AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes I, 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337). BARRACOUTA DECLARED A COMMODITY.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 it is enacted that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed (a) where the number of producers of the that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed (a) where the number of producers of the product does not exceed two hundred—by at least fifty-per centum of the total number of such producers or (b) where the number of producers of the product exceeds two hundred—by at least one hundred of such producers plus five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers exceeds two hundred, may by Proclamation declare that such product or any specified variety or grade thereof shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the Governor in Council has been requested by a petition signed in accordance with the above-mentioned sub-section to declare that Barracouta shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the said petition sets forth the particulars required by the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of section 6 of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this my Proclamation hereby declare that Barracouta shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act.



Marketing of Primary Products Acts.

PARTICULARS OF A PETITION BY PRODUCERS OF BARRACOUTTA REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO DECLARE BY PROCLAMATION THAT SUCH PRODUCT SHALL BE A COMMODITY UNDER AND FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE MARKETING OF PRIMARY PRODUCTS ACTS.

1. That each of the petitioners is a producer of Barracoutta which is a product within the meaning of the Marketing of Primary Products Acts.

2. That the petitioners in pursuance of the said Acts by this petition request the Governor in Council to declare by Proclamation that Barracoutta shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of such Acts.

3. That the petitioners request that the Marketing Board which may be constituted under the said Acts in relation to the said commodity shall consist of five members.

The Minister of Agriculture is of the opinion that the following information with respect to the powers which will be exercisable by the said Marketing Board will sufficiently acquaint producers of the said commodity as to the nature of the said powers.

Subject to the said Acts and for the purposes thereof the Board-

(a) may sell or arrange for the sale of the said com-modity which is vested in or delivered or to be delivered to it and do all acts, matters, and things necessary or expedient in that behalf

accordingly;

(b) may arrange for financial accommodation with the Government of the Commonwealth or with any bank or with any other institution or person approved by the Governor in Council, and give such securities for advances as are required. by the said Government, bank, institution, or person:

person;

(c) may do all acts, matters, and things necessary for or incidental to, and may enter into contracts for or with respect to the transport, treatment, grading, processing, branding, labelling, storage, packing, or preparing for marketing of the commodity;

(d) may deduct from the net proceeds of the sale of the commodity an amount not exceeding One half-penny in the pound of such proceeds, or such larger amount as the Governor in Council approves for the purpose of establishing a reserve fund to be used for any purpose in connexion with the operations of the Board;

(e) may purchase, contract for the use of, or otherwise provide and hold any land required by the Board and any personal property whatsoever;

(f) may contract for the use of, or otherwise provide any buildings or structures, and repair, equip, furnish, and maintain the same;

(g) (i) The Board shall out of the proceeds of the commodity disposed of by the Board make pay-ments to each producer of the commodity de-livered by him to the Board. Such payments shall be on the basis of the net proceeds of the sale of all the commodity of the same quality or standard delivered to the Board during or covering the periods of time as prescribed by Regulations.

(ii) The Board may deduct from the proceeds of sale of the commodity the expenditure incurred in or about the marketing or treatment of the commodity, the costs, charges, and expenses of the administration by the Board of the said Act and any sums necessary to repay any advances made to the Board and interest

CITY OF NUNAWADING PLANNING SCHEME, 1949. NOTICE OF APPROVAL

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, having taken into consideration a report of the Town and Country Planning Board to the Minister thereon, has approved a scheme submitted by the Council of the municipality of the City of Nunawading, pursuant to the said Acts, entitled the City of Nunawading Planning Scheme, 1949, with the modifications set out hereunder: hereunder:

- 1. In Part I., for clause 1 there shall be substituted the following clause:—
 - 1. Arrangement of Scheme:-

The scheme is divided into Parts, as follows:-

Part I. General.
Part II. Streets and Building Lines.
Part III. Reservation of Land.
Part IV. Building Restrictions and Use of
Land.
Part V. Patternat Part

Part VII. Miscellaneous.

2. In clause 2 of Part I. the definitions of "non-conforming use," "site," "story," and "warehouse" shall be omitted.

- 3. In Part II., for the heading "Reservation of Land," there shall be substituted the heading "Streets and Build-
- In Part II., after clause 5, the following new clause shall be inserted:
 - (a) No building or other structure shall be con-structed closer than 35 feet to the eastern alignment of Goodwin-street.
 - (b) Within the Light Industrial Zone, no building or other structure shall be constructed closer than 30 feet to the northern alignment of Whitehorseroad, or closer than 20 feet to the southern boundary of land, comprising that part of Koonung-street closed, pursuant to this scheme.
- 5. For the heading "Public Open Spaces" there shall be substituted the heading "Part III.—Reservation of
- 6. Clause 6 in Part II. of the scheme shall be omitted and the following clause inserted:—
 - 7. Public Open Spaces:-

The several pieces of land delineated and coloured green on the scheme map are reserved as public open spaces and/or for educational purposes, and will be purchased or acquired by the Council, pursuant to section 21 of the *Town and Country Planning Act* 1944, at such time as it thinks fit or when requested by the owner so to do so to do.

- 7. Clause 7 in Part II. of the scheme shall be renumbered $8.\,$
- 8. (a) Clause 8 in Part II. of the scheme shall be renumbered 9.
- (b) In sub-clause (i) of such clause, for the expression commencing "by the council" and ending "an open space," there shall be substituted the expression "or acquired by the council, pursuant to section 21 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1944, at such time as it thinks fit or when requested by the owner to do so."
- (c) In sub-clause (ii) the words after "Municipal Offices" shall be omitted.
- 9. Clause 9 in Part II. of the scheme shall be re-numbered 10, and for the expression "Clauses 6 or 8" therein, there shall be substituted the expression "Clauses 7 or 9."
- 10. After clause 9 in Part II. of the scheme, the following heading shall be inserted:—"Part IV.—Building Restrictions and Use of Land."
- 11. (a) Clause 10 in Part II. of the scheme shall be re-
- (b) For sub-clause (iii) of the said clause there shall be substituted the following:-
 - "(iii) Nothing in this clause shall preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for the purpose for which the same was lawfully used immediately prior to the coming into operation of this scheme."
- 12. (a) Clause 11 in Part II. of the scheme shall be renumbered 12.

(b) In sub-clause (i) after the words "professional practitioner," add "or for the purpose of a bank or of a picture theatre.

(c) For sub-clause (iii) of the said clause there shall be substituted the following:—

"(iii) Nothing in this clause shall preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for the purpose for which the same was lawfully used immediately prior to the coming into operation of this scheme."

13. After clause 11 in Part II, of the scheme, the following new clause shall be inserted:

13. Light Industrial Zone:-

(i) The area coloured light-brown on the scheme map is hereby prescribed as an area in which the land is to be used for the purpose of conducting light industries.

(ii) No person shall use any land within such area for any purpose other than to con-duct thereon a light industry or to provide on the site of any such industry a dwelling for a for a caretaker or employee of that

(iii) No person shall use any land within such area or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any of the following trades, industries, manufactures, or businesses, namely:—

16. After clause 11 of Part III. of the scheme there shall be inserted the following:

Part VI.—Applications for Consent:-

25. (i) Applications for the consent of the council under a provision of this scheme shall be made to the council, in writing, in duplicate, and shall be accompanied by-

(a) a statement (in duplicate) containing all relevant information and data;

(b) such plans, specifications, and descriptions (in duplicate) as appear to be necessary to enable the council to deal with the application.

(ii) If the council requires any further information, data, plans, specifications, or descriptions (hereinafter called "further material") in order to enable it to deal with the application, it shall, in writing, request the applicant to supply such further material.

(iii) The council may retain one set of all documents and plans supplied under sub-clauses (i) and (ii) hereof

(iv) The council shall notify the applicant, in writing, of its decision on the application within one month of the application being lodged, or in the event of its requiring further material under sub-clause (ii) hereof, within one month of such further material being supplied to the council.

26. Where an application for such consent is refused or is granted, subject to modifications or conditions, the council shall, in giving notice to the applicant of its decision, set out the reasons for such decision.

27. Where an application for such consent has been refused or has been granted, subject to modifications or conditions, the applicant may, within two months, appeal to the Minister against the council's decision, and the Minister's decision shall be final.

Any owner of any land, who, after the publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

the approval by the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the twelve months then next ensuing.
