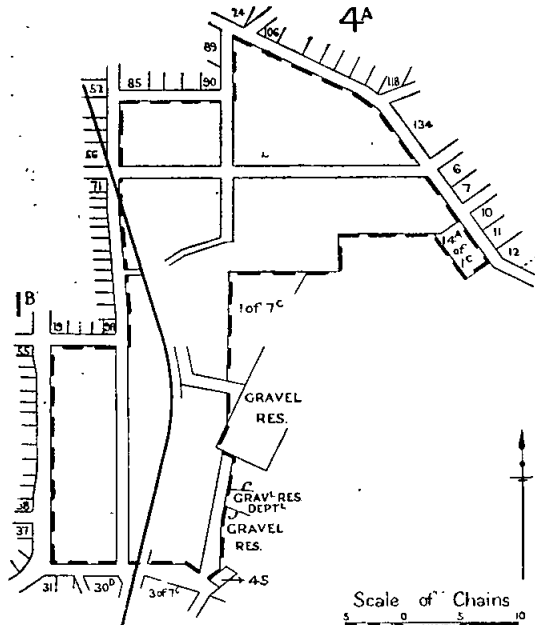

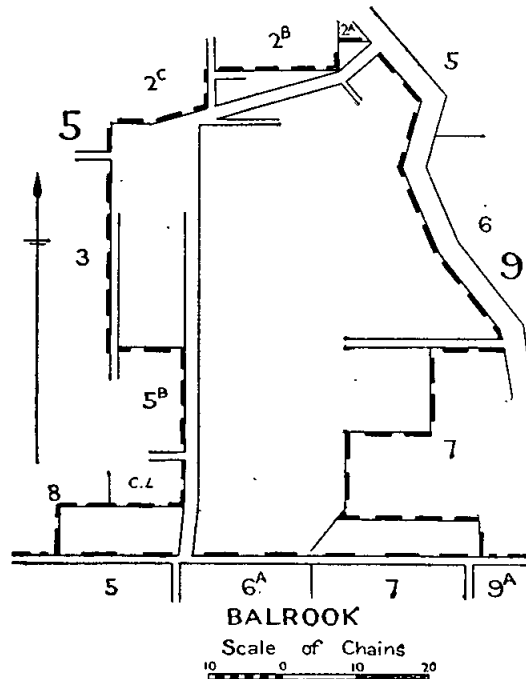

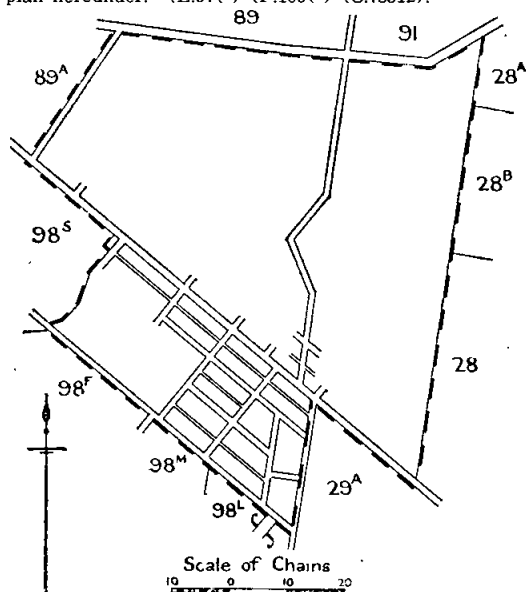

3. Any applications for permission to develop, sub-divide or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.
4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, roads, or other works and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works and recover all

expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

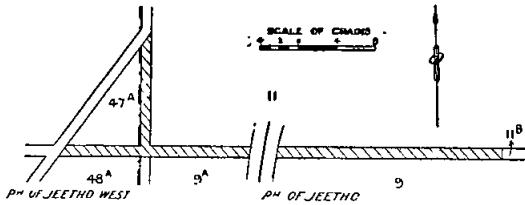

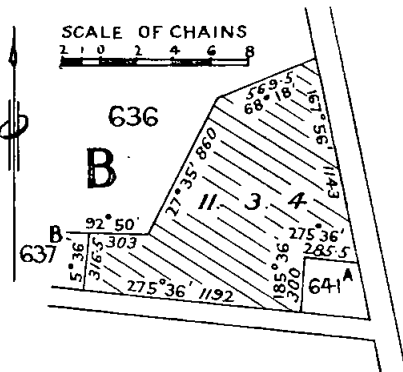

1. The Fair Rents Board, known as the Metropolitan Fair Rents Board, which was constituted by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of March, 1949, is hereby abolished.

2. 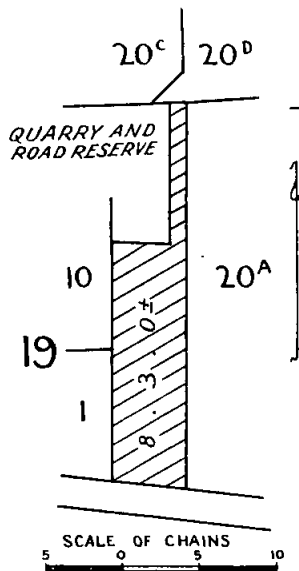

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The contract rates shall cover cartage and delivery of all descriptions of parcels and goods, including furniture, officers' furniture and effects, &c. (except for officers of Police Department), to and from the places named in the tender form.

2. The contract shall not be considered broken, infringed, or vitiated by the Government performing the service or arranging for the carrying out of the same otherwise than by the contractor in the event of urgency or emergency.

3. A separate charge is to be made for each consignment, such charge to be for the gross weight thereof, irrespective of the number of packages. Accounts in all cases to be made out by weight only, to be rendered monthly, supported by the vouchers properly received, and to be subject to any deductions for goods, parcels, furniture, &c., lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the contractor.

4. For removals of officers' furniture and effects, a separate charge must be made per van per hour, including loading and reloading as required, and a certificate from the officer concerned must accompany the voucher setting forth the number of hours employed, before payment can be made: Provided that, with the prior consent of the Tender Board, officers' furniture and effects may be removed in the manner and by the persons approved of by the Board. Transport sling vans are not to be requisitioned without the authority of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

5. The contractor shall in all cases, against each separate charge in his accounts, quote the number of the consignment note, which should be found on each consignment or

package forwarded by the contractors or departments, and the weight. Should the number not be on the package then the name of the consignor should be quoted and a description of the parcel given in lieu thereof. Any infringement of this condition will render the contractor liable, on report by the Tender Board, to such fine as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from any account due to the contractor or from the security money.

6. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

7. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. CITY OF BALLAARAT.

BY-LAW No. 130.

A By-law of the City of Ballaarat, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 130, for the purpose of amending and altering By-law No. 107 of the said city, being a By-law for controlling, managing, and preserving the public reserve known as Lake Wendouree, and for other purposes as therein provided.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 107 of the City of Ballaarat and any By-law amending the same.

2. In clause 25 of By-law No. 107 after the words "and every such licence shall terminate on the 31st day of December next following the issue thereof" there shall be inserted the words "unless sooner terminated, suspended, or cancelled as hereinafter provided."

3. After clause 31 of By-law No. 107 the following clause shall be inserted:—

*Power of Council to Terminate, Cancel, or Suspend Private Motor Boat Licences.*

31. (a) The Council shall have the right to terminate, cancel, or suspend at any time on 24 hours' notice in writing any licence issued by it in respect of any motor boat for private use and on any such termination, cancellation, or suspension it shall refund to the owner any licence fee which he shall have paid in respect of such motor boat.

4. No person shall upon Lake Wendouree drive or use any motor boat licensed for private use or for hire or for carrying passengers for hire—

(a) recklessly or negligently or in a manner which is dangerous to any boats or persons using the lake;

(b) at a speed exceeding 15 miles per hour;

(c) in such a way to make or produce noise to an extent calculated to annoy, or to interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of the public using the lake area, or the Botanical and Public Gardens Reserve, or the occupiers of homes fronting on Wendouree-parade or situate in the vicinity of the lake area.

5. Nothing in this By-law contained shall be deemed to prevent the Council exercising a discretionary power to permit of the use of motor boats as regards speed and noise on occasions of regattas, aquatic carnivals, and speed boat racing on the lake approved of and consented to by the Council.

6. In Schedule 4, after the form of licence therein set out there shall be inserted the following form:—

CITY OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 119.

A By-law of the City of Brighton, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 119, for altering and amending By-law No. 113 of the said City of Brighton.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and every other power in that behalf enabling it, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. That on and after the coming into force of this By-law it shall form part of and be read as one with By-law No. 113.

2. Clause 503, section 5 of By-law No. 113 is hereby amended by adding after the words "The whole of the municipal district" the words "Save and except that part of the municipal district bounded as follows:—On the west by the eastern building line of The Esplanade, on the north by the southern building line of Canterbury-place, on the east by the western boundary of the railway land and on the south by the northern building line of South-road."

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 112.

A By-law made under section 80 of the *Health Act* 1928, and numbered 112, for the purpose of regulating and prohibiting of the keeping in any place of any animals (including birds) or the storage of any things, in the opinion of the Council, offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 80 of the *Health Act* 1928 and of any other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon doth hereby order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"City" shall mean the City of Essendon.

"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Essendon.

"Inspector" shall mean the Inspector of Health of the City of Essendon, or person authorized by the Council to act under Health Acts.

"Animal" shall mean and include every animal other than an animal described as a domestic animal.

"Domestic Animal" shall mean and include the sheep, dog, cat, ferret, goat.

"Bird" shall mean and include every bird other than a bird described as a domestic bird.

"Domestic Bird" shall mean and include turkey, goose, duck, fowl, pigeon, and the young of each, and song birds.

"Property" shall include any tenement or land in separate occupation.

"Dwelling house, dwelling, or building" shall include a living room, sleepout, tent, or building used for business purposes.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine, and words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular, and words relating to animal, domestic animals, birds, and domestic birds shall also include the young of each, and words relating to persons shall include corporations.

2. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept any animal or bird, other than domestic animals or domestic birds, on any property without the written permission of the Council. Before granting such permission, the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing of same is adequate and not offensive or injurious to health.

3. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept on any property more than two of any one kind of domestic animal.

4. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept on any property any domestic animal, other than a dog or cat, so that the same will be within 40 feet of any dwelling.

5. (a) No person shall keep or permit to be kept on any property any ducks or geese without the written permission of the Council.

(b) No person shall keep or permit to be kept on any property more than twenty adult domestic birds without the written consent of the Council.

6. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept any domestic birds, other than song birds, except in yards or runs having an area of not less than 200 square feet, provided that if more than ten head of birds are kept at any one time, then for every five head in excess of such number there shall be an additional space of 100 square feet, but nothing in this clause contained shall be interpreted to mean that more than twenty adult birds may be kept on any property unless with the written permission of the Council.

Provided further that such yard or run shall be securely fenced with a fowl-proof fence, and shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state.

Every part of such yard or run shall be a clear 40 feet from any dwelling house, and the Council may, upon 21 days' notice to the occupier of any property on which is situated such yard or run, require such occupier to remove or alter such yard or run so that no part thereof shall be within 40 feet of any dwelling house as aforesaid, and such yard or run shall be at least 100 feet distant from the street on which the land upon which such yard or run is situated abuts as a frontage, and shall be at least 30 feet distant from any side street in which such land abuts, and is at least 10 feet distant from any other boundary of such land.

7. No domestic bird, other than song birds, shall be kept in any house, yard, or shelter unless such house, yard, or shelter complies with the following requirements:—

(a) It is at least 40 feet distant from any dwelling house erected on the land on which it is situated or any other land.

(b) It is at least 100 feet distant from the street on which the land on which it is situated abuts as a frontage, and is at least 30 feet distant from any side street on which such land abuts, and is at least 10 feet distant from any boundary of such land.

(c) Any such house or shelter is constructed of iron, and does not exceed 7 feet in height, and is of a standard approved by the City Engineer or Inspector of the City of Essendon.

(d) The total superficial area of such building is not to exceed 100 square feet.

(e) No person shall keep poultry on any land unless such land contains a dwelling house.

8. In clauses 6 and 7 of this By-law, where land is situated at the corner of two streets the word "frontage" therein used shall mean the shorter of the frontages to such streets, and where the land abuts at the front and rear thereof on streets at least 40 feet wide then such house, shelter, yard, or run, as mentioned therein, shall be at least 70 feet distant from the street to which such land fronts, and 40 feet distant from the rear street.

9. The occupier of any property on which any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird is kept or housed shall cause the place of keeping to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean and sanitary state and condition, with particular attention to drainage.

10. Any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird, which shall develop diphtheria tubercle, or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings, shall be forthwith destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping the same or causing or permitting the same to be kept.

11. The occupier of any property upon which any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird is kept shall, at all reasonable times, afford free access to every part thereof, respectively, to the Health Officer or Inspector of the City or to any person appointed by the Council to act under this By-law.

12. No person shall obstruct, impede, resist, or oppose any officer of the Council in the performance of his duty, and no person shall refuse to give information or give false information in answer to any inquiry made by any officer of the Council in the performance of his duty under this By-law.

13. No person shall allow or permit any domestic birds to wander at large or under control in or upon any street, public place, or vacant land.

14. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law, and any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further

daily penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day upon which the offence shall continue after the giving of notice thereof by the Inspector to such person.

15. Division 4 of By-law No. 87 is hereby repealed. Clause 22. Part 3, of By-law No. 71 is hereby repealed. This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the City of Essendon and shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

## SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

## BY-LAW No. 59.

A By-law of the Shire of Mornington, made under the *Health Act 1928* and the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 59, for and with respect to—

- (a) regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds), or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous;
- (b) fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal or to store any such thing;
- (c) suppressing nuisances.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts and every other Act or power enabling them in that behalf, do hereby make the By-law, and order as follows:—

(1) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those areas within the Shire of Mornington prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and shall be supplementary to the provisions of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

(3) In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- “Animals” shall mean horses, cattle, and dogs;
- “Birds” shall mean fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and all other classes of poultry and pigeons and doves;
- “Dwelling” shall include bathrooms, kitchens, sculleries, and all rooms used for sleeping, living, eating, cooking, or other like purposes.

(4) No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any animals and/or birds in any dwelling or in the yard of or attached to such dwelling or in any land whatsoever in such a manner as to be or be liable to be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

(5) The occupier of the yard of or attached to any dwelling or of any other land in which any animals and/or birds are kept or housed shall cause the place of keeping of such animals and/or birds to be maintained in a good state of repair and thoroughly cleansed and effectually deodorized from time to time as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

(6) The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable or shed or structure for the keeping or housing of animals shall—

- (a) cause all manure, refuse, and rubbish produced or accumulated therein to be placed in a receptacle properly constructed of durable material impervious to moisture and capable of being readily cleansed;
- (b) maintain such receptacle in a good state of repair as to prevent the escape or leakage of the contents;
- (c) keep such receptacle covered constantly, and from time to time effectually deodorize the same and the contents thereof;
- (d) cause the contents of such receptacle to be removed and satisfactorily disposed of at least once in every week;
- (e) cause the floor of such stable, shed, or structure to be properly drained and paved or flagged with brick, stone, concrete, or other impervious material;
- (f) keep such stable, shed, or structure in a good state of repair and cleanly and sanitary condition and free from rats;
- (g) such stable, shed, or structure shall not be erected within 30 feet of any dwelling.

(7) No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other class of poultry, within 40 feet from any dwelling, nor in any yard thereof or attached thereto, the area of which yard is less than 1,500 square feet, nor unless such fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and all other classes of poultry are housed or kept in a properly-constructed and securely-fastened shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure which shall be rat-proof.

(8) No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept more than three animals and/or twenty birds in the yard of or attached to any dwelling without the permission of the Council.

(9) Any shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any animals and/or birds erected or placed in the yard of or attached

to any dwelling contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be removed by the owner or occupier of such yard or dwelling within seven days after being required to do so by notice, in writing, under the hand of the Shire Secretary or Building Surveyor, failing which the Council may cause the same to be pulled down and removed and the expenses of such pulling down or removal shall be paid by such owner or occupier to the Council within seven days of demand therefor, otherwise the Council may recover the same from such owner or occupier.

(10) No occupier of any yard in which has been erected or placed any shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any animals and/or birds shall leave or suffer to remain therein for a longer period than is absolutely necessary, any food or other matter likely to become offensive or injurious to health, or attract or harbour rodents or other vermin. All food not immediately required for feeding such animals and/or birds shall be kept in metal bins or other approved receptacles, but in every case so as to prevent access of rats or mice to such feed.

(11) Any animals and/or birds which shall develop any infectious or contagious disease injurious to the health of the residents of the municipal district shall be forthwith destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping the same.

(12) The occupier of any premises upon which any animal or bird is kept shall at all reasonable times afford free access to every part thereof to each and every authorized officer of the shire.

## SCHEDULE.

A. The Mornington township area, as contained within the following boundaries: Commencing on the shores of Port Phillip Bay at a point opposite Beleura-road; thence southerly along Beleura-road to Nepean Highway; thence south-westerly along Nepean Highway to Tanti Creek; thence south-easterly along Tanti Creek to a point opposite the continuation of Yuille's-road and Yuille's-road to Hastings-road; thence easterly along Hastings-road to a point opposite the north-eastern corner of Crown allotment 12, section 24; thence along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 11 and 12, section 24, to the south-eastern corner of Crown allotment 11; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 11 to the Nepean Highway; thence north-westerly along Strachans-road to the shores of Port Phillip Bay; thence northerly along coastline to commencing point.

B. Mount Eliza area bounded by Gunyong Creek, Nepean Highway, Boundary-road, and the shore of Port Phillip Bay.

C. Such other areas as are designated as residential areas in any By-law of the Shire of Mornington.

(13) Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

(14) Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than One pound.
