AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

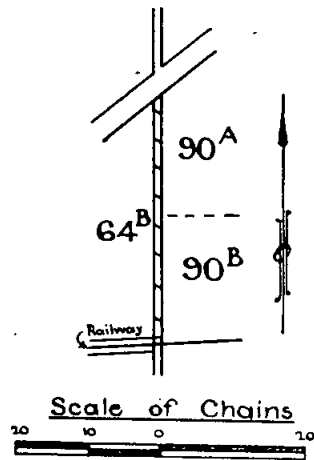

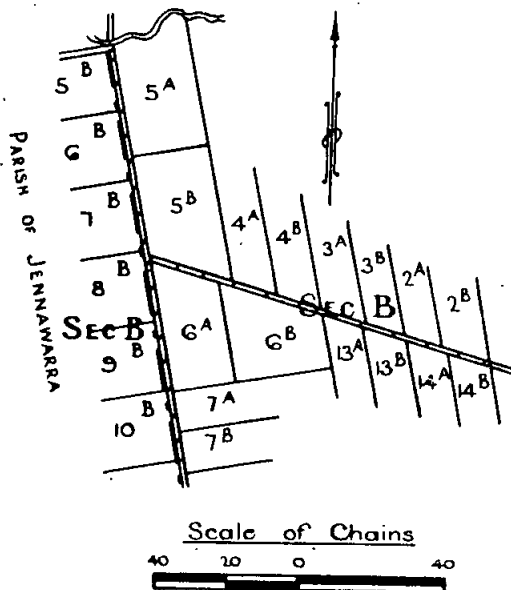
And whereas the Soldier Settlement Commission, after consultation with the Councils of the Municipalities concerned has so certified:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of Section 6 of the *Soldier Settlement Act 1946* (No. 5179) do by this my Proclamation direct that the roads, as described hereunder, be closed, that is to say:

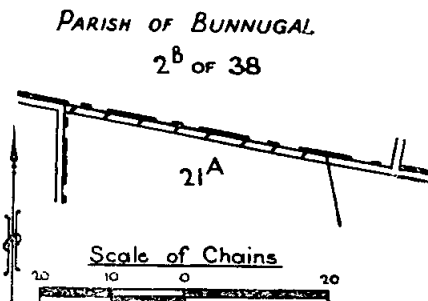

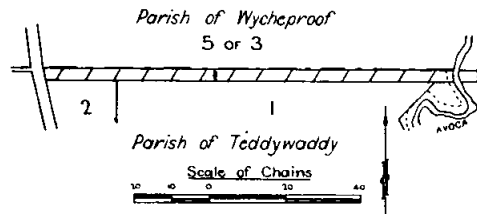

CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government*

Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Dandenong has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used as roads within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used as roads hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Dandenong aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.—PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.

Deals-road.

Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of Crown allotment 2, section XI, Parish of Mordialloc, distant 90 deg. 0 min. 2,000 links from the south-west corner of the said allotment; thence by lines bearing respectively 360 deg. 0 min. 8,000 links to the northern boundary of Crown allotment 1, section XI, 90 deg. 0 min. 50 links easterly along the said boundary, 180 deg. 0 min. 8,000 links, 270 deg. 0 min. 50 links to the point of commencement.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF

BY-LAW No. 53.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works
(hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in
exercise and execution of the powers and authorities con-
ferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of
Works Acts and pursuant to and in exercise and execution
of any other powers and authorities in any way enabling
it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the
following By-law, that is to say:—

1. No person shall, while in or upon any lands or works
vested in or under the control and management of the
Board—

- (a) destroy, cut down, or remove any tree, shrub, or
plant, or any part of any tree, shrub, or plant;
- (b) damage, disfigure, displace, or remove any hedge,
fence, barrier, footway, stairs, gate, pillar, post,
or pipe;
- (c) injure, damage, deface, or disfigure any structure
or works the property of the Board, or any part
of any such structure or works;
- (d) damage, disfigure, displace, or remove any notice,
copy of this By-law, rules, or regulations dis-
played upon any board, plate, or structure;
- (e) kindle or light a fire, except in a fire-place
specially provided by the Board, or maintain,
keep alight, or use any fire not in such a fire-
place as aforesaid;
- (f) deposit upon any such lands or works any refuse,
rubbish, human excreta, or urine other than in
a receptacle specifically provided by the Board
for the receipt thereof;
- (g) bring or deposit upon any such lands or works
any garbage, filth, dead animal, or bird or
noisome thing;
- (h) search for, pursue, shoot, wound, kill, or destroy
game of any description;
- (i) carry or have in his possession any firearm or gun
of any description, or any other contrivance
designed for the discharge of any shot, bullet,
or other missile.

2. No person shall—

- (a) swim, bathe, or immerse any part of his body in, or
- (b) cause, permit, or allow any animal to enter into,
any reservoir, dam, lake, river, stream, water-
course, or aqueduct in or flowing through any
lands or works vested in or under the control
and management of the Board.

3. No person shall, unless he shall have a general
authority granted by the Board or a permit specifying
date and place of exercise issued by the Secretary of the
Board—

- (a) fish in any reservoir, dam, lake, river, stream,
watercourse, or aqueduct in or flowing through
any lands or works vested in or under the
control of the Board;
- (b) while in or upon any such lands or works carry
or have in his possession any rod, line, net, or
other article capable of being used in fishing.

4. Save with the written permission of the Secretary of
the Board, no person shall enter into or upon any part of
the lands and works vested in or under the control and
management of the Board not specifically set aside by the
Board as a place into which members of the general public
may enter.

5. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law
shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable to a penalty
not exceeding Twenty pounds for such offence.

AVON RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST CONSTITUTED.

YATCHAW DRAINAGE TRUST.

UNDER the powers conferred by section 2 of the *Water Act* 1950 (No. 5492) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct, as follows:—

- (i) That as, on, and from the 1st day of July, 1951, the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust (which was constituted by section one hundred and fifty-three of the *Water Act* 1905) shall be and is hereby converted into a drainage trust under the *River Improvement Act* 1948, to be known as the Yatchaw Drainage Trust.
- (ii) That the works of the said Trust consist of a series of drains to provide for the removal of surplus water from the land within the district. The proposed works of the drainage trust are the enlargement and improvement of existing drains and ancillary structures and provision of new drains.
- (iii) That the boundaries of the district of the Yatchaw Drainage Trust shall be those of the waterworks district of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust immediately prior to 1st day of July, 1951.
- (iv) That the Yatchaw Drainage Trust shall be comprised of five commissioners of whom four shall be elected by ratepayers within the district and one shall be appointed by the Governor in Council.
- (v) That on and from the 1st day of July, 1951, all property, income, assets, rights, and liabilities of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust shall be and are hereby vested in the Yatchaw Drainage Trust.
- (vi) That, notwithstanding anything in clause (iv) hereof, as on and from the 1st day of July, 1951, the persons who are acting as commissioners of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust shall be and become commissioners of the Yatchaw Drainage Trust, and shall continue to hold office as such

until the first election and appointment of commissioners under the *River Improvement Act* 1948, whereupon they shall go out of office unless elected at such election.

- (vii) That all By-laws made by the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust and in force immediately before the 1st day of July, 1951, shall apply to and have full force and effect in the Yatchaw Drainage District, as though they were duly made by the Yatchaw Drainage Trust under the provisions of the *River Improvement Act* 1948, approved by the Governor in Council and published as required under the *River Improvement Act* 1948.
- (viii) The secretary and treasurer of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust in office immediately before the 1st day of July, 1951, shall become the secretary and treasurer of the Yatchaw Drainage Trust and shall hold office until such time as he resigns or is removed from office by the Yatchaw Drainage Trust.

A Regulation of the City of Warrnambool, No. 69, made under section two (2) of Part IV. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1946*, in force in the city by virtue of a By-law of the above-named city, numbered 72, for providing for the proper management and control of every library and museum.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Warrnambool make the following Regulation:—

1. The Regulations No. 48, 59, and 63, passed by the Council for the control and management of the Warrnambool Museum Library, be and are hereby repealed.

The following are the Regulations for the Warrnambool Free Lending Library:—

2. The Warrnambool Free Lending Library, belonging to and under control of the Warrnambool City Council, shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the Library Committee of the said Council, acting by and through the Town Clerk of the said city.

3. The Library shall be open for the exchange of books during the following hours, except on public holidays and such as the Council may desire:—

Monday—Friday—11 a.m.—5 p.m.
7 p.m.—9 p.m.

Saturdays—10 a.m.—12 noon.

4. Any ratepayer or resident of the City of Warrnambool, over the age of sixteen years, who delivers to the Librarian an application, on the form provided by the Council, and signed by a guarantor who is a ratepayer of the City of Warrnambool, may borrow books from the Free Lending Library.

5. The Librarian may issue to any person entitled to borrow, on his or her personal application, two borrowers' tickets, which shall be retained in the Library, and which during twelve months shall allow the person so named on it to borrow books, subject to the Regulations of the Lending Library.

6. Individuals residing outside the City of Warrnambool may obtain two borrowers' tickets on the payment of a yearly subscription of £3 3s., year to year from 1st October to 30th September.

7. Borrowers' tickets may be issued to any person who is physically incapable of applying personally, provided that a statement in writing of the reason for not attending in person be given to the Librarian, accompanied by a reference from a local magistrate or clergyman.

8. Borrowers upon entering the Lending Library must first return books and obtain their borrowers' tickets before selecting their books. Borrowers must return books personally or by message. The Librarian will neither undertake to receive nor issue books by post.

9. All books borrowed are allowed out for fourteen days (Sundays and holidays included), and must be returned on or before the latest date stamped in the book. All borrowers not complying with this condition shall incur a fine, to be paid to the Librarian, of One penny for each day or portion of a day for the first week, and Two pence per day thereafter. In the case of loss or damage the borrower or his guarantor must replace the book, set, or series lost or damaged, within one week on which the injury has been notified to him. The Librarian shall have the power to assess the value of such book or books.

10. No books can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred, and made full compensation for any loss, damage, or cost of repairs.

11. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the Library, nor exchange them with each other, and must under no circumstances transfer their ticket for use to any person.

12. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

13. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify the change to the Librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited by failure to comply with this condition.

14. Borrowers must see that books are in good order before taking them from the Library. If any book be found to be written upon, or otherwise injured, borrower must report the same to the Librarian.

15. Any borrower returning a book which has been written upon, or otherwise injured, shall, within one week of the date upon which the injury has been notified to him, replace such book, or pay to the Librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured, or shall pay such sum

for the cost of repair as may be assessed by the Librarian. Upon the payment by the borrower to the Librarian of full value of the book, set, or series injured, the borrower will be entitled to the book or books.

16. Any borrower ceasing to use the Library is required to leave their ticket with the Librarian in order to have it cancelled, as until tickets are returned borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any books taken out in their names.

17. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower. Books may not be necessarily re-issued on the same day.

18. The Librarian has the power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who, in his opinion, for other reasons, should not be entrusted with books.

19. No person shall be allowed to take any book into or out of the Library, other than those belonging to same.

20. Books shall not be issued to any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease. Borrowers must report at once to the Librarian in event of the outbreak of any disease in the house in which he or she may be dwelling, and the book returned immediately for fumigation.

21. Clause 4 of these Regulations may be altered from time to time by a Special Order of the Council, and such Resolution published twice in a newspaper circulating in the district.

22. Subject to the direction from time to time of the City Council, the Librarian of the said Council, or the person for the time being in charge of the Library, shall be charged with the carrying of these Rules and Regulations into effect.

23. This Regulation shall apply as from 1st day of July, 1951.
