DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

Where less than forty hours is worked in any week by any piece-worker, a proportionate amount of such sum of sixty-four shillings shall be added in lieu thereof.
