AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## AMENDMENT OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748), AS AMENDED BY ACT No. 3918.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency General Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 38 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by section 5 of Act No. 3918, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add the names

of the following substances and preparations to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by Act No. 3918, namely:—

"Cortisone and other supra-renal cortical hormones either natural or synthetic, and adreno-cortico-trophic hormone (A.C.T.H.) and preparations containing these substances in free or combined form, or purporting to contain them in any pharmaceutically elaborated form."

And declare that the Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by Act No. 3918, shall apply to the substances and preparations named in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

#### TYERS PLANNING SCHEME.

##### INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Town and Country Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Acts, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.

3. Any applications for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all, or any, of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

First 30 units per month: 8d. per unit.

All over 30 units per month: 6d. per unit.

## SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ECHUCA OVAL RESERVE."**

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved as a site for public recreation by Order in Council of the 27th June, 1898, in the Town of Echuca, and known as the "Echuca Oval Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person shall interfere with or damage the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Reserve, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or leave bottles, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter therein.
2. No person shall climb or jump over any buildings, seats, or fences in or around the Reserve, lie on any seats, steps, gangways, or landings, or sit in or on any gangways, steps, or landings, or stick bills on, cut letters or marks on, write or otherwise deface buildings, seats, fences, gates, posts, or trees therein.
3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee shall bring any horse or vehicle into plots of ground closed for plantation, garden, or other similar purposes.
4. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve, except as hereinbefore provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.
5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Reserve unless in the charge of adult friends or nurses.
6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the Reserve any act of indecency shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the authorized officer or servant of the Committee, or by a member of the Police Force, and shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
7. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve, and to adopt and enforce a scale of charges for admission thereto, and also may make a charge for the admission of any motor car or other vehicle as provided hereinafter, but on not more than fifty-two (52) occasions in any one year.



8. The Committee shall have the power to let the whole, or any portion, of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of cricket, football, and similar games, or for holding agricultural shows, entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, and may demand the full rental in advance or on such terms as shall be specified in any authority issued by the Committee in accordance with this Regulation.

9. No charge or fee for admission to the Reserve shall exceed Four shillings for each person, nor shall the charge for the admission or parking of any car or vehicle exceed One shilling.

10. No person or persons, except the Committee and officers and employees of the Committee on duty, shall enter or drive or otherwise propel any motor car or vehicle into any portion of the Reserve, when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Committee.

11. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Committee.

12. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, hockey, lacrosse, or any like games in the Reserve, without the written authority of the Committee, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Committee.

13. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, hockey, or lacrosse, or any like game in the Reserve on Sunday.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

15. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the employees of the Committee engaged in the Reserve.

16. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any article or food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Committee and without the payment of such fee as the Committee may by Resolution determine.

17. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.

18. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths at any time or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

19. No persons shall assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.

20. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the written consent of the Committee and then only where the coppers or fireplaces for supplies of hot water are provided.

21. No male over the age of six (6) years shall enter any building, part of building, or enclosures set aside for or being used by females, and no female over the age of six (6) years shall enter any building, part of a building, or enclosure set aside for or used by males.

22. Any person driving any horse, motor car, or other vehicle into the Reserve shall tether such horse and park such car in such place and in such manner as the authorized officer of the Committee shall direct.

23. No person shall enter or leave the arena riding or driving any horse or driving any car or other vehicle at a speed in any manner dangerous to the onlookers, nor shall a horse be ridden nor a vehicle or motor car be driven among any onlookers. Every such horse, motor car, or other vehicle shall travel by the route provided from arena exits to park exits or to the horse stalls site or the car parking site or vice versa.

24. No person, except with the consent of the Committee, shall ride any bicycle, motor cycle, tricycle, scooter, billy-cart, or other similar velocipede in the Reserve.

25. No person, without the consent of the Committee, shall graze any horse, cow, sheep, or other animal within the Reserve, and any wandering stock or stock tethered, without permission, may be impounded by the Committee or its duly authorized officer.

All costs recovered in proceedings for offences committed against the provisions of these Regulations shall be paid into the funds of the Committee of the said Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and, who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken

before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.1454.)

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AT FOOTSCRAY (KNOWN AS THE "FOOTSCRAY OVAL").

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts*, for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. 1 of the Regulations made by it on the 27th October, 1932, for the care, protection, and management of the land in the City of Footscray, Parish of Cut-paw-paw, permanently reserved by Order in Council dated the 30th September, 1878, as a site for Public purposes, and known as the "Footscray Oval" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"), and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding 60 in any one year (the days set apart to include six days from sunrise to midnight for the purpose of holding night entertainments), as the Reserve may be set aside for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, entertainments, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 7s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).—(Corres Rs.1714.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GILSENAN RECREATION RESERVE" AT PAYNESVILLE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 18th January, 1949, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Bairnsdale, and known as the "Gilsenan Recreation Reserve" at Paynesville, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.), may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding 2s. for each vehicle.

8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage, and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or

roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

17. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

18. No person shall remove any sand, stone, rock, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

19. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.6318.)

**REGULATIONS—PART III.—SALARIES, INCREMENTS, AND ALLOWANCES.**

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act 1946*, hereby amends its Regulations as shown below:—

(a) by shouting, calling out, haranguing, or singing, or

(b) by using, operating, controlling, sounding, or playing any instrument.

2. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Instrument" means any instrument, device, or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise, and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loud-speaker, amplifier, broadcasting set, wireless receiving set, gramophone, piano, player piano, or other instrument or device.

SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE.

By-LAW No. 30.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Healesville (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality"), made pursuant to the Local Government Act 1946 and clause 813 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations"), and any and all other Act or Acts in that behalf thereunto enabling, and numbered 30, for the purpose of exercising the powers conferred on the Council of the Municipality by the said clause 813.

Commencement.

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette, and By-laws Nos. 25 and 27 are hereby repealed.

No Person to Build Contrary to By-law.

2. No person shall erect, build, construct, repair, pull down, remove, alter, add to, or re-erect or cause or suffer to be erected, built, constructed, repaired, pulled down, removed, altered, added to, or re-erected, any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

Brick Areas.

3. No building shall be built, constructed, erected, added to, or extended on land fronting to or abutting upon any portions of both sides of any of the following streets or roads:—

- (i) The Maroondah Highway—
  - (a) from the junction of the northernmost side of the Maroondah Highway and St. Leonards-road to the junction of

the Maroondah Highway and McGrettons-road, and

- (b) from the junction of the southernmost side of the Maroondah Highway and Don-road to the junction of the Maroondah Highway and McGrettons-road;

- (ii) Green-street, from its intersection with the Maroondah Highway to its intersection with Symons-street;

- (iii) Harker-street, from its intersection with the Maroondah Highway to its junction with the Healesville-Kinglake road; and

- (iv) the Healesville-Kinglake road, from its junction with the Maroondah Highway to its junction with Harker-street

and including all land to a depth of 165 feet from the street alignments of the said land (hereinafter referred to as the "Brick Area" of the Municipality) unless the external walls of such buildings are of brick, stone, or concrete, provided that for the purpose of this clause buildings of brick veneer construction conforming to the requirements of Chapter 26 of the Regulations shall be deemed to have external walls of brick, and provided further that the foregoing restrictions shall extend and apply to the following outbuildings and outhouses, namely, garages, dairies, milking sheds, and such urinals as are attached to public buildings, hotels, and boarding houses.

Limit of Two Stories.

4. Excepting lands within the Brick Area of the Municipality, all the lands within the Townships of Healesville and Marysville, as defined on the respective township plans issued by the Department of Land and Survey of the State of Victoria (which areas are hereinafter referred to as the "Residential Areas" of the Municipality), are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy, as classified in Chapter 6 of the Regulations, shall not be constructed to contain more than two stories, including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause or suffer to be constructed any such building to contain more than two stories, including the ground story.

Limit of Three Stories.

5. All areas not being Residential Areas of the Municipality are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy as described in Chapter 6 of the Regulations shall not be constructed to contain more than three stories including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause or suffer to be constructed any such building to contain more than three stories including the ground story.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

6. (a) The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 4 of Table 803 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building of Classes I. and II. Occupancy, as described in Chapter 6 of the Regulations, shall be constructed throughout the Brick Area of the Municipality and throughout the aforesaid Township of Healesville in the Parish of Gracedale.

(b) The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 5 of Table 803 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building of Classes I. and II. Occupancy as described in Chapter 6 of the Regulations shall be constructed throughout all portions of the Municipality excepting the areas described in sub-clause (a) hereof.

Distance from Frontage.

7. The minimum distance of the outer wall of any building of Classes I. and II. Occupancy, as described in the Regulations, from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as 20 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

8. Subject to the Regulations, made pursuant to section 17 of the Slum Reclamation and Housing Act, the Council of the Municipality may, upon written application being made, in its discretion permit any person to—

- (a) construct a building of Class I. Occupancy, as described in the Regulations, on land throughout all portions of the Brick Area of the Municipality having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage than those specified in column 4 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or at a lesser distance from the boundaries than those specified in clauses 805 and 806 of the Regulations; or
- (b) construct a building of Class I. Occupancy, as described in the Regulations, on land throughout all portions of the Municipality excepting

the Brick Area having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage than those specified in column 5 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or at a lesser distance from the boundaries than those specified in clauses 805 and 806 of the Regulations; or

- (c) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy, as described in the Regulations, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of front less than those specified in clause 808 of the Regulations:

Provided in all such cases that on the date of the commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or was shown on a plan of subdivision approved by the Council of the Municipality and lodged in the Office of Titles.

#### Rear Access.

9. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council of the Municipality and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the said Council may, upon written application being made to it, in its discretion dispense with the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations.

#### Penalties.

10. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is continued, to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day such offence is continued.
