#### AWARD No. 74.

#### STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL ACT 1932.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that habelf conformal by the in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932, No. 4030, and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):

- 1. (a) For work done from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in December, 1950, the amount to be paid as the minimum wage to adult male workers included in this Award shall be £8 3s. per week, comprising the basic wage of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration with the addition of an amount of 1s. per week.
- (b) For work done during each future period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a February, a May, an August, or a November, the amounts to be so paid as the minimum adult wage shall be adjusted in accordance with the method of adjustment laid down by the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration.
  - (c) The Capital City figures for Melbourne shall be used.
- 2. That adult male workers whilst engaged in the classifications provided for hereunder shall be paid the minimum wage prescribed in clause 1 of this Award and in addition the appropriate margin and wartime loading prescribed in the following table:-

Every person who shall use or permit or suffer any water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day (if more than one) that such offence continues.
- 5. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may, without prejudice to any other remedy in respect thereof, close or

cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water.

  - (4) Upon demand of any inspector at any time before such dried fruit is received at the packing house a copy of such receipt shall be produced to such inspector for his inspection.



1st year—at the rate of 64s. 0d. per week. 2nd year—at the rate of 90s. 6d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 138s. 6d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 173s. 6d. per week."



given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management
of any Crown land which has been reserved under the
Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which
has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for
the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board
of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred
as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations
in respect of the reserved Crown lands along such of the
frontages to the River Yarra and Scotchman's, Backstairs,
and Big Pat's creeks in the Parishes of Yuonga and Warburton as are within the areas indicated by red and blu
colours on plan marked W.28.6.32 attached to Lands Department correspondence C.75270, and known as the "Warburton River Frontages Reserves," hereinafter referred to
as the "Reserves."

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or

2. No person shall damage or remove in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in such places as may be appointed for the purpose.

3. No person shall climb on, or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, or seats in the Reserves, nor leave, deposit, or scatter any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall put into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animal, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained in writing.

5. No person shall camp in or on the Reserves, nor erect thereon any structure, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission of the Committee of Management, in

the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.

6. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.

7. No person shall spit or expectorate, or commit any nuisance on any structure in the Reserves.

8. No person shall use the Reserves for the purpose of betting or any form of gambling.

9. No person except those employed in the Reserves shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for planta-

tion of young trees or shrubs.

10. The Committee of Management shall have power to charge the minimum of Ten shillings for each week or part thereof for each tent, shelter, car, caravan, or other vehicle which the said Committee shall allow on the Reserves subject to such conditions as the Committee may

11. No person shall discharge firearms within the Reserves without first having obtained permission of the Committee of Management.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailift of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not design therefrom may be forthwith approphended by not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
