

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 43 of the Mining Development Act 1928 (No. 3738), doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO TREATMENT OF MATERIAL AT STATE BATTERIES AND CYANIDE PLANTS.

INTERPRETATION.

- 1. "State Battery" or "Cyanide Plant" means any testing plant as defined by section 3 of the Act.
 - "Battery Foreman" means any person employed as a Battery Foreman or Battery Foreman and Cyanider and appointed under the Public Service Act 1946.
 "Bona fide prospector" means a person who is the holder of
 - a current Miner's Right and is engaged solely in prospecting or mining and is following no other occupation but does not include a syndicate or company.
 - "Crushing" includes smelting and treating. "Minister" means the Minister of Mines.

 - "Tailings or Dump material" means any gravel slime or slum produced as a result of the puddling washing or crushing of gold bearing material and includes waste material brought to the surface in connexion with any mining operations.
 - "Ton" means 22 cubic feet of material by measurement or 2,240 pounds by weight.

CRUSHING.

- 2. Fees to be paid for crushing material at any State Battery shall be as follows:-

(b) Tailings and/or Dump Material-

The fee to be charged for crushing such material is to be at the rate of 10s. per ton with a minimum charge of £5. Should it be necessary to open a battery to crush or treat such material, an additional fee of ${\tt £5}$ must be paid prior to the opening of the battery. No parcel of such material in excess of 30 tons will be accepted for crushing at any one time.

3. Fees to be paid for smelting and treating gold not produced from material crushed by a State Battery:-

Where the weight of smelted gold does not exceed 50 ozs. Where the weight of smelted gold exceeds 50 ozs. .. 10 0 -plus a further charge of 5s. for every 25 ozs. or part thereof in excess of 100 ozs.

- 4. All tailings resulting from material crushed at a State Battery shall become the property of the Minister unless removed from the Battery site within fourteen (14) days from the date of completion of the crushing.
- 5. Every applicant for a crushing at a State Battery must make application in writing in the form of Schedule "A," giving all particulars required, to the Battery Foreman, and such Foreman shall forthwith record such application in a book provided for that purpose.
- 6. Parcels of material will be crushed according to priority of application as set out in record of applications as provided for in clause 5.
- 7. Each parcel of material will be crushed separately and a complete battery clean-up will be made in each case.
- 8. The owner of the material, or his deputy, may be present during the crushing of his material and will be given every opportunity to see the whole treatment; but he shall not interfere in any way with the operations.
- 9. The owner of the material shall provide his own battery feeders and shall clean up the battery immediately after the crushing is completed. If the owner fails to clean up immediately after the crushing is completed, the Battery Foreman will do so, and his wages will be charged against the gold obtained.

The Battery Foreman must do all the retorting and smelting of the gold and will issue the prescribed "Gold Smelter's Certificate" as required by section 37 of the *Gold Buyers Act* 1938, without any further fee.

- 10. On the completion of crushing, the prescribed crushing charges must be paid to the Battery Foreman, or sufficient gold as in his opinion will cover such charges must be retained by the Battery Foreman and forwarded by him to the Secretary for Mines for sale. Any surplus over such charges on the sale of such gold is to be refunded to the owner of the material.
- 11. The Battery Foreman shall have the right to sample and have assayed, or otherwise tested, any parcel of material submitted for crushing, and if in his opinion it does not show sufficient gold value to pay the prescribed fees for crushing, he must demand payment of such charges before commencing crushing such material.

The Battery Foreman shall have power to clean up during the progress of any crushing if in his opinion the material proves too poor to pay the crushing fees.

- 12. The Battery Foreman shall not permit the use of chisels or any other sharp metallic tool in cleaning plates; hard rubber or other similar material only to be used. The plates shall not be treated with acids or fire. Parties may use their own copper plates provided such plates are placed on top of those belonging to the Battery.
- 13. All material will be received for crushing absolutely at the owner's risk, and the Minister shall not be responsible for any suspension of operations, delays in treatment, or for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever.
- 14. No charge will be made for any assays done or gold smelted in connexion with material or tailings under treatment.

CYANIDING.

- 15. Where there is a cyanide plant attached to a State Battery, tailings may be treated by cyanide for 10s. per ton.
- 16. The owners of material being crushed at State Batteries, where a cyanide plant is installed, should advise the Battery Foreman if they wish to have the tailings cyanided.

In all such cases, the Battery Foreman will take two identical samples as the tailings leave the Battery, one being handed to the owner and the other forwarded to the Mines Department Laboratory for assay by cyanide process.

- 17. In all cases where the assay value is more than 10s. per ton and there is a sufficient quantity available for treatment, the Minister may treat the material, sell the gold obtained to the Royal Mint, Melbourne, and after deducting the prescribed treatment fee of 10s. per ton, distribute the net proceeds of realization, pro rata, among the owners of the tailings, according to the assay value and tonnage treated for each owner.
- 18. Where the tonnage of any one owner is sufficient to be treated separately, after the tailings have been treated and the owner has paid the prescribed fee of 10s. per ton, the Battery Foreman will deliver the gold produced direct to the owner.

19. On receipt of a recommendation by the Chief Mining Inspector
that any State battery or cyanide plant or part or parts thereof is
not immediatey needed for use by the local miners, the Minister may
hire, let or lease any such State battery or cyanide plant or part or
parts thereof to any mine owner or mining company in that district
on such terms and under such conditions as he deems fit.

BY-LAW No. 47.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla, made under and in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Local Government Acts, and numbered 47. (a) For regulating the market places in the Shire of Benalla and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; (b) for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be heid.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla (hereinafter referred to as the Council), order as follows:—

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipality of the Shire of Benalla,

and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Council of the Shire of Benalla, and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.

1. By-laws Nos. 24, 25, 26, and 41, and all former By-laws affecting the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this By-law

coming into operation.

2. The market shall be known as the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market situated in the Shire of Benalla, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle and other

3. (a) A fortnightly market shall be held at the said market on every alternate Tuesday, commencing on the 5th day of June, 1951, for the sale of cattle, other than

calves and pigs; and
(b) a fortnightly market shall be held at the said market on every alternate Tuesday, commencing on Tuesday, the 12th day of June, 1951, for the sale of calves

Tuesday, the 12th day of June, 1951, for the sale of caives and pigs:

Provided that in the event of any of the aforesaid market days in clauses (a) and (b) above falling on Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, or any other public holiday, the President and Secretary of the Council for the time being may appoint some other day in lieu of the said holiday.

4. (a) Application, in writing, shall be made to the Shire Secretary for the time being for permission to hold a special sale for a special class of cattle on a day other than gazetted market days, provided that no application may be granted for a sale which, but for this proviso, would be held less than one clear day after any other special sale.

(b) The President and Secretary for the Shire of Benalla for the time being may refuse or grant such

application at their discretion.

(c) Each application must be accompanied by a fee/s to be determined by the Council and to remain in force until altered or rescinded, and the applicant/s shall be personally liable to the Council for all market dues in respect of such sale.

5. No sale shall be held in the said market on any day

5. No sale shall be need in the said market on any day other than one of the said gazetted market days or on a special sale day as hereinbefore provided.
6. On the sale days appointed as hereafter provided (or in respect of which days an application to hold a special sale has been granted) the market shall be open from surrise to sunset for the reception, delivery, and sale of

cattle.

7. (a) The sales of cattle other than calves or pigs, 7. (a) The sales of cattle other than calves or pigs, whether at a gazetted sale or special sale shall be commenced not earlier than Nine o'clock in the forenoon and such sale shall be conducted in the following order:—Firstly: Fat sheep; Secondly: Dairy cattle; Thirdly: Fat cattle; Fourthly: Store sheep; Fifthly: Store cattle; Sixthly: Horses of all classes; Seventhly: Sundries; but if the Markets Inspector shall so decide and publicly announce a different order of sale of any class or classes of stock the sale shall be conducted in the order so announced. announced.

(b) The sales of calves and pigs whether at a fortnightly sale or at a special sale shall be commenced not earlier tnan One o'clock in the afternoon and (unless the Market Inspector appointed by the Council shall on the day of and with respect to any such sale decide upon and publicly announce a different order of sale) it shall be conducted in the following order:—Firstly: Calves; Secondly: Fat pigs; Thirdly: Store pigs; Fourthly: Sundries; and if the Market Inspector shall decide and publicly announce a different order of sale, the sale shall be conducted in the manner aforesaid. manner aforesaid.

8. Each auctioneer who intends to sell at any fort-nightly or special sale any of the classes of stock referred to in clause 7 (a) and/or 7 (b) of this By-law shall at least 24 hours prior to the commencement of such sale disclose to the Market Inspector the number and classes of stock he intends to sell at such sale, and unless an auctioneer shall have made such disclosure he shall not be allotted a selling position nor shall he be entitled to participate in a ballot or drawing of lots under clause 9 hereof nor shall he be entitled to sell any stock at such

The auctioneers who have in accordance with clause 9. The auctioneers who have in accordance with clause 8 of this By-law made disclosure of the stock they intend to sell shall draw lots for precedence of selling and also for precedence in the allotment of selling positions in respect to the selling of the various classes of stock referred to in clauses 7 (a) and 7 (b) hereof in the order as provided in clauses 7 (a) and 7 (b) hereof. Each auctioneer shall proceed to sell in the order of precedence and selling position determined by the said drawing of lots in regard to each class of stock to be sold by him. The Market Inspector shall allot to each auctioneer in the 7110

order of precedence determined by the said drawing of lots a selling position in respect of each class of stock to be sold by him. Each auctioneer shall be entitled to nominate the selling position desired by him in respect of each class of stock to be sold by him and the Market Inspector shall allot such position to him, unless for some special reason such allotment is in the opinion of the Market Inspector, undesirable, in which case the Market Inspector shall allot to the auctioneer the selling position Market Inspector, undesirable, in which case the Market Inspector shall allot to the auctioneer the selling position next nominated by him. The auctioneer having a right to sell first shall in the case of sales of cattle other than calves and pigs commence selling at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon and in case of sales of calves and pigs, at One o'clock in the afternoon. If the auctioneer having the right to sell at the aforesaid time does not commence selling at the time stated, then he shall be placed at the bottom of the list and the auctioneer drawing the second order of sale shall have the right to sell first for the day provided, however, that if any special order of sale is publicly announced by the Market Inspector in accordance with clause 7 hereof, such auctioneer shall commence selling at the time hereinbefore set forth or at such other times that the Market Inspector shall require by verbal notice to the auctioneer.

10. The following limit of time shall be allowed each auctioneer to offer the various classes of stock:—

Fat sheep—Two minutes per pen

Fat sheep—Two minutes per pen Fat cattle—120 per hour Dairy cattle—One and a half minutes per head Store sheep—Two minutes per pen Store cattle—200 per hour Fat pigs and store pigs—120 per hour Calves—200 per hour Horses, or any single horse-a limit of 10 minutes.

- 11. Five minutes shall be allowed after one auctioneer ceases selling and the next in turn commences, and in the event of the auctioneer next in turn failing to com-mence selling on the expiration of the time allowed, then the next in turn shall have the right to sell.
- 12. The Council shall appoint a Market Inspector whose duties shall be as follows:
 - (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the Local Government Act 1928 and any amendment or amendments thereto relating to the markets
 - or amendments thereto relating to the markets are duly observed, and to exercise the discretion vested in him by clause 7 (a) hereof.

 (b) To demand and collect all market tolls as d dues.
 (c) To carry out the duties and functions of the Market Inspector provided for and in accordance with this By-law, and in particular without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing to conduct a ballot provided for in clause 9 hereof. and to allot selling positions as therein provided and to decide upon and announce an order of sale pursuant to clause 7 (a) and (b) of this By-law, and subject to clause 9 hereof, to allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case seems to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle being roped within the market yards before Five o'clock in the afternoon of the day of sale except with the consent of such Inspector.
- except with the consent of such Inspector.

 13. No person shall obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or release or remove cattle from one part of the said market to another part of the said market without the consent of the Market Inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto. immediate approaches thereto.
- 14. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied, and if any cattle are not removed within 24 hours of the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so emitted to be removed. omitted to be removed.
- 15. In the case of any dispute arising as to the priority of right to offer by auction, the Market Inspector's decision shall be final.
- 16. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.
- 17. The Council may licence any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven (7) miles from Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and the annual licence fee shall be twenty shillings (20s.) for each yard or premises so licensed.

- 18. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach of this By-law shall on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five
- 19. When the auctioneer realizes that he has reached the limit of bidding, subject to the times set out herein, he shall knock down to the last bidder, reserving the right of the vendor to accept or reject before completion of salt of next pen.
- 20. The feeding of cattle in the market yards is prohibited except in such yards as may from time to time be allocated by the Markets Inspector (duly appointed by the Council) for feeding purposes.

APPOINTING TOLLS AND DUES.

- 1. The Council of the Shire of Benalla shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle, and/or the use of any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district and outside the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, the several sums of money, as for tolls and dues appointed in that behalf, by special order of the Council.
- 2. All cattle or whatever class left in the market yards and not removed within twenty-four (24) hours of the close of the market or special sale (as the case may be), may be removed by the Market Caretaker at the risk and expense of the owner, or agent of the owner, and improved. impounded.

- 2. Definition.—For the purpose of this By-law, dog shall be deemed to be and include a dog of either sex, male or female, over the age of three months. The singular (dog) shall include the plural (dogs).
- 3. No person shall keep more than three dogs on any land or premises within the Shire of Dandenong, provided that the Council may from time to time for such period of time as it sees fit, give permission, in writing, to the keeping of more than three dogs on any land or any premises where, in the opinion of the Council, facilities exist for the keeping of more than three dogs, and where such keeping shall not be, or likely to be, a nuisance or offensive or inturious to health. offensive or injurious to health.
- 4. The occupier of any land or premises on which any dog is kept shall cause the place of keeping to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state or condition.
- 5. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 or more than £20. In the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction by any court.
- 6. A permission given under this By-law shall not remain in force for a greater period than twelve months from the date of issue, unless a renewal is granted by the Council.
- 7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Dandenong.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may-

(a) Construct a building of Class I. occupancy on, land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 5 of table 803 of the Regulations; or

(b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a build-ing of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 808 of the Regu-letion.

in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.
