. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.

16. Every account shall be in prescribed form, setting out the contract and item numbers, and shall furnish full details of how it is made up.

17. Payment for supplies will be made in Melbourne when same have been accepted.

CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW No. 84.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 84, for suppressing nuisances and prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this By-law—

"Apparatus" includes radio apparatus, amplifier, loud speaker, and any similar appliance or device by which sound is produced or amplified.
 "Premises" includes any building and any land.
 "Public Place" includes any public highway, park, garden, reserve, and other place of public resort.
 "Sound" includes voice and music, and also any sound that is produced from any apparatus by mechanical, electrical, or other means.

Prohibition of Amplifiers, &c., in Public Highways.

2. (i) No person shall in any public highway, without the consent, in writing, of the Council, use or cause or permit or suffer to be used any apparatus in such manner that any sound is produced or amplified, but for the purposes of this sub-clause "apparatus" shall not include a wireless receiving set installed in a private motor car or a motor car used for hire or a motor horn or other warning device attached to any vehicle.

(ii) For the purposes of this clause, an apparatus shall be deemed to be in a public highway if it is in, under, or over the public highway.

(iii) The Council, in its absolute discretion may give its consent as aforesaid, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit.

Prohibition of Use of Amplifiers, &c., Causing Annoyance in Public Highways.

3. No person shall in any premises abutting on or adjacent to any public highway use or cause or permit or suffer to be used any apparatus in such manner that any sound is produced or amplified that is an annoyance, or causes an annoyance, to persons in such public highway.

Prohibition of Nuisance by Noise in Public Places.

4. (i) This clause shall not apply to the use or operation of apparatus in connexion with any public or patriotic purpose in any park or reserve under the control or

management of the Council or control or management of a Committee approved by the Council during any period of time for which the Council or Committee has authorized the use of the park or reserve for that purpose.

(ii) Subject to sub-clause (i) of this clause, no person shall in any public place, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent to any public place, use or cause or permit or suffer to be used any apparatus in such a way that any sound is produced or amplified by it, which shall be a nuisance to members of the public in such public place.

(iii) For the purposes of this clause, an apparatus shall be deemed to be in a public place if it is in, under, or over the public place.

Consents.

5. Any consent given by the Council for the purposes of this By-law may be expressed to be limited so as to remain, in effect, only for a specified time, or only until a notice that it has been withdrawn is served on the person to whom it was given; and any consent, whether expressed to be so limited or not, may be withdrawn by notice served on the person to whom it was given, and after the expiration of the time so specified or the service of such notice the person to whom such consent was given shall be guilty of an offence in respect of any subsequent breach of this By-law.

Penalty.

6. (i) Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than £5.

(ii) Any person who continues an offence against this By-law, after a conviction or order of the Court in respect of a breach of the same provisions, shall be liable, on conviction, to a further penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which the offence is so continued.

Application.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH.

By-LAW No. 53.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1928*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Numurkah and the Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township Areas of Numurkah and Nathalia, and, unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than four cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The contractor or authorized person or person employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered, except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip the proprietor thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations, 1950, or any amendment thereof.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
