Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 261.

ICE—GIPPSLAND AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 261.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - (a) an "eighth block" means a block of ice weighing 11 lb. or more, but less than 22 lb.;
 - (b) a "quarter block" means a block of ice weighing 22 lb. or more, but less than 47 lb.;
 - (c) a "half block" means a block of ice weighing 47 lb. or more, but less than 100 lb.;
 - (d) a "large block" means a block of ice weighing not less than 100 lb.

"Gippsland Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in the following Town, Borough, and Shires:—

Town of Sale;
Borough of Wonthaggi;
Shires of Alberton, Avon, Bairnsdale, Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Korumburra, Maffra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, Omeo, Orbost, Rosedale, South Gippsland, Tambo, Traralgon, Warragul, Woorayl.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by wholesale in the Gippsland Area to be 68s. 4d. (sixty-eight shillings and fourpence) per ton of 20 (twenty) large blocks.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by retail in the Gippsland Area to be:—

(a) Delivered to the Purchaser's Premises—

(b) If purchased at factory—

Eighth block	0	7

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice other than eighth, quarter, half, or large blocks may be sold in the Gippsland Area to be 3d. per block.

Notice in Writing.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any size of a block of ice specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by retail in the Gippsland Area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to such person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 262.

ICE—NORTH-EASTERN AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 262.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears:—

- (a) an "eighth block" means a block of ice weighing 11 lb. or more, but less than 22 lb.;
- (b) a "quarter block" means a block of ice weighing 22 lb. or more, but less than 47 lb.;
- (c) a "half block" means a block of ice weighing 47 lb. or more, but less than 100 lb.;
- (d) a "large block" means a block of ice weighing not less than 100 lb.

"North-Eastern Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in the following Boroughs and Shires:—

- Boroughs of Benalla, Shepparton, Wangaratta;
- Shires of Alexandra, Beechworth, Benalla, Bright, Chiltern, Euroa, Goulburn, Mansfield, Numurkah, Oxley, Rodney, Rutherglen, Seymour, Shepparton, Towong, Tungamah, Upper Murray, Violet Town, Wangaratta, Wodonga, Yarrawonga, Yackandandah, Yea.

Maximum Price—Sales by Wholesale.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by wholesale in the North-Eastern Area to be £2 18s. 4d. per ton of twenty large blocks.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by retail delivered to the purchaser or into the purchaser's premises in the North-Eastern Area to be—

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice other than eighth, quarter, half, or large blocks may be sold in the North-Eastern Area to be 3d. per block.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any size of a block of ice specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the North-Eastern Area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice in writing by the Commissioner to such person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 263.

ICE—SOUTH-WESTERN AREA.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order :—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 263.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
- (a) an "eighth block" means a block of ice weighing 11 lb. or more, but less than 22 lb.;
 - (b) a "quarter block" means a block of ice weighing 22 lb. or more, but less than 47 lb.;
 - (c) a "half block" means a block of ice weighing 47 lb. or more, but less than 100 lb.;
 - (d) a "large block" means a block of ice weighing not less than 100 lb.

"South-Western Area" means all that area in Victoria comprised in—

- the City of Warrnambool;
- the Towns of Ararat and Hamilton;
- the Boroughs of Koroit, Port Fairy, Portland; and
- the Shires of Ararat, Belfast, Dundas, Glenelg, Hampden, Heytesbury, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse, Portland, Ripon, Wannon, Warrnambool.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by wholesale in the South-Western Area to be 68s. 4d. (sixty-eight shillings and fourpence) per ton of 20 (twenty) large blocks.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice may be sold by retail in the South-Western Area to be :—

(a) Delivered to the purchasers' premises—

(b) If purchased at factory—

Eighth block	0 7
Quarter block	1 0

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which ice other than "eighth", "quarter", "half," or "large" blocks may be sold in the South-Western Area to be 3d. per block.

Notice in Writing.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any size of a block of ice specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by retail in the South-Western Area, by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to such person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 264.

BRIQUETTES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 264.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 230 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretation.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - (a) "Briquette" means a small brick consisting of compressed brown coal produced by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria.
 - (b) "Melbourne Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - (c) "Geelong Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal post office at Geelong, Victoria, and includes that area comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the post office at Queenscliff, Victoria.
 - (d) "Ballarat Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal post office at Ballarat, Victoria.
 - (e) "Bendigo Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal post office at Bendigo, Victoria.
 - (f) "Yallourn Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the post office at Yallourn, Victoria.
 - (g) "cwt." means a weight of 112 lb. avoirdupois.
 - (h) "ton" means a weight of 2,240 lb. avoirdupois.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail—Specified Areas.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which briquettes may be sold by retail in the areas specified in the Schedule to this Order to be—
 - (a) where delivery is made to the purchaser's premises in the area specified—the prices specified opposite such area in the Schedule;
 - (b) where delivery is not made to the purchaser's premises in the area specified—the prices specified opposite such area in the Schedule less an amount in each case calculated at the rate of 3d. per cwt.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which briquettes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by retail in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 265.

ONIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 265.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 196 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
 - “Primary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of onions, means a person who purchases onions for the purpose of re-sale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell onions by wholesale;
 - “Secondary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of onions, means a person who purchases onions from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale;
 - “Retail Trader” in relation to the sale of onions, means a person who purchases onions and sells such onions by retail;
 - “By Wholesale” means and refers to a sale of onions in lots of one bag or more;
 - “One Ton” means 2,240-lb. weight;
 - “lb.” means pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the case requires;
 - “Point of Delivery” means, in relation to the sale of onions, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such onions to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Sales by Primary Wholesaler.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by primary wholesalers to be—
 - (a) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser free on wharf Melbourne or at Cowper-street Railway Siding—£61 19s. 6d. per ton;
 - (b) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store—£62 12s. per ton.
- (2) Nothing in either clause 5 or clause 6 of this Order shall apply to sales by primary wholesalers to secondary wholesalers.

Sales by Secondary Wholesalers—Metropolitan Area.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by secondary wholesalers in the Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£65 2s. per ton;
- (b) where the seller delivers the onions into the buyer's shop—£65 14s. 6d. per ton.

Sales by Secondary Wholesalers—Outside the Metropolitan Area.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by secondary wholesalers other than in the Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) where such onions have been purchased in the Metropolitan Area, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £62 12s. per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of rail transport from Cowper-street, Railway Siding to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 - (iii) a margin:—
 - (A) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £2 10s. per ton; or
 - (B) where the seller delivers the onions into the buyer's shop, of £3 2s. 6d. per ton;
- (b) where such onions have been purchased outside the Metropolitan Area, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) an amount calculated at a rate of £62 12s. per ton, less the usual cost of transporting such onions by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises to Cowper-street Railway Siding, plus the usual cost of transporting such onions by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 - (ii) a margin—
 - (A) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business of £2 10s. per ton; or
 - (B) where the seller delivers the onions into the buyer's shop of £3 2s. 6d. per ton.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

7. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be 9d. per lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the price fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sale in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such onions from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed 9½d. per lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

8. (1) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail onions, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those onions a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any onions shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those onions and so as to be properly associated with such onions.

Delivery of Invoices.

9. Any person who sells by wholesale onions shall deliver with such onions an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) name and address of seller;
- (b) name and address of purchaser;
- (c) date of sale;

- (d) the point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the onions sold, number of bags, and price per unit of such onions; and
- (e) total price of such onions.

Records.

10. Any person who sells any onions shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such onions and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such onions showing—

- (a) the name and address of supplier;
- (b) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such onions;
- (c) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (d) the point of delivery; and
- (e) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such onions from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any onions specified in a notice in pursuance of this clause may be sold in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
